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WEST ASIA CRISIS FALLOUT

Feeling the Heat Plan Afoot to Raise Induction Cooktop, Utensil Output

Meeting chaired by Piyush Goyal with DPIIT, power ministry and DGFT officials to review plans

New Delhi: India is considering measures to encourage companies to ramp up production of induction cooktops and utensils such as electric cookers amid surging demand, with the Iran war disrupting cooking gas imports, said an official.

Towards this, a meeting was held on Friday chaired by commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal and attended by senior officials including secretaries of the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) and power ministry, as well as the Director General of Foreign Trade.

The simmering conflict has severely affected the movement of ships carrying oil and gas through the critical Strait of Hormuz waterway. This has sparked concerns over cooking gas supplies, leading people to rush to buy induction cooktops and utensils

used in such appliances. Sales of electric kettles and cookers have also soared, causing a shortage of such products at online stores and retail outlets across the country. "We discussed how we can speed up and increase the production of induction heaters and vessels that go on those heaters," said an official, who attended the meeting.

"The demand for these goods is increasing, and they are being sold as hot cakes. So, we are prepared and proactive," the official said, adding the government's effort is to plan ahead for the future.

Policymakers are also concerned about continued imports of fertiliser, crude oil and natural gas amid the

disruptions to shipping routes.

In an effort to sustain supply chains in other sectors, the Centre Thursday exempted the import of critical petrochemical products from customs duty for three months till June 30. This gave a breather to sectors such as pharmaceuticals, chemicals, and textiles. Sectors dependent on petrochemical feedstock and intermediates such as plastics, packaging, textiles, pharmaceuticals, chemicals, automotive components and other manufacturing segments will benefit from the duty exemption that would cost the exchequer ₹1,800 crore.

India's exports sustained healthy momentum despite global headwinds and are expected to record growth in FY26, an official said Friday. "At the end of March 31, despite the war, we will be closing the year with positive growth," the official said.

Cabotage Norms Eased for 6 Months Amid Vessel Crunch

New Delhi: The government has announced a six-month relaxation of its cabotage and container movement rules until October 25 this year, allowing foreign-flagged ships to transport cargo between Indian ports. The measure aims to facilitate the movement of cargo stuck at Indian ports due to the West Asia conflict-fueled shortage of ships and containers.

This follows a suggestion put forth at a meeting called by the Directorate General (DG) of Shipping and attended by senior government officials last month. ET had reported on March 7 that this was being discussed.

"Cabotage relaxation has been given for six months following industry demand," a senior official told ET, adding the ministry of ports, shipping and waterways has issued directives to DG Shipping for ensuring the same. Officials said the government will review the situation at the end of the six-month period.

DG Shipping had scrapped the partial easing of cabotage rules in January this year. These relaxations—introduced in 2018—had allowed foreign-flagged ships to move export-import (Exim) cargo between Indian ports without the need for any specific licence. —Our Bureau

Textile Exporters Urge Govt to Waive Cotton Import Duty

Pune: Textile and garment exporters have urged the government to remove the 11% import duty on cotton, as a recent surge in domestic prices has eroded margins and hurt their competitiveness in overseas markets. Local cotton prices have risen 7-8% over the past month, driven by a sharp increase in demand as costlier crude oil pushed up prices of synthetic fibres, prompting mills to shift back to natural inputs.

The industry is seeking a temporary relief on the li-

nes of the one granted last year, when the government waived cotton import duties between August and December to ease supply pressures.

The prices of ginned cotton have increased 11-12% over the past one month, as per data from the Cotton Association of India. International cotton prices have risen 12-15% during this period, as cotton was the cheapest agricultural commodity available to investors, said industry experts.

For the export of textiles and garments, India depends on imported long-sta-

ple and contamination-free cotton, as demanded by overseas buyers. "Prices of almost all raw materials have gone up. However, as about 60-70% of the textile value chain depends on cotton, we have requested the central government to waive the import duty on cotton for three-six months," said Chandrima Chatterjee, secretary general, Confederation of Indian Textile Industries.

The increase in crude oil prices in the wake of the US-Israeli strikes on Iran has led to a 10-60% surge in prices of almost all types of raw materials used by the textile industry.

Coal India Arm NCL Dispatches 137 MT in FY26

New Delhi: Coal India arm NCL on Friday said that it supplied a record 137.08 million



tonnes (MT) of coal to its customers in power and other sectors during 2025-26, significantly reinforcing India's energy security amid surging domestic demand and shifting global dynamics. Of the total dispatch, approximately 86%, equivalent to 117.85 MT, was supplied to coal-based power plants.

Informal Sector Steps Up Coal Stocking Over Price Concerns

New Delhi: India's vast informal industrial sector using coal is cautiously building buffers, with brick kilns, small foundries and other smaller energy-intensive units gradually stockpiling the fuel in anticipation of a price increase triggered by global price pressure amid the West Asia crisis.

Industry participants said the trend picked up over the last one week as these units, typically operating outside long-term fuel linkages, now anticipate higher spot prices led by international coal prices. The stocking is, however, gradual and limited because of constraint in storing capacities.

Coal prices have risen internationally and percolated to the free market rates for coal clocking a premium of 10-15% over the usual rates during this time of the season, coal traders said.

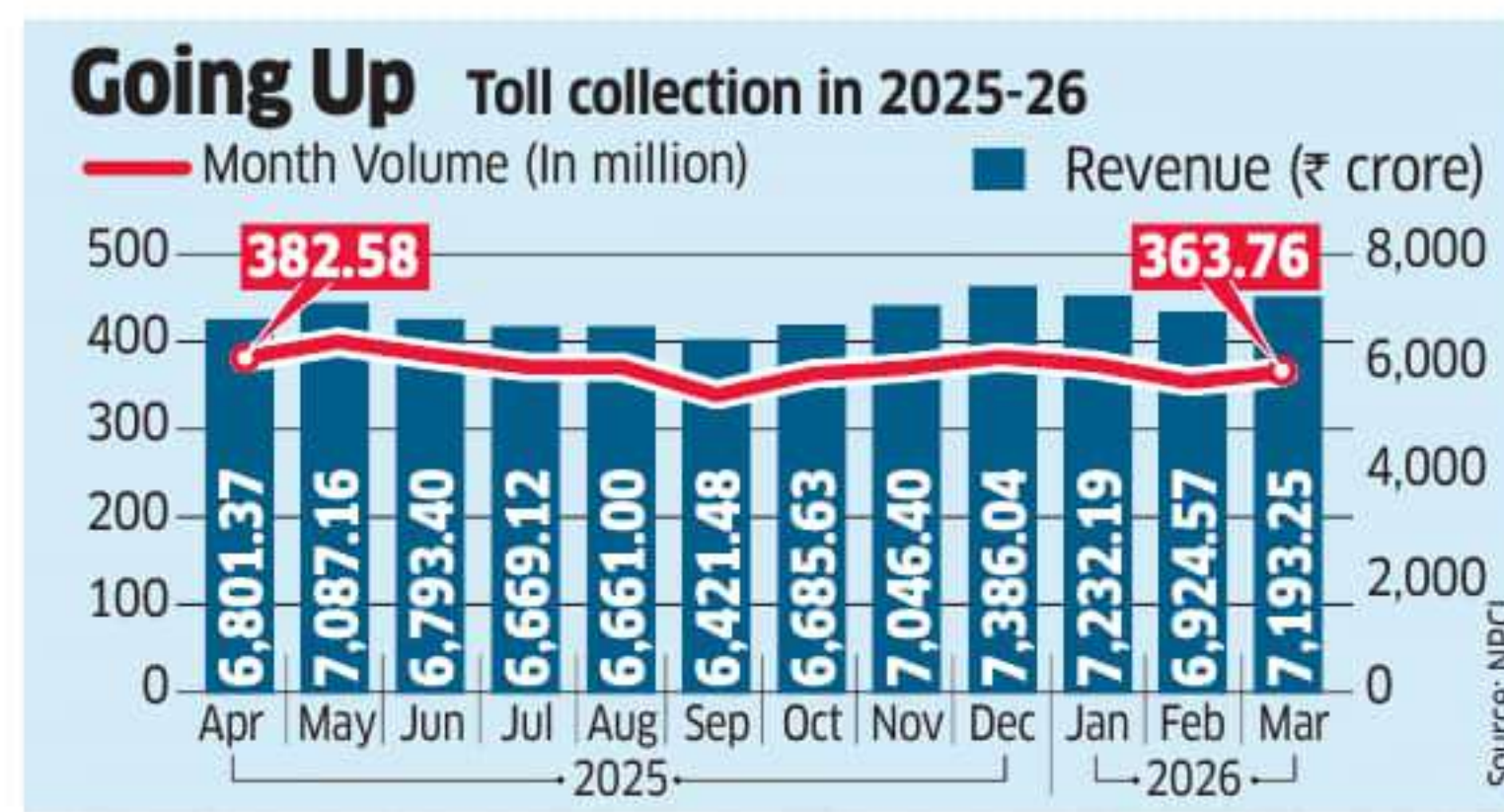
A news report from S&P Global Energy on March 23

said that the Platts CFR India 4,200 kcal/kg GAR rose from \$67/mt on February 27 to \$77.40/mt on March 20, supported by stronger buying interest in parts of Asia and firmer energy market sentiment.

Rahul Rungta, director of Kolkata-based trading firm BK Coal, said "Clients are stockpiling their requirement because imported coal prices are increasing and there is an anticipation of supply disruption in imported coal. Though rates are not very high as of now, there is an expectation in the market."

However, domestic production and availability remain robust with Coal India's notified price remaining unchanged. The Centre has already written to states to ensure that coal prices are not increased and there is ample availability to meet any increasing demand. Coal stock in the country is currently at 224 million tonnes compared with 201 million tonnes last year.

Toll Mopup Rises 14% to a Record in FY26

New Delhi: Toll collections grew 14% to a record ₹32,900.16 crore in the just-ended fiscal year, underscoring addition of new toll roads, accelerated economic activity, and roll out of the new annual FASTag facility. Tolls worth ₹72,930.83 crore were collected in FY25.

The volume of FASTag transactions rose 5.7% to nearly 4.45 billion in FY26 from 4.21 billion in the year before, showed National Electronic Toll Collection (NETC) data tracked by the National Payment Corporation of India (NPCI) and accessed by ET.

In March, total toll collections from commercial vehicles climbed to ₹7,193 crore from ₹6,924.57 crore in February despite disruptions from the Iran war, reflecting sustained economic activity. With the latest increase, annual toll collections have surged more than threefold in the past eight years with collections in FY19—the first year of computing of electronic data—at ₹25,164.50 crore.

During this period, India's tolled road length more than doubled to 55,812 km as of November 2025, from 26,067 km in FY19. "Addition of new toll plazas year-after-year has meant better logistics cost, enhanced efficiency, and ease of travel for highway users which has led to a surge in toll collection," said a senior government official.

According to the official, toll collections are expected to accelerate in the coming years as India adopts technologically advanced toll collection mechanisms and eliminates physical toll plazas.

Guarantors to Disclose Crypto, Art, Foreign Assets in IBC Cases

New Delhi: Promoters or directors who have provided surety for a stressed company's debt will be required to declare their holdings of crypto, jewellery, works of art, high-end watches and foreign assets, as part of reporting personal wealth during bankruptcy resolution, according to the draft regulations floated by the insolvency regulator.

Personal guarantors will have to declare their own assets, as stipulated under a dozen categories, whether they filed for bankruptcy resolution voluntarily along with the relevant corporate debtors or were dragged by creditors into insolvency proceedings. These include a wide spectrum of tangible and intangible assets, reflecting the intent of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) to tighten disclosure requirements. The draft regulations are firm-ed up by a five-member pa-

nel set up by the IBBI under its wholetime member Jayanti Prasad to align with the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill, 2025. The categories cover cash and bank deposits; business interests and commercial assets; domestic and overseas investments; immovable property; retirement and provident fund assets; digital assets, including crypto, virtual digital assets and non-fungible digital tokens; intellectual property and intangible assets; valuable movable assets; agricultural assets and livestock receivables and advances claims and contingent assets; and employee stock options and beneficial ownership interests.

The panel has proposed to make this "statement of assets" disclosure mandatory by inserting a new Section, 6A, in the Insolvency Resolution Process for Personal Guarantors to Corporate Debtors Regulations, 2019.

PV growth to moderate in FY27

India's passenger vehicle (PV) industry growth is expected to moderate to 4-6% in FY27, mainly due to a high base and evolving macroeconomic conditions, ratings agency ICRA said. For FY26, the industry is likely to post 7-9% growth, supported by strong festive demand, GST cuts and new model launches. ICRA noted a structural shift in the market, with utility vehicles contributing nearly 67% of total sales, highlighting continued premiumisation. Rising adoption of alternative powertrains such as CNG and electric vehicles is also supporting demand diversification. Despite slower growth, OEMs are expected to maintain strong capital expenditure on new products and EV platforms.

CII hails Jan Vishwas Bill passage

Industry body CII on Friday welcomed Parliament's passage of the Jan Vishwas (Amendment of Provisions) Bill, 2026, saying it will ease compliance burden and improve the business environment. The Bill amends 784 provisions across 79 central laws to decriminalise minor offences. CII Director General Chandrajit Banerjee said the reforms replace imprisonment with monetary penalties, introduce graded enforcement and rationalise fines. These measures will accelerate dispute resolution and reduce pressure on courts.

India Inc Q4FY26 earnings: Growth steady, outlook remains cautious

India Inc enters the fourth quarter earnings season for FY26 with tempered optimism, as steady revenue expansion is increasingly counterbalanced by mounting cost pressures and an uncertain global backdrop. Early projections suggest that while top-line growth may remain intact, profitability is likely to come under strain, shifting investor attention decisively towards management guidance for FY27.

Industry estimates indicate that revenues for the January-March quarter could rise by around 7-8% year-on-year. Yet earnings growth is expected to lag, reflecting elevated input costs, persistently high freight charges, and residual global supply disruptions.

Margins across sectors are projected to remain stable at best, with downside risks particularly pronounced in industries exposed to raw

material volatility. This earnings season, therefore, is unlikely to be defined solely by reported numbers. Instead, forward-looking commentary on demand visibility, sectoral recovery, and corporate adaptation to structural changes—including the rapid integration of artificial intelligence—will assume greater significance. Investors are expected to scrutinise management narratives as closely as balance sheets.

The information technology services sector is poised for a subdued performance. Large-cap firms such as TCS, Infosys, and HCL Technologies are anticipated to report modest sequential revenue movement, ranging from a marginal decline to slight growth in constant currency terms.

Mid-tier IT companies may demonstrate relative resilience; however, attention will centre on deal wins, contract values, and the extent to which artificial intelligence is



driving growth rather than exerting pricing pressure through automation efficiencies. Banking and financial services are likely to remain a pillar of stability. Robust credit demand, coupled with steady asset quality, is expected to underpin consistent performance among private sector lenders and wealth management firms. The automobile sector may record steady volume growth, aided by operating leverage, though elevated commodity prices could com-

press margins. Meanwhile, consumer and FMCG companies are positioned to benefit from a gradual revival in rural demand and some easing in input costs, supporting stable growth trajectories. Infrastructure and capital goods sectors are expected to sustain momentum, driven by continued government expenditure and strong project execution, reinforcing their role as key growth engines. The ongoing West Asia conflict is exerting upward pressure on oil prices

and logistics costs, while rupee depreciation against the US dollar may offer limited relief to export-oriented sectors such as IT and pharmaceuticals. The pace at which companies harness artificial intelligence to unlock new revenue streams will also be closely watched.

The earnings cycle will commence with TCS reporting on April 9, followed by HCL Technologies on April 21 and Infosys on April 23, setting the tone for corporate India's near-term trajectory. Additionally, currency volatility and interest rate expectations may further influence sectoral performance, particularly for export-driven and rate-sensitive businesses.

Companies are also expected to maintain a cautious stance on capital expenditure, prioritising efficiency and balance sheet strength. Any deviation in inflation trends or policy signals could materially alter earnings visibility in the coming quarters.

OpenAI acquires TBN Podcast

OpenAI has acquired popular technology podcast TBN, aiming to strengthen conversations around artificial intelligence while retaining the show's editorial independence. CEO Sam Altman described TBN as his "favourite tech show", emphasising that the team will continue its candid coverage without influence.

The podcast, hosted by Jordi Hays and John Coogan, is known for its daily discussions on AI, startups and the broader technology ecosystem. OpenAI said the acquisition brings a specialised editorial team into its strategy division to enhance engagement with global audiences.

Fidji Simo noted that OpenAI seeks to foster open, constructive dialogue around AI's impact rather than follow traditional corporate communication

models. The company plans to leverage TBN's platform to reach builders, users and industry voices more effectively. Under the agreement, TBN will retain full control over its programming, guest selection and editorial decisions, ensuring credibility and independence remain intact. The integration also signals OpenAI's intent to expand its public engagement strategy amid rapid AI adoption.

By combining editorial storytelling with technological leadership, the company aims to shape informed discourse globally. The move highlights a broader push to connect innovation with transparency, accessibility and real-world understanding of AI developments.

IndianOil assures steady LPG supply, avoid panic amid West Asia tensions

Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) on Friday reassured consumers that liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) supply across India remains stable and sufficient, even as geopolitical tensions continue to disrupt global energy markets.

The country's largest oil marketing company said it is currently delivering around 28 lakh LPG cylinders daily—levels consistent with normal supply prior to the recent global disruptions. IOC emphasised that ensuring uninter-



rupted domestic LPG availability remains its top priority. The company highlighted the growing role of digital platforms in streamlining distribution. Nearly 87% of refill bookings are now made through digital channels such as SMS and IVRS, while deliveries are authenticated

through OTP-based systems to ensure transparency and correct delivery to intended beneficiaries.

Addressing concerns over malpractice, IOC said it has intensified enforcement measures to curb black marketing and hoarding. More than 7,500 inspections have been conducted, with action taken against 141 LPG distributors, including the suspension of five.

In coordination with state authorities and other oil marketing companies, around 68,000 raids have been carried out, leading to 855 FIRs and

the seizure of over 48,000 cylinders.

IOC also noted that it is actively monitoring customer feedback on social media and responding promptly to complaints. Reassuring consumers, the company urged households not to engage in panic booking or unnecessary stocking, stressing that there is no shortage of LPG.

Advised customers to rely only on official communication channels and avoid rumours, reaffirming its commitment to seamless supply and strict oversight of distribution systems.

SEZ duty relief allows limited sales

The government's one-time duty concession for Special Economic Zones (SEZs) is expected to provide manufacturing units limited access to the domestic market while maintaining their export-oriented focus, experts said on Friday.

However, they noted that the relatively modest nature of the relief restricts its full potential, as it is not based on the principle of duty forgone. Gulzar Dwivedi, Partner at Deloitte India, said the move reflects a calibrated shift in India's export strategy, allowing controlled domestic sales without diluting SEZs' core export mandate. The measure is

seen as a cushion for units facing under-utilised capacity and volatile global demand. By enabling concessional duty sales in the domestic tariff area (DTA), it can improve capacity utilisation and support revenue realisation.

Sectors such as electronics, engineering goods and textiles are likely to benefit the most, while sensitive sectors like food, jewellery and animal husbandry remain excluded.

AEPC Chairman A Sakthivel said the relief comes at a critical time, helping exporters manage costs, improve liquidity and maintain production con-

tinuity amid uncertain global demand conditions.

Experts added that simplified implementation and procedural clarity will be crucial for maximising benefits, as excessive compliance requirements could limit uptake by SEZ units.

They also noted that the move signals policy intent to balance export competitiveness with domestic industrial stability.

The one-year window for the concession also suggests a cautious, trial-based approach before considering any long-term policy extension or broader structural reforms.

Bridging the trust deficit across India's life insurance market

In a conversation on Simple Hai, Vivek Law spoke with Satisshwar B. CEO and MD, Bandhan Life, about why life insurance is no longer optional. The core message is simple but powerful: before building wealth, individuals must protect it. Insurance is not an investment choice but a necessary financial safeguard.

In a world where uncertainty is the only constant, the financial conversation in Indian households is quietly shifting. The pandemic may have triggered urgency, but rising healthcare costs are sustaining it. Medical inflation, coupled with the increasing incidence of critical illnesses, is putting pressure on household finances like never before.

The reality is stark. If something happens to the primary breadwinner, the emotional loss is irreplaceable. But financial disruption can still be avoided. Life insurance ensures that families can maintain their standard of living, manage liabilities, and secure long-term goals like education. It allows dependents the space to cope without the added burden of financial stress. In that sense, insurance is less about returns and more about resilience.

How life insurance is being simplified for Indians

For decades, life insurance in India has suffered from one major drawback: complexity. Lengthy paperwork, confusing products, and unclear processes often discouraged first-time buyers. That is now changing, driven by digital innovation and a sharper focus on customer experience.

Satisshwar highlighted how the journey has been simplified significantly. From onboarding to verification, processes like Know Your Customer have become seamless. Digital infrastructure now enables quicker approvals, reduced documentation, and a smoother purchase experience.

What once felt like a cumbersome process is increasingly becoming as easy as any online financial transaction.

More importantly, the product itself is being reframed in simpler terms. Term insurance, often considered the purest form of life insurance, is positioned as an income replacement tool. The

logic is straightforward. If an individual earns ₹6 lakh annually, a typical life cover would be around ₹1 crore. This is based on income multiples, which vary by age. Younger individuals may receive a higher multiple, reflecting their future earning potential, while older individuals may receive a more conservative estimate.

This combination of financial and medical underwriting ensures that coverage remains realistic. It is a scientific approach designed to balance affordability with adequate protection. The simplification of both product and process is critical in expanding insurance adoption across India.

Term life as income replacement

One of the most practical takeaways from the conversation is the framing of term insurance as a direct substitute for lost income.

Rather than viewing it as an abstract financial product, it is positioned as a continuity tool for the household.

Satisshwar explained that life cover is calculated as a multiple of annual income. For someone earning ₹6 lakh per year, the cover typically ranges around ₹1 crore to ₹1.25 crore.

For younger individuals, this multiplier can be significantly higher, sometimes going up to 40 times income, because their earning potential is expected to grow over time.

For individuals closer to mid-career, the multiplier tends to stabilise around 20 times income.

This approach ensures that the family continues to receive a financial stream even in the absence of the bread-

winner. It helps cover everyday expenses, loan obligations, and long-term commitments. The idea is not wealth creation but income continuity.

What makes this even more compelling is the affordability. For many individuals, such coverage can be secured at a relatively low monthly premium, making it accessible across income segments. The earlier one starts, the lower the premium remains, as policies are typically structured with fixed costs over long durations. This reinforces the importance of entering the system early rather than delaying the decision.

Fighting the distrust against life insurance

Despite improvements in accessibility and affordability, one major challenge continues to shadow the insurance industry: trust. For years, consumers have been wary of claim rejections and perceived lack of transparency.

Satisshwar addressed this concern directly, pointing out that most claim disputes arise from incomplete or incorrect disclosure at the time of purchase. Customers often overlook basic health details or delegate form-filling entirely to agents, leading to discrepancies later.

The solution, he emphasised, lies in awareness and responsibility. Customers must take ownership of their applications, ensure that all information is accurate, and review key details before submission. Simple actions like correctly answering health-related questions can significantly reduce the risk of claim rejection. Regulatory changes have also strengthened consumer protection. There are now defined timelines beyond which claims cannot be contested, provided there is no fraud. Additionally, insurers are working to simplify communication with concise policy summaries and post-purchase confirmations.

The larger shift, however, is cultural. Insurance must move away from being seen as a forced purchase to being recognised as a financial essential. When understood correctly and used responsibly, it delivers exactly what it promises: financial security in moments when it is needed the most.

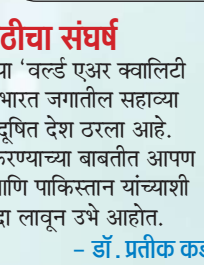

सुनावणी होण्याची शक्यता आहे. दीक्षितचे वडील अमृलाल सोलंकी व बहीण मिताली सोलंकी यांनी ज्येष्ठ वकील सतीश तळेकर व अॅड. माधवी अय्यप्पन यांच्यामार्फत ही रिट याचिका केली आहे. ही याचिका परराष्ट्र मंत्रालय, तसेच बंदरे, नौकानयन व जलमार्ग मंत्रालय, 'डायरेक्टरेट जनरल ऑफ शिपिंग' आणि 'व्ही शिप्स इंडिया' या 'लि.' (जे 'एम्पटी एम्पकेटी व्योम' जहाजाचे व्यवस्थापन करते) यांच्या विरोधात दाखल करण्यात आली आहे.
