# Reciprocal tariffs 'soon' for India, China: Trump

● Reiterates stance on tariff structures with India

US PRESIDENT DONALD Trump has said that his administration will "soon" impose reciprocal tariffs on countries such as India and China, reiterating what he had said during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent visit to the US capital. Trump was speaking at the swearing-in of commerce secretary Howard Lutnick when he made the announcement, reiterating what he told PM Modi last week.

"We'll soon impose reciprocal tariffs because that means, they charge us, we charge them. It's very simple. Whatever a company or a country, such as let's say India or China or any of them, whatever they charge, we want to be fair... so reciprocal. Reciprocal meaning, 'they charge us, we charge them,'" Trump said in Washington.

"We haven't done that, we have never done that. We are getting ready to do it," he added. Earlier on Tuesday, Fox News aired a joint television interview with Trump and billionaire Elon



## Prez orders revival of tariff retaliation against digital taxes

PRESIDENT DONALD TRUMP on Friday ordered his trade chief to revive investigations aimed at imposing tariffs on imports from countries that levy digital service taxes on US technology companies. A White House official, providing details of the order, said Trump was directing his administration to consider

responsive actions like tariffs "to combat the digital service taxes (DSTs), fines, practices, and policies that foreign governments levy on American companies."

"President Trump will not allow foreign governments to appropriate America's tax base for their own benefit," the official said. —REUTERS

Musk when the president said that he made it clear to PM Modi that India will not be spared from Washington's reciprocal tariffs and emphasised that

"nobody can argue with me" on tariff structure.

During the interview, Trump reiterated his stance on existing tariff structures between the US

and its partners, including India. "I told Prime Minister Modi yesterday — he was here — I said, 'Here's what we're going to do: reciprocal. Whatever you charge, I'm charging,'" Trump said. Hours before his bilateral meeting with Modi, Trump announced that the US will impose reciprocal tariffs on trading partners.

On Friday, Trump praised the newly sworn-in commerce secretary Howard Lutnick and said, "Howard understands something about business." President Trump also said how before Covid hit, the US had "the greatest economy in the history of the world," and added, "But tariffing is going to be very interesting and Howard's going to be in-charge of it." Trump also cracked a joke about how 'tariff' was his favourite word once but he was forced to relegate it to fourth place after 'family', 'love' and 'God'. "I think, let's put God first. You know why, because we don't want to take any chances." "I did that once, I said, 'tariff' is my favourite word. The fake news went out and they really got me and they said, 'What about God, family, relationship... a couple of words. I said, 'You are right!'" Trump said as others in the room giggled. "So, I've made it my fourth favourite word."

# Gift tickets, mall screenings: Dubai braces for a Sunday humdinger

● Fans jostled to see cricketers ahead of India-Pak match

SECURITY GUARDS OUTSIDE the ICC Academy in Dubai have struggled to control hundreds of eager fans jostling to catch a glimpse of the Indian team's practice session on the eve of the much-anticipated game against Pakistan. Anyone with a lanyard and an access ID is being asked about passes for the big Champions Trophy match. Tears stream down a child's face after missing out on a Babar Azam selfie outside the Dubai International Stadium.

After a quiet start to the tournament in Dubai, the India-Pakistan game is generating great excitement. There is a downside though — the cheapest ticket for a seat in the 30,000-seater Dubai International Stadium costs Rs 12,000 or 500 dirhams. For the lucky few, an Indian businessman is a saviour. Anis Sajjan, the vice-chairman of Danube Group, used a lucky draw to distribute 100 match tickets as a Ramadan gift to his blue-collar workforce, a majority of them from India and Pakistan. He has also organised a special screening for those who missed out on the free tickets. "Cricket is more than just a sport, it is an emotion that unites people across borders. Many of our blue collar workers are devoted cricket fans, but the high ticket prices and overwhelming demand make

attending a live match a distant dream. Watching their cricketing idols live in action will be an unforgettable experience for them," Sajjan said.

With nearly 3.7 million Indians and 1.7 million Pakistanis in the UAE, demands for tickets have gone through the roof. Sajjan is not the only business tycoon giving tickets as a gift for cricket-obsessed employees. "We always get gifts from our owners during Ramadan. This time since we got to know in advance that the match is happening here, our bosses have gifted match tickets for the game. If not, there was no way we would have been able to buy tickets," Rakesh, who works in the hospitality industry in Dubai, said.

A cinema chain is screening the game 'live' and malls are reportedly facing a staff crunch on Sunday as leave applications have piled up. For 'hosts' Pakistan, the game in Dubai is a do-

or-die one after their loss in the opener against New Zealand. After waiting for nearly three decades to host an ICC event, Mohammad Rizwan's team is starting at an early exit. None other than the Pakistan Prime Minister had reminded its players of the high stakes. "...the real task now is to not only win the Champions Trophy but also defeat our arch-rival," Shehbaz Sharif had weighed in earlier this month.

What's guaranteed is a full house at the Dubai International Stadium with all roads leading to the Sports City — roads are set to be closed for security reasons from 9 am for a 1 pm start. Sharjah, 46 minutes away by road, was the spiritual home of India vs Pakistan cricket in the 80s and 90s, but those in Dubai will hope for a modern classic despite the evident gulf in class between the sides in the 50-over game.

In ODIs in Dubai, India,

2023 World Cup finalists, have won both the previous games against Pakistan, while in T20Is, the latter has won two out of three meetings.

The players didn't meet each other on match eve. India trained at the ICC Academy while Pakistan at the Dubai Stadium. To avoid any possible tension between fan groups, the local India and Pakistan communities have decided to hold separate screenings.

On the eve of the game, in-form batsman Shubman Gill was asked if the games between the two sides were over-hyped. "India-Pakistan has a long history. It's an exciting contest when both these teams play. Everyone enjoys watching it. If so many people are happy to watch the match, then who are we to say that it is under-hyped or over-hyped? We go there to play cricket," Gill said. "I think it is a big match, but I think the biggest match would obviously be the final that the team plays," he said.

Pakistan coach Aaqib Javed acknowledged the importance of a win if Pakistan are to stay alive in the tournament.

"There is no game which you play without pressure. We lost to New Zealand which has a good balance. We still have a chance to qualify. Against India, it doesn't matter if it is a must win or not. All of our players are waiting to raise the bar," Javed said. India, despite being without strike bowler Jasprit Bumrah, and an out-of-form Virat Kohli, will have an edge going into the match. Whichever way the result goes, fans will be hoping for a modern classic contest in Dubai.

# Berkshire Hathaway's record profit again

WARREN BUFFETT'S BERKSHIRE Hathaway on Saturday posted its third straight record annual operating profit, bolstered by large increases in

underwriting earnings and investment income in its insurance businesses. Operating profit rose 27% to \$47.44 billion in 2024 from \$37.35 billion a year earlier.

Fourth-quarter operating profit also set a record, rising

71% to \$14.53 billion, or about \$1,010 per Class A share, from \$8.48 billion a year earlier, reflecting gains in its insurance operations and from foreign currency changes.

Quarterly net income

totalled \$19.69 billion, or \$13,695 per average equivalent share, as the value of Berkshire's holdings in Apple, American Express and other stocks increased.

For the year, net income totalled \$89 billion.
