Iran may turn Hormuz into a toll route, but it violates international law



As the United States' and Israel's war on Iran completes a month now, the biggest casualty of this war has emerged to be the narrow waterway of the Strait of Hormuz, where smooth transit has become a thing of the past. The traffic allowed to pass through it is almost negligible, with just a day's traffic during the normal course of time having transited in one entire month.

In fact, as per the reports appearing in Iranian government-aligned media, Iran is planning to pass legislation that will impose tolls on ships passing through the straits, which seeks to officialise its supervision over its waters. This is despite the fact that the 'Straits' of Hormuz are one of the most important shipping lanes in the world and also a major choke point on which economies of several countries are dependent. This includes the oil-exporting countries in the Gulf such as Saudi Arabia, Iraq, the UAE, Qatar, and Kuwait, besides Iran, as well as countries such as India, which is dependent on the waterway for as much as 45 per cent of its oil imports. Unfortunately, while the war may have been waged by the United States,

country also controls seven of the eight strategically located islands in the straits, some of which are also under dispute with the UAE. No wonder Iran has invested years of effort in anti-access/area-denial tactics customised for the straits, enabling it to create a high-risk environment for commercial navigation at will—something which we are witnessing due to the war currently. In comparison, the UAE does not have a similar geographical advantage, and Oman does not possess commensurate military capability. It is because of this dominance that Iran wields over the Strait of Hormuz that it is able to stall traffic, which the country is now planning to monetise by imposing a toll fee. This comes after multiple reports in the international media of Iran actually charging ships vast sums of money to pass through the straits since the war broke out in the last week of February 2026. The number of tankers that successfully transited the straits in March is nowhere close to pre-war levels, thus effectively demonstrating Iran's decades-long claim that it could close the traffic if its red lines were breached. Only a handful of ships are being allowed passage, including Indian ships. The normal two-way lane traffic has given way to a toll-booth-like arrangement, where Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) now first checks each ship's nationality, cargo, crew, and ownership before letting them pass—mostly only after payment, which is reportedly as high as \$2 million per transit. This is also reflected in the Chinese

alternative payment system, CIPS, which has recorded an abnormally high volume of transactions this March.

Although Iran's scheme of leveraging its control over the straits to collect such a fee may work during wartime, the reality is that its plan to do the same in an official capacity as the supervisor of the straits is unlikely to succeed in the long run. This is because Iran's proposed legislation to impose toll fees would violate customary international law. Interestingly, a letter sent by Iran to the International Maritime Organisation not only informed it about the plan but also claimed that Iran is well within the principles of international law—something that is far from the truth.

The UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), which Iran signed in 1982 but did not ratify, would still apply in matters concerning the strait. Part III of UNCLOS, which specifically governs "straits used for international navigation", clearly provides for a right of transit passage to aircraft and ships that cannot be suspended by coastal states. It is not within Iran's authority to levy a fee for mere transit. Thus, it may frame it as a "security fee" or "sovereignty charge", but coastal states cannot turn a natural international strait governed by transit passage rules into a toll road at their own discretion.

This is very different from cases such as the Suez Canal, which levies a fee on passing ships because it was artificially constructed to shorten a naturally existing route. In contrast, the Strait of Hormuz is a natural geographic feature, and passage through it is a legal right for other countries. India's Shipping Ministry has already called the move baseless, stating that it violates the freedom of navigation as provided under UNCLOS.

However, Iran does not seem deterred, making full use of its years-long investments to achieve its present capabilities. It is not only charging large amounts in yuan to grant passage but is also looking to institutionalise the practice through legislation. This does not mean that it will ultimately succeed in turning the Strait of Hormuz into a tolled waterway. GCC countries are unlikely to approve of such behaviour, as their economies are also heavily dependent on passage through the straits.

Meanwhile, Iran is reportedly considering making this a precondition for peace during negotiations with the United States, but this is unlikely to be accepted under any circumstances. Freedom of navigation as a principle has been consistently defended by the United States in the past, and Iran is unlikely to be an exception.

Currently, Trump is attempting to secure a workable peace, but the endgame will almost certainly involve restoring the Strait of Hormuz to its pre-war condition, with free passage for maritime traffic. Thus, Iran may eventually concede this demand in order to secure concessions elsewhere, but the fundamental nature of the Strait of Hormuz as a key global shipping lane—with a guaranteed right of passage—will not change.

'Gundaraj' will be wiped out

Police unleashing a barrage of bullets on the notorious 'Ibhala gang', six accused in custody; Action directed against three more gangs

Rajkot, A major action has been taken by the Rajkot city police under the stringent law 'Gujisotok' (GCTOC) implemented by the Gujarat government to curb organized crime. The police have registered a case under Gujistik against the notorious 'Ibhala gang', which has been terrorizing and preying on innocent citizens in the B-Division Police Station area of Rajkot for years. Two of the gang's leaders, including the mastermind, are currently in jail. While the police have nabbed four other accomplices. This operation has been carried out by the Rajkot city crime branch. Also, to eliminate 'Gundaraj' from Rajkot, the police have given instructions to take action against 3 more gangs under Gujistik in the coming days. This action of the police has spread panic among the criminal elements of the city.

Who is the Ibhala gang and what is its criminal history?

The main mastermind of this gang, which is active in the B-Division area of Rajkot, is Ibrahim alias Ibhla. The members of this gang have been committing serious crimes for a long time to establish their power. According to police records, a total of 89 crimes have been registered against this gang so far. The main crimes committed by the members of this gang include 4 crimes of attempt to murder, 5 crimes of robbery and kidnapping, 11 crimes of rioting (G.K. Mandali), 1 crime of molestation, 29 crimes of assault, besides many other crimes under the Atrocities Act, Prohibition (Liquor), Gambling and Arms Act (illegal weapons). Strict action and arrest of the police: Crime Branch has taken action against a total of 7 associates of the gang under the Gujistik. Out of which gang leader Ibrahim alias Ibhla Kathrotia and Javed alias Jawlo Kathrotia are currently in jail, efforts will be made by the police to get their custody. While the other 4 main associates have been nabbed by the Crime Branch. The arrested accused include Salim alias Saliyo Kathrotia, Mehboob alias Meblo Kathrotia, Ashraf Kathrotia and Lakhon Kamajdia. The police will deal with the accused the same way they dealt with the public: DCP

Crime Branch DCP Jagdish Bangarwa said in a conversation with the media on this matter that the criminals used to behave harshly and inhumanly with the innocent public, the police are now also determined to deal with these criminals in the same strict manner. He further added that this campaign to eliminate gangsters from Rajkot city will continue in the coming days. Preparations have been completed to take action against 3 other active gangs under Gujistik in the next few days. The police have given a clear message that no matter how powerful any criminals are, the law will be above them.

Trump's two-and-a-half front war: Strike Iran, silence critics, signal China

Not many realise President Donald J Trump is fighting a war on more than two fronts. Actually, it's a two-and-a-half front war. Let me explain.

The first is, of course, the Iran and West Asia front. Unfolding events there are not only making global headlines daily, but their impact is also felt directly in our wallets and pocketbooks. Gas prices are up nationwide in the US. The downstream effects, to use a Gulf metaphor, are obvious. The prices of everything, almost every single item of consumption, right down to weekly groceries, are sure to rise. Despite price controls and buffers, this is true, in lesser or greater measure, all over the world too. Clearly, the war is not sustainable for a prolonged period. Trump is



running out of time, if not options. A weakened, even decapitated regime still has the nuisance value to disrupt oil and gas traffic in the region and destabilise the global energy equilibrium. Iran is no longer Israel's or the US's problem; it is a global problem. That a regime more suited to the world's energy stability will emerge is more or less certain. Whether it remains inimical to Israel and the US, or whether it is run by religious fundamentalists, is almost beside the point. As I said earlier, Trump's options are limited. But that does not mean he has run out of them. The marines, who have been mobilised, are heading closer to the Gulf even as this column goes to press. The situation is highly dynamic, if not

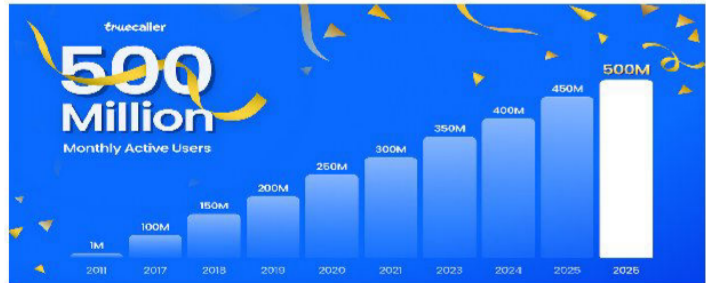
combustible. We will have to wait and watch what happens.

The second front, however, is less understood. It is at home, right inside the USA. The entire Left-liberal political establishment in Washington, flanked by a complicit media, is attacking Trump. Who's winning? If we believe the press, the US has already lost and Iran has won. But the truth—and I am not talking about "Truth Social"—is that Trump is giving as good as he gets. He has already severely damaged, even crippled, Iran. He may well reopen the Hormuz Strait and manage to win on the domestic front too. The foreign front erupted on 28 February 2026, when US and Israeli forces launched massive airstrikes on Iran, swiftly eliminating Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and key figures such as security chief Ali Ardashir Larjani in subsequent operations. What began as targeted strikes to degrade Iran's nuclear and missile capabilities escalated into a full-scale conflict. Iran retaliated with missile barrages, disrupted Gulf shipping, and partially closed the Strait of Hormuz, a chokepoint for roughly one-fifth of global oil. Energy prices surged, allies hesitated to fully commit, and casualties mounted on both sides, including American troops. Yet Trump has refused to back down. He first issued a 48-hour ultimatum for Iran to reopen the strait or face the obliteration of its power plants, then paused strikes for five days amid claims of talks (denied by Tehran). Now the deadline has been extended,

perhaps deliberately, by another week. Trump's messaging shifts—declaring military objectives nearly met one day, threatening escalation the next. Hardly
