# Interpol issues Blue Corner Notice against Luthra brothers

Beach shack demolished; their partner detained

TWO DAYS after the fire at a nightclub in Goa killed 25 people, the Goa Police Tuesday said a Blue Corner Notice has been issued by Interpol against Saurabh Luthra and Gaurav Luthra, the owners of the club, who are believed to be in Thailand. Also Tuesday, Ajay Gupta, a partner in the club, was detained in New Delhi. The fire at Birch by Romeo Lane in North Goa's Apora village started late Saturday night and left four tourists and 21 club staff dead.

The Goa Tourism Department Tuesday demolished a portion of Romeo Lane Goa (Vagator), a beach shack that was also run by the Luthra brothers, which had been sealed by revenue authorities Sunday. The brothers had taken a flight to Phuket at 5.30 am on December 7, hours after the fire at the 65-year-old club that left 21 people with a mutilated left ear, the Delhi High Court on Tuesday directed the police to take "expeditious steps".

The child, an LKO student, was mauled by a pet pitbull on

trace the accused and will also prevent them from immigrating to any other country from their present destination," the Goa Police said in a statement.

Police Tuesday named two more accused, Ajay Gupta and Surinder Kumar Khosla, who is the owner of the property where Birch by Romeo Lane had been operating. Police sources said Gupta, a resident of Gurgaon, is a businessman and is involved in real estate projects in Goa. Khosla, a British national, had leased the property to Luthras.

In a press conference, DIG (Crime & Range) Varsha Sharma said, "While perusing the documents, we found his

(Gupta's) name also. He is one of the partners and an accused in the case." Police said arrest warrants were issued against Gaurav Luthra (44), Saurabh Luthra (40) and Ajay Gupta. Look Out Circulars (LOCs) for the Luthra brothers, Gupta and Khosla were also issued. Gupta was subsequently detained.

DIG Sharma said five persons were arrested in the case so far. "All are from the management of the nightclub. Regarding the owners and partners of the nightclub concerned, we have opened LOC, and Blue Corner Notices in coordination with CBI and Interpol are ongoing, so we apprehend them."

Police said the five arrested were earlier operations managers, who managed day-to-day affairs and looked after the basic operations of the club. The DIG said these managers were being "negligent" in their roles, especially regarding electrical fittings and the putting in place of fire extinguishers.

On Monday, the Goa Police had written to the Regional Passport Office in Goa, requesting urgent revocation of passports of the Luthra brothers. In a communication to police, Goa Nijlo Varghese replied, "The passports are being summoned for questioning."

the seriousness of the matter, RPO Delhi has already issued impounding notices to both the holders of the passports. The Department's action to demolish the Vagator beach property belonged to the Luthra brothers was undertaken in connection with an enforcement order on a falling within the jurisdiction of the department, officials said.

"Upon verification, the encroached portion was found to be illegal and in violation of the applicable regulations, following which demolition action was carried out strictly per law," an official said. "A portion of the shack, about 196 square metres, which had been encroached on the government beach property, abutting two survey numbers, has been demolished. These encroached structures were demolished in July too, but the structures were not demolished. The encroachments have been removed today," said Rodin Masrenhas, Deputy Director, Tourism. Officials said this structure was subjected to demolition in 2024 for similar violations.

Police said statements of two officials who were placed under suspension for allowing the club to operate — former member secretary of Goa State Pollution Control Board, Dr. Sharmila Monteiro, and former director of the Directorate of Panchayat, Siddhi Harlanekar — have been recorded and some government officials are being summoned for questioning.

## 'Only support stolen': Kin of Uttarakhand victims grieve

MANISH SINGH Mahal left his home in Uttarakhand when he turned 18. For four years, he toiled in many metro cities. Last year, when an offer came up in Goa, he grabbed it.

It was good money during the tourist season: Rs 20,000. For a year, he stayed put and could not come home. Finally, his body arrived last night, says his brother, Krishan Mahal, after his last rites were performed in Neta Salun, Champawat, Tuesday. Manish was among the 25 people killed in the fire at a Goa nightclub late Saturday night. Of the 25 dead, 21 were staff at the club, earning between Rs 15,000 and Rs 25,000 a month.

Like Manish, four others from Uttarakhand who worked at the club, died in the blaze. According to their families, due to financial constraints, most of them left home to provide for their families right after they finished school. Manish had recently got his passport made to apply for a job in Thailand. "He was filing for a visa and was to come home on December 31. He had not seen for long, and today, that to carry his body to the bier. How did this day arrive?" asks his father, his voice cracking as he speaks to *The Indian Express* over the phone.

The family received the news of the death Sunday night, after their calls to Manish went unanswered. Manish would call every morning after his shift ended at 7 am on Sunday, when he did not call, the family called him multiple times till noon.

Sumit Negi, one of the five club staff from Uttarakhand, who died in the Goa nightclub fire

"Something felt amiss, and I asked our nephew, who works in another hotel in Goa, to check in on him. In a few minutes, we were told that he was dead," says Krishan Mahal. "The only income for the family of four was the money Manish would send back home. His younger brother is preparing for the exam to join the Agnirathi scheme. "Our only support has been stolen from us. This is gross negligence and should be met with strict action, so others become more careful. No one else should go through what we feel," the father says.

Across the Sarayu River, which separates Champawat and Pithoragarh, another family mourns the loss of their son, 35-year-old Surendra Mahal. He was also cremated Tuesday. Surendra's family was informed about the incident Sunday night by the area's revenue official. Surendra's younger brother, Mahendra Mahal, says, "He (the revenue official) asked us that Surendra Mahal was told us to rush to Goa. Another brother of mine, who works in Mumbai, was told he died in the fire and that the body would be handed over the next day. He collected it and came home last night."

Surendra leaves behind his wife, father, mother and two brothers. He had been working in Pithoragarh when he got an offer in Goa three months ago. "He had gone because of desperation at home. Anyone who gets any opportunity flees the village," says Mahendra, who drives a truck in Pithoragarh. The family knew Manish from across the river. "He was like a brother to us...," says Mahendra. Another man from Uttarakhand who died in the fire was Sumit Negi from Pant Garhwal. His friend, Sachin Rawat, brought the body back. Sachin worked in a club 15 km away from the one at caught fire Saturday. Sumit's last rites were performed in Haridwar Monday. He was the sole earner in the family, comprising his wife, their eight-month-old daughter, his parents, and two sisters. Sumit has been working at the club for seven months and was planning to come home for his daughter's first birthday.

Sachin says he also worked till morning and did not have his break with him when the fire broke out. "When I got out at 7 am, someone told me there was a fire at club nearby... I called Sumit, but he didn't answer. Later, a friend called to tell me over 20 people died," he says. At 1.30 pm the same day, Sachin went to look for him at the club. "I didn't see him. There was one of those affected. I asked the cops there, and they sent me to the police station. They told me to visit the hospital, and I found him there. The duo were childhood friends. They grew up in Chhanni village of Garhwal."

## PITBULL BITES OFF EAR OF 6-YR-OLD Delhi HC asks police to take 'expeditious steps' in FIR

HEARING A petition seeking compensation of at least Rs 25 lakh for a dog attack on a six-year-old child that left him with a mutilated left ear, the Delhi High Court on Tuesday directed the police to take "expeditious steps".

The child, an LKO student, was mauled by a pet pitbull on

November 23 while he was playing outside his house in Northwest Delhi's Prem Nagar. As per the plea filed by the boy's father, the dog had bitten off his son's left ear and also caused other injuries. The pet owner was arrested the same day.

The counsel for MCD, Tusshar Samra, informed the court that the pet was seized by the civic body on November 24.

## Delhi's 900 restaurants, clubs under fire safety lens

IN THE aftermath of the Goa nightclub fire incident, the Delhi Fire Service (DFS) has identified 900 restaurants, hotels and clubs that have a fire safety certificate (NOC) and will carry out inspection to check if they are complying with safety measures. Strict checks have also been launched in Noida and Gurgaon.

clearance certificate in Delhi. On the total number of eateries, hotels, or clubs operating in Delhi, the official said there may be thousands running illegally. "Some establishments do not require an NOC, as their holding capacity is less than 90 sq m," the official added.

Gurgaon Police Commissioner Vikas Kumar Arora on Tuesday ordered an intensive safety audit of all bars, pubs, clubs and late-night restaurants across the city. Special teams from all 36 police stations have been directed to personally inspect every establishment that remains open late or hosts parties. DCP (Headquarters) Dr. Arpit Jain said, "Any establishment found violating safety norms will be served immediate notice and strict legal action, including possible sealing," the CP warned in his written directive to all DCPs, ACPs and station house officers. Haryana Home Secretary Dr. Sumita Mishra has also ordered fire safety audits of all party establishments across the state with reports to be submitted within seven days. Fire officials in Gurgaon are investigating the blaze — where 26 people died in a fire — had flagged lapses such as the absence of fire safety equipment and emergency exits at Apora's Birch by Romeo Lane nightclub, and the lack of required licences.

## 4 hotel employees die after meal at staff quarters in Khajuraho

FOUR HOTEL employees died, and five others were critical after consuming contaminated food at their workplace in Khajuraho in Madhya Pradesh's Chhatrapur district Monday, officials confirmed Tuesday.

The victims, staff members at a local hotel, ate rice with potato curries around 3 pm Monday. By nightfall, all eight began to feel sick. "The victims died during treatment in Gwalior, and another succumbed while being transferred. Several patients remain on ventilators."

The deceased were identified as Prashant Kishore (45), Gita Rajak (35), Ramswaroop Kishore (47), and Bhanu Patel (60), all Khajuraho residents. Among those in critical condition are Roshni Rajak (35), Golu Agrahari (25), and Rav (19).

District Collector Parth Jaiswal announced Rs 20,000 in financial assistance for affected families and said food samples have been sent for forensic examination.

"The matter is being investigated seriously," he said. A health department team has been sent to the hotel to look into the hotel's kitchen operations.

## Two asst profs held for sexual assault of student

Trustati, Andhra Pradesh Police Tuesday arrested two assistant professors of Trustati National Sanskrit University for allegedly sexually assaulting a female student.

The two were identified as Lakshman Kumar, who allegedly held the student and sexually assaulted her in his office, and a Shekhar Reddy, who allegedly held the student and videos to blackmail her, officers said.

Police said the student, who is from outside the state, complained on November 24 to the university management that a video of her being sexually assaulted and accused Kumar of possessing and using it to threaten her. "The student said Kumar was using her private videos to threaten her and blackmail her," Trustati Asst DPM Bhaktavatsalam said. He said the student appeared upset after her November 21 exams. After the hotel woman, who is also a student, checked in with the student, she spoke out. Meanwhile, university VC GS N Krishna Murthy said the varsity has constituted a four-member committee to look into the issue.

## Protests, looting and another farmer's death as fertiliser crisis continues in MP

THE CONTINUING panic among farmers over the fertiliser crisis in Madhya Pradesh has led to protests, looting of trucks carrying urea, and another death of a farmer who stood in line for days at a district-level distribution centre in the state in less than two weeks.

On Monday, 52-year-old Jamuna Kushiwaha collapsed and died waiting in line at the Badoh night fertiliser distribution centre in Tikamgarh district. A resident of Kari Bajarua village, Kushiwaha had been waiting for three consecutive days to secure two bags of urea.

The day he died, he had arrived at the centre without having breakfast. Around noon, he collapsed after vomiting and was rushed to a district hospital, where doctors declared him dead at 3 pm. A postmortem confirmed he suffered a heart attack, officials said.

"The keep looking for fertiliser and urea, but they are not coming," his son said. Kushiwaha's younger brother, Chhalki, said his brother had made the eight-km journey from his village every day to the centre, and claimed the relentless queuing and stress over the fertiliser shortage had deteriorated his health.

This comes less than two weeks after 52-year-old Bhauraj died on November 26 after spending two days in line outside a Tikamgarh Centre Gunadist. A Tikamgarh Deputy Director of Agriculture (DDA) Ashish Sharma said 19,000 tonnes of urea have been distributed and an additional 2,800 tonnes have been requested.

"There is no information about the death at the Badoh night centre. Fertiliser is being given according to dates on tokens," he claimed.

However, farmers alleged the token system was unfair, and said that queues extend for several hours, leaving many returning home empty-handed after standing in line the whole day.

At the local tahsil, Sandhya Gurjar, who transported Kushiwaha to the hospital in his government vehicle after he collapsed, said the situation was chaotic. "Two trucks filled with urea were parked in the market premises. Farmers, who had been searching for fertiliser for a long time, saw the trucks, and a crowd gathered. Some people forcibly took urea bags from the trucks, causing

chaos at the scene," Soni said. While the situation was brought under control, the episode has raised questions about the fertiliser supply chain management in the district.

DDA Ashish Sharma has been scrambling for damage control since the death of Bhauraj, a member of the Saharbiyatri, in November. Days after her death, Union Minister P. K. Mishra, Scindia, the MP from Guna constituency, visited her family, offering condolences and pulling up the local administration.
