PUBLIC MOBILITY EXPANSION: Government plans region-wise rollout to improve public transport connectivity in state

5,206 buses to run on 1,164 routes across MP in 2 years

State to introduce buses in two phases under Sugam Parivahan Seva Yojana

In the first phase, approximately 5,206 buses will operate on 1,164 routes across the state over the next two years. Chief Minister Mohan Yadav on Thursday reviewed the latest progress of the State Government's Chief Minister Sugam Parivahan Seva Yojana here. Transport Minister Rao Uday Pratap Singh was also present. The Chief Minister directed that the scheme be launched in the field at the earliest. Transport Secretary Manish Singh informed that procedural work for implementation of the scheme was

progressing rapidly. The scheme will be executed in two phases.

Intelligent Transport Management System to be set up

Seven regions have been identified across the state: Indore, Ujjain, Bhopal, including Narmadapuram, Jabalpur, Sagar, Gwalior, including Chambal, and Rewa, including Shahdol. To ensure

smooth monitoring of all buses, an Intelligent Transport Management System will be established, said officials. All buses operated under the scheme will feature a uniform colour scheme to ensure consistency and visual uniformity.

It was also informed that, on the recommendation of the Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety (SCCoRS), a separate MP State Road Safety Secretariat will be established in the state to strengthen road safety measures.

MP delegation' to study organic farming practices in Dantewada

Bhopal: Organic farming is being practised by tribal farmers in Dantewada district of Chhattisgarh and a delegation from Madhya Pradesh should be sent to study these practices, Chief Minister Mohan Yadav said during a review meeting of the Tribal Affairs Department here on Thursday. Yadav said organic farming should be encouraged in tribal regions of the state. He also called for promotion of animal husbandry within the tribal community and urged that their participation be leveraged to boost milk production.

Rs 432 cr disbursed under Nutrition Grant Scheme

Tribal Welfare Minister Vijay Shah said that, under the Government's Nutrition Grant Scheme, a monthly amount of Rs 1,500 is being deposited into the bank accounts of female heads of households belonging to Particularly Backward Tribes. Since December 2023, a total of Rs 432 crore has been disbursed to 2,37,550 women.

The investigation into the high-profile Honey Trap 2.0 case in Indore revolves around Reshu alias Abhilasha Choudhary, a resident of Sagar, who is believed to be the central figure in the

alleged blackmail network. Reshu, who was active a few years ago in the politics of the Naryawali Assembly constituency adjoining Sagar, is described by sources as an ambitious and outspoken woman. Following minor controversies, she began projecting herself as an emerging youth leader in

Reshu's foreign links, political connections

Police have learned that Reshu had gone abroad for studies. She is known for a high-profile lifestyle and speaks fluent English. Information has also surfaced that she underwent a divorce some time ago. Sources claimed that Reshu came into contact with high-profile individuals after joining the BJP in Sagar district. Through these connections, she allegedly sought to gain influence and wealth. Sheweta Jain allegedly mentored her in these efforts.

Makronia, a suburb bordering Sagar city, and the adjoining Assembly constituency. She reportedly tried to secure a corporator ticket in the Makronia civic body elections but was unsuccessful. She later began preparing to seek an Assembly ticket from the Naryawali constituency in the 2023 elections and was also planning for the 2028 polls. According to sources, she allegedly attempted to influence an MLA through manipulative tactics. Subsequently, during a socio-religious event held in Makronia, family members of the MLA allegedly reprimanded Reshu publicly, following which she disappeared from public view for a few days. However, she later began efforts to regain her foothold in politics, sources claimed.

Govt clears Shiksha Ghar Yojana for dropouts

The Madhya Pradesh government has given approval to launch the 'Shiksha Ghar Yojana' to reconnect dropout students with formal education. Chief Minister Mohan Yadav approved the proposal during a review meeting and directed the School Education Department to implement the scheme from the 2026-2027 academic session. Yadav reviewed the schemes and activities of the department during the meeting held at Mantralaya on Thursday.

Scheme aims to reconnect students with formal education from 2026-27 session

that the school education department and the Women and Child Development Department should work together for the first time in the state's history to improve early childhood education and ensure quality learning for children from the founda-

tional stage. Yadav instructed district education officers to hold meetings with local MLAs to improve facilities in schools across their respective assembly constituencies.

During the meeting, Yadav also instructed officials to include the biography of Emperor Vikramaditya in the school curriculum and asked them to complete the related process at the earliest. He asked officials to complete all preparations before the new academic session beginning on June 16.

He said schools achieving 100% results, as well as those securing over 90% to 95% re-

sults, should be honoured. During the meeting, discussion was held on preparing a detailed action plan to popularise the concept of Sandipani schools among the public. He also directed officials to prepare an engaging book on the life of Guru Sandipani.

Yadav further directed that vocational training should also be introduced in schools. Students of high school and higher secondary classes should be taught agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries and other employment-oriented subjects. He suggested linking regional self-help groups with schools

wherever possible. He further suggested organising health check-up camps, driving licence camps and coaching facilities for major competitive examinations in schools. Yadav directed officials to complete the recruitment process of guest teachers before July 1 and ensure all preparations are completed before the session begins. He further announced that from July 1 till Guru Purnima on July 29, schools across the state would organise "Teacher Vandana" programmes in the presence of parents and public representatives.

State traders' welfare board set up under CM's chairmanship

State Traders' Welfare Board has been set up under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Mohan Yadav. The minister for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSME), Chatanya Kashyap, will be a member of the board.

Yadav and Kashyap will nominate ten members to the board. The other members of the committee will be its authorised members from industries; MSME; the officers of commercial taxes department; finance; agriculture; health;

public works; mining; energy; renewable energy; animal husbandry; fishermen's welfare; science and technology; aviation; cottage and village industries; technical education; tourism; the CEO of Rajya Niti Ayog; the regional head of RBI; the regional officer of NHAI; the senior manager of the Bharatiya Container Corporation; the CGM of NABARD; the branch manager of Export Credit Guarantee Corporation (ECGC); the regional head of Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA); the commissioner of Food Safety

and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI); and the CEO of State Rural Livelihood Mission. The chief executive officer of the Institute of Good Governance and the director of the Academy of Administration will be the ex officio members of the board. State heads of the CII, FICCI, Fish Oil Emulsifier, Dikko, Laghu Udyog Bharti and other state-level organisations will be its ex officio members. The managing director of MPSEDC will be the member secretary of the committee. A meeting of the board will be held once in every three months.

Central inspection team is in city to evaluate Bhopal's sanitation system

The central inspection team under Swachh Survekshan 2025-26 on Thursday began evaluating Bhopal's sanitation

- **Technical glitches slow first-day operations**
- **Survey in Bhopal's "Jodi city" Berasia completed in one day**

system, launching the survey from old city areas. The inspection began at 5am and continued till 9pm.

Inspection work in Bhopal Municipal Corporation's (BMC) "Jodi city" Berasia was completed within a few hours before the team departed for Bhopal. However, technical issues on the online portal hampered operations on the very first day. According to BMC officials, two of the six members of the central team were unable to log in to the portal because of technical glitches. As a result, only four members could proceed with field inspections across the city. The

team inspected water bodies, sewage treatment plants (STPs), garbage transfer stations, major waste-generating zones, commercial areas, parks and locations known for visual cleanliness. During the inspection, officials photographed sanitation-awareness paintings, cleanliness infrastructure and waste-management arrangements before uploading them to the survey portal. **Teams focused on North Assembly constituency areas**

Owing to the portal-related issues, the visiting teams from Delhi remained largely confined to areas falling under the North Assembly constituency. Inspections were carried out in Mazdoor Nagar (Ward 11) of Zone 2, along with Nariyal Kheda, Shiv Nagar and Ganesh Nagar in Ward 12. Officials first examined road cleanliness, drain maintenance and waste collection systems before interacting directly with residents regarding sanitation conditions and door-to-door garbage collection services. BMC staff began preparations and field coordination from as early as 5am and remained engaged in survey-related activities till late at night.

Old city survey to continue for two more days

Officials said the survey team will continue inspections across different wards of the old city over the next two days, while inspections in New Bhopal are scheduled to begin from Monday. On the first day, inspections covered Ward 7 under Zone 2; Wards 11, 12 and 13 under Zone 3; Wards 15 and 16 under Zone 4; and one ward under Zone 17. On Friday, the team is expected to continue inspections in Zones 3, 4, 5 and 17.

Questions asked during citizen feedback

During interactions with residents, the survey team asked whether garbage was collected daily, whether wet and dry waste were segregated, whether drains and roads were cleaned regularly, whether public toilets were maintained properly and whether citizens were aware of home composting practices.
