US PRESIDENT PRAISES ASIAN COUNTERPARTS IN INTERVIEW

Modi tough, great leader: Trump

Says Xi, Indian PM greatest leaders in power, leverage

Washington, June 20

US PRESIDENT DONALD Trump lavished praise on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying he is a 'great leader' and 'tough guy', who has been in power for more than 12 years.

In an interview with Axios, Trump referred to China's President Xi Jinping and Modi as the two greatest leaders he likes the most in terms of power and leverage, and the ability to execute on that. "I think Modi is very good. They've had some very good numbers announced. He stays out of wars, which is smart. He's 1.5 billion people. He's actually the biggest. India's actually the biggest. And Modi's a great leader," Trump said in response to a question on the two greatest leaders he likes the most for their power, leverage and the ability to deliver results.

Trump said the US does a lot of business with India, which earlier used to "rip us off."

"And we do a lot of business

And we do a lot of business with them, but now we do fair business. They used to really rip us off. I don't blame them for that. But now we do a lot of business.

with them, but now we do fair business. They used to really rip us off. I don't blame them for that. You know, we had stupid politicians that allowed that. But now we do a lot of business," Trump said. "They're not that happy about it because they used to do a lot better. So Modi's great," Trump said.

The US President hailed Xi as a leader of great stature and confidence. "If you were going to make a movie about either one of them, you wouldn't be able to find the man in Hollywood," Trump said. "Modi is a very different way, just highly respected. I know the real Modi is a very tough cookie," Trump said.

Trump and Modi met on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in France in an attempt to repair the relationship between the two countries that has been under strain. Trump said he had watched India over the years and seen leaders change quite often. "Somebody would be there for six months and then a year. And then all of a sudden, PM Modi ended up; he's been there for more than 12 years, very solid. And he does it through, there's a great calmness, and yet he's not a calm person. He's a very tough guy," Trump said.

Trump-Meloni spat deepens

Rome: ITALIAN PRIME MINISTER Giorgia Meloni told US President Donald Trump on Saturday to look after his own popularity after he accused his NATO ally of trying to boost her domestic ratings by repairing ties.

Escalating the ongoing diplomatic feud, Trump on Saturday reiterated his claim that Meloni repeatedly sought a photograph with him during the recent G7 summit in France, alleging that "she



wants to be friends again in order to get her numbers up." The remarks deepen the spat that began this week with the Republican president's inter-

view with an Italian broadcaster, during which Trump claimed Meloni "begged" for the photo during the G7 meeting in France.

Meloni has called that claim "completely fabricated." The dustup led Italy's foreign minister to cancel a planned trip to the US.

Responding to the comment, Meloni posted on Instagram: "President Trump, these constant, unprovoked attacks are senseless." **REUTERS**

John Jumper to leave Google DeepMind for Anthropic

GOOGLE DEEPMIND VICE PRESIDENT John Jumper, who won the 2024 Nobel Prize in chemistry for his work on artificial intelligence, is leaving the company to join Anthropic PBC.

"After nearly 9 years, I have decided to leave Google DeepMind and join Anthropic," Jumper posted on X.

"Demis Hassabis took a real chance letting me lead the AlphaFold team just six months after finishing my PhD."

A spokesperson for Google DeepMind confirmed Jumper's departure and said the company was grateful for his contributions in advancing science and AI.

Bangladesh PM to visit China, Malaysia on first overseas trip

BANGLADESH PRIME MINISTER Tarique Rahman will travel to China next week to secure infrastructure financing and deepen trade ties during his first overseas tour since taking office in February. The twin-country trip kicks off in Malaysia on Sunday, Foreign Secretary Asad Alam

Siam said at a media briefing in Dhaka on Saturday.

Rahman will hold bilateral talks with Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim in Malaysia from June 21-22, where Dhaka plans to press Kuala Lumpur to absorb more Bangladeshi expatriate workers. During the

China leg, Rahman will attend the World Economic Forum's Summer Davos in the port city of Dalian. He will then head to Beijing for talks with Premier Li Qiang on June 25 and President Xi Jinping on June 26. In Beijing, Rahman is scheduled to sign up to 17 deals, including 13 memorandums of understanding.

Matheus Cunha stars in Brazil's 3-0 win over Haiti

MATHEUS CUNHA SPEAKS six languages, a reflection more of his scattered career in Europe than his linguistic afflictions. He speaks Portuguese, Spanish, French, English, German and Italian. He talks the language of dance, sometimes he rides an imaginary wave like a surfer; sometimes he swims on the ground. He trades the language of goals, too. Reinstituted to the starting eleven after the Igor Thiago faux pas, his brace allayed fears of a campaign unravelling and became a somewhat unlikely hero.

He loves the spectacular — his album of goals in the Premier League has long-rangers, grass-trimming beauties, chipped devils and late-bending dervishes. He is not exactly a throwback to the Brazilian forwards with a magic wand for legs, but he certainly produces joyfulness that is the soul of Brazilian football. Goals, dance, joy — the perfect Brazilian symphony. Like the second goal — a brutish left-footed finish, like the clank of a machete. Even before Vinicius Junior had gathered the ball from a Casemiro clearance, he had begun to gallop. Vinicius wove an eye-of-the-needle through-ball.

Two touches took him away from the goal; a third would have given the balance, but it could have afforded more time to the retreating Haitian defenders to snatch the ball off his toes. So in a split second, he decided to leather the ball into the top left corner past the goalkeeper Johnny Placide, slightly off-balance and on the floor after the strike. He dragged himself back to the feet, and then he plunged to the dewy turf, flapping his arms.

Un-Brazilian goal
But the scrapper goal pleased the manager Carlo Ancelotti more. It not only settled the mounting nervousness, but also vindicated his decision to reinstate Cunha, a decoy number nine in place of the centre forward Igor Thiago. Cunha has understated virtues that makes him a manager's favourite. He runs hard, back and forth, he is quick, drops deep to help out the midfielders and defenders, tackles (sometimes over-zealously), and brings raw energy. The first goal also originated from Cunha's industri-

The goal was un-Brazilian, but timely. Anxiety nearly muted the yellow wave under stands canopied like the wings of an eagle, an ode to the local soccer team Philadelphia Eagles. But Brazil could breathe. The fans frolicked in the vast stands, hooting their miniature vuvuzelas, which had made a shrieking comeback in the tournament. But the strike before the 23rd minute portage would bother Brazil. It seemed a rerun

of their Morocco game in its turgid disorder. They could neither muster a coherent move nor assert themselves on their plucky counterparts, who were content in rolling the shutters down on the box, but counterattacked briskly when they offered with a sniff. Brazil were still lethargic in the midfield and toothless in the final third.

Steadily, the jarring chords un-jarred; notes and tempo fell in place. And then came the second goal, an electric dance, Cunha joined by his teammates. Celebration set in more feverishly. Vinicius, who enjoyed one of his finest nights in the Brazilian shirt, tucked in the third before half time.

The second half was a scrap, strewn with phases wherein Haiti slashed their back-line, but let down by horrendous finishing. Brazil's forwards knocked on Haiti's doors numerous times, but without the dead-eye finishing that would have added heft to their victory. Defensive susceptibility could cost the tournament. The malaise is two fold. Their full-backs are sluggish, neither play-making like modern full-backs not defending like the old-school one. Both Casemiro and Bruno Guimaraes are not press-resistant in the modern sense. They are excellent in positional play and one-on-one situations, but they could be over-run. In short, Gabriel and Marquinhos have to control large swathes of their territory. In short, though Brazil netted three goals, they are still reliant on moments of individual genius. A Vinicius moment; or a Cunha burst; or a reassuring Gabriel header; or a Marquinhos clearance. Worse, they lost forward Raphinha to an injury in the first half, even though Endrick and Gabriel Martinelli looked fluid.

India to host key 2-day BRICS security conclave

China's Wang Yi to arrive; Russia, Iran too will participate

New Delhi, June 20

CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER Wang Yi, Russian national security adviser Sergei Shoigu and other top BRICS security officials will converge in New Delhi on Monday for a two-day conclave that will focus on pressing geopolitical and regional security challenges. The conclave of BRICS National Security Advisers will be chaired by NSA Ajit Doval.

China has already announced that Wang Yi will attend the deliberations. The Chinese foreign minister is also expected to hold a bilateral meeting with Doval.

It is learnt that Iranian Supreme National Security Council's Deputy Secretary Nezamipour is also expected to join the conclave that is set to prepare the grounds for the BRICS summit to be held in September in India.

New Delhi is hosting the summit in its capacity as the current chair of the influential grouping. BRICS, originally comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa, expanded in 2024 to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates, with Indonesia joining in 2025.

The BRICS has emerged as an influential grouping as it brings together 11 major emerging economies of the world, representing around 49.5% of the global population. The top BRICS security officials are expected to deliberate extensively on the

Gangtok: SIKKIM GOVERNOR OM Prakash Mathur on Saturday flagged off the first batch of pilgrims of the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra 2026 through the Nathu La.

The group, comprising 32 men and 12 women from states across India, proceeded towards Gyangze in the Tibet Autonomous Region, a key halt on the route to the revered Mount Kailash and Lake Mansarovar. **PTI**

overall regional security scenario including the situation in West Asia as well as the Russia-Ukraine conflict.

The Indian side is likely to raise its concerns over terrorism including cross-border terrorist activities targeting Jammu and Kashmir by terror groups based in Pakistan. The Pakistan-Afghanistan hostilities may too figure in the deliberations, sources said.

"During the meeting, the National Security Advisers / Heads of Delegation of BRICS member countries will exchange views on the theme 'Non-traditional security challenges confronting the world today'" the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

It said the officials will also discuss the rapidly evolving nature of national security challenges, as well as the role of new technologies in emerging security threats.

"The National Security Advisers/Heads of Delegation will also review the outcomes of the recently held BRICS joint working groups on counter-terrorism, and on security in the use of information and communication technologies," it said in a statement. The BRICS foreign ministers' meeting in May had ended without a joint statement as sharp differences between Iran and the UAE over the West Asia conflict were on full display. BRICS operates under a framework of consensus and India had issued a chair's statement and outcome document featuring two specific paragraphs where unanimity could not be reached.
