Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results section of our report. We are independent of the Group in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us along with the consideration of audit reports of the other auditors referred to in sub paragraph no (a) of the "Other Matters" paragraph below, is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the consolidated annual financial results.

Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to Note No. 5 of the Consolidated Financial Statements wherein the subsidiary of the company has advanced a loan aggregating to Rs 2,250 lakhs during the quarter ended 30 June 2024 to a company in which directors of the subsidiary company are interested. The said loan has been advanced without passing a special resolution by members of the company in the general meeting as required by the Companies Act, 2013. The aforesaid loan along with the interest has been received back by the subsidiary during the year. The statutory auditors of the subsidiary are unable to comment on the likely outcome of the above matter and its consequential impact on the consolidated financial results of the subsidiary, if any, as at and for the year ended 31st March 2025.

Management's and Board of Directors' Responsibilities for the Consolidated Annual Financial Results

The consolidated annual financial results have been prepared on the basis of the consolidated annual financial statements. The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Group and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate implementation and maintenance of accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial consolidated annual financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which



have been used for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated annual financial results by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.

In preparing the consolidated annual financial results, the respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group is responsible for assessing the Group's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group and of its associates is also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of each company.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Annual Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated annual financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of the consolidated annual financial results.

As a part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the annual financial results, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Group to cease to continue as a going concern.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the consolidated annual financial results, including the disclosures, and whether the consolidated annual financial results represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company and such other entities included in the consolidated annual financial results of which we are independent auditors regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit. We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all the relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular No CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.

Other Matters

- (a) The consolidated annual financial results include the audited financial results of one subsidiary, whose financial statements reflects total assets (before consolidation adjustments) of Rs. 4,17,052.41 lakhs as at 31st March 2025, total income (before consolidation adjustments) of Rs 58,397.33 lakhs and total net profit after tax (including other comprehensive income) (before consolidation adjustments) of Rs. 24,652.67 lakhs and net cash inflow of Rs 11,066.42 lakhs for the year ended on that date, as considered in the consolidated annual financial results, which have audited by their respective independent auditors. The consolidated annual financial results also include the Group's share of net loss after tax (before consolidation adjustments) of Rs. 253.27 lakhs, as considered in the consolidated annual financial results, in respect of an associate, whose financial statements have been audited by their respective independent auditors. The independent auditors' reports on the financial statements of these entities have been furnished to us by the management and our opinion on the consolidated annual financial results, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these entities, is based solely on the report of the such other auditors and the procedures performed by us are as stated in paragraph above



- (b) The consolidated annual financial results include the results for the quarter ended 31 March 2025 being the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year, which are subjected to limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.

4. The above consolidated results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of Dhunseri Investments Limited ('the Company') at their respective meetings held on 20 May, 2025 .
5. During the quarter ended 30th June, 2024, the Subsidiary Company had advanced a loan aggregating to ₹ 2,250 lakhs to a Company, in which directors of the Parent Company were interested, without passing a special resolution as required by Section 185 of the Companies Act, 2013 by the Subsidiary Company in the general meeting. Subsequently, the Subsidiary Company had sought votes from the Members in its Annual General Meeting dated 20th August, 2024. However, votes casted in favour of the resolution by the Members are less than three times the number of votes casted against the resolution by the Members and hence special resolution could not be passed. Consequently, the entire loan, along with the applicable interest, has been received back by the Subsidiary Company on 30th August, 2024.
6. The Parent company sold entire holding of 48,09,595 shares of it's erstwhile associate company, Dhunseri Tea & Industries Ltd, to Naga Dhunseri Group Ltd and purchased additional 30,78,759 shares of it's subsidiary, Dhunseri Ventures Ltd during the year.
7. The figures for the last quarter of the current and previous financial year are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published year to date figures up to the end of third quarter of the current and previous financial year which has been subjected to limited review by Statutory Auditors.
8. The Statutory Auditors have audited the financial statements for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2025 and have issued an unmodified opinion thereon. The information presented above is an extract from the audited financial statements as stated.
9. The Directors in their meeting dated 20th May, 2025 have recommended dividend of ₹ 3 per equity share of ₹ 10 each i.e. @ 30% for the financial year ended 31st March, 2025, subject to approval of the Shareholders at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.
10. Nature of Capital Market in which the Company operates is such that the quarterly results do not indicate the likely annual performance.
11. Net gains and/ or loss on fair value change includes gain and/or loss on sale of investments, and changes in fair value as at quarter end on investments held.
12. Figures for previous year have been regrouped/ rearranged wherever necessary.
