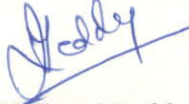

India needs to believe it has power, need to invest in sport: Cafu

Legendary Brazilian captain Cafu on Saturday said India must not think about its tiny status on the football map and rather believe it has the power to grow, adding that Brazil is open to develop cooperation in this field.

Cafu said Brazil and India can make it happen by connection between the two countries, citing how Japan and China have taken the help of the five-time World Cup winners in the past. India

and Brazil are set to play their first-ever friendly match in Kolkata on October 3, and Cafu said there may be a gap between the two national football teams, but there are positives to look forward to.

“India really needs someone with that reasoning,” Cafu said while responding to Bhaichung Bhutia’s remarks on the India-Brazil friendly, during a discussion at the Global Impact Forum here on Saturday.

“I feel those kind of matches should be on merit basis. What is going to

happen in that match is Brazil is going to dominate obviously, because they are the top world class football team. The Indian team is just going to play defence, defence, you’re just going to park the bus and want to play one match,” Bhutia said.

“India should also try and bring in a lot of great coaches, especially at the grassroots level, where the Japanese football has taken similar shape with Brazilian football. I think that is the right way of model to go into it,” he added. Cafu replied, “... that

was exactly the discussion we were having yesterday, about what India can do to enhance its football performance.”

“... and in which ways they can bring up these children to become great champions. To make India to be competitive in football. Yeah, maybe you could not compare with the Brazilian team because we already have five titles, but I say never, we should never say no.” “When we talk about this tool that we are using to include children in society, we are bringing it as a world perspective. By means of the

connection between Brazil and India, we can make this coming through,” Cafu said.

Cafu said India should not be thinking itself as “too small in football” and needs to believe it has the power to grow substantially.

“Why do you think yourselves as too small in football? This is wrong. You are a giant. You need to believe you have the power,” Cafu said.

“But then you need to give the child an opportunity. Just like China did it, Japan did it, it is possible, just like you said, by bringing coaches,

exchanging information between countries and bringing them to the Indian children, it is possible,” Cafu said, referring to the points made by Bhutia.

The two-time World Cup winner Cafu added, “Let us call this like having an opportunity. You give an opportunity to a child and the child will become a citizen and an athlete, and Brazil is open to develop the cooperation in this field so that India can become even greater than you already are. Let’s invest in sport and in education.”

Suthar picks up match haul of seven in big Warwickshire win

India’s newest spin-bowling star Manav Suthar picked up a match haul of seven wickets as Warwickshire defeated Hampshire by an innings and 129 runs in a Division One away game of the English County Championship.

Having picked 11 wickets in his first two games for the Birmingham-based County club before leaving for national duty in Sri Lanka, the left-arm orthodox spinner started from where he had left off with a match haul of 7 for 94 in a total 38.3 overs bowled across both Hampshire innings.

Batting first, Warwickshire scored 398 and then bowled out Hampshire for 115 and 154 inside three days. The match ended late Friday evening as per India time. Suthar had figures of 3/42 in 15 overs in the first innings and followed it up with 4/52 in 23.3 overs in the second innings. Out of his seven dismissals, he had one

batter bowled, two were leg before and one was stumped signalling his dominance over the Hampshire batting unit. In another match at the Oval in London, Surrey beat Yorkshire by one wicket with Jammu and Kashmir pacer Auqib Nabi picking a wicket each in both innings in a winning cause. His maiden county wicket was fellow India Test teammate Kuldeep Yadav. Towards the end of the chase, he also hit a six to bring Surrey closer to the target. Out of contention for national recall, Yuzvendra Chahal picked up nine wickets for Northamptonshire, including a five-for in the second innings, but Durham produced a clinical bowling performance to win the Division 2 game by 153 runs despite conceding a first-innings lead.

Durham scored 205 and 261 in their two innings while Northants after scoring 263 in their first innings were bowled out for 50 in the second essay in pursuit of 204.

Challenging to join T20 after Duleep, it’s our job to adapt: Tilak, Kishan

Tilak Varma and Ishan Kishan admitted that it is “tough” to join India’s T20I squad for the three-match series against Afghanistan right after the Duleep Trophy final, but understood the need to adapt to the situation and as professional cricketers they can’t offer “excuses.”

The five-day domestic fixture, which starts here on Sunday, is scheduled for a September 10 finish, and India will face Afghanistan in the first of the three T20Is in New Delhi on September 13.

“It is just about knowing what format you are playing. I know it gets difficult when you are playing Test match and suddenly you have to go and start hitting from ball one (in white ball format) and then suddenly you have to go back to your domestic team and you have to play a whole different role,” Kishan, who is leading East Zone, said in the pre-match press conference. Kishan, who is a part of India’s T20I squad, found a supporting voice in Tilak Varma, South Zone captain and India’s T20I vice-

captain. “Yes, it will be slightly challenging...playing five days here (Duleep Trophy) and again joining the (India) team. From here we are going to Delhi, so, there will be like a two day break. We can practise there. It will be slightly challenging,” he said.

So, how to mitigate the situation? Kishan and Tilak banked on their ability to adapt. “We have played enough domestic games, we have played in every condition, so we can adjust. We know how to change our mindsets and maintain our body with good fluids and everything.” “We have played before in domestic as well as international back-to-back games, so we are quite used to it,” he said. It may be recalled that Tilak had openly manifested his desire to play in the Duleep Trophy final after winning the semifinal in Bengaluru. Kishan too joined Tilak on the adaptability road. “I feel as professionals it is our job to adapt. We cannot come up with excuses after knowing this is your routine for the next few days. So, it is better to not be in a situation where we have to make excuses. “But



at the same time be aware and be just mindful of what is going to happen and I will be playing T20I after this. So, my job will be different. But still I feel we are getting two days of practice before the first game against Afghanistan. So, it will be more than enough I feel,” he added. However, Tilak will not be alone in his task of manning South’s batting

after the addition of in-form Devdutt Padikkal.

“Yeah, it will be a big boost for us. The kind of form he (Padikkal) is in, it will be really helpful for us and he can share his experience with the players. We have got quite a few young guys on our side and it will be really helpful.” Tilak said the Karnataka left-hander will bat at No. 3, a position where

batted in India ranks. “Padikkal will be batting at number 3 and his coming into the side will strengthen our batting line-up, especially with the kind of form we have seen from Padikkal in the last 2 or 3 games. He has done really well. It will be a big boost for us.” Similarly, East Zone will have 15-year-old Vaibhav Sooryavanshi to depend on to make an

impact up the order. For the record, this will be Sooryavanshi’s first five-day game in representative career. Whether it is U-19, Ranji Trophy or Duleep Trophy, he has so far played only 4-day games.

“I feel Vaibhav is very smart for a 15-year-old boy. He knows what he is doing, he has been in this situation and I have heard him speaking to other players as well. So, there is no doubt if he has played 4 day or 3 day cricket earlier and this is a 5-day game, I think you just need to get runs out of him and that is what he is willing to do. “I think he is doing a great job until now. He played a very crucial role in the previous match where the wicket was not that good but he played those extra shots which helped us get that opening partnership.” The left-hander made sparkling 92 and an important 40 against Central Zone in the semifinal at Bengaluru. “It was very important while we were chasing. So he is doing everything right for now and if there is anything, I think we are there to always help him,” said Kishan. (PTI)

It’ll be tough but I don’t take pressure: Parul Chaudhary

Asian Games double gold medallist Parul Chaudhary said the addition of 1500m race to the competition list has not burdened her, and is trusting the intense pre-event training process to do an encore in the upcoming edition. Chaudhary had won gold in 3000m steeple chase and 5000m in the previous edition of the continental showpiece held in Hangzhou, China.

Additionally, she will take part in the 1500m event in this Games to be held in Japan. “There will be good and tough competition. There are strong athletes



from across Asia, particularly from Japan and Bahrain. But I am confident of doing well. I had won gold medals last time and I want to bring those medals back to the country,” Chaudhary told PTI in an interview facilitated by SAI. Chaudhary admitted

that competing in three different events in as many days can be tough, but exuded confidence that adaptive training at SAI Centre of Excellence can stand her in good stead.

“It is difficult (competing in three events). But I am training accordingly. I have to compete for three days in a row. “So, I will have to train accordingly. But I don’t take pressure at all, as I just think about giving my best. I am sure a medal will follow.” The 31-year-old gave a glimpse into her training methods here. “It (training) has been good so far. The preparation is going well. We still have time to prepare for Japan’s weather conditions.

“I have seen that it is raining there. We will adapt to those conditions, mainly hot and humid. We will set a preparation time for the summer conditions in mind,” she said. However, Chaudhary’s run-up to the Asian Games was less than satisfactory, finishing well behind in 3000m steeplechase and 5000m in the Glasgow Commonwealth Games.

Age just number, I see hunger in Shami bhai to make India comeback: Ishan

The fire burns inside Mohammad Shami even after tallying 903 wickets in 100 first-class games, leaving East Zone skipper Ishan Kishan convinced about the pacer’s “hunger and motivation” to make an India comeback.

Shami played a big role in East Zone’s march to the Duleep Trophy final after 13 years, taking five wickets against Central Zone in the semifinal at Bengaluru.

“I think he is just one of the best. He has been legend of this game. He has been doing so well since he started playing for Bengal. He has been picking wickets, giving all his energy and he has done so well for Indian team also,” Kishan said.

“It’s hard to say when it comes to age, I feel age is just a number. If he is working hard it doesn’t matter. I see that hunger in Shami bhai because who better than me to judge about hunger right now (hinting at Kishan’s time away from Indian cricket team for various reasons). “He has been doing so well, especially having him in our team...it gives us a bit of more confidence,” Kishan added. At 36, Shami is closer to the end of his career but Kishan said it has not prevented the Bengal man from



asking for a few extra overs. “Looking at his efforts as a captain, I felt very nice, because Shami bhai came in, asking me for those extra overs to get the wickets, this is something which always gives confidence to skip-pers. When you have bowlers who are willing to get you wickets. So, it’s always good to have him in the team.”

“He also finished with two boundaries, so he is an allrounder I feel nowadays. So I am very happy to have him in my team,” he added. So what sets apart Shami? “Looking at Shami bhai this season, I feel he has been very different, how I have seen him in past, but his approach towards the game, his intensity, his energy has been very different.” Kishan clearly saw the hunger in Shami, someone who desperately wanted to earn a recall to the India fold.

“You know it is hard when you are not regularly playing for the Indian team and to again have that same kind of

motivation for your domestic games is tough. He has that hunger and that motivation right now like he wants to do that comeback. He wants to be part of Indian squad again and you can see it in him.”

Shami’s last appearance in India colours was in the Champions Trophy 2025 final against New Zealand in Dubai. But Kishan said the long absence from top-flight cricket has not dulled Shami’s competitive spirit. “When he is trying to help me when I am leading the side...he is trying to come to me, give me options of what you can do. I think these things you can pick from a player whether he is willing to win you this game or not.” “That is something which all our boys are trying to do and we have been on the winning side,” he added.

South Zone skipper Tilak Varma too showered praise on Shami, but said his side is ready to take on the wily pacer. “It will be a good competition for us playing against Shami bhai. We have seen in the last game how he set up batters and took that wicket. But we know that we are pretty confident for that challenge. That is why you love the sport. So, we prepared enough for that and we are ready to take him on,” said Tilak.
