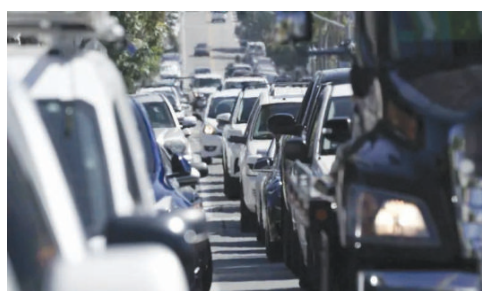
BSF hands over 13-year-old Bangladeshi boy to BGB in a goodwill gesture

New Delhi. The Border Security Force (BSF) handed over a 13-year-old Bangladeshi boy, who was apprehended while illegally crossing the international border in Meghalaya, to the BGB in a goodwill gesture, officials said on Sunday. A woman smuggler and the boy were apprehended on September 24 while illegally crossing the India-Bangladesh border through the unfenced area at Nongkhen in Meghalaya for petty smuggling, a BSF statement said. Both the woman and the boy hail from Sylhet district of Bangladesh. The woman revealed that she brought the minor boy with her as labour for carrying items meant for smuggling into India, the BSF said. The boy was handed over to Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) during a flag meeting on Saturday in presence of police representatives as a goodwill gesture and the apprehended Bangladeshi woman was handed over to police station Bagmara for further legal action, the statement said. BSF Meghalaya Frontier Inspector General Inderjit Singh Rana said the goodwill gesture was adopted by the BSF as a humanitarian approach in such cases where the victims are minors. "Both the border guarding forces have developed an understanding on such subjects and these issues are amicably resolved to strengthen the existing relationship and to enhance mutual trust between both the neighbouring countries," he said.

Centre to roll out Rs 7,270 crore scheme for road safety in 14 states

New Delhi. The Union Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) is all set to roll out a new Rs 7,270 crore State Support Programme for Strengthening Road Safety to help realise the vision of "Zero road fatalities on Indian roads." The centrally-sponsored six-year programme will be implemented in 14 states that are now contributing to 85 per cent of the total road fatalities in the country. While MoRTH will lend a budgetary support of Rs 3,635 crore, an amount of Rs 1,818 crore will be secured as loan each from the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank. Of the total cost, Rs 6,725 crore will be disbursed to the 14 states based on their performance while MoRTH will use Rs 545 crore for capacity building activities. The scheme will incentivise state governments to drive road safety interventions at the grassroots level with the main objective of curbing road accidents and achieving a reduction in fatalities, the MoRTH said in a concept note circulated to the target states. The target

states under the scheme are Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Bihar, Telangana, West Bengal, Odisha, Haryana and Assam. "This is an output and outcome-driven scheme wherein the performance of the states will be assessed on 11 mandatory and three elective indicators (road safety interventions). The grants will be distributed to the states based on the Key Performance Indicators," top official sources told PTI. The preliminary project report prepared by MoRTH says the Motor Vehicle Amendment Act (2019) was brought in as an important intervention to achieve the fatality reduction target. "To leverage the strengthened law, it is necessary to have focused interventions in the related areas of road safety like road engineering, enforcement, road safety advocacy and media campaigns and efficient emergency response systems. The states need to be supported to act on result-oriented



strategies. Hence the new scheme," the sources said. India reported about 1.51 lakh road deaths in 4.49 lakh accidents in the year 2019. Of the total deaths, the 14 identified states accounted for 1,27,379. The number of fatalities remained consistent over the last five years. In 2020, 1.32 lakh road deaths were recorded across the country, with the Covid-19-induced lockdown resulting in the reduction in number. The new scheme targets to reduce the fatality rate by 30 per cent by March 2027. Cyclists, two and three-wheeler

riders and pedestrians have been identified as "vulnerable road users" who comprised about 54 per cent of road traffic deaths in India. Under the new scheme, performance-based indicators have been proposed with the aim of reducing the impact of road accidents on these vulnerable users. An Integrated Road Accident Database (IRAD) will be rolled out in all states by 2022-23 and applied for identifying and rectifying all black spots on state highways and major district roads. Road safety audit will be made mandatory on state highways and urban roads by the end of the scheme period. From 2022-23, MoRTH will launch a "Challenge Round" every year to provide incentives to states on additional road safety interventions and also to promote competition among states. "The grant of Rs 7,270 crore will only meet partial fund requirement for the scheme. States are expected to make their own budgetary allocations and also.

Armed forces' role in Doklam stand-off, Galwan clashes enhanced India's stature: Army Vice Chief

► Vice Chief of Army Staff Lt Gen C P Mohanty said the role played by Indian armed forces during the Doklam Valley clashes not only enhanced India's prestige but also raised its stature globally.



prestige of the nation, but it has also given us a big stature internationally." "Today everyone talks about India as a net security provider," he said at the event organised by Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies (VIPS). "It is not going to be long when we also start being counted amongst the superpowers," he added. The troops of India and China were engaged in a 73-day stand-off in Doklam tri-junction in 2017 that even triggered fears of a war between the two nuclear-armed neighbours. Indian armed forces put up stiff resistance to China's construction of a road in Doklam near the trijunction. The dispute was resolved through several rounds of talks.

The Indian Army blunted "vicious" Chinese attacks in the Galwan Valley in eastern Ladakh on June 15 last year in eastern Ladakh. Twenty Indian Army personnel laid down their lives in the clashes with Chinese troops that marked the most serious military conflicts between the two sides in decades. In February, China officially acknowledged that five Chinese military officers and soldiers were killed in the clashes with the Indian Army though it is widely believed that the death toll was higher. In his address, Lt Gen Mohanty said India has invested in its security forces and they have been playing a key role in the overall development of the country as security is a key aspect of prosperity. He emphasised that allocation towards the armed forces is part of the nation-building process. Lt Gen Mohanty also complimented Indian Air Force Wing Commander Abhinandan Varthaman for his role in thwarting a Pakistani offensive a day after the Balakot strikes in February 2019. "He held his head high and become a symbol of today's youths," he said.

UP cabinet expansion aimed at mobilising caste votes: Mayawati slams BJP

New Delhi. Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati slammed the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) led Uttar Pradesh government for trying to mobilise the votes on the basis of caste by inducting new ministers in Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath-led Cabinet, months ahead of Assembly polls in the state. Taking to Twitter, the BSP chief cautioned the voters of the poll-bound state about the "dual character" of the Uttar Pradesh government and alleged the not only BJP-led government has not taken any concrete steps for the development of the sections BJP is allegedly trying to appease by inducting new ministers but also halted the projected stated during her government in the state for them. "Whoever has been made a minister by BJP yesterday to mobilise votes on the basis of caste in UP, it would have been better if they did not accept it. Because by the time they will understand their respective ministry and want to do something, the code of conduct for election will be implemented here," she tweeted. "While the present BJP government has not taken any concrete steps for the development and upliftment of these sections of society, but most of the works started by the BSP government in their interests have also been stopped. Advice to these classes to be careful with this double-character of their's (government)," Mayawati added. Ahead of Uttar Pradesh Assembly polls that are scheduled to be held early next year, seven new ministers took the oath of office in the UP cabinet on Sunday. The is seen as an attempt to set the caste balance right and give more representation to most backwards and schedule castes before elections in the state. Among the ministers who took oath are Jitin Prasad, a Brahmin switched over from Congress in June this year. Out of six others, Dharmveer Prajapati, Chhatrapal Gangawar and Sangita Balwant Bind are from other backward classes (OBC), Paltu Ram and Danesh Khatik belong to scheduled caste and Sanjeev Kumar Gond, who belongs to the Gond community-- a scheduled tribe. Prasad is the only cabinet minister, the other six have been given the rank of minister of state (MoS). Uttar Pradesh is the fourth BJP-ruled state where a major rejig is happening after Gujarat, Karnataka and Uttarakhand. Earlier in the month, Bhupendra Patel was sworn in as Gujarat's new chief minister replacing Vijay Rupani. The entire Gujarat cabinet was changed subsequently. In Uttarakhand, the BJP had changed its CM three times.

Bharat Bandh: Delhi-UP traffic hit as farmers' strike begins, national highways blocked in Haryana

New Delhi. The Delhi Traffic Police has said vehicular movement has been closed from Uttar Pradesh towards Ghazipur due to the farmers' strike. The Delhi-Amritsar National Highway and National Highway 44 in Haryana have also been blocked. Farmers have also blocked the Shambhu border (Punjab-Haryana border) till 4 pm in view of the 10-hour long strike against the Centre's three farm laws. The entry and exit for Pandit Shree Ram Sharma has been closed, the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) has informed. The Delhi Traffic Police has informed that due to the Bharat band protest, the local police have closed the following points: Netaji Subhash Marg; both carriageways with Jersey barriers at Chhatta rail junction, Netaji Subhash marg carriageway (Red Fort-Daryaganj) from T point Subhash park Carriageway (Daryaganj) -Red Fort) at

Traffic has been affected after agitating farmers blocked border areas in Delhi and national highways in Haryana as the Bharat Bandh began on Monday.



Khas cut near Kabutar Market. The farm leaders have appealed to all Indians to join

the shutdown. They have put out detailed guidelines and have called for a peaceful strike. This will be the third Bharat Bandh called by the SKM and the Kisan Unions expect the bandh to be an effective one. The Bandh will be held on Monday from 6 am to 4 pm. Transport and markets are expected to remain shut on a large scale during this period. Talking about the shutdown, SKM said, "This would include all government and private offices, all educational and other institutions, all shops, industries and commercial establishments, all public events and functions. Public and private transport will also come to a halt during this period." The kisan body said, "All emergency establishments and essential services, including hospitals, medical stores, relief and rescue work and people attending to personal emergencies will be exempted."

How Goa strongman Luizinho Faleiro may benefit TMC as it tests new waters



New Delhi. Political circles in Goa are abuzz with the talks of former Goa chief minister and the sitting MLA of Navelim constituency, Luizinho Faleiro, joining the Trinamool Congress (TMC) after quitting Congress. The buzz gained further momentum after the announcement of a mega press conference by

Luizinho Faleiro, who is Goa's senior-most Congress leader. Luizinho Faleiro will be addressing the media at the ballroom of the Marriott Hotel in Miramar on Monday. Faleiro, meanwhile, added fuel to the fire on Sunday by telling reporters in Goa that he has been "after meditating for the last few days his

mind is made up". He, however, denied meeting any TMC leader or being invited by the party to join its ranks. Till a few days ago, Faleiro was considered close to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi. He has been representing Navelim since 1980 and was elected from the seat for the first time on a Congress ticket. In 1984, he won the seat as an independent to clinch the seat again in 1989, 1994, 1999 and 2002 on a Congress ticket. The seat was won by Churchill Alemao of the Save Goa front in 2007 and Avertano Furtado in 2012. Faleiro wrested back control of the seat in 2017. Faleiro's significance in Goa can be gauged from the fact that recently, the AICC appointed him chief of the 13-member Campaign Committee for Goa elections. A senior office-bearer of the state Congress told India Today TV that Monday's press conference by former CM does not have the party's endorsement. He claimed that resentment has been brewing in the Goa Congress with elections nearing. He didn't rule out the possibility of some disillusioned party leaders switching sides to

the TMC. In 2017, despite winning 17 assembly seats in Goa and emerging as the single largest party, Congress failed to form the government as top leaders bickered among themselves. The state Congress top brass led by Girish Chodankar and Digambar Kamat as the Congress Legislature Party (CLP) head is facing charges of ignoring the voice of state leaders. Faleiro can bring more than a toe-hold for the TMC in Goa as he was also the Tripura campaign in-charge of the Congress party in 2019. With the TMC planning to spread its footprint in Tripura, apart from Goa, Faleiro can prove to be an asset. An indication that the TMC is eyeing to make big inroads in Goa's 2022 assembly polls came when its Rajya Sabha leader Derek O'Brien and Lok Sabha MP Prasun Banerjee landed in Goa last week. Sources said that their trip was exploratory in nature and they planned to meet a cross-section of political leaders and social groups to assess the political situation before taking the plunge. Last week, Mamata Banerjee had clearly stated that the TMC would be contesting the Goa assembly elections that will be held early next year. Interestingly, team members of Mamata's political strategist Prashant Kishor's I-PAC have already been stationed in Goa for more than a month. They have been meeting MLAs, former MLAs, heads of religious groups, social activists and prominent citizens to gather information on the current political situation in Goa. However, this would not be TMC's maiden entry into Goa politics. In 2012, former chief minister Wilfred de Souza, who is credited with the win for the Congress in Goa in 1980, became a big catch for the TMC. Since 1963, Goa politics has been dominated by regional players, especially the Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party. In July 1998, Souza formed the Goa Rajiv Congress Party using a splinter group of the INC and was sworn in as chief minister for the third time on July 30, 1998, and remained in the post until 26 November 1998. He joined the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) in 1998 and was its Goa president from 1999 to June 2009. The TMC contested 20 assembly seats in 2012, but could not win any as its total vote share was below 2%.
