**Sub.: Disclosure under Regulation 30 of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (“SEBI Listing Regulations”) at Bajaj Electricals Limited (“Company”)**

Dear Sir/Madam,

Pursuant to the provisions of Regulation 30 (read with sub-para 8 of Para B and/or sub-para 20 of Para A, Part A of Schedule III) of the SEBI Listing Regulations, and in line with the Company’s Policy on the Determination of Materiality for Disclosure of Events or Information, and further to our letter dated March 31, 2024, [wherein the Company had, inter alia, intimated that it had received an assessment order on May 25, 2023, issued by the Assistant Commissioner of Sales Tax, Kotwali, Bihar (“GST Authority”), under section 74(1) of the CGST/SGST/IGST Act, 2017 (“Order”), raising a total demand of Rs. 1.16 crore, which inter alia included a general penalty of Rs. 39.58 lakh, on account of an alleged disallowance of transitional credit availed in 'Form Tran 1', whereby the Company had already filed an appeal against the said Order before the Office of the Commissioner (Appeals) of Customs, CGST & Central Excise, Patna, Bihar (“Appellate Authority”)], we hereby would like to provide an update as follows:

- We are now in receipt of an adverse Appeal Order dated March 30, 2026 (received by the Company on April 16, 2026, at 3:22 p.m.), issued by Appellate Authority (“Appeal Order”), whereby the Appellate Authority has rejected the appeal filed by the Company and upheld the impugned Order with a total demand of Rs. 1.16 crore, which inter alia includes a general penalty of Rs. 39.68 lakh.

The management is currently evaluating appropriate legal options, which, *inter alia*, include filing an appeal before the appropriate appellate tribunal and/or a writ petition before the Hon’ble High Court against the said Appeal Order.

The financial impact of the Appeal Order, if materialises, would be limited to the extent of the demand raised and penalty levied thereunder. There is no impact on the operational, financial, or other activities of the Company on account of this order/assessment.

We request you to take the above on record and treat it as compliance under the applicable provisions of the SEBI Listing Regulations, if any.
