## Shiv Sena (UBT) accuses BJP of trying to set up 'laboratory of riots' in Maha

MUMBAI, MAY 17 /--/ The Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (UBT) on Wednesday accused the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of trying to set up a "laboratory of riots" in Maharashtra to disturb social peace and polarise voters.

May be they want to fight elections by dividing the society, just like they "broke the Shiv Sena" to form government in Maharashtra, an editorial in the Shiv Sena (UBT) mouth-piece 'Saamana' said referring to the split in the Sena last year following which

Eknath Shinde became the CM with the BJP's support. The people of the state need to be alert as they are surrounded by those who crave for power by side-stepping the Constitution, national unity and religious coexistence, the Marathi publication claimed. Maharashtra witnessed communal clashes on Saturday and Sunday in Akola city and Shevgaon village in Ahmednagar district, respectively, in which one person was killed and 13 others injured. In another incident, members of a different religion allegedly tried to force

their way into the famous Trimbakeshwar temple in Nashik district, prompting the state government to set up a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to conduct a probe into it. The editorial in Saamana claimed since the time Eknath Shinde-Devendra Fadnavis coalition has come to power, the state has been witnessing religious and social tensions. "In Maharashtra, the BJP and its supporters are trying to disturb social peace, polarise voters by setting up a laboratory of riots," it alleged. "Some issues can be resolved through under-

standing, but it looks like they want to fight elections by dividing the society, just like the Shiv Sena was broken to form government," the Marathi daily said. It said the recent incidents in Akola, Shevgaon and Nashik were a cause of concern. Social tensions were deliberately being created with political motives and this was being done in a systematic and planned manner, the editorial claimed. "Despite Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis saying he would expose the masterminds, nothing has happened," it added. (PTI)

## Mumbai citizens to get weather updates on mobile phone during monsoon: Civic body

MUMBAI, MAY 17 /--/ Citizens in Mumbai will receive weather updates on their mobile phones through SMSes during monsoon, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has said.

The District Disaster Management Department has set up a control room to provide timely alerts about weather conditions and it has a mechanism to provide real-time weather alerts, the BMC said in a release on Tuesday. "An SMS alert will be sent to citizens during an emergency," it said. BMC Commissioner Iqbal Singh Chahal on Tuesday chaired a meeting with various agencies on disaster management and monsoon preparedness. Officials of BEST, MMRDA, MSRDC, PWD, Mumbai Metro, Railways, NDRF, IMD, MHADA and other agencies along with civic officials attended the meeting. Chahal directed all departments and agencies to expedite coordination to mitigate the possible challenges during the monsoon, the release said. For the smooth operation of suburban trains, which are used by more than 70 lakh people daily, Chahal directed the BMC's garden department to complete the trimming of trees in the railway premises by May-end.

De-watering pumps will be installed at 480 locations in Mumbai where waterlogging may occur during heavy rainfall and these pumps will also have CCTV camera

surveillance. After May 15, no permission will be given for the digging of roads in Mumbai except for emergencies, the civic body said. The BMC has reserved 3,000 beds to accommodate patients with monsoon-related diseases, it said, adding each ward will now have arrangements for five schools in case of emergencies like heavy rainfall to provide shelter to citizens. Chahal said the occupants of dangerous buildings should be served notices to vacate, and alternative arrangements for their accommodation should be made.

As per the orders of the High Court, the water supply of such dangerous buildings should be discontinued. "In accordance with this, Municipal Commissioner Chahal instructed to coordinate properly at the district collectorate level and to take necessary measures. He also asked to formulate the policy for the construction of protective walls," the civic body said. The BMC was informed that the NDRF has formed three teams for monsoon-related emergencies in Mumbai. Additionally, an extra team will be stationed in the eastern suburbs. "The Indian Navy has also informed about their teams and divers who will be ready for emergency response," the release said. Chahal also instructed Mumbai Fire Brigade to remain vigilant for any emergency, it added. (PTI)

## GUET-UG not to make board exams redundant: UGC Chairman Jagadesh Kumar

## British used 'classic mafiosi tactics' to expand territory in India: Tharoor

NEW DELHI, MAY 17 /--/ Senior Congress leader and author Shashi Tharoor on Tuesday said the British had used what was a "classic mafiosi tactics" to expand its territory in India during the colonial era.

He was speaking at an interaction held late evening at the India International Centre here on the book "British Takeover of India: Modus Operandi", recently republished after its original version had come out in 1979. Tharoor reiterated how the British came as traders to India, but realised it was "far more profitable, to trade at the end of a gun". He referred to the gradual fall of the Mughal empire, and how, at the Battle of Plassey in 1757, fought under the command of Robert Clive, the East India Company forces defeated the ruling Nawab Siraj-ud-Daula of Bengal. Soon, Mughal Emperor Shah Alam II granted the Diwani of Bengal, Bihar and Orissa to the Company. Tharoor, author of "An Era of Darkness: The British Empire in India", told the audience that the British extracted "four times more revenue" than has ever been extracted, exploited resource on India and repatriated profits to England. The former Union minister also said that weakness of many Indian rulers of princely states or other po-



tentates, helped in the expansion of the British Empire in India. "Frankly, what the British used was a classic mafiosi tactics, it was something that was perfected later in Italy," he said, drawing chuckle from the audience. Mafiosi, an Italian-origin word, refers to member of a mafia or a similar criminal organisation. They (the British forces) would go to a small maharaja, and be allowed to park themselves in their domains, and were paid for by the maharaja's treasury. And, through tactics used by the British, a maharaja ended up "paying his own people, to protect himself from his own people". Among other things, the British did during the colonial rule, was such an "incredible racket", Tharoor said.

The East India Company ruled over large territories in

India till 1857 when the Sepoy Mutiny, also referred to as the First War of Independence, took place, following which India came directly under the rule of the British Crown, and it ruled till 1947 when India became an independent nation. Tharoor, in response to questions from members of the audience, praised orientalist like William Jones who set up the Asiatic Society of Bengal in 1784, and botanists who meticulously documented flora of India. In response to another question, he said, "I have argued in my book (An Era of Darkness) that the entrenching and formalising of the caste system is actually a British colonial legacy". Asked about the relevance of the Commonwealth in India's context, Tharoor said in 1947, it was a "transfer of power", rather than a surren-

der or capitulation by the British. The Congress government of that time "went out of their way to ensure there was no humiliation of the British at the time, they relinquished the power. And, expressed their willingness to remain associated, "but they said they will do so without acknowledging the Crown as our sovereign ruler", he added. So, thanks to India that entire distinction was made, between the role of the king or queen as the head of the Commonwealth and the authority of a king or the queen as the head of State. So, that time the king was the head of the Commonwealth and head of State of Australia, South Africa, Canada and New Zealand, he said.

India chose to be a Republic (since 1950) with its own head of State, but acknowledged the king as the head of the Commonwealth, the Congress leader said. "And, this formula gave India an opportunity to continue engaging through these foreign countries, in one form of international affairs. I would argue, it was far more important in the late 40s and early 50s than subsequently. And, gradually institution of the Commonwealth has become less and less important for pursuit and objectives of the Indian foreign policy," Tharoor said. (PTI)

## Cybercriminal poses as former Delhi Police commissioner, dupes 75-year-old man of over Rs 7 lakh

NEW DELHI, MAY 17 /--/ In a case of sextortion, a 75-year-old resident of Vasant Kunj was defrauded of Rs 7.34 lakh by a group of cybercriminals, one of whom posed as former Delhi Police commissioner Rakesh Asthana. The cyber scammers trapped K N Joshi by using the modus op-

Commissioner of Delhi. He said that he got information about the video call with Anjali and asked me whether you have contacted her," Joshi told the police. "I told him that I never met her. He said that Anjali is a drug smuggler whose actual name is Neha and shared a copy of the FIR. He said that

## Gadkari requests Maharashtra govt to consider shifting of proposed thermal power project from Koradi in Nagpur

NAGPUR, MAY 17 /--/ Union minister Nitin Gadkari has written a letter to Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis to consider shifting of the proposed 2x660 MW thermal power project from Koradi in Nagpur to another location.

In the letter dated May 14, Nagpur Lok Sabha member Gadkari mentioned that the NGO 'Vidarbha Connect' has said the power project can be set up at Parshivni (Parseoni) in Nagpur dis-

tract. Gadkari cited a letter and concerns raised by the NGO which has requested for consideration and cancellation of the proposed 2x660 MW thermal power project at Koradi in Nagpur on the ground of health hazards and to shift it to another location. The Union minister said the NGO's representation states that Mahagenco is planning to erect a new thermal power project with a total capacity of 1,320 MW at Koradi. The present power generation capacity of Koradi thermal power station is 2,600 MW and falls in the Nagpur metro region limits. The units at Koradi are adding to the health problems of local residents, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader said citing the NGO's representation.

The NGO has opposed the proposed MPCB (Maharashtra Pollution Control Board) environmental public hearing on May 29, 2023. Gadkari said the NGO has pointed out that the power generation capacity at Koradi and Khaparkheda has reached the upper pitch and the proposed power station can be installed at Parshivni.

This may help to generate employment in the Parshivni tehsil and help find a solution to the problem of pollution in Koradi, he said, citing the NGO's representation. (PTI)

**NEW DELHI, MAY 17 /--** The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission to undergraduate programmes is not likely to make the board exams irrelevant, according to UGC Chairman M Jagadesh Kumar.

The pass percentage and number of students scoring above 90 per cent and 95 per cent in CBSE class 12 declined this year, kickstarting a debate about whether the introduction of the CUET has taken the focus off board exams and will end up making them redundant in the longer run. "The basic eligibility criterion for entrance into universities remains unchanged which is that a candidate must have passed the class 12 examination from any recognised board or equivalent. In fact, marks in grade 12 for eligibility will vary across programs and universities," Kumar told PTI. "Moreover, the board examination is an 'achievement test' whereas CUET-UG is a 'selection test'. Hence, board exams at the class 12 level are not likely to become redundant," he said. The second edition of CUET-UG is set to begin on May 21.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) chief explained that the basic eligibility criteria are a key factor for admission to all

universities and other examinations such as JEE (engineering) and NEET (medical) at the national level. "The principles for university entrance exams require a common test. The National Testing Agency (NTA) is working to offer a high-quality Common Aptitude Test, as well as specialised common subject exams in the sciences, humanities, languages, arts and vocational subjects. "These exams will test conceptual understanding and the ability to apply knowledge and shall aim to eliminate the need for taking coaching for these exams," he said. "Students have been able to choose the subjects for taking the test and each university will be able to see each student's individual subject portfolio and admit students into their programmes based on individual interests and talent," he added.

Asked about how CUET will provide an edge to students over the board exam marks for UG admissions, Kumar said, "In the past, students used to be under stress to secure more than 95 per cent marks in class 12 board examination to get admission in the university of their choice. "With the introduction of CUET, the stress on them for securing very high marks in the one and only

board examination stands reduced. Marks given by different boards vary widely because of the typology of questions and the scoring pattern. These things will now be standardised under CUET," he said.

The UGC, in March last year, announced that undergraduate admissions will be conducted in all central universities through a common entrance test and not based on class 12 marks. The debut edition of the CUET-UG was conducted in July last year and was marred by glitches, prompting the NTA to cancel the exam at multiple centres. While several students were informed about the cancellation a night before the exam, many of them were turned away from centres. The UGC chairman had then said the exam at certain centres had been cancelled following reports of "sabotage". Nearly 14 lakh applications have been received for the CUET-UG this year, registering a 41 per cent increase from the debut edition last year. CUET-UG remains the second-largest entrance exam in the country in terms of applicants. In the debut edition of CUET-UG, 12.50 lakh students registered themselves and 9.9 lakh of them submitted their applications. (PTI)

chat followed by a call for extortion, Joshi, in his complaint with the Delhi Police, has said that on January 15, he received a message saying "hello" from a woman who introduced herself as Anjali Sharma. She then asked for a video call and appeared nude, he said in his complaint, adding, "In a few minutes the call was disconnected." Two days later on January 17, she shared a morphed obscene video of Joshi and threatened that if he didn't pay Rs 61,000, she would make it viral on social media. Joshi said that he immediately blocked the number. Then on January 25, he missed a call from an unknown number. "I called back on the number and the person told me that he is Rakesh Asthana, Police

YouTube and gave me the number of Dhyaneswar Bajirao," he said. When Joshi contacted Bajirao, he demanded Rs 21,500 and Rs 43,000 through a digital wallet to get those videos deleted and also assured him that he would get back the money. "This made me gain some trust that they are actual police. He also shared a copy of the email stating that the video was deleted," the FIR, registered on April 25, reads. Joshi thought that his plight would be over after paying Rs 64,500 in two installments but the fraudsters kept asking for more money on one excuse or the other. The person who posed himself as Asthana and his gang cooked up bizarre stories around Anjali to extort as much money

committed suicide and so he should pay Rs 4 lakh into her account. A police officer, privy to the investigation, said that Joshi paid Rs 7,34,500 in total on three different dates. The police officer added, "In these types of cybercrime, fraudsters use recorded obscene videos of women which they play on video call to people. Initially people think that they have got a call from a woman. In the recorded call, these women ask people to undress or indulge

the video of such people, morphed it and made it obscene. They shared it back to people asking them to pay, otherwise they would make it viral on social media," he said. "They use the name of senior police officers to threaten people. In some cases, they dressed as cops and made video calls asking them to pay huge money," he added. (PTI)
