Assam police rescue 10 child trafficking victims from Arunachal

TINSUKIA, ASSAM, APR 5: Poverty is a compelling factor in the child trafficking industry across the globe. The story and horror of eleven boys and girls, including four minors, from a remote village in Assam's easternmost district, Tinsukia, was no different. But the swift action of Assam police, involving two states, reunited at least ten of them with their families.

The police have arrested two persons – Deep Jyoti Gogoi, a resident of Lakhimpur district and Dipak Karmakar alias Guddu, a resident of Lohali Basti under Doomdooma police station in Tinsukia district – for their alleged involvement in this child trafficking case.

Superintendent of Tinsukia police Abhijeet Gurav said, "Based on a complaint at Doomdooma police station, an operation was launched and ten victims of human trafficking were rescued from Taksing Basti in Arunachal's Upper Subansiri district. All the victims hail from Lohari Basti in Talap."

Taksing Basti, a small hamlet in the frontier state, is almost 250 kms northwest of Doomdooma. Describing the modus operandi,

investigating officer of the case Sub-Inspector Dilip Das said the accused targeted teenagers from poor background and lured them with the promise of good life and employment at Silapathar in Assam. "But instead he took them to Taksing Basti under Nacho police station in the neighboring state of Arunachal Pradesh where they were



pressed into domestic work." Das was accompanied by WC Saraswati Upadhyay of Talap police Outpost and OC of Nacho police station ASI Nido Talar. "Based on a tip, we arrested the local brokers and during remand interrogation, one of them spilled the beans," Das said, adding, "Based on the leads extracted, an

operation was launched on March 31."

"After a 72-hour-long operation, we finally succeeded in rescuing 10 victims and returned back on Monday. One girl had fled away before police could track them. We are trying to locate her," added Das.

Das said, when he questioned the parents of the victims, mostly daily wage workers, they informed the police that their children were forcefully taken away. "However, no such evidence was found during the course of investigation."

According to the United Nations Department of Defense and Crime, the definition of trafficking in persons' means "the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring or receipt of

persons, by means of threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of deception, of the abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation". Kauvery Hospital removes tumour of an elderly woman from blood vessel

KAUVERY Hospital, Chennai operated upon a 63 year old woman and removed a tumour from a blood vessel. An examination revealed that she had a cancerous tumour in her abdomen and required immediate treatment. She had visited several health care facilities but the tumour was not diagnosed.

Dr. U P Srinivasan, Gaestromintestinal Surgeon, said "She was denied surgery owing to the complexity as She had undergone multiple surgeries, including a hysterectomy". A PET Scan revealed that the tumour had not spread to other nearby organs. "Hence we recommended

debulking surgery and the hyperthermic intraperitoneal chemo therapy (HIPEC) procedure", he said.

In this method first the visible tumour cells are removed through surgery. There after a few tubes are inserted and a device pumps the chemotherapy drugs into the abdominal cavity at a temperature of 42 degrees Celsius" He said.

The procedure took around nine hours. HIPEC treatment improves the longevity of life for the patient in advance stages of Cancer. Kauvery Hospitals co-founder and Executive Director Aravinda Selvaraj said "This technology is a boon for the patients in the advance stages of Cancer.

KATTANKULATHUR, APR 5: SRM Institute of Science and Technology and La Trobe University, Australia, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding to establish a joint Centre of Eminence to pave the way for collaboration in digital technologies and engineering.

The MoU, signed at SRM IST at Kattankulathur on Tuesday, April 04, will also open opportunities for the design, development, incubation, and nurturing of ideas as business models or proof of concepts. Besides attracting industries to invest in innovative ideas, the MoU will attract potential minds and help converge to achievable goals in IoT and allied fields like machine learning, artificial intelligence, data analytics, cloud computing and cyber security.

"La Trobe recognises SRM as one of the top-ranking universities in India, offering a wide range of UG, PG and Research Programmes in Engineering, Management, Medicine and Science and Humanities. This partnership would establish a top-class collaborative Joint Centre of Eminence in Digital Technologies and Engineering," said a spokesperson of La Trobe University, ranked among the top 1 % of Universities of the World and one of the country's pioneering universities offering distinctive and high-quality degrees to equip students to understand and engage with global issues of today.

While interacting with the media after the signing of the MoU, Prof John Kinley Dewar, AO – Vice Chancellor and President, La Trobe University, said the exchange will make

it possible for them to plan the future in a more coordinated way between the two institutions. The new Joint Centre of Eminence will have its own Governance structure with 2 directors – 1 from each institution, an Advisory Board and systematic planning.

"We are very keen that our students come to India – which is a very dynamic country, and our students can learn so much from by spending



here and getting exposed to the expertise and talent here, and also learning the Indian way of life and culture," Prof. Dewar remarked.

Indian students can visit Australia for short courses like artificial intelligence, cyber security, and the Internet of Things, in which they possess the expertise, he said.

"I have been coming to India for 30 years and have never observed a time when there is so much optimism - both about what is happening in India and about relations between Australia and India. I am very excited and this is a partnership of equals without a hierarchical relationship," he said.

SRM IST and La Trobe both come together as very strong institutions

and with complementary expertise to gain from the collaboration, including short courses and seminars for staff joint research projects. He said this would be model many universities will pursue increasingly, particularly in India.

"We have many reasons for wanting to collaborate with institutions of this calibre (SRM IST). The calibre of students at this university is remarkable. We are very keen to

work with SRM to help develop and teach them. We are also very keen – through you – to partner with the industry. We are very committed to taking our knowledge and expertise outside for an impact in the wider world and collaborating with industries is very important," Prof. Dewar added.
