DOCTORS' STRIKE | Treatment refused to patients, only emergency services were open OPDs in 12K pvt hospitals remain shut

Around 12,000 private hospitals and nursing homes in the state, including 400 private hospitals in Bhopal, suspended OPD services as a mark of protest against the rape and murder of trainee doctor at RG Kar Medical College, Kolkata.

The OPD services were suspended in solidarity with the junior doctors, who are on the strike the Kolkata incident.

In Bhopal, Adhikari Ghose of Kasturba Nagar, who went for a dental problem to a private dentist, was suggested to come on Sunday afternoon.

Similarly, Manoj visited a private hospital with fever, but he was refused treatment and suggested to come on Sunday.

At Chirayu Hospital, students took out a rally. AIIMS doctors took out a rally on Hoshangabad Road, demanding Central Protection Act.

private hospitals in Bhopal. All of them suspended regular OPDs and it will continue till Sunday morning. Only emergency services are being carried on."

Stating that emergency services cannot be denied, Dr Sanjay Gupta, general secretary Bhopal Nursing Homes, said, "The emergency services were being carried out. We have not diagnosed even single patients in protest."

Dr Rakesh Malviya, convenor of Shashikya and Swashashi Chikisak Mahasangh, said, "We want Central Protection Act. We want our safety after the Kolkata incident. We are not simply agitating but also carrying on emergency services."

Private doctors take out rally, stage sit-in

Rising protest over Kolkata incident

In protest against the incident of rape-murder of a doctor that took place in Kolkata, a rally was taken out followed by a sit-in demonstration here on Saturday on the Indian Medical Association (IMA)'s call. As a mark of protest, all medical institutions in the city remained closed for 24 hours, with only emergency services operational.

The call for the shutdown was supported by the Ujjain

Nursing Home Association, FOGSI, AYUSH Medical Association, Physiotherapy Association, Medical Representatives Association, Homeopathy and Electro-Homoeopathy Association, PG Students Organization, Nursing Association and many other social organizations. Initially, a large rally was taken out starting from the Tower Chowk, passing through Shaheed Park and ending at the Tower. After the rally, the speakers shared their thoughts.

Prominently Dr Vijay Agarwal, president of IMA, Dr Samrat Ghosh, secretary, Dr Katyayan Mishra, president of the Nursing Home Association, Dr SK Nagar, Dr Satinder Kaur Saluja, Dr Jaya Mishra, Dr SK Gupta, Dr Anshu Ghosh, Dr Anuradha Pancholi, Dr Rajendra Bansal, Dr Manju Rathi and several other speakers addressed the gathering. All the participants in the rally raised slogans against the Mamata Banerjee government of Bengal.

Youth dies of accidental strangulation

A 23-year-old youth died due to accidental strangulation after he tightened a noose to scare his mother to demand money under Hira Nagar police station circle on Friday. He was addicted to drugs and took his own life by hanging himself after his mother refused to give him money for drugs.

According to the police, the deceased has been identified as Ayush, son of Ajay, a resident of Gauri Nagar. Ayush had been demanding money from his mother to buy drugs. His mother, who runs a small shop refused to give him money. Ayush's father had passed away four years ago. Since then, Ayush had become addicted to a drug. He would frequently pressure his mother for money, often threatening that he would kill himself if she didn't comply. His mother initially thought these were mere threats.

On Friday, Ayush once again demanded money for drugs and his mother refused, saying that she wouldn't support his addiction. In response, Ayush went to his room and initially tightened the noose intended to scare his mother but he died due to accidental strangulation. When his mother returned home, she found him hanging.

Gohar said that from the Scheduled Caste reservation given by the Supreme Court on August 1, the state government in the country can do the work of giving representation by classification. Govt cancels circular providing jobs to those giving info on dacoits

The state government recently decided to cancel the circular of 1981 meant to provide appointment facility in government service to informers, who used to give input about dreaded dacoits carrying cash reward of Rs 1,000 or more.

A senior officer of the General Administration Department (GAD) told Free Press that the circular was cancelled as it is no longer relevant in today's circumstances. According to the circular the government had decided to give appointment in government service (conditional) to those informers who helps in

the arrest of dreaded dacoits or gives correct information to police and helps in elimination of dacoit gangs. Such appointments will be made on lower grade clerk posts or posts equivalent to it. Apart from this, such appointments will be done on class four category posts to be filled through direct posting.

Autopsy performed at night at Mhow Civil Hospital

A post-mortem examination was conducted on the body of Dharmendra Mishra, a resident of Dharamkunj Colony in Sagore Kurl area near Pithampur, at the Mhow Civil Hospital on Friday night.

The autopsy was performed by a team of doctors, including Dr HR Verma, Dr Ved Kumari Arya and Dr Mohan Chohan, in the presence of two execu-

utive magistrates, Mhow SDM CS Hooda and Tehsildar Vivek Soni.

and senior officials of the health department have been informed of the autopsy results.

Meanwhile, Dharmendra's family received his body on Saturday afternoon after completing the necessary formalities at the hospital.

The incident has sparked panic among patients who received the same intravenous fluid, prompting their families to rush them out of the hospital without proper documentation. The hospital authorities are taking steps to address the concerns and ensure the safety of patients.

State biggest victim of lightning strikes

Madhya Pradesh is the biggest victim of lightning hazard. The state continues to be at the top with the highest lightning strikes (count 6,55,788) in 2021-22 and highest reported deaths (496) in 2021 and 2022. Mostly, the casualties are from rural areas, mainly of farmers, cattle grazers, fishermen,

tribals and labourers working in the open.

This was the crux of the policy brief 2024 on Strengthening State Preparedness for Disaster Risk Management prepared by the Rajya NITI Aayog.

The report said in comparison to other hazards like floods, lightning and cold exposure, highlighting has claimed the maximum lives. In 2022, 15 people died due to

flood, 27 due to heat stroke, 24 due to cold exposure and 496 due to lightning. As many as 496 people died due to lightning in 2021, 429 in 2020, 400 in 2019, 381 in 2018 and 452 in 2017.

The report further stated that the state lies in the heat-wave zone. Average number of severe heatwave and heatwave days reported in the last five years (2018-22) were 7, 13, 2, 1, 13, respectively.

There is a marked reduction in mortality between human mortality and thermal stress caused due to such events. Districts like Chattarpur and Ratlam have experienced temperatures as high as 48 degrees Celsius (in 2002) and 45.5 degrees Celsius (in 2023).

During 2022, extreme temperatures in Datia, Morena and Tikamgarh districts resulted in early maturity and lower grain weight of wheat and chickpea.

Severe flower and fruit drop, reduction of fruit size was observed in mango in Tikamgarh district.

The state is also vulnerable to other hazards like cold waves, hailstorm, industrial and fire accidents etc. The report concludes with the remark that the disaster risk landscape of the state might not be very strong as compared to other few states. But

given the nature of disasters and impact of climate change, the frequency and intensity of hazards has been increasing.

Hazards like flooding, extreme weather events, fire incidents have increased. This gives a strong reason to strengthen the preparedness of the state, from community level to institutional level to deal effectively with any disaster in future.
