The Schedule V of the companies Act and terms of appointment restricts the payment of minimum remuneration to a period of three years in the absence of adequate profits. However, The company has stated that the managerial remuneration is in compliance with Schedule V of the companies Act 2013, subject to approval by the shareholders in its general meeting under section 197(10) of the companies act 2013. Refer note 51 to the standalone financial statements.

- h. With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:

v. (a) The final dividend proposed in the previous year, declared and paid by the Company during the year is in accordance with Section 123 of the Act, as applicable.

vi. Based on our examination which included test checks, the company has used an accounting software for maintaining its books of account which has a feature of recording audit trail (edit log) facility and the same has operated throughout the year for all relevant transactions recorded in the software. Further, during the course of our audit we did not come across any instance of audit trail feature being tampered with. Additionally, the audit trail has been preserved by the company as per the statutory requirements for record retention. Our examination of the audit trail was in the context of an audit of financial statements carried out in accordance with the Standard of Auditing and only to the extent required by Rule 11(g) of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014. 

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of **K.C.P Sugar and Industries Corporation Limited** (the "Holding Company") and its subsidiaries (the Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group"), which comprise the consolidated balance sheet as at March 31, 2026, and the consolidated statement of profit and loss (including other comprehensive income), the consolidated statement of changes in equity and the consolidated statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the consolidated financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated financial statements").

These financial statements have been audited by another auditor whose audit report has been furnished to us by the Management, and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this subsidiary, and our report in terms of sub-section (3) of section 143 of the Act, in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiary, is based solely on the report of such other auditor.

 - e) On the basis of the written representations received from the Directors of the Holding Company as on March 31, 2026 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors of the Group companies incorporated in India is disqualified as on March 31, 2026 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164(2) of the Act.
 - f) With respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the Group and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our separate Report in "Annexure A" which is based on the auditor's reports of the company and its subsidiaries incorporated in India. Our report expresses an unmodified opinion on the adequacy and operating effectiveness of internal financial controls over financial reporting of those companies, for the reasons stated therein.
 - g) With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with the requirements of section 197(16) of the Act, as amended:

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the managerial remuneration of INR 25.28 lakhs paid by the Company to its Executive Director for the period 29th July 2025 to 31st March 2026 during the financial year 2025-2026 is the minimum remuneration for the fourth consecutive financial year of inadequate profits during her tenure covering



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29th July 2022 to 28th July 2027. The Schedule V of the companies Act and terms of appointment restricts the payment of minimum remuneration to a period of three years in the absence of adequate profits. However, The company has stated that the managerial remuneration is in compliance with Schedule V of the companies Act 2013, subject to approval by the shareholders in its general meeting under section 197(10) of the companies act 2013. Refer note 41 to the Consolidated financial statements.

- h) With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, as amended, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us and based on the consideration of the reports of other auditors on separate financial statements of the subsidiary, as noted in the "Other Matters" paragraph:
- i. The consolidated financial statements disclose the impact of pending litigations on the consolidated financial position of the Group. Refer note 35.1 to the consolidated financial statements.
