Political map redrawn across key states

HIGH-STAKES ASSEMBLY POLLS MARK A DEFINING SHIFT IN INDIA'S POLITICAL LANDSCAPE

First disruption since MGR: How Vijay caught imagination of voters

IN A RESULT that has already rewritten Tamil Nadu's political grammar, actor-politician Vijay's Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) was leading or had won in 109 seats by Monday evening, ahead of the DMK (73) and AIADMK (52), even as Chief Minister MK Stalin lost his Kolathur constituency by 9,121 votes to TVK's VS Babu — marking a rare instance of a sitting Chief Minister being unseated on home turf.

In essence, Tamil Nadu is witnessing the rise of its first truly new political force in five decades — not a faction, not a breakaway, not a rearrangement of the familiar Dravidian order, but something closer to a disruption of it. The last time this happened at scale was when MG Ramachandran walked out of the DMK and converted cinematic devotion into political power.

That moment itself had roots in an older design: CN Annadurai and the DMK had already spent decades turning theatre and cinema into instruments of mass political communication, building a system where the screen spoke politics fluently. Vijay has now entered that system — but without growing inside it. And that is what makes this moment different.

If Kerala's poll results were

shaped by visible anti-incumbency and distress, Tamil Nadu's mood appears to have moved along a different axis: a silent craving for a new face after half a century of familiar political inheritances, combined with a deep, if often unspoken, contempt toward what the ruling establishment and the public knowledge about the corruption, is seen by critics to have become — insular, dynastic and, at times, politically complacent.

A different kind of political entry

Tamil Nadu has always had film stars in politics. But they followed a pattern. Annadurai and Karunanidhi used cinema to build ideology. MGR used that ideological base to build a party. Jayalitha inherited and consolidated that structure. Even later entrants operated within or against that grammar.

Vijay's rise is not built on ideological training or long political apprenticeship. It is built on a direct, almost unmediated relationship with his audience — one that has now split into the political domain. This is not cadre politics. It is character politics. Vijay supporters do not always speak the language of policy or ideology. They speak the language of familiarity — of films, of dialogue, of a man they have watched for decades.

Modi: Lotus blooming from Gangotri to Gangasagar

PRIME MINISTER NARENDRA Modi on Monday said the lotus is now blooming from Gangotri to Gangasagar with the BJP's historic victory in West Bengal and asked all parties to work for change, not revenge, and ensure that the state's future trumps over fear. Addressing BJP workers at the party headquarters after the win in assembly elections in Bengal, Assam and Puducherry, Modi said it was a special day in many ways as it heralds a bright future for the country.

"It is a day of trust in the great democracy of India, trust in the politics of performance, trust in the resolve of stability, trust in the spirit of *Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat*. I bow before the people of Bengal, Assam, Puducherry,

Tamil Nadu and Kerala," he said at the victory celebration event where BJP President Nitin Nabin, Union ministers Amit Shah and Rajnath Singh, among others, were present.

Modi said on November 14 last year, when the Bihar election results came in, he told the BJP workers from this very spot that the Ganga flows onward from Bihar all the way to Ganga Sagar (in West Bengal).

"And today, with victory in West Bengal, from Gangotri (Uttarakhand) to Ganga Sagar (West Bengal), it is nothing but the lotus in full bloom. Uttarakhand, UP, Bihar, and Bengal today, in these states surrounding Mother Ganga, there are BJP-NDA governments," he said. PTI

THE BJP'S DECISIVE victory in West Bengal, ending 15 years of Mamata Banerjee's rule, was emphatic in its spread across the state. If the party held on to its bastion in North Bengal, it made inroads into South Bengal, including the Presidency division which was so far the TMC's impregnable fortress.

The BJP also regained its dominance in the tribal belt of Junglemahal, changing its messaging as per the issues of the three regions. South Bengal: 240 seats; voted in Phase-2

This region comprises the

Presidency division, including Kolkata, Howrah, Nadia, North and South 24 Parganas, which has long been considered a TMC stronghold. It is also the state's power centre with five CMs of the state winning from this region, including the CPI(M)'s Jyoti Basu, his successor Buddhadeb Bhattacharya and now Mamata (Bhabanipur).

This time, three key factors were at play in the region, comprising semi-urban and urban areas, against the TMC: huge anti-incumbency, Hindu vote consolidation, and anger at the party's "goondagiri". The BJP reaped the gains of all.

So, in the Presidency division, the BJP is poised to win 27

seats. These include 6 of 11 in Kolkata (Rashbehari, Maniktala, Jorasanko, Chowringhee, Kashipur-Belgachia and Shyampur), with the remaining 5 set to go to the TMC (Bhabanipur, Kolkata Port, Ballygunge, Belegata and Entally). Bhabanipur is Mamata's constituency and, after 14 out of 20 rounds of counting and much see-sawing, she was holding on by the skin of her teeth against bete noire Suvendu Adhikari of the BJP.

In North 24 Parganas, the BJP is on course to win 18 seats, compared to TMC's 15.

Several TMC ministers: Sashi Panja, Chandrima Bhattacharya, Aroop Biswas and Bratya Basu trailed in Kolkata.

Congress-led UDF ends Pinarayi's 10-year run

KERALA ON MONDAY witnessed a sharp political reset as the state electors voted out the last Left government in the country, bringing back the Congress to the ruling saddle after a gap of 10 years, while the BJP broke through a long-standing electoral drought by winning three seats.

The Congress-led UDF swept aside a decade of Left rule under Pinarayi Vijayan with a decisive Assembly victory, with the national party adding the third



southern state to be ruled by it, in its kitty. The party is in power in Karnataka and Telangana.

Apart from strong anti-incumbency against the government, the results of the April 9 polls also indicated a consolidation of support across sections of society in favour of the United Democratic Front, which had been in opposition to the Left dispensation for the past decade. The UDF won 102 seats, while the CPI(M)-headed LDF netted 35 seats, according to Election Commission data on counting of votes for 140 constituencies.

The outcome also marked the absence of the Left from governance in any Indian state for the first time in five decades. —PTI

Assam: BJP scores a hat-trick

THE BJP-LED NDA'S return to power in Assam for a third consecutive term with a massive mandate has reinforced the state as the party's strongest base in the Northeast and validated Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma's governance model.

The NDA has won or is leading in 102 of the 126 Assembly seats, comfortably crossing the majority mark of 64. The BJP alone won 81 seats and was leading in one more constituency.

BJP's allies, the Bodoland People's Front (BPF) and Asom Gana Parishad (AGP) have 10 seats each, according to Election Commission data.

This is for the first time since

Independence that an alliance bagged more than 100 seats, or a single party other than the Congress secured an absolute majority on its own.

All other earlier non-Congress governments, including the two BJP Regimes of 2016 and

2021, did not have any party getting the majority mark single-handedly.

The mandate is significant in the national context as the victory strengthened the BJP's narrative of state-level dominance ahead of their 2026 polls and the 2029 Lok Sabha cycle.

The BJP's spectacular show in West Bengal and retention of Assam sent a clear signal of the party tightening its pan-India grip.

With the latest results for the five states that went to the polls, the BJP-led NDA will be governing 21 of 31 states and UTs.

Commenting on the performance, Assam BJP social media in-charge Ranjib Kumar Samah told PTI that the assembly results have strengthened Modi's hands.
