In Dang village, Rs 25,000 fine if found drunk: Panchayat resolution to help residents kick alcohol habit

GUJARAT'S ONLY total tribal-district, Dang, saw an entire village support a resolution to ban consumption and sale of any kind of liquor that also imposes heavy penalties, going as far as "ostracisation" of involved families.

The gram panchayat of Garudiya village with a population of nearly 1,500 passed a resolution on Thursday banning the "sale of IMFL (Indian Made Foreign Liquor) or country-brewed liquor," which is already banned under the state's strict prohibition law.

Garudiya is a village of Subir taluka and shares border with Nandurbar district in Maharashtra, a wet state.

On Thursday, sarpanch K M Kamri convened a gram panchayat meeting and proposed banning the sale and consumption of liquor in the village. The proposal was approved by all panchayat members. A copy of the resolution was submitted to the Subir police station. After the resolution passed, the village sarpanch convened a meeting of villagers and announced the details in it. The sarpanch has formed a five-member 'Dekh Rekha' (supervision) committee to monitor liquor-related activities in the village.

The resolution states: "The 'Dekh Rekha' committee, formed by the Gram Panchayat and headed by the village sarpanch, will ensure that no person in the village manufactures, sells, or consumes country-made liquor or IMFL. If anyone is found in a drunken condition, a penalty of Rs 25,000 will be recovered from them and they will also be subject to a police case.

None from the village will support the accused in obtaining bail during the police procedure. If anybody from the village or outside gives a tip-off to the Dekh Rekha committee about the sale or consumption of IMFL/country-made liquor, they will be rewarded with Rs 10,000 recovered from the accused, and the remaining Rs 15,000 (from the penalty) will be deposited in the Gram Panchayat fund."

The village's primary occupation is agriculture, but alcohol consumption is common among the people.

The resolution also states, "If anybody enters the village in an inebriated state and is caught by the villagers or the committee, he/she will also have to pay a penalty of Rs 10,000. Apart from this, if anyone violates the resolution even after being caught once, their family will be barred from social contact and other religious functions in the village. Not a single member of the village will participate in any events by such a family."

Sarpanch Kamri told this newspaper, "Many people have died due to liquor consumption. In our village, both men and

women consume liquor and even offer it to people at funerals, weddings, and religious events. Now, to overcome the vice of liquor consumption, we have adopted a resolution to save the lives of our village people."

He added, "Our village is around 15 km from the Maharashtra border, and people used to travel frequently to the neighbouring state for work and other social activities. They consume liquor there or bring it here to sell to locals or consume it themselves. We want to make our village liquor-free, and to that end, we have taken the following steps. For tribals living in our village, Rs. 25,000 is a big amount, and they will be afraid of committing such a sin."

Subir Police Station Inspector H B Patel said: "The consumption of liquor is common among the people of Dang. Each year, we make out around 8 to 10 prohibition cases in Garudiya village. The villagers consume both country-made liquor and IMFL. When our team arrives in the village for raids, the liquor is nowhere to be found. We appreciate the step taken by the Garudiya village sarpanch and assured him of our full support."

Convoy shrunk, no reception at airport: Shah's austerity push

Meetings to have only officials from the 'specific depts concerned'

UNION HOME and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah, who began a two-day visit to the state on Saturday, ensured that the austerity measures Prime Minister Narendra Modi suggested were followed even in meetings reviewing project progress in the Gandhinagar Lok Sabha constituency, which he represents. This included shrinking his convoy, deterring any reception at the airport upon arrival and having only officials from the "specific departments concerned" in the meetings.

This is Shah's first visit to Gujarat after the BJP's victory in West Bengal and Assam.

On Friday, the Gujarat government also announced energy-conserving guidelines. These included returning extra cars to the government pool, urging officials to prefer public transport, holding online meetings, drafting a policy to procure indigenous products for government offices, setting a six-month target to switch all government canteens from LPG to piped gas, and prioritising electric vehicles.

Shah, whose security detail usually has a convoy of 10-12 vehicles, was down to four on

Saturday, sources told this newspaper. The sources said he had also issued strict instructions that no one should receive him at the airport or during his send-off when he departs after the Gujarat visit.

Aiming at making Gandhinagar parliamentary constituency which Shah represents, a "green lok sabha", Shah set a target of planting more than one crore trees in the area in the ongoing financial year, directing officials to identify residential areas, industrial clusters, medians, entry points and more aiming for a "64 per cent" higher plantation in his constituency than last year which adds up to Rs 1.03

crore, said a government statement. Shah expressed confidence that these measures would help "provide the future generations clean air, water and a green environment."

Sources said he decided that the meeting venue would be the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation's South West Zonal office in Jodhpur area, "to make it convenient for officials from Gandhinagar and Ahmedabad to participate," according to an official in the know.

This is not the first time the Union Minister was holding a meeting here, said the source.

Specific targets were assigned to various government

departments. For example, the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Ahmedabad, was given a target of planting 38.79 lakh trees, the DCF, Gandhinagar, received a target of 12.47 lakh trees; the AMC will plant 25 lakh trees; and the Gandhinagar Municipal Corporation will plant 5.42 lakh trees. Beautifying the entry points - 18 in Gandhinagar and 7 in Ahmedabad districts, by planting exotic flowering plants on land acquired from the respective panchayats and revenue department.

The plans discussed included the Forest Department distributing one free sapling per family, identifying residential societies where more than 50 trees could be planted and encouraging public partner-

ships in this drive. Shah also sought updates on the project to modernise the Sarkhej-Gandhinagar highway, and the conservation and interlinking of lakes in his constituency.

Gandhinagar which aims to be the "country's model lok sabha constituency" increased its green cover by 11.25 per cent (2,729 hectares) during his first term (2019-2024), according to the statement.

Apart from municipal corporation officials, the meeting included officials from the forest department, irrigation, roads and building department, Chief Secretary Manoj Kumar Das, Deputy Chief Minister Harsh Sanghavi and Health and Family Welfare Minister Pratul Pansheriya.
