# At least 19 Naxalites arrested in separate operations in Chhattisgarh's Sukma

SUKMA, OCT 29 /-/- At least 19 Naxalites, three of them carrying bounty, were arrested by the security forces in separate operations in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district, police said on Tuesday.

As many as 14 Naxalites were apprehended from the Jagargunda police station area, while five were caught in the Bheji police station limits on Sunday, an official said. Joint teams of the District Reserve Guard (DRG), 219th and 150th battalions of the Central Reserve Police Force and 201st battalion of CoBRA (Commando Battalion for Resolute Action) — an elite unit of CRPF — were involved in the two actions, he said.

Of the 14 men, aged between 18 to 40 years, held in Jagargunda, three carried a bounty of Rs 1 lakh each, he said.

The official said the trio included Barse Hadma (25), a militia commander, and Barse Nagesh (20) and Hemla Jitu (18), who were working with CNM (Chetna Natya Mandli) — a frontal wing of Maoists, he said. The security forces recovered three gelatin rods, 300 gm of gunpowder, cordex wire, firecrackers, detonators, electric wire and batteries from the 14 cadres, he said. Similarly, five cadres were apprehended from Bheji. They were allegedly involved in the murders of a villager in Bhandarpadar in September and an electrician engaged in laying a power transmission line in the same village in February this year, the official said.

The arrested men were active in the outlawed outfit for eight to 10 years, he added. (PTI)

# Over 150 injured in fireworks accident at Kerala temple

KASARAGOD, OCT 29 /-/- A fire accident during a Theyyam performance at a temple near Neeleswaram late on Monday night left 150 people injured, 10 of them seriously, when firecrackers stored in the vicinity exploded, police said on Tuesday.

While police said that the exact cause of the blaze is yet to be ascertained, eyewitnesses said sparks from firecrackers fell on the rest of the stocks stored nearby, leading to an explosion that scared away the people watching the Theyyam performance. The incident happened at Veerarkavu Temple near Neeleswaram in this northernmost district of Kerala, police said. Neeleswaram police have registered a case into the firework accident under the Explosive Substance Act and various sections of the BNS. "A case was registered into the incident, and eight persons are booked. All those booked are temple committee members," a senior police officer told news agency PTI.

It was suspected that the firecrackers were burst without complying with safety norms and guidelines, he said. Hundreds of people, including women and children, had gathered to have a glimpse of the Theyyam at the shrine. Theyyam is a centuries-old ritualistic performance held at temples and 'kavus'

(sacred groves) in the Malabar (north Kerala) region of Kerala. Mobile phone footage, broadcast by television channels, showed hapless people getting scattered and running in panic after a thundering explosion and a ball of fire happened on one of the premises of the shrine. The incident was suspected to have happened after the fire crackers stored in a shed in the temple premises caught fire accidentally, eyewitnesses said.

According to police, over 150 people sustained serious and minor injuries in the accident, and at least 108 persons were seeking treatment in various hospitals in Kasaragod, Kannur, and Kozhikode districts and in Mangalore in neighbouring Karnataka, police said. The district collector said on Tuesday that those who were seriously injured had 80 per cent burns. "The cause of the accident is being ascertained. Samples have been collected from the site," he said. He further said that according to a preliminary probe, the fireworks storage facility and the place where the crackers were being burst were close by.

"The safety precautions were not taken. The requirement of maintaining a minimum distance of 100 meters between the two was not followed. No permission was taken either for storage of fireworks," he

added. Mobile phone footage broadcast by television channels, showed the severity of the accident and the distress of the helpless crowd gathered at the village temple. In the footage, a large crowd could be seen gathered on one side of the temple, with a Theyyam artist, dressed in ritualistic red attire, performing amidst them. A burst was heard, and a ball of fire and billowing smoke appeared on the other side of the shrine, an eyewitness recalled.

People, including women and children, were seen scattering, running around, and urging others to move away. Many survivors said they were yet to recover from the shock and said they still had no clarity on what happened at midnight. "We were watching Theyyam... suddenly we heard a huge sound of explosion and fire at some distance. Luckily, we could move to a safer place," a young man told TV channels on Tuesday. Everything was over within seconds. Several people suffered injuries in the stampede after the tragedy, said another eyewitness. (PTI)

# BJP focuses on reaching out to voters to win all 11 out of 12 Assembly seats it fights in Nagpur

NAGPUR, OCT 29 /-/- Out of the total 12 Assembly constituencies in Nagpur district of Maharashtra, the ruling BJP is contesting as many as 11 seats, while only one has gone to ally Shiv Sena, which perhaps indicates the importance the party attaches to this region.

The party has tasked 50,000 of its workers to reach out to voters ahead of the polls. It is making all-out efforts, including door-to-door meetings and holding interactions with people from different walks of life, to win these seats. Nagpur is also the home district of several high-profile party leaders, including Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis and state party chief Chandra Bawankule. Union minister and former BJP chief Nitin Gadkarialsohailsfromhere. Also, the party's ideological fountainhead, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) is headquartered in Nagpur. A senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader said the party has laid much stress on this region and is leaving no stone unturned to win all the seats from here in the next month's state elections.

Union Home Minister and former party president Amit Shah visited Nagpur on September 24 and interacted with office-bearers of all 62 constituencies in the Vidarbha region. He made a pitch for increasing the vote share by 10 per cent in every booth and work in tandem with all the alliance partners.

Shah also said that Vidarbha is a stronghold of the BJP and the road to power in Maharashtra goes through Vidarbha. In the 2019 Assembly elections, the BJP won six out of the total 12 seats, Congress four, NCP one and one independent. This time, the saffron party is contesting 11 seats. Fadnis, who has earlier successfully contested the Assembly election for five times, is contesting from the Nagpur South-West constituency, while Bawankule is fighting from the Kamptee constituency. A senior BJP leader said efforts are being made to reach out to maximum voters through meetings and other means. "More than 70 per cent party workers in the district have hit the ground and are going door-to-door to connect with voters.

The party workers are reaching out to especially those pockets where a false narrative about the Constitution was spread by the Opposition parties," he said. Several organisations linked to the Sangh Parivar are doing the needful, the leader said, and expressed confidence that the BJP and the Mahayuti constituents will win all 12 seats comfortably unlike this year's Lok Sabha elections in Vidarbha, he said.

Of the 12 constituencies, the BJP is locked in a direct fight with the Congress in most of the seats in Nagpur. While the BJP is contesting 11 seats, its ally Shiv Sena is contesting the Ramtek constituency. Talking about the BJP's poll campaign, the party's Maharashtra spokesperson based in Nagpur, Chandan Goswami, said the booth workers are moving from door-to-door to meet voters. They are also seeking suggestions from people to be included in the BJP manifesto. "More than 50,000 workers are working on the ground in Nagpur district to connect with the voters. They are also holding meetings with people from all

walks of life, including doctors, lawyers, businessmen and employed people," he said. Senior party leaders, including Gadkari, Fadnis and Bawankule, have put special focus on Vidarbha seats and are keeping constant coordination with BJP office-bearers and workers, he said. "Our campaign strategy is ready and visits of party leaders for poll campaigns and meetings are being worked out. The poll campaigning will start within a few days," the BJP spokesperson added. The BJP workers in the district are being guided by Senior leaders like Kailash Vijayvargiya and Prahlad Patel and are working on the ground as per their instructions. "About two dozen committees have been formed for the election, wherein various responsibilities have been assigned to the BJP office-bearers. A team has also been formed to coordinate with alliance partners. The BJP and its Mahayuti partners are hopeful of winning all the Assembly segments from the district and more than 45 across 62 seats in Vidarbha," Goswami said. (PTI)

# Delhi HC seeks AAP govt response over BJP MLAs' plea seeking CAG reports in Assembly

NEW DELHI, OCT 29 /-/- The Delhi High Court on Tuesday sought a response of the AAP government on a plea filed by several BJP MLAs seeking a direction to place 12 CAG reports related to liquor duty, pollution and finance before the Assembly. Justice Sanjeev Narula subsequently issued a notice to the Delhi government, the office of Legislative Assembly speaker, the lieutenant governor (LG), the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) and the accountant general (audit), Delhi. The

matter was posted for hearing on December 9. The petition has been filed by Leader of Opposition in the Delhi Assembly Vijender Gupta and Delhi BJP MLAs Mohan Singh Bisht, Om Prakash Sharma, Ajay Kumar Mahawar, Abhay Verma, Anil Kumar Bajpai and Jitendra Mahajan. During the hearing, the counsel representing the lawmakers sought an earlier date of hearing owing to certain "compelling reasons". The counsel appearing for one of the respondents, however, claimed

the plea was filed with a political motive. The plea, on the other hand, claimed the CAG reports from 2017-2018 to 2021-2022, were pending with Delhi Chief Minister Atishi, who also holds the finance portfolio. The plea further alleged despite the LG's repeated requests, these reports have not been sent to him for tabling the same before the Assembly. The petition, filed by advocates Neeraj and Satya Ranjan Swain, the BJP MLAs had approached the chief minister, the chief secretary and the speaker in the past but nothing came of it. (PTI)
