Extension of SCLR to open in Jan 2025

The much-anticipated Santacruz Chembur Link Road (SCLR) extension project is in its final stages, with just 100 meters of suspension span awaiting installation. This segment, part of a cable-stayed bridge, is on track to be completed once the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) secures necessary traffic permissions for two scheduled blocks, sources said. The phased installation will align with the bridge's curved design, followed by suspension cables and road surfacing.

4.2km extension was first slated for a 2019 completion but faced many delays due to land acquisition issues

The 4.2 kilometer SCLR extension, which began construction in 2016, was initially slated for a 2019 completion but faced delays due to land acquisition issues, particularly with defence land. The BMC recently cleared a Rs16 crore payment to defence authorities, a crucial step in finalising the project.

Stretching from Kapadia Nagar to Panbai International School, the extension connects key points, including Vakola Junction, Ambedkar Chowk, University Junction, and BKC Junction. This new route is expected to significantly ease traffic flow between Kurla and Vakola, enhancing connectivity across Mumbai's bustling corridors. With approvals in place, the final stretch is set to open to the public on January 1, 2025.

VERSOVA SEAT | Opp voices dissatisfaction citing stalled projects & congestion

Bharati Lavekar faces a tough competition amid infra woes

The Versova Vidhan Sabha constituency is located in Mumbai Suburban district and is part of the Mumbai North West Lok Sabha constituency. Bharati Lavekar, 58, served as a BJP MLA for two consecutive terms and has now been nominated for a third. With 2.82 lakh voters, Versova covers areas including Seven Bungalows, Yari Road, Versova, Lokhandwala, Oshiwara, Veera Desai Road, and parts of Jogeshwari (West). It is a cosmopolitan area, with a significant minority and North Indian population, and includes the Koli community.

Versova was established during the 2008 delimitation of the Vile Parle constituency. It includes portions of the former Vile Parle and Amboli constituencies. In 2009, Congress candidate Baldev Khosa was elected, but the seat shifted to the BJP in 2014 when Lavekar was elected. In 2019, Lavekar secured 41,057 votes, defeating Congress candidate Baldev Khosa by 5,186 votes.

Lavekar, a PhD holder, received the 'Ahilyabai Holkar' award from the Maharashtra government in 2000-2001, and the 'Maharashtra Ratna' award in 2005 for her distinguished

social work. She was one of two Indians selected by the American government to study the legislative elections in the US in 2006.

According to a report by the Praja Foundation, which assesses the performance of elected representatives, Lavekar ranked 14th overall and maintained a clean criminal record with top attendance. However, she ranked 16th in terms of the quantity

and quality of questions raised in the assembly.

Versova faces several unresolved issues. The long-awaited Versova-Madh bridge has been planned for 35 years, yet construction has not begun, with estimated costs rising from Rs400 crore to Rs4,000 crore. Line 6 of the metro project has completed 80% of its civil work, but the construction of the yard remains stalled. Other pending projects include a post office near Taraporewala Tower (planned since 1990) and a fire brigade station at Chitrakoot Grounds, reserved in the 1991 development plan but not yet built.

Dhaval Shah, director of the Andheri Lokhandwala Oshiwara Citizens Organisation, stated, "Road and bridge delays contribute to significant traffic congestion in the constituency. The Oshiwara River bridge project, started in 2018, remains incomplete. The Thackeray flyover extension has faced delays near Country Club, and the Yari Road to SVP Nagar flyover has been in the works for decades. The Mrinal Tai flyover extension is delayed by three years, and

the Versova-Bandra Sea Link project has been delayed by four years, leading to cost escalation and high tolls for citizens."

Predicting the outcome in this constituency is challenging. Political experts say that in the recent Lok Sabha election, Versova gave a lead of 21,000 votes to the Maha Vikas Aghadi candidate. People are dissatisfied with Lavekar's work, which could negatively impact BJP's votes. "The party declared my name late because it took time to decide who would receive this seat among the Mahayuti allies," Lavekar said. "My party informed me much earlier to start working. Over the last 10 years, I have completed several major projects. The Savitribai Phule garden, a playground, a bridge work completed and the Versova-Madh bridge tender has been issued. A modern jetty worth Rs. 400 crore has been approved, which will benefit the Koli community."

"The Oshiwara maternity hospital is under construction, and nine metro stations in the Versova area, along with the coastal road, are also

being developed. The Versova-Bandra Sea Link project is 26% complete," she added. Versova has 1.1 lakh minority voters. To counter the BJP and the AIMIM, Uddhav Thackeray has nominated a loyal Shiv Sena (UBT) member, Haroon Khan, as candidate. Khan stated, "Voters should not think of me as just a Muslim candidate. I want to work for every community and focus on developmental work. In our constituency, several infrastructure projects, such as resolving issues on the JVLR, metro works, and pending SRA projects, are overdue. Good schools and playgrounds are needed in our constituency. This fight is between the BJP and the MVA."

Raju Pednekar from the UBT has rebelled and filed as an independent. There is talk that Shiv Sainiks, along with other aspirants from the constituency, are upset because Thackeray has nominated Khan. MNS has announced Sandesh Desai as its candidate, and the AIMIM has fielded Raiees Lashkaria. Lashkaria stated, "In Versova, not a single infrastructure project has been completed in the past 10 years. This reflects a total failure on the part of the BJP MLA. Both the central and state governments have failed to address infrastructure needs in our area. With 40% of the constituency being from minority communities, I see a strong chance for the AIMIM to win this seat."

Desai said, "In our constituency, the Koliwadas' FSI (floor space index) and boundary issues are major concerns. The MLA has made promises but has not delivered any results."

FIR against son of bizman for killing dog

The primary suspect in the October 17 incident that led to the fatal injury of a dog 'Sheru' outside Samar Heights in Antop Hill, Wadala, has been identified as Nilesh Jain, according to police sources. Jain, reportedly aged between 26 and 30, is the son of a wealthy businessman and resides close to the spot where Sheru died.

Although the accused's identity is widely known among police officers and residents of Samar Heights, the FIR registered at Antop Hill police station lists him as 'unknown'.

On the day of the incident, Jain and five friends, all residents of Samar Heights, were smoking in the building's parking lot. "The incident occurred in the evening," a police officer stated. "According to eyewitnesses, one of the boys' father saw them loitering and asked them to disperse immediately. They may have panicked prompting Jain to start his car hastily to leave the premises. In his rush, he reportedly struck the building's car lift and one of the pillars in the parking lot before reaching the main exit," the police officer added. Sheru, the dog, was reportedly sleeping near the gate of the building. "The accused then ran over the dog with his car, dragging Sheru until the dog managed to free itself from under the wheels," the officer added.

Ramsuresh Yadav, the building's security guard, witnessed the entire incident. He recounted that the dog howled in pain as the accused continued to drive without stopping, dragging the dog along. CCTV footage reportedly shows the dog screaming in pain, and after it was released from under the vehicle, it collapsed on the road, unable to stand. Yadav informed society treasurer Vivek Bhattacharge, who is also the complainant in the FIR. Bhattacharge and other residents rushed the dog to a hospital in Parel, where it was treated between October 18 and 24. Despite doctors' efforts, Sheru succumbed to

his injuries due to a crushed spine and other fatal wounds. Residents covered Sheru's Rs45,000 medical expenses and performed his final rites on Thursday after the police registered an FIR against Jain for the dog's death.

However, the police are yet to question Jain and are continuing their investigation. Police sources indicated that a legal notice will be issued to Jain, requiring his cooperation. Once statements from the accused and eyewitnesses are recorded, the police will draft a chargesheet to be submitted to the court.

Interestingly, sources revealed that the case has been transferred three times, leading to frequent changes in the investigating officer. Although the incident occurred on October 17 and came to light on October 18, the police initially declined registering an FIR. When residents and complainants from Samar Heights approached an IPS officer, she cited a 2023 Bombay High Court judgment stating that "dogs and cats are not humans, hence hit-and-run sections cannot apply to non-humans." However, after legal intervention by Roshan Pathak, a member of the NGO PAL, who highlighted the "intent" behind Sheru's case, the police agreed to press charges against the accused, whose father is reportedly in the gold business.

₹17L seized from car amid MCC in state

The flying squad in Ulhanagar seized Rs17 lakh cash on Thursday early morning amid the model code of conduct in force in Maharashtra since October 15 for the November 20 assembly polls, an official said. The cash was seized from the Innova car's one occupant, who was heading towards Murbad from Thane on Ulhasnagar-Shahad road during a nakabandi, the official added. "A probe into the source of the cash and other details is underway," said another official. The squad alerted the police and income tax department to conduct a further investigation.

Vishnu Tamhane, senior police inspector said, "According to the owner of the car, he provided information that he was carrying cash for distribution to labourers. However, further investigation is being carried out by the Income Tax department."

On October 30, the Kasara police seized Rs2 crore cash from the car's two occupants on Mumbai-Nasik road near Kasara ghat, Shahapur taluka, near Chintamani police chowki, during a police naka-bandi.

Man dies by suicide, case filed against 3

The Kurar police have registered an FIR against the owner and manager of Hathway Saistar Cable, along with a Tata employee, for allegedly abetting the suicide of a 22-year-old man who was found hanged in Malad East. However, the police did not immediately confirm why was the victim being threatened and their past connection. "The investigation is underway to more in the case," said a police officer.

The accused - Sadanand Kadam (firm owner), Paresht Shetty (manager), and Deepak Vishwakarma (Tata employee) - are implicated in the death of Chandrashekhar Tiwari. Tiwari reportedly hanged himself from an iron hook in his ceiling. His brother later filed a complaint, prompting the police to register a case against the three on November 1. According to the FIR, Tiwari, who lived in Shivaji Nagar, Malad East, with his mother and elder brother, had recently switched jobs from Tata Play to Airtel as a senior sales executive. Following his departure, Kadam, Shetty,

and Vishwakarma allegedly threatened him, saying they would prevent him from working anywhere in Mumbai over an unresolved dispute.

Tiwari's mother and brother left for their native place in Uttar Pradesh on October 22, leaving him alone in Mumbai. On October 30, his brother Pawan tried reaching him by phone but received no response. Pawan then asked their maternal uncle, Santosh Shukla, to check on him.

Shukla and his son arrived at Tiwari's residence and, after receiving no response, forced the door open with neighbours' help. They found Tiwari hanging and rushed him to Shatabdi Hospital, where he was pronounced dead at 2pm.

The family later discovered a video Tiwari posted on Instagram around, where he named all three accused and explained he felt threatened by Vishwakarma, who allegedly said he would block Tiwari from working anywhere in Mumbai. Tiwari thanked his friends, apologised to his family, and described feeling unable to continue due to years of distress.

Biker dies in collision with pickup van

A delivery man died after his two-wheeler collided with a pickup van near the Ghanoli Dargah in Sector 2 on Wednesday. The deceased, Faizan Irshad Qureshi, 30, had left his residence in

Koparkhairane and was riding a scooty (registration number MH 43 BV 2630) towards Ghanoli station.

At the same time, the accused, Mohammad Shamim Mohammad Istaj Ansari, 27, was driving his pickup van (MH 43 BP 8517) from Ghanoli railway station. "The

deceased had just arrived at the Kokan Fusion Hotel when the pickup van came at full speed from the opposite direction and rammed into his vehicle," said a police officer. The rider suffered serious injuries and was rushed to the hospital but succumbed upon arrival.

Man killed over bursting of crackers; 5 arrested

The Antop Hill police have arrested five persons for killing a 22-year-old man in the Sion Koliwada area early Friday morning. According to the police, the incident occurred around 12.30am in Maharashtra Nagar. The victim, Vivek Gupta, along with his friends, was bursting crackers in the narrow lane when one of the accused allegedly asked him to move the activity to a more secluded area. This led to an altercation, initially involving a few persons but soon escalating as more people joined in.

"It began as a verbal dispute that seemed to end quickly," said a police officer. "However, one of the accused returned with his wife, brother, and a weapon, which was used to stab Gupta. After the stabbing, everyone fled. Police reached the spot and rushed the victim to Sion Hospital. At around 3.30am, Gupta was declared dead."

The accused Karthik R Mohan Devendra, his wife, Karthik Kumar Devendra, Vicky Muthu Devendra, and Miniappan Ravi Devendra. They have been charged with murder, unlawful assembly while armed with a deadly weapon, rioting, criminal intimidation, and intentional insult with intent to provoke a breach of peace under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.
