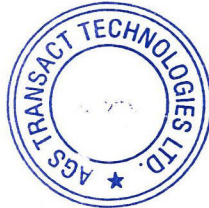

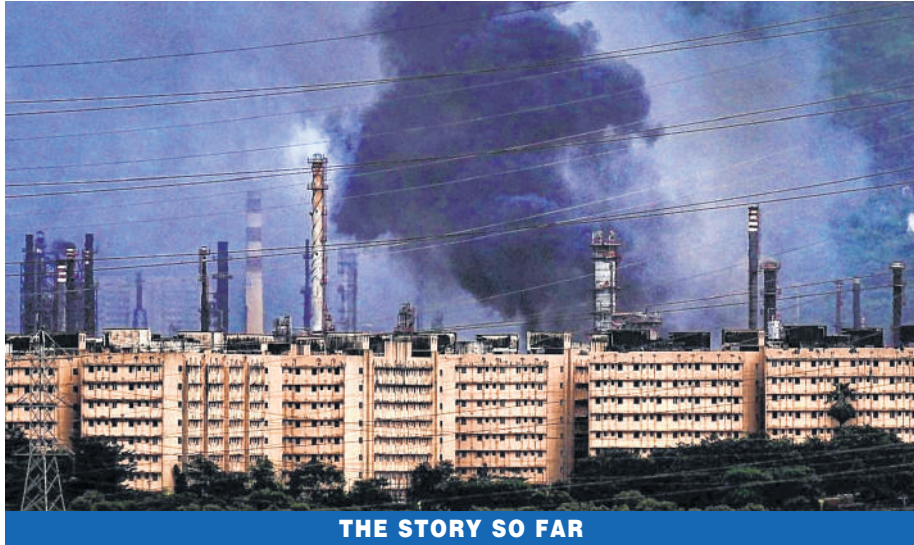

THE STORY SO FAR

2013

The Environment Pollution Research Centre of KEM Hospital, Parel, conducts a respiratory mortality study in Mahul and finds that two out of every three persons have respiratory problems at least three days a month. The study finds higher than average rates for asthma.

2018

IIT-Bombay, does a study on the infrastructure in the resettlement colony. The study, commissioned by Maharashtra's Urban Development Department, as directed by Bombay HC, finds air pollution, sewage issues and water contamination in the area.

2019

The Bombay High Court asks BMC to stop sending homeless families to Mahul and to provide homes outside Mahul to people already living there. If the BMC does not have tenements to put up the families, the civic body is to pay rent to the families so that they can find their own accommodation.

2020

The National Green Tribunal imposes a fine of Rs286 crore on four companies in the Mahul area for releasing Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs - a group of aerosols that can have adverse health effects on humans) in the air at Mahul and neighbouring Ambapada villages.

buildings with over 17,000 families. In 2009 the high court had ordered the BMC to demolish slums along the Tansa water pipeline. The slums were a hygiene and security threat to the city's water pipes, the court had said. The families from the slums demolished along the pipeline were moved to Mahul. In 2019, the court stopped resettlement at the tenements after studies

showed the area was highly polluted. Civic activists said that the entire Mahul resettlement area, and not just one locality as claimed by the BMC, is unfit for habitation. "I have visited the area twice. The buildings are built so close that some tenements do not get sunlight at all. There is a residue of oil in the air and there is a film of oil on water stored in drums," said lawyer

Godfrey Pimenta of the citizens' group Watchdog Foundation. "The decision to shift the slum dwellers to Mahul is totally contradictory to the Bombay High Court order," Pimenta said. The Mahul resettlement colonies are located in the middle of a large industrial complex that has two oil refineries, a power plant, a fertiliser company and other factories.

Lack of CCTV footage hindering police investigation into cases

Lack of closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras or faulty cameras are hampering police investigations. In two recent incidents - one in which a man disappeared near Jogeshwari-Vikhroli Link Road (JVLR) and the other in which a Class 11 student died in a hit-and-run incident on Wadala Bridge - unavailability of footage has hit the probe.

In the second case, there is no trace of the motorcyclist who knocked down the girl, who was then run over by a truck. In the first incident, which is being investigated by the Bhandup police, a man, identified as Harsh Arora, 43, left home for a walk on the morning of October 30. According to the police, Arora was seen walking towards Airoli via Fortis Hospital in Mulund. He proceeds towards the junction at JVLR, going towards Bhandup Village on the service road. Arora then disappears.

The CCTV cameras in the vicinity do not work, and it is very hard to establish where Arora went, a police source said, adding that it is the municipality's responsibility to maintain the cameras. "There are always some CCTV's that are not functioning. It's not like we haven't alerted the civic body. When they do repair the damaged

one, another one malfunctions, leaving blind spots," said the source. Arora's family members have questioned the negligent situation at two of the city's longest highways - Eastern Express Highway and JVLR. The police, on the other hand, blame the civic body, or in some cases, the Mumbai Metropolitan Re-

gion Development Authority. Riya Gupta, 19, who died on October 30, was returning home from her college via the Wadala Bridge. Gupta was trying to cross the road when a speeding Enfield Bullet struck her, causing her to fall in the middle of the road. In no seconds, a BEST bus ran over her, with its rear tyre killing her instantly. Although the bus driver did not even realise what had happened, he halted the vehicle and waited. The motorcyclist, however, fled. The Matunga police, who are investigating the case, are yet to trace the motorcyclist. According to them, the place where the incident took place is a blind spot. There is one camera at the start of the bridge. Footage from that camera shows a Bullet among numerous vehicles, but its licence plate is not discernible. The police are currently checking the cameras at other locations adjoining the bridge, another source said.

Man held for duping home-buyers of ₹30 crore

More than five years after evading arrested, the director of a construction company who along with his accomplices duped nearly 150 investors and home-seekers in the coastal area of Arnala near Virar to the tune more than Rs30 crore was finally arrested by the Crime Branch Unit (Zone III) attached to the Mira Bhayandar-Vasari Virar (MBVV) police.

The accused, Raju Siddhya Sulire, 54, was apprehended by a team led by Inspector Pramod Badhaakh and Sub Inspector Umesh Bhagwat from Kengeri area of Bengaluru. According to the police, the accused and his accomplices floated several construction companies, including Mandar Housing Private Limited, and offered cheap flats to gullible homebuyers and investment opportunities

to investors by showcasing a couple of their completed buildings between 2001 to 2018. However, after accepting the money, the accused failed to hand over possessions. They also sold the same flats to multiple buyers by registering the properties using fake documents. A complaint against seven people including Sulire was registered against the accused under the relevant sections of the IPC for cheating

and criminal conspiracy along with the provisions of the Maharashtra Protection of Interest of Depositors Act, 1999 in May 2018. Some of his accomplices had been arrested earlier, while others managed to procure anticipator bail from the court, an official said. However, Sulire, whose bail application was rejected by the Supreme Court last year, was absconding and kept changing his locations to avoid arrest.

Police arrest 2 more artistes who starred in Urfi video

Oshiwara police on Saturday arrested two more artistes who appeared in a video depicting social media influencer Urfi Javed's "arrest". Earlier in the day the police had served a 41A CrPC (Code of Criminal Procedure) notice to the two women - Vijayalakshmi Vinodkumar Dubey, 33, and Ritu Rupesh Yadav, 35 - who played the role of constables in the video.

On Friday, the police had served a 41A CrPC (Notice of appearance before police officer) notice to Ganpatibhai Sawajibhai Makwana, who had played the role of a police officer, and arrested him.

"Both female accused came to the Oshiwara police station after receiving the notice," Senior Inspector Manoj Patil said. "They are junior artistes, and Urfi's team had approached them, offering Rs1,000 each for their acting services. We are investigating the source of the police uniforms and insignia they used." Meanwhile, Javed, who has been booked for cheating and defamation, has left the country. The police contacted her manager, who told them she was abroad. Senior Inspector Mohan Patil said: "We contacted Urfi's manager and confirmed that she is outside India. We will serve her a notice once she returns." Javed could not be contacted. Krishnakant Upadhyay, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Zone 9 said, "Three individuals have served notice and arrested. The police have tried contacting Urfi but she is not available."
