Japan Credit Rating Agency, Ltd. (JCR) announces the following credit ratings.

Rationale

- (1) Housing and Urban Development Corporation Limited (HUDCO) is a public financial institution incorporated by the Government of India (GoI) for the purpose of housing construction and urban infrastructure development in the country. It plays a highly significant role in the GoI's housing promotion policy and urban development initiatives. The ratings are strongly linked to the GoI's creditworthiness and are in line with the Republic of India's Long-term Issuer Ratings (FC: BBB+/Stable and LC: BBB+/Stable). This reflects HUDCO's strong capital and personnel ties with the GoI, its critical position as a financing arm for housing and urban development projects nationwide, and its close integration with the GoI that is underpinned by its designation as a de facto implementing agency (Nodal Agency) for government-led projects.
- (2) HUDCO was established in 1970 with full funding from the GoI. It was listed on NSE and BSE in 2017, and although the government's shareholding had declined to 75% as of the end of September 2025, no further divestment is planned, with their strong capital ties expected to continue. Board members are appointed with the approval of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, indicating deep personnel linkage with the government. The Company participates in various government-led projects and holds high strategic importance in the GoI's industrial policy. For instance, under the flagship project "Housing for AII," launched in 2015 to address urban housing shortages, HUDCO has been designated as one of the Nodal Agencies for PMAY-U (Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban), a government housing scheme that has continued as PMAY-U 2.0 since 2024. In 2024, the Company was granted "Navratna" status, the second-highest category among public-sector enterprises, providing discretion for strategic investments through joint ventures and M&As both domestically and internationally. Based on these factors, JCR views HUDCO's relationship with the GoI as strong and virtually integrated.
- (3) Driven by robust domestic demand for housing and urban development, HUDCO's loan portfolio has been on an upward trend. It has adopted a policy to allocate over 75% of its loan book to infrastructure financing and following its approval as an NBFC-IFC (Non-Banking Financial Company-Infrastructure Finance Company) in August 2024, infrastructure lending has grown significantly. For FY2025, outstanding loans increased substantially by 35% year-on-year, and both consolidated revenue from operations and net profit reached record highs of INR 103.1 billion and INR 27.1 billion, respectively. With numerous urban development projects continuing across the country, HUDCO's business expansion is expected to persist in FY2026.
- (4) HUDCO's loan portfolio remains sound. Although the top 20 borrowers account for approximately 78% of total loans, indicating high concentration, around 90% of the portfolio is guaranteed by the central and state governments, limiting its credit risks. Reflecting these guarantees, its capital to risk-weighted assets ratio stood at 46.6% at the end of FY2025, well above the domestic regulatory requirement of 15%. Its nonperforming loan ratio has been on a declining trend, standing at 1.67% on a gross basis and 0.25% on a net basis as of the end of FY2025.
