ANANT CHATURDASHI FESTIVITIES | Lord Ganesha was given a ceremonial send-off

Lord Ganesha immersed during day, tableaux procession held at night

It was the day of Lord Ganesha on Saturday. Throughout the day, people were seen coming individually and in groups to bid emotional farewell to the Ganesha at various ghats of river Kshipra and other water bodies. They prayed him, "Ganpati Bappa Morya, Agli Baras to Jaldi aa". By night, the scheduled routes saw attractive tableau of various departments and socio-cultural organisations. The day of farewell for Lord Ganesha arrived on Saturday, marking Anant Chaturdashi. After ten days of worship and devotion, the idols of Lord Ganesha were given a ceremonial send-off following aarti and



Collective immersion of Lord Ganesha's idols was carried out in a pond in Heera Mill area through crane rituals. This year, the administration did not permit idol immersion in the Kshipra River. Heavy police deployment was placed at every ghat to enforce the restriction. Instead, arrangements for immersion were made at Hira Mill Kund and Undasa Pond. Using cranes, the idols were given a symbolic water bath before being transported in

The immersion procession began early in the morning with household idols being taken for farewell rituals. Devotees who went to Triveni, cranes, twelve Eicher vehicles and five tractor-trolleys to manage the process. The grand public processions of Ganesha idols began at around 9 pm. Tableaux from across the city started gathering at Chamunda Mata Temple, before proceeding as a ceremonial parade toward the bank of river Kshipra. The night-long procession featured decorated tableaux from the Ujjain Municipal Corporation, District Hospital, PHE Department, District Administration and Chimananjay Krishi Ujaj Mandi along with those organised by major Ganesha Mandals in the city. Elaborate security and traffic arrangements were put in place for the smooth conduct of the procession.

Citizens to get regular potable water supply from Sept 8

Water will be supplied daily in Ujjain from Monday, April 15, water was being supplied to the city on alternate days. This arrangement was implemented due to water shortage in Gambhir dam. Now after four and a half months, the situation has become normal. Gambhir dam is filled with water up to its full capacity of 2250 Mc Ft. In such a situation, on Saturday, public representatives performed puja-paath at Shri Billeshwar Mahadev temple located in Ambodia village. After discussing with the officials, it has been decided to provide regular water supply to the

city from September 8. Mayor Mukesh Tatwal, Ujjain Municipal Corporation speaker Kalavati Yadav, BJP City president Sanjay Agrawal and commissioner Abhilash Mishra performed puja at the temple. Water Works Committee in-charge Prakash Sharma was also present. After the puja, aarti was performed by offering a chunari on the Gambhir river. During the discussion with the commissioner, it has also been decided that water supply will be done with adequate pressure. Attention will also be paid to preventing wastage of water. MIC members, zone presidents and officials of various departments were present in the programme.

The festival holds special significance as it aims to promote Sanskrit theatre, showcasing not only classical plays but also modern works written in Sanskrit on contemporary themes. This year, Karmabharatam a play written by the great poet Bhasa, who preceded Kalidasa was staged by Pratibha Cultural Institute, New Delhi. Based on the life of the famous Mahabharata character Karna, the play was directed by Bhumeswar Singh and incorporated elements of Chhau dance. The inaugural day was held in the presence of Prof Shivshankar Mishra, Vice-Chancellor of Mahatma Jai Prakash Sanskrit and

Vedic University, as chief guest, with Ujjain Municipal Corporation speaker Kalavati Yadav presiding, and BJP president Sanjay Agrawal as special guest. On the second day, Central University, Sringeri (Karnataka), presented Vasanatikarnam, a Sanskrit adaptation of Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, authored in the 19th century by noted Sanskrit scholar Krishnamacharya. Sohagpura primary school classrooms filled with water

Heavy rainfall in Sohagpura, Pithampur tehsil, caused flooding in a primary school, with water levels reaching 4-5 feet. Classrooms were submerged and furniture was underwater. Although the school was closed due to flooding, the situation highlights the need for urgent action. Block Coordination Resource Education Officer Rajesh Shinde attributed the flooding to the school building's low elevation and surrounding fields' water flowing into the school premises. A previously constructed drain was blocked, preventing water from draining properly. Tehsildar Shivani Srivastava took immediate action upon learning of the situation, instructing the Block Coordination Resource Education Officer to drain the water and work on preventing future flooding. Heavy rainfall caused 1-2 feet of water to accumulate in the school. The school building's low elevation and blocked drains contributed to the flooding.

Deputy Collector acquitted in fraud case

Deputy Collector, Radha Mahadant was acquitted in a fraud case by the court. The police had failed to obtain permission from the government before filing charges against her. The case involved a dispute over land worth crores of rupees in Chikhali village, Sihorol. A farmer, Sukhlal Nanaka Bosod had

applied to change his caste from Bosod to Scheduled Tribe in the revenue records. Based on the report from the Revenue Inspector (RI) and Patwari, Mahadant had ordered the change. This led to the land being sold to Arvind Mishra for 744 lakh using forged documents. During investigation, Mahadant was also implicated as an accused.

Seven years later, the then Collector, Manish Singh issued a notice to Mishra, stating that the sale of tribal land

without the Collector's permission was illegal. Mishra filed an FIR against Chen Singh, Suresh and Jagdish in Sihorol police station. The police registered a case of fraud, forgery and creating false documents. During investigation, Mahadant was also implicated as an accused. The court, however, observed that the police had not followed the law and did not obtain the required permission from the government to prosecute a public servant under Section 197 of the CrPc. The court discharged Mahadant from the case, allowing the trial to proceed against the other accused. Mahadant is currently serving as a Deputy Collector in Ratlam. Her lawyer has also filed a petition in the High Court to quash the FIR under Section 482 of the CrPc.

12-day long 'MH Attachment Camp' concludes
