SC grants bail to Varavara in Bhima Koregaon case

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Wednesday granted permanent medical bail to 82-year-old P Varavara Rao in the Bhima Koregaon case, rejecting the National Investigation Agency (NIA)'s argument that an accused booked under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) cannot be let out on bail on grounds of old age or medical condition.

Noting that the octogenarian has spent two-and-a-half years behind bars as an under-trial and was never accused of misusing the liberty of justice bail, a bench led by Justice Uday U Lalit granted regular bail to Rao with usual conditions, such as not leaving the jurisdiction of the trial court in Mumbai and not contacting witnesses in the case.

Rao shall be free to avail medical attention of his choice, directed the court, adding that he should keep NIA apprised of his treatment. The bench, which included Justices Anuruddha Bose and Sudhanshu Dhulia, further recorded that in its order, "the sluggish pace of the 2018 case, underlining that not only are certain accused yet to be arrested, charged and have not been framed against those who were arrested and jailed four years ago".

Rao is among the activists, lawyers, poets and scholars arrested by NIA in connection with alleged inflammatory speeches made at the Elgar Parishad convales held in Pune on December 31, 2017. This, the police claimed, triggered violence the next day near the Koregaon Bhima war memorial located on the outskirts of the western Maharashtra city, leading to death of one person and injuries to several others. NIA claims the accused have Maoist links and indulged in anti-national activities.

questioned Raju why NIA chose not to file an appeal against the February 2021 Bombay high court order giving him interim medical bail for six months.

Further, there is nothing on record to say he misused his liberty which now stands extended to one-and-a-half years. You cite some emails to us which means you have been keeping a watch, tailing him. But it is not your argument that he abused his medical bail. You have further requisitioned the trial court to go to his residence or that you have any other apprehension," it added.

At this point, the ASG cited Asaram's example, saying the man was 81 but the Supreme Court denied him bail in a rape case. Raju claimed that in a UAPA case, old age or medical ailment cannot secure reprieve for an accused, especially when the offence alleged can be punished with a maximum penalty of death sentence.

The court was, however, unmoved. "If you say that age or medical ailment is not a factor, why did you not challenge the high court order? Today, you aren't seriously disputing that he is suffering from several ailments. Look at the age as well. He is 82. If a man suffers from ailments at this age, he doesn't start recuperating. It can only aggravate..." it added.

Another submission by NIA that Rao's custodial interrogation may still be required was also not appreciated much by the bench. It asked the ASG why there was a delay of more than a year in NIA taking over the investigation. "Why so much delay? The moment there is a charge under UAPA, the state is obliged to send a report to the Centre, we are trying to see whether you proceeded with diligence or not. He was arrested in August 2018 by the state police. You took over in February 2019. So, we take it that the require-

ment of law is fulfilled as far as his custodial interrogation is concerned," it told Raju.

On his part, the ASG then read out emails purportedly written by Rao to two persons, conspiring to lead an armed rebellion against the country. But the court noted that one of the recipients of the alleged mail is dead while another is yet to be arrested by NIA.

Senior advocate Anand Grover, appearing for Rao, denied the veracity of these emails. "We have a serious dispute regarding how these emails were planted. We will prove it during the trial. But do have to be in custody till the trial is over? I am a poet and a writer in Telugu literature. Is it in their interest that I die in jail like Sean Swamy? I am ready to stand trial but why should I die in jail just because they have invoked UAPA," Grover argued.

Eighty-four-year-old tribal rights activist San Swamy, also named in the same case, died in judicial custody in Mumbai on July 5 last year, even as his bail application remained pending before the high court since April 2021 while his health deteriorated. NIA had alleged his bail contending there was no "conclusive proof" of his ailments.

Grover, at this point, submitted that Rao should be allowed to go to his hometown, Hyderabad, where his wife and his children reside. The senior lawyer said his client could get a formidable treatment for his ailments there. The bench, however, pointed out that Rao will have to make a separate application in this regard.

It then passed the order granting permanent medical bail to Rao, referring to his advanced age; period of custody as an under-trial; delay in framing of charges in the case; and the fact that his medical condition has not improved. It was given interim bail in 2021.

COURT ALLOWS ED TO QUESTION NAGPUR LAWYER

MUMBAI: A special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court on Wednesday allowed the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to question Nagpur-based lawyer Sureshra Gadhing in a money-laundering case.

The ED's case is based on the Elgar Parishad-Bhima Koregaon violence case in which the NIA has arrested 16 activists, including Gadhing.

Special Judge Rajesh Kataria permitted ED officials to question Gadhing on August 17, 18, and 19 at Taloja jail in Navi Mumbai where he is lodged. In its plea filed before the court last week, the agency said that the accused in the Elgar Parishad-Bhima Koregaon violence case were members of the banned Communist Party of India (Maoist), and Gadhing was involved in raising funds in collusion with the company. The ED also alleged that Gadhing had various bank accounts opened in the names of their family members and Gadhing was the prime suspect, it said.

Gadhing said the allegations made against him did not make out an offence under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act. Special prosecutor Sunil Gonsalves, who appeared for the ED, said that the NIA investigation was limited to the offence and it was the job of the ED to track down the money trail. "We are not asking for his arrest. We just want to record his statements vis-à-vis to unearth the proceeds of crime."

- 1. The above unaudited financial results of the Company have been reviewed by Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on 10th August, 2022. The Statutory Auditors have also conducted limited review of the unaudited financial results.
2. The above unaudited financial results of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind-AS) as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time.
3. Catering contracts awarded before 22nd March, 2020 have been treated as zero period due to Pandemic and income and expenditure incurred during the year 2020-21 and for the period up to 26.11.2021. Catering services has been restarted with cooked food from 27.11.2021 in a phased manner and income and Railway share payable has been accrued accordingly. However, the effect of enhancement of Licence Fee for the periods from 18.11.2019 to 22.03.2020 and 27.11.2021 to 30.06.2022 has not been accounted & recognized on account of increase in catering tariff as per the CO-60 of 2019 issued by the Railway Board. Since date from 2022 onwards the Company has been re-licensed by the Company as pending which is now in progress.
4. During the Financial Year 2021-22, an amount of ₹ 2713.32 lakhs was paid and charged to revenue on account of 15% Railway share in profits of Railiner plants (owned and PPP plants) up to 31.3.2021 as Railways have not agreed with the contractor. Further, due to non-availability of figures of ITC claimed by the contractor for 15% Railiner Plants for the quarter ending 30th June 2022, the same could not be estimated and accounted for in the quarter ended 30th June 2022 and these DCOs have been resubmitted against the claim of IRCTC for Input Tax Credit (ITC) has nominated a committee to examine the provisions of the contract agreement vis-à-vis applicable laws and impact will be given in the books as per the approval of the Competent Authority.
5. As per the terms and conditions of the tender, in respect of a PPP Railiner plants, the Developer cum Operator (D/COs) are to be reimbursed the GST on sales net of Input Tax Credit (ITC) availed by them. The impact for the same was accounted for in Financial Year 2021-22 except for one plant where figures of ITC claimed by the DCO were not available. Further, due to non-availability of figures of ITC claimed by the DCOs for 15% Railiner Plants for the quarter ending 30th June 2022, the same could not be estimated and accounted for in the quarter ended 30th June 2022 and these DCOs have been resubmitted against the claim of IRCTC for Input Tax Credit (ITC) has nominated a committee to examine the provisions of the contract agreement vis-à-vis applicable laws and impact will be given in the books as per the approval of the Competent Authority.
6. The Audit Committee issued notice dated 23.02.2022 for professional amount of ₹5041.44 Lakhs under section 171 of the C&A Act, 2017 for passing the benefit of tax reduction to consumers. The show cause notice is being considered by the Company and the matter is pending.
7. Arbitration award was pronounced in April, 2022 amounting to ₹ 7400 Lakhs plus simple interest @8% per annum from July, 2018 onwards, in favour of certain licensees which represents principal amount towards claims for arrears of licence fee. The award was pronounced in favour of licensees and recovery of differential costs to the benefit of the passengers on the instructions of Railways whereas the price of combo meal, which is lower than the price of regular meal, has been determined in favour of licensees. The matter has been referred to the Arbitrator for its instructions on the matter as the final liability in this matter would be of Railways and the Company has the liability to recover from Railways in case ultimately it is made payable to the matter is pending.
8. As per the terms and conditions of the tender, in respect of a PPP Railiner plants includes (i) ₹ 2248.54 Lakhs being reversal of excess provisions for previous years relating to Performance Related Pay, (ii) ₹ 2713.32 lakhs being excess on account of 15% Railway share in profits of Railiner plants up to 31.3.2021 (refer Note no.4) and no. of 33 lakhs being excess provisions written back for previous years relating to various other expenses.
9. During the Financial Year 2021-22, the Company has sub-divided its 1600 Lakhs equity shares of face value of ₹ 10/- each fully paid up into 8000 Lakhs equity shares of face value of ₹ 2/- each fully paid up w.e.f. 29th October, 2021 as recommended by the Board of Directors and approved by the Shareholders of the Company. Earnings per Share have been calculated / restated as applicable for all the periods presented after considering the new number of equity shares post such sub-division in line with the provisions of the applicable Ind AS and to make figures of EPS comparable with previous period/year.
10. Figures for the quarter ended 31st March, 2022 represents the derived figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended 31st March, 2022 and the unaudited published year to date figures up to 31st December, 2021 being the date of the end of the third quarter of the relevant financial year which were subjected to limited review by the statutory auditors of the Company.
