Op Sindoor stands for humanity's fight against terrorism: President

Murmu says economy healthy due to reforms

DIVYAA New Delhi, August 14

IN HER FIRST detailed public remarks on Operation Sindoor, President Droupadi Murmu Thursday hailed the country's "steely resolve" in responding to the Pahalgam terrorist attack and pointed to how the world has taken note of India's stance on fighting terror.

Addressing the nation on the eve of the 79th Independence Day, President Murmu said, "I believe Operation Sindoor will go down in history as an example in humanity's fight against terrorism."

In her 22-minute address, the President also dwelt at

length on India's resilience amid stress in the global economy, and the contribution of farmers and workers towards the country's GDP growth. "In the economic field, our achievements are all the more noticeable... With a GDP growth rate of 6.5% in the last fiscal, India is the fastest growing among the major economies in the world," Murmu said.

"Even amid stress in the global economy, demand at home is pacing ahead. Inflation has remained under control. Exports are rising. All key indicators show the economy in the pink of health. This is as much due to carefully calibrated reforms and sagacious economic management as due to the hard work and dedication of our workers and farmers," the President said.

These remarks come amid a tense trade standoff between

India and the US, with US President Donald Trump imposing tariffs of upto 50 per cent on India even as bilateral negotiations continue for a deal.

On Operation Sindoor and the Pahalgam attack, the Presi-

dent said, "This year we had to face the scourge of terrorism. Killing innocent citizens on holiday in Kashmir was cowardly and utterly inhuman. India responded in a decisive manner and with steely resolve. Operation Sindoor showed that our armed forces are prepared to meet any eventuality when it comes to guarding the nation... With strategic clarity and technical capability, they destroyed terrorist hubs across the border."

The President also referred to the unity displayed in the wake of the attack, and the political messaging conveyed to the world through multi-party delegations. "In our response, what was most noticeable was our unity, which is also the most befitting response to those who wanted to divide us. Our unity was on display also in the multi-party delegations of the Members of Parliament that reached

to various nations to explain India's position," she said. "The world has taken note of India's stance, that we will not be the aggressor, but we will not hesitate to retaliate in defence of our citizens," she said.

President Murmu said Operation Sindoor was also a test case of the Atma Nirbhar Bharat mission in the defence sector. "The outcome has proved that we are on the right path. Our indigenous manufacturing has achieved the critical level that makes us self-sufficient in meeting many of our security requirements. These are landmark achievements in India's defence history since Independence," she said.

At a time when the Election Commission has come under attack from the Opposition, especially over the electoral list revision in Bihar, the President hailed India as "a democracy with universal adult franchise."

Publish list of 6.5 mn deleted voter names: SC to EC

THE SUPREME COURT on Thursday directed the Election Commission to publish by August 19 details of the 6.5 million voters excluded from the draft electoral rolls in poll-bound Bihar to enhance "transparency" in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voters' list and allow Aadhaar as an accept-

able document for identity proof. Observing that the EC should put at rest the "narrative being built" against it, a bench of Justices Surya Kant and Jyotsnaya Bagchi also ordered that the details should include reasons for their non-inclusion during the ongoing SIR exercise. "Transparency will create voter

confidence." The revision of the voters' list in Bihar—the first since 2003—has sparked a huge political row. The SIR's findings have reduced the total number of 79 million registered voters in Bihar, from before the exercise, to 72.4 million.

The Congress described the EC directive as a "beacon of

hope" and a "massive victory for democracy," and said the top court has upheld the Constitution in a "categorical, convincing, and courageous" manner. The Congress along with the BJP and an NGO Association of Democratic Reforms (ADR) are the petitioners in the case. —PTI

EV charging stations to grow 4-fold in 2 years

SWARAJ BAGGONKAR Mumbai, August 14

BETWEEN 2023 AND 2025, India has seen a staggering 4x growth in public chargers for electric four-wheelers, reaching 24,000 charging stations across highways and urban centres by mid-2025.

According to the India Charging Report - 2025 by TATA.ev, in April 2023 the country had 5,500 electric four-wheeler charging stations. About 91% of national highways now offer fast charging at radius of 50km or less, up from 60% two years ago.

"Charger numbers are the rise, and with them, both utilisation and trust in public charging infrastructure," said the study. As of July 2025, 35% users of Tata Motors EV, utilise a fast charger at least once a month, up from 21% in 2023. "This reflects not just network expansion but also growing consumer confidence," it further added.

But despite progress, not all public chargers are reliable. As of February 2024, there were approximately 25,000 public chargers for all vehicles like e2W, e3W, e4W, eBUS, in the country, but around 12,100 were reportedly non-functional. "This has been a significant pain point, with 38% of customers citing unreliable chargers as a major obstacle, directly contributing to range anxiety and limiting broader adoption. On highways, a single inoperative charger can trigger hours of delay or, worse, leave users stranded," said the report.

Super Cup: Uefa displays anti-war poster

A BANNER proclaiming "Stop Killing Children - Stop Killing Civilians" was shown before Wednesday's Uefa Super Cup match between Champions League winners Paris Saint-Germain and Europa League holders Tottenham Hotspur in Udine, Italy, accompanied by kids from various conflict zones around the world.

Two Palestinian refugee children were joined by seven others from Afghanistan, Iraq, Nigeria and Ukraine at the opening ceremony, with Uefa stressing that it was not a political statement but a message borne out of humanity.

It's "not political but about humanity - in fact you could say it is just common sense," a person from European football's governing body said.

Last week, Liverpool forward Mohamed Salah had asked Uefa to be more forthright when it condoned the death of Palestinian footballer Suleiman Al-Obeid in an Israeli attack.

"Farewell to Suleiman al-Obeid, the 'Palestinian Pete'." A talent who gave hope to countless children, even in the darkest

of times," Uefa had posted, to which Salah had replied with "Can you tell us how he died, where, and why?"

But Wednesday's gesture had been planned long before Salah made the comment on social media, Uefa claimed.

The European body's Uefa's rules do not allow political messages or actions and it steered clear of mentioning any specific conflict.

It said that the Uefa

Foundation for Children had invited two refugee children from Gaza, getting medical treatment in Milan, to be part of the medal ceremony along with Uefa president Aleksander Ceferin.

"12-year-old Tala is a young Palestinian girl with fragile health who was transferred to Milan to receive appropriate medical care, as the adequate equipment was lacking in Gaza after the start of the war.

"Tala will be joined on the

podium by nine-year-old Mohamed, who lost his parents during the war and was severely injured following an air strike. Due to the seriousness of his condition and his young age, Mohamed and his grandmother were fortunate enough to leave Gaza and were welcomed in Milan, where Mohamed is currently undergoing medical treatment," the statement said.

PSG defeat Tottenham

APAdd: Paris Saint-Germain produced a dramatic late rally before beating Tottenham in a penalty shootout to win the Uefa Super Cup on Wednesday, securing a fifth trophy of 2025 for the French club.

Nuno Mendes converted the clinching spot kick in the shootout to complete a PSG comeback that looked unlikely when Tottenham held a 2-0 lead in the 85th minute of regulation in the annual match between the most recent winners of the Champions League and Europa League. Lee Kang-in gave PSG hope by reducing the deficit with a fierce shot into the bottom corner and fellow substitute Gonçalo Ramos grabbed an equalizer in the fourth minute of stoppage time to make it 2-2 at Stadio Friuli in Udine.

AIFF to mention impasse in SC

New Delhi: The All India Football Federation (AIFF) is likely to mention the raging issue concerning the Indian Super League before the Supreme Court on Monday. The apex court has reserved its judgement on draft AIFF constitution. Hundreds of Indian and foreign footballers are living in uncertainty as the Masters Rights Agreement (MRA) between Football Sports Development Limited (FSDL) and AIFF with regards to ISL is yet to be signed. The clubs have decided not to pay salaries to the players and support staff till the impasse continues between the two bodies. PTI

Savarkar defamation case: After statement fearing harm to Rahul, lawyer withdraws it

THE LAWYER representing Congress leader Rahul Gandhi in a criminal defamation case filed by Hindutva ideologue V D Savarkar's grandnephew on Thursday withdrew the pursis he had filed in a Pune court fearing harm to Rahul in the light of his current political stand and complainant's lineage from Nathuram Godse.

A special court in Pune dealing with cases involving MPs and MLAs is currently hearing the

defamation case filed by Sanyasi Savarkar against Rahul last year. On Wednesday, advocate Milind Pawar, who is representing Rahul in the case, filed the pursis, which is a formal written submission placed before court. Hours after filing the pursis, Pawar had said it was filed by him without instructions from

his client and that contents of the pursis were drafted by him without consulting Rahul. "My client has taken strong exception to filing of this pursis and has expressed his disagreement with its contents," Pawar said.

On Thursday, Pawar filed a plea before the court seeking to withdraw the pursis. "The court has accepted our plea to withdraw the pursis," he said after appearing before the court.

The pursis stated, "The complainant, Sanyasi Savarkar, has categorically admitted that he is a direct descendant through his maternal family lineage of

Nathuram Godse and Gopal Godse, the principal accused in the assassination of Mahatma Gandhi."

"Rahul Gandhi has condemned the present government by raising the slogan 'Vote Chor Sarkar'. He has produced documentary evidence alleging serious electoral irregularities, directly implicating the Election Commission in actions which, by their very nature, provoke hostility from those whose political power and ideological interests stand challenged. The apprehension of harm to Rahul Gandhi is neither abstract nor unfounded.
