The Exchange in order to verify the accuracy or otherwise of the information reported in the press and to inform the market place so that the interest of the investors is safeguarded had written to the officials of the company.

Jindal Strips Limited has vide their letter dated November 03, 2000 stated "In the last Annual General Meeting held on September 20, 1999 the company had obtained sanction of the share holders through special resolution passed pursuant to section 77 A and 77 B of the Companies Act 1956 to buyback its own shares. This power conferred by the shareholder and valid for one year could not be exercised by the company during the year."
