Pragg, Vaishali score wins in Grand Swiss chess

Top seed Praggnanandhaa Rameshbabu landed his first win defeating 15-year-old GM Zemlyanskii Ivan moving half a point behind the leaders at the FIDE Grand Swiss 2025, Samarkand. In the women's section, Grand Master Vaishali Rameshbabu shared the lead with 2.0 points, sweeping aside Dutch International Master Eline Roebers. On top of the table, three GMs viz., Alireza Firouzja, Parham Maghsoodloo and Anton Demchenko shared the lead with 2/2 score. Half a point behind at 1.5 points were GMs Erigaisi, Praggnanandhaa, Gukesh, Keymer, Giri, Abdusattorov, Nepomniachtchi, MVL, Vidit, Rapport, Gelfand, Nihal, Mendonca, Puranik among others.

Having shed a draw in the opener, FIDE Circuit leader Praggnanandhaa was back in the business defeating GM Zemlyanskii Ivan. The English opening game appeared heading for an even finish when the Russian teenager slipped with 30...Rc7, placing his rook in an awkward position. Pragg instantly grabbed the chance, landing a deadly fork attacking the black rook and knight simultaneously. Black resigned on the 33rd move, just three moves after committing a hara-kiri.

World Champion Gukesh Dommaraju missed a chance to join the leaders allowing GM Erdogmus Yagiz Kaan to escape from a losing position. Two teenagers battling

it out on the top board of the world's strongest Swiss tournament is an indication that the game is getting younger and younger. Starting the game in an unorthodox style Gukesh gradually got the upper hand against the 14-year-old Turkish prodigy. Taking black out of the opening worked well for the Indian until the 40th move, the last one before the first time control. The fatal slip allowed Erdogmus to hold the world champion to a draw through perpetual checks.

It turned out to be a sunny day for Indians with GMs Erigaisi Arjun, Nihal Sarin, Mendonca Leon Luke, Aryan Chopra emerging winners, while GMs Pranav Venkatesh, Raunak Sadhwani, S L Narayanan, Aditya Mittal and Pentala Harikrishna drew their games. Women's World Cup winner Divya Deshmukh held off German Grandmaster Alexander Donchenko opening her score.

In the women's section defending champion Vaishali Rameshbabu scored a crushing 22 move victory over Dutch women champion Eline Roebers. The win puts Vaishali on top of the leader-board with 2.0 points from as many rounds along with International Maser Olga Badelka of Austria. With nine rounds remaining, it's still a long way to go before the two Candidates spots get grabbed.

Playing in England was rewarding: Opener Jagadeeshan

Bengaluru, Sep 6: India opener Narayan Jagadeeshan provided an in-depth reflection on his recent Test match experience in England, describing it as both highly challenging and rewarding.

He emphasised the significance of adapting to difficult conditions, seizing opportunities, maintaining focus, and enjoying the game while staying grounded.

"Playing in England is genuinely very challenging. The conditions can change very quickly - you could have overcast skies one moment and bright sunshine the next ? which makes batting tricky. Facing top bowlers is always going to be a huge test," Jagadeeshan told reporters.

Speaking about his 197 run-innings against North Zone in

the Duleep Trophy semifinals, Jagadeeshan highlighted the need for patience and strategic play in the opening session.

"We had to fight our way through, especially in the first session. Once things eased out, we were able to capitalise and take more attacking shots, scoring runs quickly when batting with my partner," he said.

He emphasised that the wicket required a careful approach. "As an opener, I had to take my time in the beginning and not worry too much about runs. The first one or two hours could set the tone for the entire game. Playing smart helped us build partnerships and avoid losing wickets quickly," he added.

Jagadeesan's sublime innings of 197 powered South Zone to

a formidable 536 all out against North Zone on the second day of the Duleep Trophy semifinal at the BCCI CEG Ground, leaving the visitors with an uphill task in the first innings.

Even a brilliant five-wicket haul from North Zone spinner Nishant Sindhu was not enough to contain South Zone's batting onslaught.

North Zone will need a disciplined and resilient batting performance to avoid slipping further behind. The first innings now looks pivotal in determining which side will secure a place in the final.

India meet Qatar in U23 men's Asian Cup Qualifiers

Doha, Sep 6:

After beginning their AFC U23 Asian Cup 2026 Qualifiers campaign with a solid 2-0 win over Bahrain, the Indian men's U23 team will now face hosts Qatar in their second Group H match on September 6, at the Abdullah bin Khalifa Stadium here, at 22:30 IST. The Blue Colts are aiming to create history by qualifying for the AFC U23 Asian Cup for the first time ever. With the group winners assured of a direct ticket to Saudi Arabia 2026 and only four best second-placed sides across all 11 groups joining them, Saturday's clash against Qatar could prove pivotal in shaping India's qualification hopes.

"It's always a good thing to start with a win and get those three points," said Moosa after the win over Bahrain. "That win gave us a lot of hope and belief that if we do well against Qatar,

we'll have the chance to qualify. It's very important we go forward with a winning mentality." Qatar began their campaign with a thumping 13-0 victory over Brunei Darussalam, showcasing their attacking prowess.

Moosa acknowledged the challenge ahead, saying, "Qatar are probably one of the best teams in Asia that we could face. Their playing style is totally different from Bahrain's. They rely on short passes, quick switches, and a lot of wing play. We need to focus on stopping those movements from the sides." Reflecting on the Bahrain game, Moosa credited India's preparation and collective effort.

"During the 20-day camp in Bangalore, followed by a few days in Malaysia, where we played the friendlies against Iraq, we worked a lot on teamwork. The players were aggressive and played like a team, which helped us a lot.

Against Qatar, we cannot afford lapses. We have to be strong and disciplined until the final whistle."

While Qatar enjoy the comfort of home conditions, Moosa believes his boys have adjusted well in Doha. "We've been here for almost a week, played one game, and trained regularly. The players are acclimated to the weather. Also, since the match is at 8 pm, later than the last one, I don't think conditions will affect us much." Looking at the bigger picture, Moosa underlined the importance of the campaign for the squad's development. "This campaign is very important for us. If we win, we stand a good chance of advancing. That would mean more camps, more friendlies, and better preparation for not just the AFC U23 Asian Cup but also future competitions like the 2026 Asian Games. Continuity is the key."

If you still choose silence, don't be surprised when history does not remember you at all. Or worse, remembers you as cowards.

Because in the end, there are only two groups—the bold and the cowardly. And no prizes for guessing which side moves the world forward...!

Neeraj advances in world boxing women's 65kg

Liverpool, Sep 6: Sumit Kundu (men's 75kg) and Neeraj Phogat (women's 65kg) registered contrasting victories to advance to the pre-quarterfinals of their respective weight categories as Indian boxers continued to impress at the World Boxing Championship in Liverpool, UK today.

Sumit was rarely in any trouble through-out the three rounds against Jordan's Mohammad Alhussien in the men's 75kg first round to win 5:0 while Neeraj had to dig deep into her reserves to outlast Finland's Krista Kovalainen and eke out a 3:2 verdict.

India has fielded a 20-member strong contingent in the inaugural

World Championships being held under the aegis of the World Boxing- a recently formed international governing body for boxing -- and are looking to continue building on their strong outings in the World Boxing Cup legs in Brazil and Kazakhstan.

Neeraj was first to take the ring on the second day of competition and was under pressure as the Finnish national champion, Kovalainen, mounted a strong comeback in the second round. But the Indian took the attack to her opponent in the third round and got four of the five judges to back her to win the bout and advance.

Sumit then dominated all the three rounds against Alhussien to make

it to the Round and 16.

In the last night session, Sanamacha Chanu had defeated Denmark's Ditte Frostholtm to start her women's 70kg campaign in style while World Boxing Cup Astana gold medallist Sakshi

outclassed Viktoriia Shkeul of Ukraine in her women's 54kg opener.

Sakshi was at her aggressive best against the Ukrainian and the referee had to stop contest (RSC) in the second round.
