In another incident on Tuesday night, an unidentified youth died after being hit by a train near the Meja Road railway overbridge, also on the Delhi-Howrah line.

Locals found the injured young man lying unconscious near the tracks and called the station master and police. He was taken to the Community Health Centre (CHC) in Ramnagar, where doctors declared him dead on arrival.

Police have sent the body for post-mortem examination and are trying to identify the deceased.

VARANASI: Banaras Locomotive Works (BLW) dispatched the fourth 3300 HP AC-AC diesel-electric locomotive to Mozambique on October 18, as part of a 10-locomotive export order via RITES Ltd. The first two were sent in June 2025, the third in September, and the remaining six will go by December.

These Cape Gauge (1067 mm) locomotives reach 100 km/h and feature crew comforts like a fridge, hot plate, toilet, and ergonomic cab. Mozambique Railways, impressed by six earlier 3000 HP units, placed this new order. BLW's success reflects 'Make in India' and its global engineering excellence.
