This is to inform you that the Board of Directors of the Company at its meeting held today i.e., May 9, 2025, inter-alia approved the following:

1. Audited Financial Results:

Audited Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025, were discussed and approved. We enclose herewith the Audited Financial Results of the Company, along with the Auditors' Report thereupon.

We hereby declare that the Statutory Auditor of the Company, M/s. N. M. Raiji & Co., Chartered Accountants, Mumbai (Registration No. 108296W) have issued the Audit Report for the Audited Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025 with an unmodified opinion.

2. Dividend for the financial year 2024-25

Report on the audit of Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Financial Results ("the Statement") of ALKYL AMINES CHEMICALS LIMITED ("the Company") for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company, pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- a. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- b. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the Statement in accordance with the Standards on Auditing, specified under section 143(10) of the Act (SAs). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Results section of our report. We are independent of the Company, in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI), together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial results under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, and the Rules made thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial results.

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these financial results, that give a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information, in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards, prescribed under Section 133 of the Act, read with relevant rules issued thereunder, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial results, the Board of Directors is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting, unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

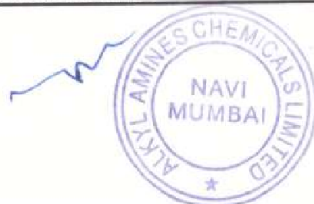
