FROM STRENGTH TO SCALE

Scale. Speed. Solidity.

For four decades, Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited has built its business on a clear proposition: that Lucknow's housing market rewards land discipline, diligent execution and an intimate understanding of local demand. FY26 is the year this proposition converted into visible scale. Booking value more than doubled to ₹743.9 crore, area booked crossed 10.8 lakh square feet, and the Company secured three large projects in Lucknow's prime growth corridors with cumulative GDV of nearly ₹2,000 crore. Together with the existing project portfolio, these additions strengthened Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited ("EHIL") medium-term development visibility.



What makes this **Scale** credible, rather than opportunistic, is its origin. It did not arrive through a single large transaction or an aggressive land bet. It arrived through the compounding of a franchise built project by project since 1985: Eldeco City, Eldeco Regalia, Eldeco Imperia and, most recently, Eldeco Solano Gardens, each an extension of the template before it, each adding to the Company's standing with the Lucknow Development Authority, its contractors and the homebuyers who have watched the group deliver across successive generations. The response to Solano Gardens, with 343 of 433 units sold and over ₹384 crore booked within days of launch, is a strong confirmation of Eldeco's brand value.

Scale of this kind means little without the operating **Speed** to convert it into delivered value, and FY26 demonstrated that capability as well. Eldeco Imperia Phase 2 received its completion certificate ahead of the committed customer schedule. Construction spend rose 14% to ₹177.7 crore during the year, expanding in step with the pipeline rather than ahead of it.

None of this scale or speed would be durable without the Balance Sheet **Discipline** that has always distinguished EHIL within its category. The business remains substantially self-funded with a comfortable mix of debt financing, insulating the business from interest rate cycles to a degree few developers of

comparable scale can claim. A final dividend of 450% i.e. ₹9/- per equity share, sustained through a year of heavy reinvestment in land and construction, is itself evidence of this discipline.

Scale, Speed and Solidity are not separate achievements for EHIL in FY26. They are one story told three ways: a franchise deep enough to be trusted with more land, an operating system fast enough to turn that land into cash flow, and a balance sheet sound enough to fund the entire cycle without diluting shareholders or over leveraging the Company.

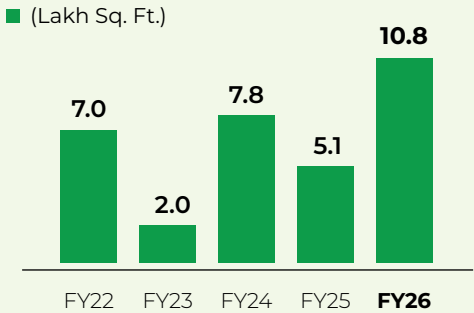

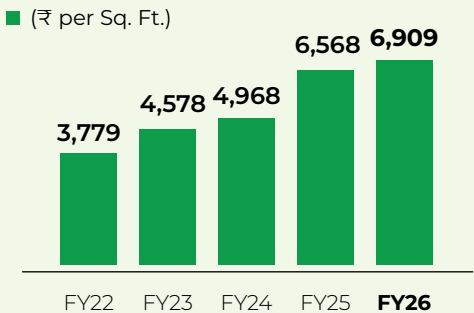

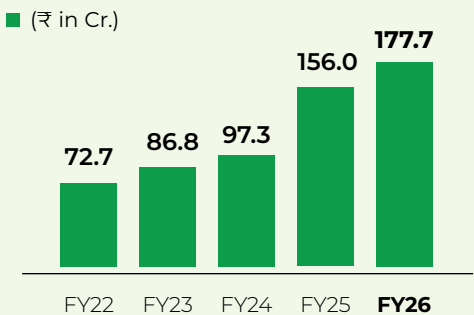

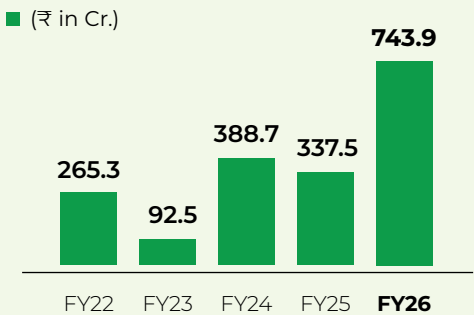

The Company focuses on emerging and established micro-markets that benefit from strong infrastructure connectivity, expanding social infrastructure, and favourable urban growth trends. Lucknow continues to be among the fastest-growing Tier-II real estate markets in India, supported by rapid urbanisation, infrastructure investments, metro connectivity, educational institutions, and increasing economic activity.

Today, EHIL stands at the intersection of a trusted franchise, a growing development pipeline, and proven execution capabilities, providing a strong foundation for sustained value creation in the Lucknow real estate market.

1975-1985

Foundation of the Eldeco Group by S.K. Garg and commencement of the Company's journey in real estate development.

The Company was listed on the Bombay Stock Exchange in Sep, 1990, establishing a platform for long-term growth.

2006-2015

Launched the landmark 133-acre Eldeco City township, one of Lucknow's most prominent residential developments. The decade was marked by large-scale project deliveries and growing brand recognition across North India.



2016-2022

Continued strengthening the Company's leadership position in Lucknow through successful project launches and deliveries. Achieved listing on the National Stock Exchange of India Limited in 2022 and recorded then-highest annual bookings of ₹265 crore and collections of ₹152 crore.

2023-2024

Entered a phase of accelerated growth, achieving record bookings of ₹388 crore and highest-ever area booked of 7.8 lakh sq. ft., reflecting strong demand and growing market leadership.

2025

Successfully launched Eldeco Trinity, the Company's ultra-luxury residential offering. Recorded highest-ever realization of ₹6,568 per sq. ft. and construction spend of ₹156 crore, highlighting increasing premiumisation and execution intensity.

2026

A landmark year in the Company's evolution. Achieved all-time high sales bookings of ₹743.9 crore and collections of ₹352.1 crore. Successfully launched Eldeco Solano Gardens and strengthened the development platform through the addition of three strategic land parcels with development potential of approximately ₹2,000 crore GDV.

STRATEGY

Scale, Speed and Solidity define FY26

Over four decades, EHIL has built a real estate franchise founded on trust, execution, excellence and financial discipline. FY26 highlighted the strength of this foundation, with the Company's operational and financial progress reflected through three defining pillars Scale, Speed and Solidity.



Scale - Expanding the Development Platform

For EHIL, scale is not measured by geographical expansion, but by the ability to execute multiple developments concurrently while maintaining operational efficiency, customer satisfaction, and prudent capital allocation.

FY26 reflected a meaningful step in this direction. The Company ended the year with five ongoing projects and secured three new land parcels in Lucknow's key growth corridors, adding approximately ₹2,000 crore of Gross Development Value (GDV) to the growth pipeline. Booking value reached a record ₹743.9 crore, growing 120% year-on-year, while area booked increased 109.5% to 10.77 lakh sq. ft., reflecting strong demand across projects and market segments.

The successful launch of Eldeco Solano Gardens emerged as a key milestone during the year, with approximately 5.11 lakh sq. ft. booked and booking value of ₹384.5 crore. Together with an expanding portfolio of ongoing and forthcoming developments, the Company operated a broader and more diversified project platform during FY26 than at any point in its history.



Speed - Converting Opportunities into Execution

A key differentiator for EHIL has been its ability to efficiently convert land acquisitions into development opportunities and translate project plans into customer bookings and completed developments.

During FY26, two of the three newly secured land parcels were acquired through development authority auctions, providing greater execution visibility and enabling faster progression towards project development. The Company also received the Completion Certificate for Eldeco Imperia Phase 2 during the year, further demonstrating its focus on timely execution and delivery readiness.

Construction expenditure increased by 14% year-on-year to ₹177.7 crore, supporting continued progress across ongoing projects. Simultaneously, collections grew by 39% to ₹352.1 crore, reflecting strong execution, improved cash conversion, and the ability to monetize developments effectively.

The combination of disciplined project execution, efficient approvals management, and timely delivery continues to support customer confidence and reinforces the Company's reputation for reliability in the Lucknow market.



Solidity - Growth Supported by Financial Discipline

While scale and speed drove operational performance during FY26, financial discipline continued to underpin the Company's growth strategy.

The Company reported total income of ₹175.7 crore, EBITDA of ₹41.5 crore and profit after tax of ₹24.3 crore during the year. Despite increased investments in construction and land aggregation, finance costs remained low, highlighting the largely self-funded nature of project execution and the strength of the Company's cash generation model.

Strong collections, prudent capital deployment, and a conservative approach to leverage allowed the Company to pursue growth opportunities while maintaining balance sheet stability. Reflecting confidence in its financial position and commitment to shareholder returns, the Board recommended a dividend of ₹9 per equity share translating to 450% of FV for FY26.

A Differentiated Development Model

Unlike many developers that pursue growth through geographic diversification, EHIL has focused on deepening its presence within a single market. Over four decades, this approach has enabled the Company to build strong local relationships, develop a nuanced understanding of customer preferences, and establish a reputation for quality and timely delivery. This market-focused strategy continues to support efficient execution, disciplined land acquisition, and prudent capital allocation across the development lifecycle.

From the CMD's Desk

Dear Shareholders,

FY26 was a milestone year for Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited, one in which the disciplined and patient approach the Company has followed since 1985 converted into a step change in scale. It gives me pleasure to report to you a year of record bookings, record collections and a meaningfully expanded growth pipeline, achieved without compromising the Balance Sheet principles that have defined this Company for four decades.



Macro environment

The global economy navigated a more challenging environment during the year, marked by geopolitical tensions, elevated energy prices, and moderating growth expectations. Despite these headwinds, India remained among the world's fastest-growing major economies, supported by resilient domestic demand and sustained public infrastructure investment. While inflationary pressures and global uncertainties persisted, the country's macroeconomic fundamentals continued to provide a stable backdrop for business activity and investment.

Industry outlook

In this environment, capable and reliable developers continued to gain favour with homebuyers, supported by strong end-user demand and ongoing urbanisation. A clear shift towards premium housing continued during the year, while infrastructure-led development and favourable demand-supply dynamics supported residential market growth. In this environment, developers with strong execution capabilities, established brands, and a proven track record continued to gain customer preference. Lucknow emerged as one of the Country's most

attractive regional markets, benefiting from strong absorption, rising property values, and supportive policy measures aimed at accelerating urban development.

FY26 business performance

Against this backdrop, EHIL delivered its strongest operating year. Booking value for FY26 stood at ₹743.9 crore, up 120% over the previous year, on area booked of 10.77 lakh square feet, more than double the prior year's figure. Collections rose nearly 39% to ₹352.1 crore, reflecting healthy conversion of bookings into cash flow. Total income for the

year stood at ₹175.7 crore, EBITDA at ₹41.5 crore and profit after tax at ₹24.3 crore, up 13% over the previous year. FY26 profitability included a one-time provision relating to GST input credit write-off and residual costs on earlier projects. The underlying operating performance of the business and the pipeline it has built remain unaffected by this item.

Operational review

The defining operational event of the year was the launch of Eldeco Solano Gardens, which received an exceptional response from the market where 343 of the 433 units launched were sold within days of launch, translating into bookings of over ₹384 crore in the launch phase alone. Solano Gardens extends a development template the group has refined since Eldeco City, combining plotted development, villas and, in later phases, group housing, and it validates our judgment that Lucknow's homebuyers continue to reward well-located, well-designed product backed by execution reliability.

Project pipeline

During the year, the Company added approximately ₹2,000 crore of gross development value through three new land parcels in key Lucknow growth corridors, two of them secured through Lucknow Development Authority auctions and the third along the Shaheed Path corridor. Together with unsold inventory in ongoing projects and the upcoming phases of Solano Gardens, a pipeline

we expect to monetise over the next five to seven years as projects move through design, approval and launch.

Execution progress and Financial Discipline

Construction spend for the year rose 14% to ₹177.7 crore, and the Company delivered 280 homes across 2.78 lakh square feet during FY26. The Company's capital structure remains one of its more distinctive features within the sector. Growth in FY26 was funded through prudent balance of customer advances, internal accruals and debt. Land for two of the three new parcels added during the year was secured through government auction, a route that avoids the extended capital lock in and price uncertainty associated with private land assembly.

Capital allocation

The Company committed capital to securing new land parcels and sustaining construction across five ongoing projects, while the Board recommended a final dividend of 450% i.e. ₹9/- per equity share, continuing the Company's uninterrupted dividend record since incorporation.

Future outlook

FY26 strengthened the Company's operating platform through strong execution across the project portfolio, improved cash conversion through construction milestones and handovers, and continued advancement of

its development pipeline. The successful launch of Solano Gardens, strong collections and the addition of strategic land parcels during the year reinforced the Company's commitment to disciplined capital allocation and balance sheet prudence.

Stakeholder appreciation

None of this would be possible without the continued trust of our homebuyers, many of whom have now purchased their second or third home from the Eldeco Group across successive projects, or without the sustained commitment of our employees, contractors and channel partners, who executed a year of unusually high activity without compromising on quality or timelines. I would also like to acknowledge our shareholders and lenders for their continued confidence in the Company.

Closing remarks

Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited concluded FY26 with a stronger and more diversified pipeline than at any point in its listed history, a franchise built patiently over four decades, and a capital structure designed to support growth with discipline.

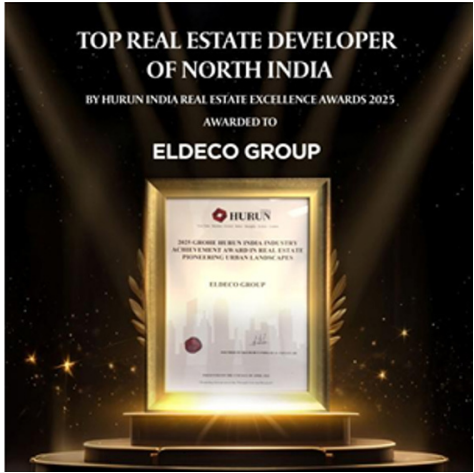

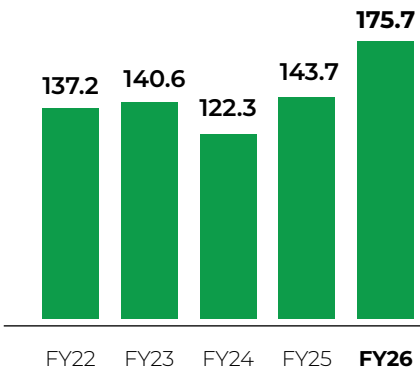

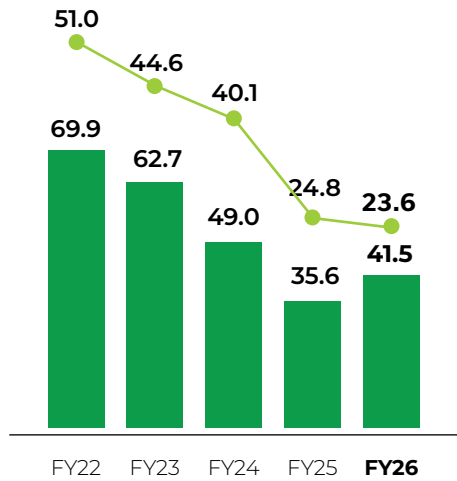
TOTAL INCOME

■ (₹ in Cr.)



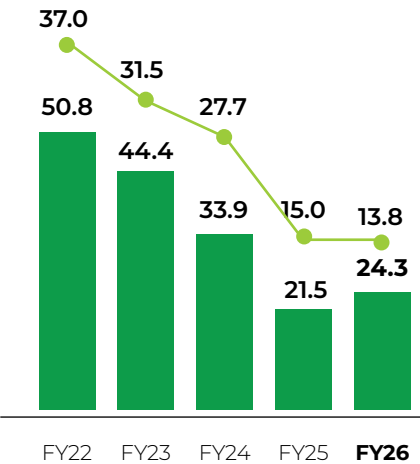
EBITDA & EBITDA MARGIN

■ (₹ in Cr.) — (In %)



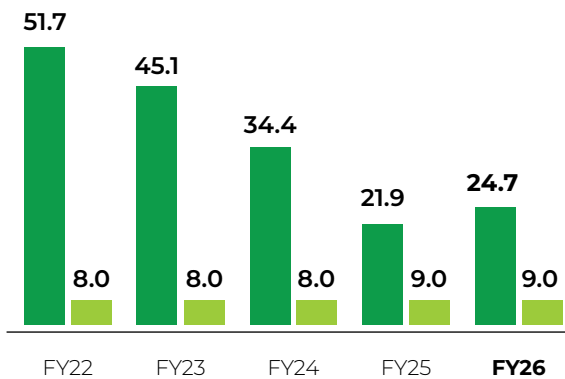
PAT & PAT MARGIN

Management Discussion and Analysis

ECONOMY OVERVIEW

Global Economy

The global economy entered 2026 with improving resilience, supported by steady consumption, technology-driven investment, and gradual easing of trade policy uncertainty. However, this momentum was disrupted by the outbreak of conflict in the Middle East during the early part of the year. As a result, global growth is expected to moderate, with the International Monetary Fund projecting global GDP growth of 3.1% in 2026, down from 3.4% in 2025, before recovering to 3.4% in 2027.

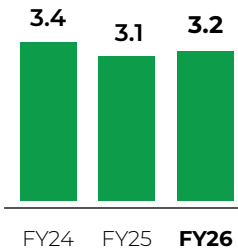
Global headline inflation is projected to rise to 4.7% in 2026, reversing the disinflation trend seen since early 2024, before easing to 3.9% in 2027. While advanced economies continue to experience relatively subdued growth, emerging market and developing economies, led by India, continue to outpace advanced economy growth, supported by resilient domestic demand and ongoing structural reforms. Overall, the global economic outlook remains positive but sensitive to geopolitical and macroeconomic developments.



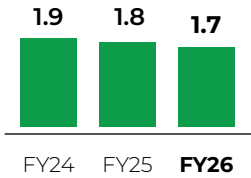
WORLD ECONOMIC OUTLOOK GROWTH PROJECTIONS

■ (Lakh Sq. Ft.)

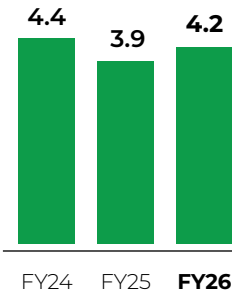

Indian Economy

India continued to be among the world's fastest-growing major economies in FY26, demonstrating resilience despite a volatile global environment. Growth was supported by sustained government investment in infrastructure, increasing domestic demand, and a broadly supportive policy framework. As per the IMF report (April 2026), India's real GDP growth stood at 7.6% in 2025 and is expected to moderate to 6.5% in 2026 amid rising global uncertainties and cost pressures. During the year, the monetary policy environment became more supportive with inflation moderating and the Monetary Policy Committee reducing the repo rate by 100 basis points, while maintaining a neutral stance from June 2025.

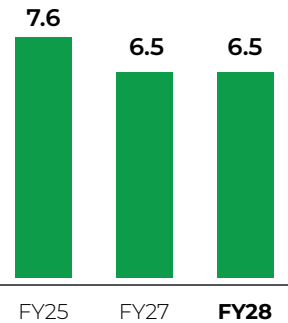
This is positive for investment-led sectors such as such as real estate, particularly residential development, as

lower interest rates improve housing affordability, support buyer sentiment, and ease financing conditions. Overall, these factors are expected to strengthen economic activity, reinforce investment momentum, and support India's position as a key driver of global growth.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Indian Real Estate Market

The Indian real estate sector continued to demonstrate healthy momentum, supported by rising disposable income, urbanisation, infrastructure-driven development, and evolving consumer preferences. Within this environment, residential real estate continues to account for the largest share of overall sector activity, with demand supported by both end-user purchases and growing aspirations for home ownership. Mid-segment housing continued to account for a significant share of residential sales, contributing nearly 52% of total sales over the last four years. At the same time, premiumization emerged as a key trend, with rising demand for luxury and high-

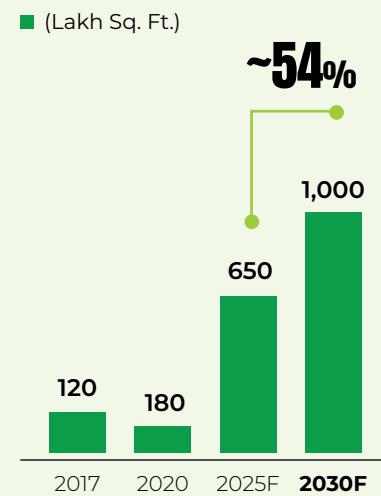
end homes driven by lifestyle upgrades, increasing NRI participation, and preference for premium living spaces.

With lower interest rates, improving connectivity, and rising per capita income levels, the sector remains well positioned for long-term growth. According to IBEF, the Indian real estate market is expected to grow by 54% to USD 1,000 billion by 2030.

Growing Income levels & employment opportunities is fuelling urbanisation & strengthening purchasing power, thereby improving the affordability of urban real estate.

Indian Residential Real Estate Market

India's residential real estate market remained steady in 2025, transitioning from volume-led expansion to value-driven growth. The sector was increasingly characterized by rising ticket sizes, premiumization and stronger pricing power, even as overall housing sales moderated amid price inflation and macroeconomic uncertainties. During H1 CY2026, housing sales across the country's remained broadly stable at 171,471 units, reflecting consolidation rather than correction after four years of strong post-pandemic growth. Affordable housing supply has remained constrained relative to demand, pushing an increasing share of transaction value towards the premium and luxury segments. Additionally, Tier II cities, including Lucknow,

have been highlighted by industry research as gaining a growing share of national residential demand, driven by affordability, improving

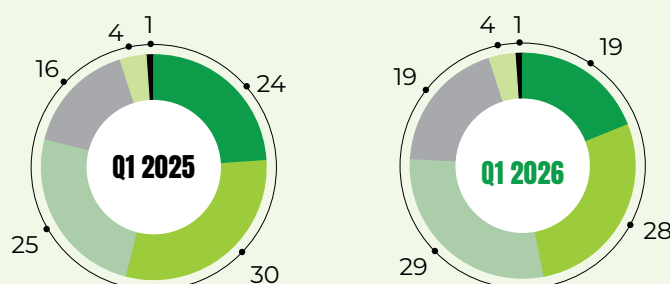
connectivity and accelerating infrastructure investments, supporting long-term sector growth prospects.

■ <5mn ■ 5-10mn ■ 10-20mn ■ 20-50mn ■ 50-100mn ■ >100mn



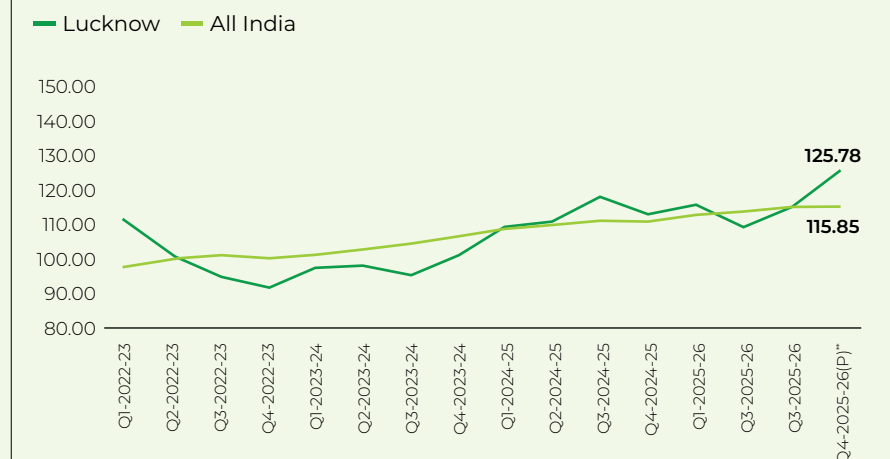

After muted growth between 2015 and 2019, residential prices rose by over 50% during 2019-24 and moderated to a sustainable ~8% growth in 2025. At the same time, the sales mix shifted towards larger ticket-size homes, indicating an increase in demand for premium housing.

House Price Index

Residential real estate prices continued to strengthen during FY26. The All-India House Price Index (HPI) increased from 110.00 in Q4FY25 to 115.85 in Q4FY26, indicating sustained demand & continued resilience across major residential real estate markets. Lucknow witnessed even stronger price appreciation, with its HPI rising from 100.00 to 125.78 during the same period, supported by improving infrastructure, rising homebuyer demand and limited quality supply. These trends underscore the city's emergence as a key growth market and provide a supportive backdrop for premium residential developments.

LUCKNOW - North India's Emerging Growth Hub & Real Estate Destination

Lucknow's residential real estate market has demonstrated a distinctive growth trajectory over the last five years, with housing demand consistently exceeding new supply, setting it apart from several larger and more mature metropolitan markets. According to Anarock Research, the city absorbed ~27,640 residential units between 2021 and 2025, average residential prices in Lucknow rose from ~₹3,890 per square foot in 2021 to ~₹6,380 per square foot in 2025, an increase of nearly 64%, with the sharpest gains recorded during the post pandemic recovery and steadier appreciation since. The ₹80 lakh to ₹1.5 crore price bracket accounted for the largest share of new launches over the period, reflecting Lucknow's positioning as an aspirational, primarily end user driven market rather than a speculative one. Infrastructure investment, including the ongoing second phase of the Lucknow Metro, the outer ring road, airport connectivity, expressway networks and the developing defence corridor, continues to expand the city's addressable growth corridors and has boosted investor confidence.

The Uttar Pradesh government's urban development policy, introduced in February 2026, liberalises floor area ratio norms and is intended to shorten project approval timelines, a change management believes will benefit established, well capitalised developers such as Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited disproportionately.

Operational Performance

During FY26, the Company delivered its strongest operational performance to date, driven by record sales bookings, robust collections, continued construction progress, and strategic expansion of its development pipeline. The successful launch of Eldeco Solano Gardens, strong demand across ongoing projects, and disciplined execution enabled EHIL to achieve its highest-ever

booking value and collections during the year. Simultaneously, the Company strengthened its future growth platform by securing three strategic land parcels in Lucknow's key growth corridors, adding nearly ₹2,000 crore of Gross Development Value (GDV) to its pipeline.

The year witnessed the successful launch of Eldeco Solano Gardens, which recorded bookings of approximately 5.11 lakh sq. ft. with a booking value of ₹384.5 crore, reflecting strong market acceptance and reinforcing the Company's integrated township development strategy. In addition, ongoing projects such as Eldeco Latitude 27, Eldeco Trinity, Eldeco Hanging Gardens and Eldeco Skywalk continued to progress as planned, supported by steadily increasing construction activity.

The Company booked 10.77 lakh sq. ft. during FY26, more than double the previous year, while average realization improved to ₹6,909 per sq. ft., driven by a favourable product mix and growing demand for premium residential developments. During the year, EHIL delivered 2.78 lakh sq. ft. across 280 homes and received the Completion Certificate for Eldeco Imperia Phase 2, further strengthening its execution track record.

Total income for FY26 stood at ₹175.7 crore compared with ₹143.7 crore in FY25, reflecting growth of 22.3% year-on-year. 3. 6. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Act.
7. In accordance with the Secretarial Standard-2 on General Meetings ("**SS-2**") issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India ("**ICSI**"), the proceedings of the AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company which shall be the deemed venue of the AGM. 8. The Register of Members and the Share Transfer books of the Company will remain closed from **Thursday, September 17, 2026 to Wednesday, September 23, 2026** (both days inclusive) for the purpose of AGM and determining the entitlement of the shareholders to the final dividend for the financial year ended March 31, 2026.

9. The Board of Directors has fixed **Wednesday, September 16, 2026** as the 'Record Date' for determining entitlement of Members to receive final dividend for the financial year ended March 31, 2026, if declared at the AGM.

10. In terms of the provisions of Section 152 of the Act, Mr. Shrikant Jajodia (DIN: 00602511), Director of the Company, retires by rotation at the ensuing AGM. The Nomination and Remuneration Committee and the Board of Directors of the Company have recommended his re-appointment. Mr. Jajodia is interested in the Ordinary Resolution set out at item no. 3 of the Notice with regard to his re-appointment. Save and except the above, none of the Directors/Key Managerial Personnel of the Company/their relatives are, in any way, concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the Ordinary Business set out under item no. 3 of the Notice.

Further, the relevant details pursuant to Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI Listing Regulations and SS-2 issued by the ICSI, in respect of the Director seeking appointment/re-appointment at the ensuing AGM are provided in **"Annexure-A"** attached to the Notice of the AGM.

11. The Dividend on Equity Shares, as recommended by the Board of Directors and if declared at the AGM, will be paid subject to deduction of Tax at source (**"TDS"**) within 30 days from the date of declaration at the ensuing AGM, as under:

- i) To all the beneficial owners in respect of shares held in dematerialised form as per the data made available by the National Securities Depository Limited (**"NSDL"**) and **CDSL**, (collectively **"Depositories"**), as at the close of business hours on **Wednesday, September 16, 2026**.
- ii) To all the Members in respect of shares held in physical form after giving effect to valid transmission or transposition requests lodged with the Company as at the close of business hours on **Wednesday, September 16, 2026**.

Pursuant to the Finance Act, 2020, dividend income is taxable in the hands of the Members w.e.f. April 1, 2020 and the Company is required to deduct TDS on payment of dividend at the prescribed rates in the Income Tax Act, 1961 (**"the IT Act"**). The Members are requested to refer to the Finance Act, 2020 and amendments thereof, for the prescribed rates for various categories. Further, the shares in respect of which dividend has remained unclaimed for 7 (seven) consecutive years or

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

Consolidated Financials

During the year under review, the Company's consolidated total revenue stood at ₹ 17,571.70 lakhs including other income of ₹ 1,078.83 lakhs as compared to total revenue of ₹ 14,369.63 lakhs including other income of ₹ 975.50 lakhs during the previous financial year ended March 31, 2025.

As at March 31, 2026, profit after tax stood at ₹ 2,428.31 lakhs as compared to the profit of the previous financial year ended March 31, 2025, amounting to ₹ 2,150.84 lakhs.

Standalone Financials

During the year under review, on standalone basis, the total revenue stood at ₹ 16,253.10 lakhs including other income of ₹ 899.04 lakhs as compared to total revenue of ₹ 12,845.71 lakhs including other income of ₹ 766.08 lakhs during the previous financial year ended March 31, 2025.

As at March 31, 2026, profit after tax stood at ₹ 3,110.06 lakhs as compared to the profit of the previous financial year ended March 31, 2025 amounting to ₹ 2,569.94 lakhs.

The operational performance of the Company has been comprehensively covered in the Management Discussion and Analysis Report.

DIVIDEND

Taking into consideration the performance of the Company and in recognition of the trust in the management by the members of the Company, the Board of Directors at its meeting held on May 25, 2026 have considered and recommended a final dividend @ 450% i.e. ₹ 9/- per equity share of the face value of ₹ 2/- each for the financial year ended March 31, 2026 subject to the approval of the members at the ensuing Annual General Meeting ("AGM") of the Company.

The final dividend, subject to the approval of the members at the ensuing AGM scheduled to be held on **Wednesday, September 23, 2026** will be paid within 30 (thirty) days of the AGM to those members whose names appear in the Register of Members as on the **Record date i.e. Wednesday, September 16, 2026** and in respect of shares held in dematerialised form, it shall be paid to the members whose names are furnished by National Securities Depository Limited ("NSDL") and Central Depository Services (India) Limited ("CDSL"), as beneficial owners as on that date.

In view of the changes made under the Income Tax Act, 1961 ("IT Act"), by the Finance Act, 2020, dividends paid or distributed by the Company is taxable in the hands of the shareholders. The Company shall, accordingly, make payment of final dividend after deduction of tax at source ("TDS") at the prescribed rates as per the IT Act.

The Company has written to the members holding shares in physical form requesting them to furnish details regarding their PAN and also their bank account details for payment of dividend through electronic mode. Those shareholders who are yet to respond to the Company's request in this regard are once again requested to take action in the matter at the earliest.

For enabling payment of dividend in future through electronic mode, members holding shares in physical form are requested to furnish updated particulars of their bank account to the Company or our Registrar & Share Transfer Agent, Skyline Financial Services Private Limited ("RTA"). Beneficial owners holding shares in electronic form are requested to furnish their bank account details to their respective Depository Participant ("DP") and ensure that such changes are recorded by them correctly.

BOARD EVALUATION

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 134(3) (p) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") and Regulation 17(10) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ("the SEBI Listing Regulations"), the Board of Directors has carried out an annual evaluation of its own performance, board committees and individual directors. The criteria is broadly based on the Guidance Note on Board Evaluation issued by the SEBI.

The Company has a structured assessment process, wherein the Nomination and Remuneration Committee ("NRC") of the Company has laid down the process for an effective manner of performance evaluation of the Board, its Committees and the Directors, including the Chairman.

The performance of the Board was evaluated by the Board after seeking inputs from all the directors on the basis of criteria, such as, Board composition and structure, effectiveness of board processes and procedures, information and functioning, etc.

3. COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

- f) Review and monitor the auditor's independence and performance and effectiveness of audit process;

- h) Review management letters/letters of internal control weaknesses issued by the Statutory Auditors;
- i) Reviewing the adequacy of internal audit function and discussing with Internal Auditor on the significant findings and reviewing the progress of corrective actions on such issues;
- j) Evaluation of the internal financial controls and risk management systems;

1. Notes to Standalone Financial Statements

For the year ended 31st March, 2026

1. CORPORATE AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited (**"the Company"**) is domiciled and incorporated in India and its equity shares are listed at BSE Limited & National Stock Exchange of India Limited (NSE). The registered office of the Company is situated at Shop No, S-16, 2nd Floor, Eldeco Station-1, Site No-1, Sector 12, Faridabad, Haryana-121007 and corporate office is situated at Eldeco Corporate Chamber-1, 2nd Floor, Vibhuti Khand (Opp. Mandi Parishad), Gomti Nagar, Lucknow- 226010.

The Company is engaged into the business of developing real estate properties for residential, commercial and retail purposes.

The financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2026 were approved and authorized for issue by Board of Directors in their meeting held on 25th day of May, 2026.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Indian Accounting Standards (**"IND AS"**) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (**"the Act"**) read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules as amended from time to time notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of certain financial assets and liabilities which have been prepared to comply with the IND AS, including the rules notified under the relevant provisions of the Act, (as amended from time to time) and presentation and disclosure requirements of Division II of Schedule III to the Act, (IND AS Compliant Schedule III) as amended from time to time.

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions. Actual results could vary from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised, if the revision effects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods or both.

The Company's functional currency and presentation currency is Indian Rupees (**INR**). All amounts disclosed in the financial statements and notes are in Lacs except otherwise indicated.

3. CLASSIFICATION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES INTO CURRENT AND NON-CURRENT

The Company presents its assets and liabilities in the Balance Sheet based on current/non-current classification.

An asset is treated as current when it is:

- expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle;
- held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- expected to be realised within twelve months after the reporting period; or
- cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is treated as current when:

- it is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle;
- it is held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- it is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period; or
- there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle being a period within twelve months for the purpose of current and non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

A. Material Accounting Policies:

(i) Basis of Measurement

The Financial Statements of the Company are consistently prepared and presented under historical cost convention on an accrued basis in accordance with IND AS except for certain Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities that are measured at fair value.

The financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (₹ "INR"), which is the Company's functional and presentation currency and all amounts are rounded to the nearest Rupees (except otherwise indicated).

(ii) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for goods supplied and services rendered, net of returns and discounts to customers.

(a) Real Estate projects

The Company derives revenue from execution of real estate projects. Revenue from Real Estate project is recognised in accordance with IND AS 115 which establishes a comprehensive framework in determining whether how much and when revenue is to be recognised. IND AS 115 replaces IND AS 18 revenue and an IND AS 11 construction contract which prescribes control approach for revenue recognition as against risk and rewards as per IND AS 18. In accordance with IND AS 115 revenue from real estate projects are recognised upon transfer of control of promised real estate property to customer at an amount that reflects the consideration which the Company expects to receive in exchange for such booking and is based on following 6 steps:

1. Identification of contract with customers:

The Company accounts for contract with a customer only when all the following criteria are met:

- Parties (i.e. the Company and the customer) to the contract have approved the contract (in writing, orally or in accordance with business practices) and are committed to perform their respective obligations;
- The Company can identify each customer's right regarding the goods or services to be transferred;
- The Company can identify the payment terms for the goods or services to be transferred;
- The contract has commercial substance (i.e. risk, timing or amount of the Company's future cash flow is expected to change as a result of the contract); and
- It is probable that the Company will collect the consideration to which it will be entitled in exchange for the goods or services that will be transferred to the customer. Consideration may not be the same due to discount rate, etc.

2. Identify the separate performance obligation in the contract:

Performance obligation is a promise to transfer to a customer.

Goods or services or a bundle of goods or services i.e. distinct or a series of goods or services that are substantially the same and are transferred in the same way.

If a promise to transfer goods or services is not distinct from goods or services in a contract, then the goods or services are combined in a single performance obligation.

The goods or services that is promised to a customer is distinct if both the following criteria are met:

- The customer can benefit from the goods or services either on its own or together with resources that are readily available to the customer (i.e. the goods or services are capable of being distinct); and
- The Company's promise to transfer the goods or services to the customer is separately identifiable from the other promises in the contract i.e. the goods or services are distinct within the context of the contract.

3. Satisfaction of the performance obligation:

The Company recognizes revenue when (or as) the Company satisfies a performance obligation by transferring a promised goods or services to the customer.

The real estate properties are transferred when (or as) the customer obtains control of the property.

4. Determination of transaction price:

The transaction price is the amount of consideration to which the Company expects to be entitled in exchange for transferring promised goods or services to customer excluding GST.

The consideration promised in a contract with a customer may include fixed amount, variable amount or both. In determining transaction price, the Company assumes that goods or services will be transferred to the customer as promised in accordance with the existing contract and the contract can't be cancelled, renewed or modified.

5. Allocating the transaction price to the performance obligation:

The allocation of the total contract price to various performance obligation are done based on their standalone selling prices. The standalone selling price is the price at which the Company would sell promised goods or services separately to the customers.

6. Recognition of revenue when (or as) the Company satisfies a performance obligation:

Performance obligation is satisfied over time or at a point in time.

Performance obligation is satisfied over time if one of the criteria out of the following three is met:

- The customer simultaneously receives and consumes a benefit provided by the Company's performance as the Company performs;
- The Company's performance creates or enhances an asset that a customer controls an asset is created or enhanced; or
- The Company's performance doesn't create an asset within an alternative use to the Company and the Company has an enforceable right to payment for performance completed to date.

Therefore, the revenue recognition for a performance obligation is done over time if one of the criteria is met out of the above three, else revenue recognition for a performance obligation is done at a point in time.

The Company disaggregate revenue from real estate projects on the basis of nature of revenue.

(b) Project Management Fee

Project Management fee is accounted as revenue upon satisfaction of performance obligation as per agreed terms.

(c) Interest Income

Interest due on delayed payments by customers is accounted on accrual basis.

(d) Dividend income

Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive the payment is established.

(iii) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing cost that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of a qualifying asset (including real estate projects) are considered as part of the cost of the asset/project. All other borrowing costs are treated as period cost and charged to the statement of profit and loss in the year in which incurred.

(iv) Property, Plant and Equipment

Recognition and initial measurement

Property, plant and equipment are stated at their cost of acquisition. The cost comprises purchase price, borrowing cost, if capitalization criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discount and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company. All other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in statement of profit or loss as incurred.

Subsequent measurement (depreciation and useful lives)

Property, plant and equipment are subsequently measured at cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

De-recognition

An item of property, plant and equipment and any significant part initially recognised is de-recognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on de-recognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in the income statement when the asset is de-recognised.

(v) Intangible Assets

Recognition and initial measurement

Intangible assets are stated at their cost of acquisition. The cost comprises purchase price, borrowing cost, if capitalization criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discount and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price.

Subsequent measurement (amortisation and useful lives)

Intangible assets comprising of ERP & other computer software are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated amortization and are amortised over a period of five years on straight line method.

(vi) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

The Company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the

recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

(vii) Financial Instruments

(a) Financial Assets

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument and are measured initially at fair value adjusted for transactional costs.

Subsequent measurement

(1) Financial instrument at amortised cost - The financial instrument is measured at the amortised cost if both the following conditions are met:

- (a) The asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets for collecting contractual cash flows, and
- (b) Contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding.

After initial measurement, such financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate (EIR) method. All other debt instruments are measured at Fair Value through other comprehensive income or Fair Value through profit and loss based on Company's business model.

(2) Equity Investment – All equity investments in scope of IND AS 109 are measured at fair value. Equity instruments which are held for trading and generally classified as at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL). For all other equity instruments, the Company decides to classify the same either as at fair value through Other Comprehensive Income (FVOCI) or fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL). The Company makes such election on an instrument by instrument basis. The classification is made on initial recognition and is irrevocable.

(3) Investment in subsidiaries is carried at cost in the separate financial statements.

De-recognition of financial assets

A financial asset is primarily de-recognised when the rights to receive cash flows from the asset have expired or the Company has transferred its rights to receive cash flows from the asset.

(b) Financial Liabilities

Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and transaction cost that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial liabilities are also adjusted. These liabilities are classified as amortised cost.

Subsequent measurement

Subsequent to initial recognition, these liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. These liabilities include borrowings and deposits.

De-recognition of financial liabilities

A financial liability is de-recognised when the obligation under the liability is discharged or cancelled or expired. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms or on the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the de-recognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

(c) Impairment of Financial Assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost and FVOCI debt instruments. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

For trade receivable only, the Company applies the simplified approach permitted by IND AS 09 financial instruments, which requires expected lifetime losses to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables.

(d) Offsetting of Financial Instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet if there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, to realize the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(viii) Inventories and Projects in progress

(a) Inventories

- (i) Building material and consumable stores are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value, which is determined on the basis of the 'First in First out' method.
- (ii) Land is valued at lower of cost and net realisable value, which is determined on average method. Cost includes cost of acquisition and all related costs.

- (iii) Construction work in progress is valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of materials, services and other related overheads related to project under construction.
- (iv) Completed real estate project for sale and trading stock are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of land, materials, construction, services and other related overheads.

(b) Projects in progress

Projects in progress are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of land, materials, construction, services, borrowing costs and other overheads relating to projects.

(ix) Retirement Benefits

- i. Contributions payable by the Company to the concerned Government Authorities in respect of provident fund, family pension fund and employee state insurance are charged to the statement of profit and loss.
- ii. The Company is having Group Gratuity Scheme with Life Insurance Corporation of India. Provision for gratuity is made based on actuarial valuation in accordance with IND AS-19.
- iii. Provision for leave encashment in respect of unavailed leave standing to the credit of employees is made on actuarial basis in accordance with IND AS-19.
- iv. Actuarial gains / losses resulting from re-measurements of the liability / asset are included in other comprehensive income.

(x) Provisions, Contingent Assets And Contingent Liabilities

A provision is recognized when:

- the Company has a present obligation as a result of a past event;
- it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; and
- a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

(xi) Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the total profit for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the total profit for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity share.

(xii) Leases

In accordance with IND AS 116, the Company recognises right of use assets representing its right to use the underlying asset for the lease term at the lease commencement date. The cost of right of use asset measured at inception shall comprise of the amount of the initial measurement of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payment made at or before commencement date less any lease incentive received plus any initial direct cost incurred and an estimate of cost to be incurred by lessee in dismantling and removing underlying asset or restoring the underlying asset or site on which it is located. The right to use asset is subsequently measured at cost less accumulated depreciation, accumulated impairment losses, if any and adjusted for any remeasurement of lease liability. The right to use assets is depreciated using the straight line method from the commencement date over the shorter of lease term or useful life of right of use asset. The estimated useful lives of right of use assets are determined on the same basis as those of property, plant and equipment. Right of use assets are tested for impairment whenever there is any indication that their carrying amounts may not be recoverable impairment loss, if any, is recognised in statement of profit and loss. The Company measures the lease liability at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date of lease. The lease payments are discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease, if that rate can be readily determined; the Company uses incremental borrowing rate. Lease arrangements where the risk and rewards incident to ownership of an asset substantially vest with the lessor are recognised as operating lease. Lease rent under operating lease are charged to statement of profit and loss on a straight line basis over the lease term except where scheduled increase in rent compensate the lessor for expected inflationary costs.

The lease liability is subsequently remeasured by increasing the carrying amount to reflect interest on lease liability, reducing the carrying amount to reflect the lease payments made and remeasuring the carrying amount to reflect any reassessment or lease modification or to reflect revised-in-substance fixed lease payments, the Company recognizes amount of remeasurement of lease liability due to modification as an adjustment to right of use assets

and statement of profit and loss depending upon the nature of modification. Where the carrying amount of right of use assets is reduced to zero and there is further reduction in measurement of lease liability, the Company recognizes any remaining amount of the remeasurement in statement of profit and loss.

(xiii) Income Tax

- (i) Provision for current tax is made based on the tax payable under the Income Tax Act, 1961. Current income tax relating to items recognised outside profit and loss (either in other comprehensive income or in equity).
- (ii) Deferred tax is recognised on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period. The carrying amount of deferred tax liabilities and assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period.

(xiv) Fair Value Measurement

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either:

- In the principal market for the asset or liability, or
- In the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

The fair value of an asset or a liability is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming that market participants act in their economic best interest.

A fair value measurement of a non-financial asset takes into account a market participant's ability to generate economic benefits by using the asset in its highest and best use or by selling it to another market participant that would use the asset in its highest and best use.

The Company uses valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, maximizing the use of relevant observable inputs:

- **Level 1:** Quoted (unadjusted) market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- **Level 2:** Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is directly or indirectly observable.
- **Level 3:** Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is unobservable.

For assets and liabilities that are recognized in the financial statements on a recurring basis, the Company determines whether transfer have occurred between levels in the hierarchy by re-assessing categorisation (based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole) at the end of each reporting period.

For the purpose of fair value disclosure, the Company has determined classes of assets and liabilities on the basis of nature, characteristics and risks of the asset or liability and the level of the fair value hierarchy as explained above.

(xv) Cash and Cash Equivalent

Cash and Cash equivalent in the balance sheet comprises cash at bank and cash on hand, demand deposits and short term deposits which are subject to an insignificant change in value.

The amendment to IND AS-7 requires entities to provide disclosure of change in the liabilities arising from financing activities, including both changes arising from cash flows and non-cash changes (such as foreign exchange gain or loss). The Company has provided information for both current and comparative period in cash flow statement.

(xvi) Business Combinations

The acquisition method of accounting is used to account for all business combinations, except common control transactions, regardless of whether equity instruments or other assets are acquired. The consideration transferred for the acquisition of the transferor Companies comprises the:

- fair values of the assets transferred;
- liabilities incurred to the former owners of the acquired business;
- equity interests issued by the Company; and
- fair value of any asset or liability resulting from a contingent consideration arrangement.

Identifiable assets acquired, liabilities and contingent liabilities assumed in a business combination are with limited exceptions, measured initially at their fair values at the acquisition date.

Acquisition-related costs are expensed as incurred.

The excess of the consideration transferred and acquisition-date fair value of any previous equity interest in the acquired entity over the fair value of the net identifiable assets acquired is recorded as goodwill. If those amounts are less than the fair value of the net identifiable assets of the business acquired, the difference is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity as capital reserve provided there is clear evidence of the underlying reasons for classifying the business combination as a bargain purchase. In other cases, the bargain purchase gain is recognised directly in equity as capital reserve.

Where settlement of any part of cash consideration is deferred, the amounts payable in the future are discounted to their present value as at the date of exchange. The discount rate used is the entity's incremental borrowing rate, being the rate at which a similar borrowing could be obtained from an independent financier under comparable terms and conditions.

Contingent consideration is classified either as equity or a financial liability. Amounts classified as a financial liability are subsequently remeasured to fair value with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss. There is no contingent consideration in respect of all the years presented.

Business combinations involving entities that are controlled by the Company are accounted for using the pooling of interests method as follows:

- The assets and liabilities of the combining entities are reflected at their carrying amounts.
- No adjustments are made to reflect fair values or recognise any new assets or liabilities. Adjustments are only made to harmonise accounting policies.
- The financial information in the financial statements in respect of prior periods is restated as if the business combination had occurred from the beginning of the preceding period in the financial statements, irrespective of the actual date of the combination. In case of Court approved Scheme the business combination is recognised from the appointed date following the accounting treatment approved by the Court.
- The balance of the retained earnings appearing in the financial statements of the transferor is aggregated with the corresponding balance appearing in the financial statements of the transferee.
- The identity of the reserves are preserved and the reserves of the transferor become the reserves of the transferee.
- The difference, if any, between the amounts recorded as share capital issued plus any additional consideration in the form of cash or other assets and the amount of share capital of the transferor is transferred to capital reserve and is presented separately from other capital reserves.

(xvii) Significant management judgement in applying accounting policies and estimation of uncertainty

Significant Management Judgement

When preparing the financial statements, management undertakes a number of judgements, estimates and assumptions about the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

The following are significant management judgement in applying the accounting policies of the Company that have the most significant effect on the financial statements.

(a) Recognition of deferred tax assets

The extent to which deferred tax assets can be recognized is based on an assessment of the probability of the Company's future taxable income against which the deferred tax assets can be utilised.

(b) Estimation of uncertainty

(a) Recoverability of advances/receivables

At each balance sheet date, based on historical default rates observed over expected life, the management assesses the expected credit loss on outstanding receivables and advances.

(b) Defined Benefit Obligation (DBO)

Management's estimate of the DBO is based on a number of critical underlying assumptions such as standard rates of assumptions such as standard rates of inflation, medical cost trends, mortality, discount rate and anticipation of future salary increases. Variation in these assumptions may significantly impact the DBO amount and the annual defined benefit expenses.

(c) Provisions

At each balance sheet date on the basis of management judgement, changes in facts and legal aspects, the Company assesses the requirement of provisions against the outstanding warranties and guarantees. However, the actual future outcome may be different from this judgement.

(d) Inventories

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value (NRV).

NRV for completed inventory is assessed including but not limited to market conditions and prices existing at the reporting date and is determined by the Company based on net amount that it expects

to realise from the sale of inventory in the ordinary course of business.

NRV in respect of inventories under construction is assessed with reference to market prices (by referring to expected or recent selling price) at the reporting date less estimated costs to complete the construction and estimated cost necessary to make the sale. The costs to complete the construction are estimated by management.

(e) Fair Value Measurements

Management applies valuation techniques to determine the fair value of financial instruments (where active market quotes are not available) and non-financial assets. This involves developing estimates and assumptions consistent with how market participants would price the instrument/assets. Management bases its assumptions on observable data as far as possible but this may not always be available. In that case Management uses the best relevant information available. Estimated fair values may vary from the actual prices that would be achieved in an arm's length transaction at the reporting date.

(f) Lease

The Company evaluates if an arrangement qualifies to be a lease as per the requirements of IND AS

116. Identification of a lease requires significant judgement. The Company uses significant judgement in assessing the lease term (including anticipated renewals) and the applicable discount rate.

The Company determines the lease term as the non-cancellable period of lease, together with both periods covered by an option to extend the lease if the Company is reasonably certain to exercise that option and periods covered by an option to terminate the lease if the Company is reasonably certain not to exercise that option. In exercising whether the Company is reasonably certain to exercise an option to extend a lease or to exercise an option to terminate the lease, it considers all relevant facts and circumstances that create an economic incentive for the Company to exercise the option to extend the lease or to exercise the option to terminate the lease. The Company revises lease term, if there is change in non-cancellable period of lease. The discount rate used is generally based on incremental borrowing rate.

(g) Classification of Assets and Liabilities into current and non-current

The Management classifies assets and liabilities into current and non-current categories based on its operating cycle.

42. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Company activities exposes it to variety of financial risk i.e. Credit Risk, Liquidity Risk, Capital Risk, Interest Rate Risk, etc. These risks are managed by senior management of the Company and is supervised by Board of Directors of the Company to minimise potential adverse effects on the financial performance of the Company.

(i) Credit Risk:

Credit risk from cash and cash equivalents and bank deposits is considered immaterial in view of the creditworthiness of the banks the Company works with. Credit risk is the risk i.e a customer or the counter party fails to pay to the Company causing financial loss. The credit risk primarily arises from outstanding receivables from customer. The Company has specific policies for managing customer credit risk on an ongoing basis. These policies factor in the customer financial position, past experience and other customer specific factor.

Financial assets are written off when there is no reasonable expectation of recovery such as a debtor failing to engage in a repayment plan with the Company. The Company makes provision for doubtful debt or write off when a debtor fails to make contractual payments. When loans or receivables have either been provided for or written off, the Company continues to engage in enforcement activity to attempt to recover the receivable due. When recoveries are made, these are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The Company has low credit risk in respect to cash and cash equivalent, other bank balances, other financial assets, trade receivables and security deposits paid.

(ii) Liquidity Risk:

Liquidity Risk is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. The Company approach to managing liquidity is to ensure as far as possible, that it will have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when they are due. Management monitors rolling forecasts of the liquidity position and cash and cash equivalent on the basis of expected cash flows. The Company takes into account the liquidity of the market in which the entity operates.

The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of the adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Group and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial

controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Consolidated Financial Statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Consolidated Financial Statements, Management and Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible for assessing the Group's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless Management either intends to liquidate the Group or to cease operations or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the Group.

For the other entities included in the financial statements, which have been audited by the other auditors, such other auditors remain responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audits carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding

independence and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence and where applicable, related safeguards.

From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements of the current period and are therefore, the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

OTHER MATTERS

We did not audit the financial statements and other financial information in respect of 34 subsidiary Companies, included in the statement, whose Financial Statements includes Total Assets of ₹ 26,969.58 Lacs as at 31st March, 2026, Total Revenue (including other income) of ₹ 1,351.01 Lacs and net cash flows of ₹ 1,782.41 Lacs for the year ended 31st March, 2026, as considered in the Consolidated Financial Statements. These financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the management and our opinion on the Consolidated Financial Statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiary Companies and our report in terms of Section 143(3) of the Act, in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiaries are based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

Our opinion on the Consolidated Financial Statements and our report on Other Legal and Regulating Requirements below is not modified in respect of the above matter with respect to our reliance on the work done and the report of the other auditors.

REPORT ON OTHER LEGAL AND REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

1. As required by clause (xxi) of paragraph 3 of the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2020 (**"the Order"**), issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub Section 11 of Section 143 of the Act, based on our audit and on the consideration of report of the other auditors on separate IND AS financial statements and the other financial information of the subsidiary Companies, incorporated in India, as noted in the 'Other Matter' paragraph we have given in the **"Annexure I"**. 2. - d) In our opinion, the aforesaid Consolidated Financial Statements comply with the IND AS specified under Section 133 of the Act read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2015.
- e) On the basis of the written representations received from the directors of the Holding Company as on 1st April, 2026 taken on record by the Board of Directors of the Holding Company and on the basis of written representations received by the management from directors of its subsidiaries which are incorporated in India, as on 1st April, 2026, none of the directors of the Group companies incorporated in India is disqualified as on 31st March, 2026 from being appointed as a Director in terms of Section 164(2) of the Act.
- f) With respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls with reference to Consolidated Financial Statements of the Holding Company and its subsidiary Companies covered under the Act and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our separate report in **'Annexure A'** wherein we have expressed an unmodified opinion.

 - iii. There has been no delay in transferring amounts, required to be transferred, to the Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Holding Company and its subsidiary Companies covered under the Act, during the year ended 31st March, 2026.

Further, where audit trail (edit log) facility was enabled and operated throughout the year for the respective accounting software's, we did not come across any instance of the audit trail feature being tampered

with. However, due to the inherent limitation of the accounting software's, we are unable to comment whether there were any instances of the audit trail feature been tampered during the audit period. Further, the audit trail has been preserved by the Group as per statutory requirements for record retention.

3. As required by Section 197(16) of the Act based on our audit, we report that the Holding Company has paid remuneration to its Directors during the year in accordance with the provisions of and limits laid down under Section 197 read with Schedule V of the Act. Further, we report that subsidiaries incorporated in India whose financial statements have been audited under the Act has not paid or provided for any managerial remuneration during the year. Accordingly, reporting under Section 197(16) of the Act is not applicable for such subsidiaries.

1. Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements

For the year ended 31st March, 2026

CORPORATE AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited (**"the Company"**) is domiciled and incorporated in India and its equity shares are listed at BSE Limited & National Stock Exchange of India Limited (NSE). The registered office of the Company is situated at Shop No, S-16, 2nd Floor, Eldeco Station-1, Site No-1, Sector 12, Faridabad, Haryana-121007 and corporate office is situated at Eldeco Corporate Chamber-1, 2nd Floor, Vibhuti Khand (Opp. Mandi Parishad), Gomti Nagar, Lucknow- 226010

The Company is engaged into the business of developing real estate properties for residential, commercial and retail purposes.

The financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2026 were approved and authorised for issue by Board of Directors in their meeting held on 25th day of May, 2026.

A. Basis of Preparation, Statement of Compliance and Material Accounting policies

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the Indian Accounting Standards (**"IND AS"**) as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (**"the Act"**) read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules as amended from time to time notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of certain financial assets and liabilities which have been prepared to comply with the 'IND AS', including the rules notified under the relevant provisions of the Act, (as amended from time to time) and presentation and disclosure requirements of Division II of Schedule III to the Act, (IND AS Compliant Schedule III) as amended from time to time.

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions. Actual results could vary from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised, if the revision effects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods or both.

The Company's functional currency and presentation currency is Indian Rupees (**"INR"**). All amounts disclosed in the financial statements and notes are in Lacs except otherwise indicated.

(i) Basis of Consolidation

The Consolidated Financial Statements relate to Eldeco Housing and Industries Limited ('the Company') and its subsidiary Companies (collectively referred to as **"the Group"**). The Consolidated Financial Statements have been prepared on the following basis:

- (a) The financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries are combined on a line by line basis by adding together like items of assets, liabilities, equity, incomes, expenses and cash flows, after fully eliminating intra-group balances and intra-group transactions.
- (b) Profits or losses resulting from intra-group transactions that are recognised in assets such as inventory and property, plant & equipment are eliminated in full.
- (c) Where the cost of the investment is higher/lower than the share of equity in the subsidiary at the time of acquisition, the resulting difference is disclosed as goodwill/capital reserve in the investment schedule. The said Goodwill is not amortised, however, it is tested for impairment at each Balance Sheet date and the impairment loss, if any, is provided for in the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss.
- (d) Offset (eliminate) the carrying amount of the parent's investment in each subsidiary and the parent's portion of equity of each subsidiary.
- (e) The difference between the proceeds from disposal of investment in subsidiaries and the carrying amount of its assets less liabilities as on the date of disposal is recognised in the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss being the profit or loss on disposal of investment in subsidiary.
- (f) Non-Controlling Interest's share of profit/loss of consolidated subsidiaries for the year is identified and adjusted against the income of the group in order to arrive at the net income attributable to shareholders of the Company.
- (g) Non-Controlling Interest's share of net assets of consolidated subsidiaries is identified and presented in the Consolidated Balance Sheet separate from liabilities and the equity of the Company's shareholders.

(ii) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for goods supplied and services rendered, net of returns and discounts to customers.

(a) Real Estate Projects

The Company derives revenue from execution of real estate projects. Effective from 1st April, 2018, Revenue from Real Estate project is recognised in accordance with IND AS 115 which establishes a comprehensive framework in determining whether how much and when revenue is to be recognised. IND AS 115 replaces IND AS 18 revenue and IND AS 11 construction contracts which prescribes control approach for revenue recognition as against risk and rewards as per IND AS 18. In accordance with IND AS 115 revenue from real estate projects are recognised upon transfer of control of promised real estate property to customer at an amount that reflects the consideration which the Company expects to receive in exchange for such booking and is based on following 6 steps:

1. Identification of contract with customers:

The Company accounts for contract with a customer only when all the following criteria are met:

- Parties (i.e. the Company and the customer) to the contract have approved the contract (in writing, orally or in accordance with business practices) and are committed to perform their respective obligations;
- The Company can identify each customer's right regarding the goods or services to be transferred;
- The Company can identify the payment terms for the goods or services to be transferred;
- The contract has commercial substance (i.e. risk, timing or amount of the Company's future cash flow is expected to change as a result of the contract); and
- It is probable that the Company will collect the consideration to which it will be entitled in exchange for the goods or services that will be transferred to the customer. Consideration may not be the same due to discount rate, etc.

2. Identify the separate performance obligation in the contract:

Performance obligation is a promise to transfer to a customer.

Goods or services or a bundle of goods or services i.e. distinct or a series of goods or services that are substantially the same and are transferred in the same way.

If a promise to transfer goods or services is not distinct from goods or services in a contract, then

the goods or services are combined in a single performance obligation.

The goods or services that are promised to a customer is distinct if both the following criteria are met:

- The customer can benefit from the goods or services either on its own or together with resources that are readily available to the customer (i.e. the goods or services are capable of being distinct); and
- The Company's promise to transfer the goods or services to the customer is separately identifiable from the other promises in the contract i.e the goods or services are distinct within the context of the contract.

3. Satisfaction of the performance obligation:

The Company recognises revenue when (or as) the Company satisfies a performance obligation by transferring a promised goods or services to the customer.

The real estate properties are transferred when (or as) the customer obtains control of the property.

4. Determination of transaction price:

The transaction price is the amount of consideration to which the Company expects to be entitled in exchange for transferring promised goods or services to customer excluding GST.

The consideration promised in a contract with a customer may include fixed amount, variable amount or both. In determining transaction price, the Company assumes that goods or services will be transferred to the customer as promised in accordance with the existing contract and the contract can't be cancelled, renewed or modified.

5. Allocating the transaction price to the performance obligation:

The allocation of the total contract price to various performance obligation are done based on their standalone selling prices. The standalone selling price is the price at which the Company would sell promised goods or services separately to the customers.

6. Recognition of revenue when (or as) the Company satisfies a performance obligation:

Performance obligation is satisfied over time or at a point in time.

Performance obligation is satisfied over time if one of the criteria out of the following three is met:

- The customer simultaneously receives and consumes a benefit provided by the Company's performance as the Company performs;

- The Company's performance creates or enhances an asset that a customer controls as asset is created or enhanced; or
- The Company's performance doesn't create an asset within an alternative use to the Company and the Company has an enforceable right to payment for performance completed to date.

Therefore, the revenue recognition for a performance obligation is done over time if one of the criteria is met out of the above three else revenue recognition for a performance obligation is done at point in time.

The Company disaggregate revenue from real estate projects on the basis of nature of revenue.

(b) Project Management Fee

Project Management fee is accounted as revenue upon satisfaction of performance obligation as per agreed terms.

(c) Interest Income

Interest due on delayed payments by customers is accounted on accrual basis.

(d) Dividend Income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive the payment is established.

(iii) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or construction of a qualifying asset (including real estate projects) are considered as part of the cost of the asset/project. All other borrowing costs are treated as period cost and charged to the statement of profit and loss in the year in which incurred.

(iv) Property, Plant and Equipment

Recognition and initial measurement

Property, plant and equipment are stated at their cost of acquisition. The cost comprises purchase price, borrowing cost, if capitalization criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discount and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company. All other repair and maintenance costs are recognized in statement of profit or loss as incurred.

Subsequent measurement (depreciation and useful lives)

Property, plant and equipment are subsequently measured at cost net of accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is

provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

De-recognition

An item of property, plant and equipment and any significant part initially recognised is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on de-recognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in the income statement when the asset is derecognised.

(v) Intangible Assets

Recognition and initial measurement

Intangible assets are stated at their cost of acquisition. The cost comprises purchase price, borrowing cost, if capitalisation criteria are met and directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use. Any trade discount and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price.

Subsequent measurement (amortisation and useful lives)

Intangible assets comprising of ERP & other computer software are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated amortisation and are amortised over a period of five years on straight line method.

(vi) Impairment of Non Financial Assets

The Company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any, such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognised in the statement of profit and loss.

(vii) Financial Instruments

(a) Financial Assets

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument and are measured initially at fair value adjusted for transactional costs.

Subsequent measurement

(1) Financial instrument at amortised cost -

The financial instrument is measured at the amortised cost if both the following conditions are met:

- (a) The asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets for collecting contractual cash flows; and
- (b) Contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding.

After initial measurement, such financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the Effective Interest Rate (EIR) method. All other debt instruments are measured at Fair Value through other comprehensive income or Fair value through profit and loss based on Company's business model.

(2) Equity Investment – All equity investments in scope of IND AS 109 are measured at fair value. Equity instruments which are held for trading and generally classified as at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL). For all other equity instruments, the Company decides to classify the same either as at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI) or fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL). The Company makes such election on an instrument by instrument basis. The classification is made on initial recognition and is irrevocable.

(3) Investment in subsidiaries is carried at cost in the separate financial statements.

De-recognition of financial assets

A financial asset is primarily de-recognised when the rights to receive cash flows from the asset have expired or the Company has transferred its rights to receive cash flows from the asset.

(b) Financial Liabilities

Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and transaction cost that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial liabilities are also adjusted. These liabilities are classified as amortised cost.

Subsequent measurement

Subsequent to initial recognition, these liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. These liabilities include borrowings and deposits.

De-recognition of financial liabilities

A financial liability is de-recognised when the obligation under the liability is discharged or cancelled or expired. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms or on the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the de-recognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

(c) Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses associated with its assets carried at amortised cost and FVOCI debt instruments. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

For trade receivable only, the Company applies the simplified approach permitted by IND AS 09 financial instruments, which requires expected lifetime losses to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables.

(d) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet if there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(viii) Inventories and Projects in Progress

(a) Inventories

- (i) Building material and consumable stores are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value, which is determined on the basis of the 'First in First out' method.
- (ii) Land is valued at lower of cost and net realisable value, which is determined on average method. Cost includes cost of acquisition and all related costs.
- (iii) Construction work in progress is valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of materials, services and other related overheads related to project under construction.
- (iv) Completed real estate project for sale and trading stock are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of land, materials, construction, services and other related overheads.

(b) Projects in Progress

Projects in progress are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes cost of land, materials, construction, services, borrowing costs and other overheads relating to projects.

(ix) Retirement Benefits

- i. Contributions payable by the Company to the concerned Government Authorities in respect of provident fund, family pension fund and employee state insurance are charged to the statement of profit and loss.
- ii. The Company is having Group Gratuity Scheme with Life Insurance Corporation of India. Provision for gratuity is made based on actuarial valuation in accordance with IND AS 19.
- iii. Provision for leave encashment in respect of unavailed leave standing to the credit of employees is made on actuarial basis in accordance with IND AS 19.
- iv. Actuarial gains/losses resulting from re-measurements of the liability/asset are included in other comprehensive income.

(x) Provisions, Contingent Assets and Contingent Liabilities

A provision is recognized when:

- the Company has a present obligation as a result of a past event;
- it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; and
- a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not require an outflow of resources. Where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

(xi) Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the total Profit for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the total Profit for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity share.

(xii) Leases

In accordance with IND AS 116, the Company recognises right of use assets representing its right to use the underlying asset for the lease term at the lease commencement date. The cost of right of use asset measured at inception shall comprise of the amount of the initial measurement of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payment made at or before commencement date less any lease incentive received plus any initial direct cost incurred and an estimate of cost to be incurred by lessee in dismantling and removing underlying asset or restoring the underlying asset or site on which it is located. The right of use asset is subsequently measured at cost less accumulated depreciation, accumulated impairment losses, if any and adjusted for any remeasurement of lease liability. The right of use assets is depreciated using the straight line method from the commencement date over the shorter of lease term or useful life of right of use assets. The estimated useful lives of right of use assets are determined on the same basis as those of property, plant and equipment. Right of use assets are tested for impairment whenever there is any indication that their carrying amounts may not be recoverable. Impairment loss, if any, is recognised in statement of profit and loss. The Company measures the lease liability at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date of lease. The lease payments are discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease, if that rate can be readily determined; the Company uses incremental borrowing rate. Lease arrangements where the risk and rewards incident to ownership of an asset substantially vest with the lessor are recognised as operating lease. Lease rent under operating lease are charged to statement of profit and loss on a straight line basis over the lease term except where scheduled increase in rent compensate the lessor for expected inflationary costs.

The lease liability is subsequently remeasured by increasing the carrying amount to reflect interest on lease liability, reducing the carrying amount to reflect the lease payments made and remeasuring the carrying amount to reflect any reassessment or lease modification or to reflect revised-in-substance fixed lease payments, the Company recognises amount of remeasurement of lease liability due to modification as an adjustment to right of use assets and statement of profit and loss depending upon the nature of modification. Where the carrying amount of right of use assets is reduced to zero and there is further reduction in measurement of lease liability, the Company recognises any remaining amount of the remeasurement in statement of profit and loss.

(xiii) Income Tax

- (i) Provision for current tax is made based on the tax payable under the Income Tax Act, 1961. Current income tax relating to items are recognised outside profit and loss (either in other comprehensive income or in equity).

- (ii) Deferred tax is recognised on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period. The carrying amount of deferred tax liabilities and assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period.

(xiv) Fair Value Measurement

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either:

- In the principal market for the asset or liability or
- In the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

The fair value of an asset or a liability is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming that market participants act in their economic best interest.

A fair value measurement of a non-financial asset takes into account a market participant's ability to generate economic benefits by using the asset in its highest and best use or by selling it to another market participant that would use the asset in its highest and best use.

The Company uses valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs:

- **Level 1:** Quoted (unadjusted) market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- **Level 2:** Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is directly or indirectly observable.
- **Level 3:** Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is unobservable.

For assets and liabilities that are recognised in the financial statements on a recurring basis, the Company determines whether transfer have occurred between levels in the hierarchy by re-assessing categorisation (based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole) at the end of each reporting period.

For the purpose of fair value disclosure, the Company has determined classes of assets and liabilities on the basis of nature, characteristics and risks of the asset or liability and the level of the fair value hierarchy as explained above.

(xv) Cash and Cash Equivalent

Cash and Cash equivalent in the balance sheet comprises cash at bank and cash on hand, demand deposits and short term deposits which are subject to an insignificant change in value.

The amendment to IND AS 7 requires entities to provide disclosure of change in the liabilities arising from financing activities, including both changes arising from cash flows and non cash changes (such as foreign exchange gain or loss). The Company has provided information for both current and comparative period in cash flow statement.

(xvi) Business Combinations

The acquisition method of accounting is used to account for all business combinations, except common control transactions, regardless of whether equity instruments or other assets are acquired. The consideration transferred for the acquisition of the transferor Companies comprises the:

- fair values of the assets transferred;
- liabilities incurred to the former owners of the acquired business;
- equity interests issued by the Company; and
- fair value of any asset or liability resulting from a contingent consideration arrangement.

Identifiable assets acquired, liabilities and contingent liabilities assumed in a business combination are with limited exceptions, measured initially at their fair values at the acquisition date.

Acquisition related costs are expensed as incurred.

The excess of the consideration transferred and acquisition-date fair value of any previous equity interest in the acquired entity over the fair value of the net identifiable assets acquired is recorded as goodwill. If those amounts are less than the fair value of the net identifiable assets of the business acquired, the difference is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity as capital reserve provided there is clear evidence of

the underlying reasons for classifying the business combination as a bargain purchase. In other cases, the bargain purchase gain is recognised directly in equity as capital reserve.

Where settlement of any part of cash consideration is deferred, the amounts payable in the future are discounted to their present value as at the date of exchange. The discount rate used is the entity's incremental borrowing rate, being the rate at which a similar borrowing could be obtained from an independent financier under comparable terms and conditions.

Contingent consideration is classified either as equity or a financial liability. Amounts classified as a financial liability are subsequently re-measured to fair value with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss. There is no contingent consideration in respect of all the years presented.

Business combinations involving entities that are controlled by the Company are accounted for using the pooling of interests method as follows:

- The assets and liabilities of the combining entities are reflected at their carrying amounts.
- No adjustments are made to reflect fair values or recognise any new assets or liabilities. Adjustments are only made to harmonise accounting policies.
- The financial information in the financial statements in respect of prior periods is restated as if the business combination had occurred from the beginning of the preceding period in the financial statements, irrespective of the actual date of the combination. In case of Court approved Scheme the business combination is recognised from the appointed date following the accounting treatment approved by the Court.
- The balance of the retained earnings appearing in the financial statements of the transferor is aggregated with the corresponding balance appearing in the financial statements of the transferee.
- The identity of the reserves are preserved and the reserves of the transferor become the reserves of the transferee.
- The difference, if any, between the amounts recorded as share capital issued plus any additional consideration in the form of cash or other assets and the amount of share capital of the transferor is transferred to capital reserve and is presented separately from other capital reserves.

(xvii) Significant Management Judgement in Applying Accounting Policies and Estimation of Uncertainty

Significant management judgement

When preparing the financial statements, management undertakes a number of judgements, estimates and assumptions about the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

The following are significant management judgement in applying the accounting policies of the Company that have the most significant effect on the financial statements.

(a) Recognition of deferred tax assets

The extent to which deferred tax assets can be recognized is based on an assessment of the probability of the Company's future taxable income against which the deferred tax assets can be utilised.

(b) Estimation of uncertainty

(a) Recoverability of advances/receivables

At each balance sheet date, based on historical default rates observed over expected life, the management assesses the expected credit loss on outstanding receivables and advances.

(b) Defined Benefit Obligation (DBO)

Management's estimate of the DBO is based on a number of critical underlying assumptions such as standard rates of assumptions such as standard rates of inflation, medical cost trends, mortality, discount rate and anticipation of future salary increases. Variation in these assumptions may significantly impact the DBO amount and the annual defined benefit expenses.

(c) Provisions

At each balance sheet date on the basis of management judgement, changes in facts and legal aspects, the Company assesses the requirement of provisions against the outstanding warranties and guarantees. However, the actual future outcome may be different from this judgement.

(d) Inventories

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value (NRV).

NRV for completed inventory is assessed including but not limited to market conditions and prices existing at the reporting date and is determined by the Company based on net amount that it expects to realise from the sale of inventory in the ordinary course of business.

NRV in respect of inventories under construction is assessed with reference to market prices (by referring to expected or recent selling price) at the reporting date less estimated costs to complete the construction and estimated cost necessary to make the sale. The costs to complete the construction are estimated by management.

(e) Fair Value Measurements

Management applies valuation techniques to determine the fair value of financial instruments (where active market quotes are not available) and non-financial assets. This involves developing estimates and assumptions consistent with how market participants would price the instrument/assets. Management bases its assumptions on observable data as far as possible but this may not always be available. In that case Management uses the best relevant information available. Estimated fair values may vary from the actual prices that would be achieved in an arm's length transaction at the reporting date.

(f) Lease

The Company evaluates if an arrangement qualifies to be a lease as per the requirements of IND AS 116. Identification of a lease requires

significant judgement. The Company uses significant judgement in assessing the lease term (including anticipated renewals) and the applicable discount rate.

The Company determines the lease term as the non-cancellable period of lease, together with both periods covered by an option to extend the lease if the Company is reasonably certain to exercise that option and periods covered by an option to terminate the lease if the Company is reasonably certain not to exercise that option. In exercising whether the Company is reasonably certain to exercise an option to extend a lease or to exercise an option to terminate the lease, it considers all relevant facts and circumstances that create an economic incentive for the Company to exercise the option to extend the lease or to exercise the option to terminate the lease. The Company revises lease term, if there is change in non-cancellable period of lease. The discount rate used is generally based on incremental borrowing rate.

(g) Classification of Assets and liabilities into current and non-current

The Management classifies assets and liabilities into current and non-current categories based on its operating cycle.

44. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The Group activities exposes it to variety of financial risk i.e. Credit Risk, Liquidity Risk, Capital Risk, Interest Rate Risk etc. These risks are managed by senior management of the Group and is supervised by Board of Directors of the Group to minimise potential adverse effects on the financial performance of the Company.

(i) Credit Risk:

Credit risk from cash and cash equivalents and bank deposits is considered immaterial in view of the creditworthiness of the banks the Group works with. Credit risk is the risk i.e a customer or the counter party fails to pay to the Company causing financial loss. The credit risk primarily arises from outstanding receivables from customer. The Group has specific policies for managing customer credit risk on an ongoing basis. These policies factor in the customer financial position, past experience and other customer specific factor.

Financial assets are written off when there is no reasonable expectation of recovery, such as a debtor failing to engage in a repayment plan with the Group. The Group makes provision for doubtful debt or write off when a debtor fails to make contractual payments. When loans or receivables have either been provided for or written off, the Group continues to engage in enforcement activity to attempt to recover the receivable due. When recoveries are made, these are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The Group has low credit risk in respect to cash and cash equivalent, other bank balances, other financial assets, trade receivables and security deposits paid.

(ii) Liquidity Risk:

Liquidity Risk is the risk that the Group will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. The Group approach to managing liquidity is to ensure as far as possible, that it will have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when they are due. Management monitors rolling forecasts of the liquidity position and cash and cash equivalent on the basis of expected cash flows. The Group takes into account the liquidity of the market in which the entity operates.
