Khalistani Money: Hidden force shaping Trudeau's Government

On November 12, 2024, a sensational newspaper report revealed a shocking truth about how Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's government has turned a blind eye to the growing threat of Khalistani terrorism. Newly surfaced documents shed light on an alarming nexus between Canadian political stability and funding from Khalistani elements. The NDP, crucial to Trudeau's parliamentary majority, has effectively kept the Liberal Party in power. This arrangement places Canada's political future in a precarious position—beholden to Khalistani interests for its survival.

This entanglement also offers a new explanation for Trudeau's controversial statements accusing India of involvement in Nijjar's death. When Trudeau lashed out at India, it wasn't just political rhetoric—it was likely an attempt to protect a financial lifeline that sustains his government. Meanwhile, Canadian Hindus, who increasingly feel marginalized, are left to wonder whether their security is being sacrificed for the sake of political expediency.

While the infiltration of Khalistani sympathizers into Canadian politics is not new, these documents reveal how deeply entrenched the issue has become. Khalistani extremists, once confined to the fringes, now seem to exert considerable influence at the highest levels of government. This dangerous alliance has effectively shackled Canadian authorities, making it unlikely they will take decisive action against Khalistani operatives anytime soon. With this newfound



influence, Khalistani groups are emboldened to escalate their threats.

In one chilling example of this growing boldness, Khalistani terrorist Gurpatwant Singh Pannu recently issued a video threatening to target the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, one of Hinduism's holiest sites. Pannu, who heads the terror group Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), warned of an attack on November 16–17, 2024. In the video, recorded in Brampton, Canada, Pannu not only threatens violence at the Ram Temple but also targets Hindu MP Chandra Arya, a member of Canada's parliament.

Pannu's threats against the Ram Temple in Ayodhya are a direct challenge to India's national security. He also issued a broader call to incite violence against other Hindu religious sites, promising to shake the very foundations of Ayodhya, the birthplace of Hindutva ideology. His rhetoric, which also includes threats against Indian diplomats in Canada, underscores the dangerous rise of Khalistani extremism, which continues to be fueled by support from within Canada.

Pannu, a fugitive from Indian justice, has long been involved in stirring anti-India sentiment and recruiting Khalistani sympathizers to incite violence. With his operations now extending to threats against religious sites in India, the Canadian government's failure to act against him is deeply concerning.

As the situation escalates, the United States may play a key role in curbing Pannu's operations. Given America's strong stance against terrorism, there is hope

that the U.S. could intervene and put pressure on Canadian authorities to take stronger action against Pannu and his affiliates.

The revelations about the financial ties between Canada's political elite and Khalistani financiers represent a new and troubling challenge. Extremism in any form is a danger to global stability, but Khalistani backing, with its Pakistani roots, poses an especially grave threat. Now, with the Khalistani movement attempting to use religious tensions to sow division within India—through threats against the Ram Mandir—the stakes have never been higher.

This exposure of Khalistani networks should serve as a wake-up call for governments, social media companies, and civil society worldwide. There is an urgent need for greater vigilance and cooperation to thwart covert operations aimed at stoking violence and destabilizing nations. Governments must invest in cyber security, counterintelligence, and stronger diplomatic ties to combat foreign influence campaigns.

The relationship between Canada's political elites and Khalistani financiers risks creating an irreparable rift between India and Canada. India's patience is rapidly running out, and without a fundamental shift in Canadian policy, it's hard to see how relations could improve. The troubling reality is that Khalistani dollars are propping up the political machinery in Ottawa, trapping Trudeau in a dangerous web. Only a significant change in the political landscape in Canada may be able to alter this precarious situation.

Repco Home Finance reports 14.4% growth in net profit at Rs. 108.7 cr

Chennai, Nov 13: Repco Home Finance Ltd reported a 14.4% year-on-year (YoY) increase in net profit at Rs. 108.7 crore for the second quarter that ended September 30, 2024.

In the corresponding quarter of the previous fiscal, Repco Home Finance posted a net profit of Rs. 95 crore, the company said in a regulatory filing.

Net interest income (NII), which is the difference between the interest income a bank earns from its lending activities and the interest it pays to depositors, was up 1.7%, coming at Rs. 175.7 crore against Rs. 172.7 crore in the corresponding quarter of

FY24. In monetary terms, gross NPA stood at Rs. 552 crore against Rs. 583 crore quarter-on-quarter, whereas net NPA came at Rs. 217 crore against Rs. 223 crore quarter-on-quarter.

Repco Home Finance's loan sanctions reached Rs. 926 crore, an 8% increase from Rs. 860 crore in Q2 FY24. Loan disbursements also grew by 9%, standing at Rs. 867 crore compared to Rs. 797 crore in the previous year.

Total income for the quarter rose by 11.5%, amounting to Rs. 428 crore, up from Rs. 384 crore in Q2 FY24. Net interest income increased by 28%, from Rs. 680 crore to Rs. 867 crore.

As of September 30, 2024, the company's loan book stood at Rs. 13,964 crore, an 8.1% increase from Rs. 12,922 crore a year ago. Housing loans made up 74% of the loan book, while home equity products accounted for 26%.
