Elephants have been a part of human society for thousands of years

World Elephant Day has been created to bring the world together to help elephants. Elephants are among the most intelligent of the creatures with whom we share the planet, with complex consciousness that are capable of strong emotions. Across Africa they have inspired respect from the people that share the landscape with them, giving them a strong cultural significance. India is one of the seventeen megadiverse countries of the world. Elephants have enjoyed a special place in India's culture and tradition. They were used as a means of transport for the royalties and to fight battles, as has been captured by various frescoes. Most important, however, is the status of the elephant as a deity in the form of Lord Ganesha. For over 70% of the population, elephants hold religious importance. It is disappointing to learn that today only about 27,000 wild elephants remain in India, as

opposed to a million a decade ago as indicated by research. Human-elephant conflict is a major conservation concern in elephant range countries. A variety of management strategies have been developed and are practiced at different scales for preventing and mitigating human-elephant conflict. The elephant population has been declining for decades. This is due to several factors, such as habitat loss, human conflict, and hunting. Elephants are considered to be the most intelligent of all animals after humans. They are very social creatures that live in herds led by a 'matriarch'. The leading female of the herd is called the 'matriarch'. They help maintain the health of the herd by distributing seeds by roaming over great distances.

Elephants have been a part of human society for thousands of years. Humans have been both aiding and hurting elephants for centuries. In many stories, humans and elephants live in harmony as friends. Humans have always taken advantage of the incredible strength and endurance of elephants. Elephants are necessary for the survival of forest ecosystems, and indeed, many creatures. Asian elephant numbers have dropped by at least 50% over the last three generations, and they're still in decline today. With only 40,000-50,000 left in the wild, the species is classified as endangered. An



elephant is killed every 15 minutes and now some believe that in 12 years the elephant population will be extinct. Poachers kill about 20,000 elephants every single year for their tusks, which are then traded illegally in the international market to eventually end up as ivory trinkets. This trade is mostly driven by demand for ivory in parts of Asia.

The poaching trade began in earnest in 1971, when a severe drought killed 9,000 elephants in a Kenyan game reserve. Neighbours of the park moved in to collect ivory. In recent years, the number of elephant killings due to poaching has decreased, largely due to the worldwide ban (since 1990) on the trade of ivory. However, the illegal trade continues, and as long as it does, poachers will be a part of it. Today, witnessing a herd of elephants is becoming increasingly uncommon; as more and more elephants die prematurely every year. The illegal trade in ivory is one of the greatest threats to elephants today.

Elephants are long-lived animals, and their survival depends upon regular migration over large distances to search for food, water, and social and reproductive partners. Too many elephants are getting killed in conflicts with humans! We simply cannot allow them to disappear from the face of this earth. Without the proper conservation of elephant survival we will see a drastic shift in the environment. Today as our physical world is changing fast, it is important to take a moment to reflect on and reinvent our relationship with elephants. Gujarat government preparing to enact new impact fee law

GANDHINAGAR: With just a few months left for the state assembly elections, the Gujarat government plans to come out with a law to legalize several buildings that are yet to be given building use (BU) permission. The law, which is being referred to as an impact fee law, follows the Gujarat Regularization of Unauthorised Development

Act 2011 under which illegal construction could be legalized by paying a fee. This Act was introduced for a short period and then saw several amendments. The process was considered a failure as many people still do not have BU permission. One of the salient features of the new law will be that properties that have 20% to

30% parking violations will be allowed to apply for legalization unless there is an objection from neighbouring dwellers. "The idea is that an illegal construction should not be a public nuisance. An onsite inspection will be carried out too," says a senior urban development department official. Also, dwellings which violate up to 20% margin space will be allowed to apply under the new law. The new impact fee law draft is likely to be tabled in the state assembly during the monsoon session in September. A crucial aspect of the law is that the community or residential society will have to agree for legalizing the illegal construction. It is worth noting that after a three-month sample survey of 8,320 buildings - residential, commercial, highrises, and special category buildings such as hospitals across the state, the urban development department had concluded that almost 35% of the

surveyed structures were without building use (BU) permissions.

Four in-laws booked as woman commits suicide

AHMEDABAD: Satellite police on Monday booked four persons including three women from Ghuma for allegedly forcing their daughter-in-law, 21, a resident of Sarkhej, to commit suicide. According to the police, Krishna Thakor had on January 18 jumped off the Iskcon flyover to commit suicide. She was rushed to Asarva Civil Hospital where she slipped into a coma on February 25 and died on March 12. Krishna's brother, Fenil Thakor, stated in his FIR that Krishna had married Akash Chavda from Ghuma on February 1, 2020.

Four months after their wedding, her father-in-law Dashrath Chavda, mother-in-law Sami Chavda, and her sisters-in-law Shradha and Jasi began harassing Krishna.
