Sub. : Update under Regulation 30 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 — Natural calamity damaging the administrative building at the Waste-to-Energy plant site

Ref. : Our intimation dated July 8, 2026 regarding the above matter

Further to our intimation referenced above, and pursuant to Regulation 30 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, we wish to provide the following update.

It is with deep sorrow that Antony Waste confirms that nine of its people have lost their lives following a natural calamity at the landfill adjacent to the Company's Waste-to-Energy plant. The incident occurred after incessant rains caused thousands of tonnes of waste from a landfill located outside the facility to collapse onto the site, resulting in severe damage to the administrative building where 23 employees were present at that time. Each of them is a member of the Antony Waste family, and this loss is felt across the organisation.

Emergency response teams — the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), the Indian Army, the Fire Brigade and the local administration — responded immediately. Fourteen employees were rescued and are receiving medical treatment and counselling.

Support for affected employees and families

- All hospital, medical and counselling expenses of injured employees will be borne by the Company.
- Funeral and last-rites expenses will be covered in accordance with each family's customs and wishes.
- Financial assistance of ₹ 25,00,000 (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakh Only) will be provided to each bereaved family, comprising ex-gratia support from the Company and benefits payable under applicable statutory welfare/insurance schemes and the Company's Group Insurance Policy.

- Employment will be offered to an immediate family member of each deceased employee, where suitable. Further, the Company is committed to supporting the education of the minor children of each deceased employee and will meet their educational expenses.
- A dedicated representative of the Company has been assigned as a single point of contact for each affected family — assisting with medical care, documentation, insurance claims, statutory benefits and other formalities, under the direct oversight of senior management.

Impact on operations and business continuity

Operations at the Waste-to-Energy plant have been temporarily suspended as a precautionary measure while a structural and safety assessment of the site is carried out. Municipal waste collection and transportation services remain unaffected. The Company's assets and operations are adequately insured. The financial impact of the incident is under assessment and will be intimated to the stock exchanges once ascertained.

The Company continues to cooperate fully with all concerned authorities and remains committed to providing all necessary support to the affected individuals and their families. We will keep the stock exchanges informed of any further material developments in this regard.

Antony Waste confirms nine fatalities after natural calamity damages the administrative building at its Waste-to-Energy plant site; management personally meeting each affected family

Mumbai, 12 July 2026 — It is with deep sorrow that Antony Waste confirms that nine of its people have lost their lives following a natural calamity at the landfill adjacent to the Company's Waste-to-Energy plant. The incident occurred after incessant rains caused thousands of tonnes of waste from a landfill located outside the facility to collapse onto the site, resulting in severe damage to the administrative building where 23 employees were present at that time. Each of them is a member of the Antony Waste group, and this loss is felt across the organisation.

The Company is deeply grateful to the emergency response teams — the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), the Indian Army, the Fire Brigade, PCMC and the local administration — and to every volunteer who joined the rescue and relief operations. Their immediate, swift and selfless efforts brought fourteen of our colleagues to safety; they are receiving medical treatment and counselling, and the Company will remain thankful to each of those who stood with us.

Management personally meeting each family

The Company's immediate priority is the people affected — the injured under medical care, and the families of those who have lost their lives. Every action the Company takes in the days ahead flows from that priority, beginning with reaching each family directly.

The affected employees and their families are part of the Antony Waste group. The Company's senior management is in the process of personally meeting each of the families — at hospitals and in their homes — to listen, to understand their immediate and longer-term needs, and to ensure that the support measures announced reach them without delay.

Support for affected employees and families

- All hospital, medical and counselling expenses of injured employees will be borne by the Company.
- Funeral and last-rites expenses will be covered in accordance with each family's customs and wishes.
- Financial assistance of ₹25,00,000 (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakh Only) will be provided to each bereaved family, comprising ex-gratia support from the Company and benefits payable under applicable statutory welfare/insurance schemes and the Company's Group Insurance Policy.
- Employment will be offered to an immediate family member of each deceased employee, where suitable. Further, the Company is committed to supporting the education of the minor children of each deceased employee and will meet their educational expenses.
