8 juveniles escape from observation home

Eight juveniles escaped from a government-run observation home in Chhattisgarh's Mahasarak district in the early hours of Monday, prompting a police search operation, officials said. The minors, aged between 14 and 17 years, fled from the observation home under the City Kotwali police station limits in the wee hours of the day, they said.

The alleged offence came to light on August 1 in Darri-kapa village under Kota police station limits after a tip off, he said.

DMK MLA gets bail over remarks against Vijay

The Madras High Court on Monday granted conditional bail to DMK MLA G V Markandeyan, who was arrested for allegedly making derogatory abusive and threatening remarks against Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C. J. Jayaram. Justice G. K. Rajan granted bail to Markandeyan on the condition that he should appear before the Tuticorin police every day for two weeks, except on Assembly days.

Minor among two held with sword, dagger

Two persons, including a minor, were booked in Latur for allegedly possessing weapons, a police official said on Monday. In separate operations, a sword and a dagger were seized, he added.

RPF staff suspended in assault case

Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw informed Rajya Sabha on Friday that an inter-departmental enquiry committee has been constituted in connection with the alleged assault on a station master by RPF personnel at a station in Agra. Raising the issue in the Upper House, Samajwadi Party MP Ramji Lal Suman sought to know the "status of the action taken so far in connection with the incident that occurred in July this year at Agra Railway Station, wherein RPF personnel assaulted a railway employee".

Four women among 5 held for honey-trap

Police have arrested four women and another person for allegedly honey-trapping a man and trying to extort Rs 1 lakh from him in Maharashtra's Nanded district, officials said on Monday. A woman allegedly lured the victim to Bejanagar on July 31 under the pretext of needing a driver. Once he arrived, he was taken into a house where the accused recorded his photographs and videos in a compromising position, threatened to circulate them on social media and demanded Rs 1 lakh, according to police.

TN SEEKS SC NOD FOR CAUVERY WATER RELEASE

Chief Minister Joseph Vijay led-Tamil Nadu government on Monday approached the Supreme Court seeking directions to the Karnataka government for immediate release of the share of Cauvery water to Tamil Nadu.

Tamil Nadu government standing counsel P. Karunanidhi confirmed the filing of the petition that alleges that the quantum allocated to it by the Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) as well as that released by its neighbour Karnataka was far less.

A CWRC meeting held on July 28 directed Karnataka to release 3,500 cusecs for 15 days starting July 29, an order which was upheld by the CWMA later.

However, the quantum of water released at Biligundlu ranged between 138-550 cusecs from July 29 to August 2, the state government said.

A press release issued by the Tamil Nadu government said that as of August 3, the combined total storage in the reservoirs in Karnataka — KRS, Kabini, Harangi and Hemavathy — stood at 77,337 TMC and Karnataka would face no difficulty in releasing Tamil

Nadu's due share proportionately. Following rains in the catchment areas in the KRS and Kabini dams in Karnataka recently, the proportionate water to be released at Biligundlu should be 28,954 TMC, it said.

"Accordingly, the Cauvery Water Management Authority order allocating 4,336 TMC is very less," the release added. Karnataka has "failed" to share with Tamil Nadu its due share of water and the quantum was 28,954 TMC, the press release said.

Earlier the DMK, the main opposition party in Tamil

Thanjavur (Tamil Nadu): Leading a demonstration in Thanjavur, Leader of the Opposition Udhayanidhi Stalin on Monday fiercely attacked the state government over its handling of the Cauvery water dispute with Karnataka and the distress faced by the agricultural community. Meanwhile, taking to X,

DMK president M K Stalin attributed the plight of Delta farmers due to lack of water in the Cauvery to irrigate their crops to the "negligence" of the TVK administration.

The protest, which witnessed a large turnout of farmers and party cadres, was organised to push for complete waiver of all agricultural loans, immediate



intervention to stop the construction of Karnataka's proposed Makeddu dam as well as official declaration of the Delta districts as drought-affected.

PK ends BJP's 30-year hold on Bankipur seat

Breaking the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) three-decade hold over the Bankipur Assembly constituency, Jan Suraj founder Prashant Kishor on Monday won the by-election by defeating BJP candidate Neeraj Kumar Sinha by 18,224 votes.

Kishor secured 64,151 votes, while Sinha polled 44,827. Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) candidate Rekha Gupta finished a distant third with 14,773 votes. Kishor maintained a lead over the BJP candidate throughout the counting process.

The victory is being seen as a setback for BJP national president Nitin Nabin, who represented the constituency five times. It also marks the first electoral test since the BJP installed Samrat Choudhary as Chief Minister, replacing Janata Dal (United) leader

Unlike the previous Assembly election, when he did not contest, Kishor entered the fray himself in the Bankipur by-poll, emerging as his party's campaign. In the 2025 Assembly elections, Jan Suraj had contested 238 of the state's 243 seats but failed to win any.

During the campaign, Kishor described the by-election as a referendum on Chief

Minister Samrat Choudhary and criticised the BJP for projecting Bankipur as its "stronghold", a claim that analysts believe may have influenced voters.

Former Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) professor Pushpendra Kumar Singh said there was a growing sentiment among sections of the electorate that the BJP should be defeated. He added

that the recent Gen Z demonstrations at Jantar Mantar and the controversial Bhojpur police encounter, in which Bharat Bhushan Tiwari was killed, also influenced voter sentiment across social groups.

Political observers said Kishor managed to draw support from both BJP and RJD vote banks. While the Kapsa community largely backed the BJP, sections of other upper-caste and Other Backward Classes (OBC) voters shifted towards Kishor.

Similarly, some Muslim and Yadav voters, traditionally aligned with the RJD, also supported him, believing he had a stronger chance of defeating the BJP.

Analyst Indrajit Singh said Kishor's campaign focused on education, employment and civic issues instead of caste and religion, helping him establish a stronger connect with voters.

'Bankipur mandate sends message to BJP leadership'

A day after winning the Bankipur Assembly by-election, Jan Suraj founder Prashant Kishor on Monday said the result had sent a strong message to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) that Bihar needed better leadership.

Speaking to reporters, Kishor said that while the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) would remain in power because of its emphatic victory in the last Assembly election, the Bankipur verdict carried an important political message for the BJP.

"The BJP's three-decade fort crumbled in 30 days," he said.

"This election is not just about choosing an MLA. It is about sending a message to the BJP's top leadership that Bihar deserves a capable Chief Minister who can provide better education and employment opportunities. Migration from Bihar must stop, and youths should find employment within the state. The people have delivered that message," he said.

Bihar CM Samrat Choudhary congratulates PK for victory

congratulated Jan Suraj Party founder Prashant Kishor on his victory in the Bankipur Assembly bypoll on Monday.

Kishor won the Bankipur Assembly constituency of Bihar, a BJP bastion which the party had never lost since 1995. In a bypoll that was necessitated after its national president Nitin

Nabin vacated the seat. He defeated his nearest RJP rival Neeraj Kumar by a margin of 18,224 votes.

Commenting Kishor, the chief minister said, "In the grand festival of democracy, we people have chosen Jan Suraj in the Bankipur Assembly bypoll. I respect the people's verdict and extend my heartfelt congratulations to Prashant Kishor ji on his victory."

BJP holds Manjalpur in Gujarat by-poll

The BJP on Monday retained the Manjalpur assembly seat in Gujarat's Vadodra district, with its candidate Satish Patel defeating Congress nominee Bhikhabhai Rahani by more than 30,000 votes in the by-election.

According to the Election Commission, Patel secured 55,481 votes, while Rahani polled 24,851 votes after all 20 rounds of counting, giving the former a winning margin of 30,630 votes. Counting of votes

began at 8 am at Bhavan's School in the Makrapura area of Vadodra amid tight security.

The bypoll, held on July 30, recorded a voter turnout of 373 per cent. The election was necessitated by the death of senior BJP MLA and former Gujarat minister Yogesh Patel on June 2 following a prolonged illness.

The BJP had fielded former Vadodra Municipal Corporation councillor Satish Gvendbhai Patel, while the Congress nominated its Gujarat vice-president and former minister Bhikhabhai Rahani.

BJP targets CPI(M), TMC over terror arrest

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Monday launched a sharp attack on the CPI(M) and the Trinamool Congress (TMC) following the arrest of suspected terror operative Hanin Mondal in East Burdwan, alleging that successive governments had turned West Bengal into first a "safe passage" and later a "safe home" for terrorists and anti-social elements.

Addressing reporters, BJP state president and Rajya Sabha MP Samak Bhattacharya claimed the state's internal security had steadily deteriorated over the years. "During the CPI(M) regime, Bengal became a safe passage for anti-national elements. Under the TMC government, it turned into a safe home. Extremists and anti-social elements believed they enjoyed political patronage, creating an environment in which radical networks could thrive," Bhattacharya alleged.

Mamata ready with new symbol if ECI rejects TMC claim

Amid the tussle between two factions of the Trinamool Congress (TMC), party supremo Mamata Banerjee is said to have readied a "Plan B" if the Election Commission of India (ECI) rejects her faction's claim to retain the party's original election symbol.

Both the Mamata Banerjee faction and the faction led by Leader of the Opposition Ritabrata Banerjee have ap-

proached the ECI, each claiming to be the original TMC and seeking the right to use the party's symbol.

Sources in the Mamata Banerjee camp said that if the ECI does not alter the existing symbol to her faction, the party is prepared to adopt a new symbol, believed to be another flower.

The sources added that the faction is also prepared to challenge any adverse decision in court.

Speaking to reporters, TMC

party's identity was inseparable from Mamata Banerjee. "TMC means Mamata Banerjee. Mamata Didi is an icon. Launching the new symbol is just a matter of time. At least six MPs who defected to the NCP are in touch with us, and over 30 rebel MLAs are either in touch with me or other leaders. Some of them have already spoken directly with Didi. These defections are being engineered by the Bharatiya Janata Party with the help of the state police," Ghosh alleged.

Multiple cloudbursts trigger flash floods across Valley; woman killed

A woman was washed away while hundreds of people were evacuated as multiple cloudbursts struck the Valley on Monday, triggering flash floods in several districts, officials said.

Naseema Begum (52) was washed away in a flash flood caused by a cloudburst as she was trying to manoeuvre across a culvert over a swollen stream in Lohab area of Kupwara district, officials said.

Her body was later recovered downstream near Shahabad.

A mosque and a footbridge were also damaged due to

Kerala rain: 15 dead, seven missing, says CM Satheesan

Thiruvananthapuram:

Chief Minister V D Satheesan

on Monday said that the death toll in rain-related incidents across Kerala has risen to 15, while seven people remain missing, and the overall situation was under control as the state intensified rescue and relief operations amid continuing heavy rain.

Addressing a press conference after chairing a joint emergency meeting of the State Disaster Management Authority, Satheesan said the government had reviewed

the situation across the state and found that conditions were under control in all districts except a few areas in Puthamthitta.

He said that as part of the preparedness, 14 fishing boats from Kollam have been deployed to Chengannur for rescue operations.

Two helicopters from Sohar (Tamil Nadu) have reached Thiruvananthapuram. One National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) team has been deployed in the affected area.

dipora district, officials said, adding that some bridges and roads have been damaged due to the flash floods.

Authorities evacuated hundreds of people including tourists to safer places in Shoppan and Pahalagam as water levels in local streams are rising rapidly.

As many as 80 persons have been evacuated in Shoppan, while around 200 have been moved to safety in Pahalagam, officials said.

We have Gandhi, no need to look at Bangladesh or Nepal: Dipke

In an interview to PTI at his house in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar, Dipke also spoke on CJP's expansion plans, compensation to kin of NEET aspirants who died by suicide and allegations the state of education in India.

Nasreen's comment drawing a parallel between the CJP's Delhi protest against exam irregularities and the 2024 stir that ousted Sheikh Hasina's Awami League regime.

"Protests in Bangladesh, Nepal are being used to de-

fame us who are different," he asserted.

"We showed during the recent protest in Delhi that we were following the Constitution and holding our demonstration peacefully. Parallels to the protests in Bangladesh and Nepal are being used to defame us."

"We don't need to look at Bangladesh or Nepal when we have Mahatma Gandhi from whom the world takes inspiration to protest," Dipke said. People are talking about Bangladesh and Nepal protests because police brutality may have reminded them of the scenes in those countries, he said.

He saved lives in Bhiwandi, pothole crash claimed his

A 31-year-old Thane Disaster Response Force (DRF) member, who had recently taken part in rescue operations after the Kohnoor building collapse in Bhiwandi, died after his motorcycle hit a pothole on the Mumbai-Nashik Highway near Shalapur on Monday morning.

The deceased, identified as Vikas Lahu Gore, was a resident of Ramane village on the Shalapur-Sarlambe Road. He is survived by his wife Kavita and twin daughters.

The National Highways authority said the pothole at the accident site had since been repaired and three teams were filling potholes daily along a 60km stretch.

"However, continuous heavy rainfall and the movement of heavy vehicles are causing new potholes to develop," said Shashank Adke of the Project Implementation Unit, Nashik, National Highways.

According to police and local sources, Gore was travelling to work when the accident occurred on the

Shirangi River bridge. Preliminary information suggested that he failed to spot a deep pothole on the rain-soaked highway, lost control of his motorcycle and was thrown onto the road before crashing into the central divider.

Gore suffered severe injuries, including critical trauma to his lower body. Passers-by and local residents took him to Shalapur

Sub-District Hospital, where doctors declared him dead during treatment.

DRF officer Sachin Dubey described Gore as one of the force's dedicated rescuers. He said Gore had been associated with the Disaster Response Force since 2019 and became a permanent member in 2024.

The accident has renewed scrutiny of the condition of the Mumbai-Nashik Highway. Residents alleged that road maintenance authorities had failed to carry out timely repairs despite repeated complaints.

Expressing anger over the death of an emergency responder, they demanded immediate repairs and accountability. Gore's wife Kavita said one of their twin daughters was unwell and her husband assured her that he would return from duty and take the child to hospital. One of his classmates said, "Whenever there was an emergency, he would be among the first to respond. Ironically, a man who rescued so many people became a victim of administrative negligence."

Dog trainer dies in trek mishap

A 22-year-old dog trainer died after allegedly slipping into a deep gorge while trekking to KP Waterfall in Khajapur on Sunday evening. His body was recovered around 2.30am on Monday following an overnight rescue operation in heavy rain and difficult terrain by Khopoli Police, HELP Foundation volunteers and local youths.

The deceased, identified as Abhishek Hariram Kuswaha, a resident of Dhokali Naka in Thane (West), had travelled with friends Sahil Harjan, 17, Deva Gaydhankar, 22, and Sahil Sawant, 18, to the popular monsoon trekking spot.

According to police, the group was trekking between Zenith Waterfall and KP Waterfall at around 7pm when Kuswaha allegedly lost his footing. His companions searched for him for several hours but failed to locate him in the darkness. Without torches or rescue equipment, they reached Zenith Thakurwadi around 11.30pm and alerted local residents.

Villagers informed the HELP Foundation and Khopoli police, who launched a search operation. After ques-

tioning the trekkers and examining mobile phone videos, rescuers concluded Kuswaha had fallen into the gorge.

Despite heavy rain, dense vegetation, slippery slopes and poor visibility, the teams continued searching through the night. Kuswaha was found in the gorge around 2.30am but had succumbed to his injuries. His body was retrieved using ropes and a bucket stretcher before being taken to Khopoli Municipal Council Hospital.

Police Inspector Sachin Hire said the operation required exceptional coordination due to the challenging conditions. HELP Foundation founder Garunath Sathidar said volunteers continued despite the risks, hoping the trekker could still be rescued.

Special relief for flood-hit Palghar, Vasai-Virar

Palghar: The state government has issued a Government Resolution (GR) announcing a special financial assistance package for families affected by the July floods in Palghar district and the Vasai-Virar Municipal Corporation area.

Flood-affected and displaced families will get ₹10,000 for the loss of clothing and ₹20,000 for household articles, taking the total assistance to ₹30,000 per family. The government has also sanctioned ₹15 lakh for fully damaged pucca and kutcha houses, ₹50,000 for houses with 50% structural damage, ₹25,000 for 25% damage and ₹15,000 for houses with 15% damage. Eligible huts in recognised urban slum areas will receive ₹15,000.

Shopkeepers, stall owners and artisans will receive 75% of losses, subject to a maximum of ₹50,000 for shops and ₹20,000 for stalls. The package also provides compensation for livestock and fisheries losses, including ₹40,000 per milch animal, ₹32,000 per large draught animal, ₹20,000 per small draught animal and assistance for damaged boats and fishing nets.

Overnight rains cripple Bhiwandi

Torrential overnight rain brought Bhiwandi to a standstill on Monday. Flooding low-lying areas, disrupting traffic and pushing the Karmori River above the danger mark.

The downpour, which began late Sunday night, inundated Nadi Naka, Edghar Road, MHADA Colony, Bandar Mohalla, Khadiapur and Tandul Mohalla. Water entered several houses, damaged belongings and forced some residents to move to safer places.

A strong current in the Karmori River submerged vehicles parked near the riverfront. A video of a minibus being swept away by the swollen river circulated widely on social media.

Commercial activity was also hit as waterlogging affected the main vegetable market and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Chowk. Traders and vegetable vendors reported losses, while customers faced difficulty accessing submerged market areas.

Widespread water in Edghar stranded women, children and senior citizens, while impassable roads caused traffic congestion.

The local administration alerted residents in vulnerable riverbank areas and deployed disaster management and civic teams for round-the-clock monitoring. The India Meteorological Department forecast further heavy rain and advised citizens to avoid unnecessary travel and stay away from rivers, streams and overflowing drains.

₹100 cr from bars: ED gets nod to prosecute Anil Deshmukh

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday submitted a letter granting permission to prosecute former home minister Anil Deshmukh for alleged money laundering. The agency obtained the approval from the Governor of Maharashtra on May 21. The letter conveying this was submitted before the special court by ED prosecutor Sunil Gonsalves.

The case dates back to 2021, when former Mumbai Commissioner of Police Param Bir Singh, in a letter to then chief minister Uddhav Thackeray, alleged that

Deshmukh had instructed certain police officers, including now incarcerated Sachin Vaze, to collect ₹100 crore every month from bars and restaurants in the city.

Thereafter, CBI had on April 21, 2021, registered a case against Deshmukh and others. After CBI, ED too had initiated a probe into money laundering wherein it said that Vaze had collected ₹4.70 crore from owners of orchestra bars between December 2020 and January 2021. The funds were allegedly handed over to Deshmukh through his personal assistant Kundan Shinde.

No anticipatory bail for nat'l footballer in fake degree case

A sessions court has rejected the anticipatory bail plea of 27-year-old national-level footballer Sahdev Patil, accused of securing a Central government auditor's job by submitting a fake BCom degree certificate.

The court said Patil's custodial interrogation was necessary to determine how he obtained the allegedly forged certificate.

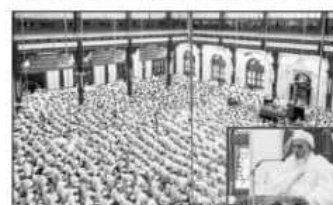
According to the prosecution, Patil, who was a goalkeeper for India, was appointed as an auditor under the sports quota in the office of the Principal Accountant General (Audit), Mumbai. During verification,

the Audit-I office allegedly found the BCom degree certificate submitted by him was fake.

The applicant prima facie submitted the said BCom degree certificate and obtained a Central Government job. Thus, the nature of the offence is very serious, the court observed. Patil approached the court after the Azad Maidan police

booked him for allegedly submitting the fake degree. He claimed that he had completed an admission form on Aris University's website, paid the fees and appeared for the examination.

His lawyer argued that Patil may have been a victim of a racket involved in issuing fake certificates. Opposing the plea, prosecutor Vijay Malankar said Patil had submitted a fake BCom degree certificate and marksheet to obtain the auditor's post. When the documents were sent to the university for verification, it reportedly informed the authorities that Patil had never taken admission and that his identity details and other documents were fake.

"Syedna's words on discipline made me think about how I approach my studies," said 15-year-old Ansal Abbas. "He reminded us that hard work is not just about achieving results; it is about building character. I am leaving today with a clearer sense of how I want to discipline my own routine, whether it is my studies or how I spend my time outside school."

Husain Dhoondia, a 40-year-old Mumbai-based manufacturer of fumigation and scientific devices, said the sermon reinforced the importance of perseverance. "There is no shortcut to success, only hard work," he said.
