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Constitution has given us the power to dream: PM

In a letter on Constitution Day, he urges citizens to fulfil constitutional duties

New Delhi, 26 November

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday urged the citizens of India to fulfil their constitutional duties and strengthen democracy by exercising their right to vote.

In a letter to the people of the country on the occasion of Constitution Day, PM Modi called upon citizens to place their duties foremost in their minds as India moves towards the vision of a Viksit Bharat.

The Constitution Day celebrations were held at the Central Hall of the Old Parliament building here and state capitals. The programme at the Central Hall included the reading of the Preamble led by President Droupadi Murmu.

Besides Murmu, those seated at the dais included Vice-President C P Radhakrishnan, Prime Minister Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Opposition leaders Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi, Union ministers J P Nadda and Kiren Rijiju and Deputy Chairman of Rajya Sabha Harivansh. Several union ministers and MPs from both houses of Parliament also attended the event.

In her speech, President Murmu said that the Constitution is the cornerstone of the nation's identity as also the guiding document to shun colonial mindset and adopt nationalist thinking.

PM Modi said that it is the power of India's Constitution that someone like him, "coming from a humble and economically disadvantaged family", has served as the head of the government continuously for over 24 years. "This Constitution has given several others, like me, the power to dream and the strength to work towards it," he said.

The celebrations, which mark the

adoption of the Constitution on this day in 1949, turned into political contestation between the Centre and state governments run by the INDIA bloc parties. It was reminiscent of the Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) and Congress-led INDIA bloc's campaigns on the issue in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

In his letter, the PM noted that in 2010, when the Constitution completed 60 years, "the occasion did not receive the attention it deserved at a national level". Modi pointed out that a "Samvidhan Gaurav Yatra" was organised in Gujarat "to express our collective gratitude and commitment to the Constitution". Modi was then the chief minister of Gujarat.

The PM said that when the Constitution completed 75 years, "we" at the Centre "decided that this would be an extraordinary milestone for the people of India", and convened a special session of Parliament. The PM also recalled that in 2014, when he came to Parliament for the first

time, he bowed and touched with his forehead the steps of "the greatest temple of democracy". "Again, in 2019, after the election results, when I entered the Central Hall of Samvidhan Sadan (the old Parliament building), I bowed and placed the Constitution on my forehead as a mark of reverence," he noted.

In Kolkata, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, after garlanding the statue of B R Ambedkar at Red Road, alleged the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls was aimed at implementing the National Register of Citizens (NRC), or NRC "through the backdoor", and creating fear among the ordinary people.

"I am observing with sorrow that people's voting rights are being taken away, their religious rights are being taken away. Attacks are being made using vile language, and no one is being spared, not even Dalits, minorities or the common Hindu voters," she said, with the Constitution in her hand.

Uranium deal important part of India-Canada bilateral ties: MEA

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Wednesday confirmed that India and Canada are negotiating a uranium deal, stating that it was an important part of bilateral ties and would further strengthen the civil nuclear cooperation between the two nations.

During the MEA's weekly press briefing, spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said the uranium deal is an ongoing conversation between the two countries, and was discussed during the meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Canadian counterpart Mark Carney in Johannesburg.

"It is an important part of the India-Canada bilateral cooperation, and how we can further strengthen the civil nuclear cooperation between the two countries," he said.

According to a report by Canada's Globe and Mail on Monday, Canada and India are close to finalising an export agreement in a deal valued at about \$2.8 billion.

The report said that the deal for Canada to ship uranium to India would run for 10 years, if finalised. It said that uranium would be supplied by Canada's Cameco Corp.

THE MEA SAID IT IS REVIEWING DHAKA'S EXTRADITION REQUEST FOR SHEIKH HASINA, STRESSING ITS COMMITMENT TO BANGLADESH'S PEOPLE

The MEA spokesperson confirmed that the India-Russia Annual Summit will take place in New Delhi in December. According to reports from Moscow, Russian President Vladimir Putin could travel to India in the first week of December. However, Jaiswal said that specific dates will be conveyed later. He said both sides have been "working hard" to strengthen ties and discussing several issues that will form part of the visit's outcomes.

On Sheikh Hasina's extradition India on Wednesday said it is examining a request by Bangladesh to extradite former prime minister Sheikh Hasina and that it is committed to ensure the best interests of the people of that country.

Hasina, 78, was last week sentenced to death in absentia by a special tribunal in Dhaka for "crimes against humanity" over her government's brutal crackdown on student-led protests last year.

The Awami League leader has been living in India since she fled Bangladesh on August 5 last year in the face of massive protests. "The request is being examined as part of ongoing judicial and internal legal processes," Jaiswal said.

"We remain committed to the best interests of the people of Bangladesh, including peace, democracy, inclusion and stability in that country and will continue to engage constructively in this regard with all stakeholders," he said. In Dhaka, according to a PTI report, Bangladesh said India gave "no reply" to its earlier request seeking Hasina's extradition, but Dhaka now expects a response from New Delhi as the "situation is different now" with the judicial process completed and the former premier convicted.

"I do not expect that they (India) will answer within a week of Dhaka's request, but we expect we will get an answer," Bangladesh's Foreign Affairs Adviser M Touhid Hossain told reporters.

India on Wednesday also rejected Pakistan's criticism of PM Modi's participation in a ceremony at Ayodhya's Ram temple and said the neighbouring country, with a deeply strained record of repression of minorities, has no moral standing to lecture others.

CDSCO committee urges govt to ensure uniform enforcement of drug standards

In a move to ensure effective enforcement of medicine standards nationwide, the Drug Consultative Committee (DCC) has recommended to the Centre to take steps against non-uniformity in implementation of these norms in several states. DCC is a statutory body under the Central Drug Standards Control Organisation (CDSCO).

In its 67th meeting held on

November 17, the DCC suggested writing to all states to take proactive steps to address issues. These include non-uniformity in implementation of prescribed drug standards and lack of testing facilities. It sought necessary infrastructure as highlighted under the Centre's State Health Regulatory Excellence Index (SHREXI).

SHREXI is a virtual gap tool for states to evaluate their current status and progress towards maturity certification.

It is aiming to ensure drug safety, quality and efficacy across all states and Union Territories (UTs). According to the minutes of the meeting, seen by Business Standard, the DCC stated that some states are lagging behind in the uniform implementation of prescribed drug standards, testing facility of laboratories and skilled development of staff.

The lack of uniformity in drug standards among states has been in discussion ever since several cases of deaths due to intake of contaminated oral formulation, such as cough syrups, came to the fore in October.

Another big issue is the low conviction rate due to reasons like insufficient investigations, delay in testing results and ineffective prosecution services.

The minutes of the DCC meeting added that states may also be asked to implement rigorous scrutiny of adulteration in imported pharmaceuticals in imported

Cabinet okays rail projects worth ₹2,781 cr

The government on Wednesday approved doubling of the Dwarka-Kanals rail line in Gujarat and building third and fourth lines between Badlapur and Karjat in Mumbai metro-pollitan region.

A meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the two projects with a total cost of ₹2,781 crore, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told.

The Devbhumi Dwarka (Okha)-Kanals rail line will improve connectivity to the Dwarkadhish temple, a key pilgrimage site, and transporta-

tion of commodities such as coal, salt, container, and cement.

"The capacity augmentation works will result in additional freight traffic of magnitude 18 million tonnes per annum (MTPA)," Vaishnaw, who is also the railway minister, said.

The Badlapur-Karjat section forms part of Mumbai's urban corridor and the third and fourth line project will improve the connectivity in the region and meet the future demands of passengers, along with providing connectivity to southern India, the minister said.

According to a government statement, the increased line capacity will significantly

enhance mobility, resulting in improved operational efficiency and service reliability for Indian Railways.

"These multi-tracking proposals are poised to streamline operations and alleviate congestion," the statement said. The projects are in line with the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a new India, which will make people of the region Atmanirbhar by way of comprehensive development in the area, it said.

"The projects are planned in accordance with PM-Gati Shakti National Master Plan with focus on enhancing modal connectivity and logistical efficiency through integrated planning and stakeholder consultations, it added.

This is the second major project approved under Phase-2, following the sanction of Line 2A (Vamre-Chandani Chowk) and Line 2B (Ramwadi-Wagholi/Vithalwadi).

India's rice output may hit record high of 124 mt in 2025 kharif season

Good rice production could pressure government to step up buying

India's rice production in the 2025 kharif season is estimated to hit a new record of around 124.5 million tonnes (mt), 1.4 per cent more than the same season last year, the first advance estimate of food grains production for the 2025-26 crop season released Wednesday said.

The crop season runs from July to June. The overall kharif food-grains production for 2025-26 is estimated to be 173.33 mt, which is around 3.9 mt or 2.3 per cent more than the kharif season of 2024-25.

Sowing for kharif crops starts around June, with the onset of monsoon, and harvesting starts from October onwards. A good kharif production is expected to further keep inflation under check which has already dropped to multi-year lows.

Also, a bumper rice production could put pressure on the government to step up its official purchases in 2025-26 further adding on to the bulging state inventories which on November 1 was estimated at 64.31 mt, as against the buffer requirement of 30.77 million tonnes.

Meanwhile, the data showed that production of maize in the kharif season is estimated to be 12.30 mt, which is around 3.5 mt more than the same period last year.

Releasing the first advanced estimate, Union

ICAR rebuts bias charges in gene-edited rice trials

The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) on Wednesday has strongly refuted allegations of bias in the evaluation of two gene-edited rice varieties, asserting that both Pusa DST-1 and DRD Dhan 100 Kamala demonstrated superior performance in their designated growing regions. In a detailed statement, ICAR defended its multi-location trial methodology under the All India Coordinated Research Project on Rice (AICRPR), which has been operational since 1965 and has contributed to the release of over 1,750 rice varieties. The rebuttal comes in response to criticism from The Coalition for a GM-Free India, which had questioned the evaluation process for the two gene-edited lines developed through advanced breeding techniques. ICAR emphasised that both varieties were specifically evaluated in their target performance environments (TPEs) — the regions where their parent varieties MTU1010 and Samba Mahsuri are already released and cultivated, primarily in southern states under Zone VII. For Pusa DST-1, developed as a salt and alkalinity-tolerant variant of MTU1010, ICAR reported significant yield advantages under stress conditions.

Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said that though excessive rainfall affected crops in some areas

of the country, most parts have benefited significantly from a good monsoon, leading to overall good crop

growth. Meanwhile, total kharif pulses production is projected at 7.41 mt which is slightly lower than the 7.73 mt of last year.

Within this, according to the official data, production of tur (arhar) is estimated at 3.59 mt as against 3.62 mt last season while urad production is estimated at 1.2 mt as against 1.34 mt last year and moong at 1.72 mt against 1.77 mt of last year.

Kharif oilseeds production is estimated at 27.56 mt, according to the first advanced estimate which is 2.3 per cent lower than 28.02 million tonnes of last year. Within oilseeds groundnut production is projected at 11.0 mt, which is around 0.60 mt more than last year, and soybean production estimated at 14.26 mt, down from 15.26 mt of last kharif season.

"These estimates are based on yield trends from previous years, other ground-level inputs and field observations, primarily from the states. These estimates will be revised as actual yield data from crop cutting experiments become available," an official statement said.

Among other crops, the data showed sugarcane production is estimated at 475.61 mt, an increase of almost 21 mt from last year while cotton production is estimated at 29.21 million bales (one bale weighing 170 kilograms) slightly down from the 29.72 million bales of last year.
