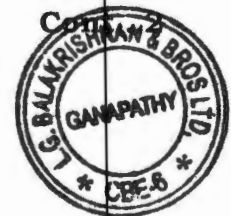

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

Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

- Obtain sufficient and appropriate audit evidence regarding the Statement to express an opinion on the Statement.

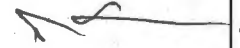

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Statement, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the group to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Statement, including the disclosures, and whether the Statement represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the Statement/ consolidated financial information of the entities within the Group to express an opinion on the Statement. We are responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audit of financial information of such entities included in the Statement of which we are the independent auditors. For the other entities included in the Statement, which have been audited by other auditors, such other auditors remain responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audits carried out by them. We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the Statement that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the statement may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the Statement.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company and such other entities included in the Statement of which we are the independent auditors regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.



We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the LODR Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.

Other Matters

1. The Statement includes' the audited financial results of its domestic wholly owned subsidiary, "LGB Steel Private Limited" (formerly known as RSAL Steel Private Limited), whose interim financial information reflect Group's share of total assets of Rs.4328.66 Lakhs as at 30th June, 2025, Group's share of total revenue of Rs.3,450.75 Lakhs and Group's share of total net profit after tax of Rs.34.10 Lakhs for the for the quarter ended 30th June, 2025 respectively, as considered in the Statement which have been audited by their respective independent auditors. The independent auditors' reports on interim financial information of the above-mentioned entity have been furnished to us and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of the entity is based solely on the report of the other auditor and the procedures performed by us as stated in the above paragraph.
2. The Statement includes the unaudited financial results of one subsidiary and two of its step-down subsidiaries, whose interim financial statements reflect Group's share of total assets of Rs.8,076.62 Lakhs as at 31st March 2025, Group's share of total revenue of Rs. 3,007.72 Lakhs and Group's share of total net loss after tax of Rs. 17.15 lakhs for the quarter ended 31st March 2025 respectively, as considered in the Statement. These unaudited interim financial information's have been furnished to us by the Board of Directors and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries is based solely on such unaudited interim financial information. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us by the Board of Directors, these interim financial information are not material to the Group.



Our opinion on the consolidated financial results is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors and the financial information certified by the Board of Directors.
