## 10 YEARS OF STARTUP INDIA

## PM Modi Calls on Startups to Focus on Mfg, Deep Tech

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Friday called on Indian startups to focus on manufacturing, deep technology and global leadership, saying the next decade of Startup India must position the country at the forefront of innovation.

At the National Startup Day, which also marked the 10 years of the startup Startup India Mission, the PM said startups are key to shaping India's economic and technological future. He hailed Startup India as a "revolution" and a "rainbow vision" that transformed India into the world's third-largest startup ecosystem, growing to over 2 lakh, including nearly 125,000 startups from less than 500 startups in 2014.

"Today's startups are becoming unicorns. Unicorns are launching their IPOs and creating more jobs. Last year alone, nearly 44,000 new startups were registered. This is the biggest jump in any single year since the launch of Startup India."

Modi noted that the last 10 years have proven India's entrepreneurial capabilities and the goal should be to "lead the world in the next 10 years in India's new startup trends and technologies."

Emphasising that risk-taking has become mainstream with startups of varying sizes, sectors, location, and regional competitiveness, Modi said: "The government is with you in all your efforts. I have faith in your capabilities."

At the same event, commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal said Indian startups are cur-

rently active in over 50 sectors, including deep tech, AI, machine learning and quantum computing.

DPIIT-registered startups have 50 million users and 100 million users across the country. "Over 50 Startups are being recognised in India per day," Goyal posted on X.

## AI, MANUFACTURING

While he acknowledged challenges such as high computing costs, the PM said India AI Mission will help startups with more than 30,000 GPUs onboarded to make big technology accessible to small startups.

"We are also making sure that Indigenous AI should be developed by Indian talents on Indian servers. Similar efforts are being made in semiconductor, data centres, green hydrogen, and many other sectors," Modi said.

He asked startups to work on new ideas, solve problems, focus more on manufacturing and make products of the best quality in the world.

He highlighted that Startup India has fostered a national culture—democracy, entrepreneurship and bringing business aspirations to those living in smaller cities, towns and rural villages.

"First, new businesses and new ventures were only brought by children from rich families as they were the ones to get funding. Most of the middle-class and poor children were only able to dream of a job. But Startup India has changed this thinking. Now Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities and even villages are launching their startups," he said.

## Cross-border Ecomm Gets a Legup, Postal Exports Put on Par with Cargo Shipments

Paves way for speedier clearances, easier access to incentives such as RoDTEP, ROSCTL

New Delhi: In a major boost to cross-border e-commerce, the government has overhauled customs rules, treating exports made through postal channels on par with regular cargo shipments.

The reforms, just ahead of the Feb 1 budget, are expected to enable speedier exports through e-commerce exports through postal services besides providing smoother access to key export incentives such as duty drawback, Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP), and Rebate of State and Central Taxes and Levies (RoSCTL), which were earlier denied to them.

## Guj, AP, Goa Best in Startup Ecosystem

New Delhi: Gujarat, Arunachal Pradesh, and Goa were ranked the 'best performers' in developing a startup ecosystem for budding entrepreneurs while Karnataka, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh were also categorised as the top performers in the annual rankings released by the Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT).

Gujarat has been ranked the best performer for the fifth time in a row.

The ranking evaluates all states and union territories on their efforts to build an ecosystem conducive to start-ups growth. It rates them under five categories—best performers, top performers, leaders, aspiring leaders and emerging startup ecosystems.

The states and UTs were broadly divided into two sections based on their population size—those with above 1 crore and those with less than 1 crore.

They are evaluated across six reforms and are clearly defined in the report, covering policy and institutional support, physical and digital infrastructure, access to funding, market access and linkages, capacity building for entrepreneurs and ecosystem stakeholders, and innovation-led growth.

"By encouraging both healthy competition among states, governments, the framework supports the development of strong well-functioning startup ecosystems across the country," the DPIIT said.

Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Telangana, Uttarakhand, Manipur, Meghalaya, and Nagaland were categorised as leaders.

Assam, Bihar, J&K, Odisha, Arunachal and Nagaland, Mizoram, Sikkim, and Tripura were ranked as aspiring leaders.
