CM pushes for tech-driven healthcare

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has directed the Public Health Department to effectively use three technology-driven initiatives aimed at improving healthcare delivery and accessibility across the state.

The initiatives include an Integrated Health Dashboard, Integrated Health Facility Centre and hospital star-rating system. The Integrated Health Dashboard consolidates data from more than 40 Public Health Department portals. It will provide state- and district-level information on maternal and child health, tuberculosis control and screening for non-communicable diseases.

The Integrated Health Facility Centre will upgrade the existing 104 call centre by handling both incoming and outgoing calls. It will follow up with high-risk pregnant women, post-natal mothers, tuberculosis patients and people with non-communicable diseases. The centre can handle about 1,000 calls daily.

Government health facilities will be assessed on specialised services, staff availability, medicines, laboratories, outpatient and inpatient care, deliveries, surgeries, and patient feedback.

Nariman Pt ring road slowly taking shape

The 27-km loop is part of a larger network of nine proposed rings to integrate major infra projects

Mumbai's planned ring-road network is gradually taking shape, with a 27-km inner loop around Nariman Point set to become the first of several interconnected road rings across the Mumbai Metropolitan Region.

The smallest proposed ring will connect Nariman Point through the Mumbai Coastal Road, Sewri-Worli Elevated Connector, Eastern Freeway and Orange Gate-Marine Drive connection before returning towards Nariman Point. The Coastal Road and Eastern Freeway are already operational, while the other two links are under construction. Their completion will be crucial to creating a continuous alternative route around south Mumbai.

The 27-km loop is part of a larger network of nine proposed rings measuring 34 km, 67 km, 98.4 km, 119.62 km, 185.55 km, 197 km, 110 km and 273.5 km. These wider loops will integrate major infrastructure including the Bandra-Worli Sea Link, Western Express Highway, Santacruz-Chembur Link



Road, Jogeshwari-Vikhroli Link Road, Eastern Freeway Extension, Northern Coastal Road, Dahisar-Bhayandar connectivity, Uttan-Virar Sea Link and Atal Setu.

The objective is to provide motorists with multiple east-west and orbital travel options between Mumbai's eastern and western suburbs, as well as between north and south Mumbai, Thane, Mira-Bhayandar and areas across the harbour. This could reduce dependence on congested north-south routes.

The ring-road concept was first proposed by MMRDA Commissioner Dr Sanjay Mukherjee in 2024 as a way to change the geometry of Mumbai's road network. Instead of treating individual projects as separate corridors, the approach seeks to connect

them into a larger orbital system.

Under this model, sea links, tunnels and elevated roads could become parts of longer journeys once adjoining projects are completed. A motorist could combine several corridors to bypass congested stretches and reach different parts of the metropolitan region. This makes every missing link important to the wider network. As ongoing projects are completed, existing roads will gain greater utility through improved integration. The 27-km Nariman Point loop is therefore the first building block of a much larger ring-road system. Its effectiveness, however, will depend on the timely completion and seamless integration of the infrastructure projects still under construction.

Conductorless buses likely on short routes

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) is considering expanding conductorless bus services on suitable routes to reduce manpower costs and improve its financial position, while simultaneously tightening rules on employees making social media content while on duty.

Transport Minister Pratap Sarnaik has asked the undertaking to prioritise conductorless services as part of efforts to increase revenue, reduce expenditure and optimise resources. The model is already being tried on shorter routes such as Mumbai-Pune and Mumbai-Thane using digital tickets, QR codes and smart cards. However, its expansion to long-distance routes could pose challenges during breakdowns and emergencies. Meanwhile, drivers, conductors and other employees have been barred from making reels, videos or livestreams while on duty, including inside buses, at depots and bus stations. Content that damages MSRTC's image or reveals confidential information is also prohibited. However, employees can create positive promotional content with prior approval.

Senior Pune cops face human rights notices

The Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission has issued notices to Pune Commissioner of Police Amitesh Kumar, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Zone IV) Chilumula Rajnikant and 10 other police personnel, holding them prima facie responsible for negligence in protecting the human rights of a 20-year-old accused.

The notices relate to two complaints alleging that Sultan Rehman Shaikh was taken into custody, paraded through busy streets and subjected to custodial torture and public humiliation. The complaints allege that he was forced to squat, apologise publicly and was abused with a derogatory slur. Photographs attached to the complaints were also examined by the Commission.

The Commission observed that the alleged incident took place under the jurisdiction of Laxmi Nagar police station and said the CP and DCP, as supervisory authorities,

appeared to have been negligent in preventing human rights violations.

The Commission also noted that it had received two reports about the alleged incident by email on July 29, purportedly signed by the DCP, Zone IV. However, it said Kumar had failed to submit a report despite being directed. It observed that his failure to respond prima facie indicated negligence in preventing and protecting the victim's human rights.

Notices under Section 16 of the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993, were issued to the officials and police personnel, including senior police inspector Ravindra Mansingh Kadam, assistant police inspectors Shivaji Marotirao Vibhute and Ravikant Sudhakar Nandanwar, police sub-inspector Mahesh Hariba Nalawade and six constables.

The Commission directed that both matters be placed before a Division Bench under Regulation 16(4) of the Maharashtra State Human Rights Commission (Procedure) Regulations, 2011.

33,993 vehicles penalised for lack of HSRP

Maharashtra's enforcement drive against vehicles without High Security Registration Plates (HSRP) has resulted in 33,993 vehicles being penalised, with ₹79.13 lakh collected in fines between July 1 and August 28. According to transport department data, teams from 60 Regional Transport Offices (RTOs) inspected 1,06,668 vehicles across the state.

The HSRP requirement applies to vehicles registered before April 1, 2019. Vehicle owners were given several extensions to install the mandatory security plates before enforcement began on July 1. Following the expiry of the extended deadline, RTO teams intensified inspections across the state.

Nearly one-third of the vehicles checked were found without HSRP plates and penalised. The plates feature security measures designed to prevent tampering, duplication and misuse of registration numbers, while also helping enforcement agencies identify vehicles.

‘Don’t make employee wait for gratuity’

The Bombay High Court has dismissed a plea by the Breach Candy Swimming Bath Trust challenging an order to pay ₹11.67 lakh in gratuity to its former manager, who served the organisation for 23 years, saying employees cannot be kept waiting for gratuity.

The court upheld the

Controlling Authority's November 2025 order directing the Trust to pay former manager Rajesh Somnath Nerkar ₹11,67,785 along with 10% interest.

Nerkar joined the Trust in November 2000 and was later appointed manager. His services were terminated in July 2023 after the Trust accused him of shredding original membership records during a digitisation exercise. The

Trust claimed the alleged act caused losses of 5 crore and argued that his gratuity could be forfeited.

However, the court noted that the City Civil Court had declared his termination illegal, although appeals against that decision remain pending. The Trust challenged the gratuity order before the High Court, claiming it had not been properly served notices during the pro-

ceedings. Justice Marne rejected the argument, observing that notices had been duly served through the Trust's Administrative Manager.

The court also noted that the Trust had failed to challenge the gratuity order within the prescribed statutory period and had not used the remedies available under law before approaching the High Court.

“Merely because there are disputes between the two managing committees,” the court said, Nerkar could not be denied gratuity for his 23 years of service. The court further found that the Trust had not issued the mandatory notice required for forfeiture of gratuity. The court dismissed the petition and directed the Trust to pay the gratuity dues and ₹1 lakh costs within six weeks.
