Sooryavanshi ton steers India to 6th Under-19 WC title

CRICKET'S LATEST WUNDERKIND

Vaibhav Sooryavanshi played arguably the most breathtaking knock in the history of U-19 World Cup to fire India to a record-extending sixth title with a 100-run drubbing of England in the summit clash here Friday. Sooryavanshi's 80-ball 175, which comprised a record 15 sixes and as many fours, propelled India to an imposing 411 for 9 after England opted to bowl first. Bruised and battered following Sooryavanshi's brutal onslaught, England's innings ended at 311 in 40.2 overs after being set an improbable target of 412 against a well-rounded bowling attack. Caleb Falconer top-scored for England with a scintillating 67-ball 115, leaving a lasting impression on the biggest stage while helping his side reduce the margin of defeat. This was after the 14-year-old Sooryavanshi produced a knock for the ages and raced to

the three-figure mark in a mere 55 balls to become the second fastest centurion in this competition. The triumph, which ensured India's continued dominance in the age-group showpiece, could be attributed to a robust domestic structure, vast talent pool, exposure to advanced coaching, high-quality preparation, and passion for the game among the country's youth. India last won the tournament in 2022. Once India crossed 400 in the final, they were the overwhelming favourites to emerge victorious, and that is exactly how the script panned out, with the bowlers performing as a collective outfit. To some extent, the achievement bore resemblance to the exploits of world-class Indian U-19 teams of the past that featured the likes of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, but this side led by Ayush Mhatre has carved a niche of its own, especially in terms of sheer ruthlessness, and no one exemplifies that better than that raging force called Vaib-

hav Sooryavanshi. Sooryavanshi's knock is the record for the best individual score in a U-19 World Cup final and is also the highest team total in the summit showdown of the tournament. The opener exploded when it mattered the most, reaching his fifty in just 32 balls and continued in the same vein to torment the English bowlers with his wide range of strokes. His second fifty came off just 23 balls. As many as 150 off his 175 runs came off boundaries thanks to his 15 sixes and as many fours during a knock in which he literally toyed with the opposition attack and turned the Harare Sports Club into his playground. He now holds the record for most sixes in a Youth ODI innings, surpassing his own 14 maximums against UAE at ICCA Dubai in December. Sooryavanshi now also has the fastest 150 (off 71 balls) in U-19 cricket, bettering the 98 balls taken by England's Ben Mayes against Scotland at the same venue earlier in the competition.

INDIA BEGIN T20WC TITLE DEFENCE AT HOME

Amid heightened political controversy and diplomatic uncertainty, the 10th edition of the biennial ICC Men's T20 World Cup gets underway today. Co-hosted by India and Sri Lanka, the tournament features 20 teams divided into four groups, with 55 matches scheduled across eight venues—5 in India and 3 in Sri Lanka. The final will be played in Ahmedabad on March 8, while Colombo has been put on standby. **Compiled by Ankit Pattnaik**

Nuclear-capable Agni-3 missile successfully test-fired

INDIA ON FRIDAY successfully test-fired nuclear weapons-capable Agni-3 ballistic missile from the Chandipur off Odisha coast, which has a strike range of more than 3,000 kilometres, officials said. The surface-to-surface

missile was launched by the personnel of Strategic Forces Command (SFC) from a mobile launcher as part of a regular training exercise for the user. The missile was picked up randomly from the production lot and test fired, they said adding that the SFC is tasked with handling strategic weapons systems. The

launch validated all operational and technical parameters, officials said. After the command for auto-launch was given, the two-stage solid-propelled missile took off on a designated flight path and homed onto the pre-designated target area in the Bay of Bengal with accuracy. The Defence Research and

Development Organisation (DRDO) sources said that it met all the mission objectives. Various parameters and trajectory of the 17-meter long missile were tracked and monitored in real time by radars along the east coast, as well as by the telemetry and electro-optical systems. Two down-range ships

near the impact point recorded the terminal event, they said. Agni-3 is one of the sophisticated and accurate missiles of its class and has already been inducted into the armed forces. It is capable of carrying a payload weighing 1.5 tons to a distance of more than 3,000 kilometres.

4) The Group's operations predominantly relate to providing diagnostic services in radiology and pathology services. The Chief Operating Decision Maker (CODM) reviews the operations of the Group as one operating segment. Accordingly, the Group has single reportable segment and it derives entire revenue from the external customers in India and have entire assets located in India. The group has one major external customer which accounts for 10 per cent or more of groups revenues.

5) Pursuant to search and seizure proceedings initiated under the provisions of section 132(1) and section 133A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 ("the search operations"), the Holding Company had received assessment order dated March 31, 2024 for Assessment Year ("AY") 22-23, and orders for AY 23-24, AY 21-22, AY 20-21 and AY 17-18 were received during last week of March 31, 2025 under the Income Tax Act, 1961 ("the Orders").

In the aforesaid Orders, the Income Tax authorities have made additions on account of undisclosed income and disallowance of certain deductions claimed by the Holding Company against the income tax returns filed for the relevant AY. Consequently, it has resulted in a demand order of Rs. 513.86 million. Subsequently, the Holding Company has filed an appeal against the aforesaid assessment Orders with the Joint Commissioner (Appeals)/ Commissioner of Income-Tax (Appeals). The Holding Company has paid the amount under protest of Rs. 39.27 million against the Order of AY 22-23 and while making an appeal application against the Orders for the remaining AYs, has requested to the Assistant Commissioner of Income Tax to adjust the tax refunds for AY 2024-25 to the extent of Rs. 63.50 million against the amounts to be paid under protest. These appeal applications have been acknowledged by the Commissioner of Income-Tax (Appeals).

Further, after the quarter ended December 31, 2025, the Holding Company received show cause notices dated January 07, 2026, for AY 18-19 and AY 19-20 in connection with the assessment proceedings consequent to search mentioned above, the Holding Company has submitted the preliminary information requested, and the hearing is awaited. Based on management's assessment, the points raised in these show cause notices are consistent with those in previous years, where aforesaid assessment orders have already been issued.

The Holding Company has provided the requisite disclosure to the stock exchange with respect to the search operations and receipt of the Orders in accordance with Regulation 30 of the SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015 (as amended).

The management of the Holding Company, based on available information and underlying evidence and opinion obtained from its tax consultants and experts, is of view that the aforesaid demand orders are not tenable and will not have any material impact on the previous period financial statements and Group's financial position as of December 31, 2025, and on its performance for the period ended on that date.

6) On 21 November 2025, the Government of India notified four new Labour Codes viz. the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020, consolidating 29 existing labour laws. The Ministry of Labour & Employment has issued draft Central Rules and FAQs to facilitate implementation of the Codes. Based on actuarial valuation carried out, management's assessment and the guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, Company has recognised the incremental impact arising primarily due to the change in the definition of wages prescribed under the new Labour Codes. The Company continues to monitor the finalisation of Central and State Rules and any further clarifications issued by the Government and will recognise additional accounting impacts, if any, based on such developments.
