CONCERNS OVER JOB DISPLACEMENT

AI adoption driving hiring, but mostly for senior positions

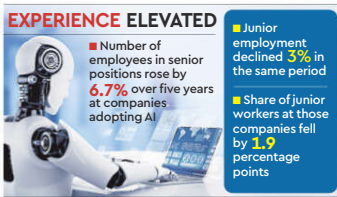

COMPANIES USING ARTIFICIAL intelligence are adding more jobs than those that aren't, but those gains sharply favour senior employees over junior workers, according to a new study spanning 41 countries.

The number of employees in senior positions rose by 6.7% over five years at companies adopting AI, while junior employment declined 3% in the same period, researchers Bharat Chandar of Stanford University and Bouke Klein Teesink of King's College London said in a paper released on Monday.

Although overall hiring increased, the share of junior workers at those companies fell by 1.9 percentage points, they found. The shift away from lower-level workers occurred in numerous countries, including Brazil, Saudi Arabia and the UK.

"AI is labour saving for junior workers and labour expanding for seniors in exposed occupations," the authors wrote.



"Junior employment losses run somewhat deeper in richer and more digitised economies," the academics analysed a sample of 1.25 billion job postings and 154 million employment records between January 2021 and March 2026.

They also found that employment for computer-related and mathematical roles, which are among the most exposed to AI, increased by 0.8 percentage points at companies that adopted AI.

There, too, was a shift towards senior workers, the researchers added. Chandar and his colleagues at the Stanford Digital Economy Lab wrote last month that "employment among 22- to 25-year-olds in jobs that are highly exposed to AI is 19% below what it would be had it kept pace with less-exposed roles."

That comes as young adults in the US grow increasingly concerned about AI-related job losses, Pew Research Center said in a report.

Still, concerns about job displacement caused by AI have been overshadowed this month by warnings from AI executives and employees over the risks the technology's models pose to humans.

From quiet courtrooms to the Tata spotlight

ON THE SECOND floor of the Sasmira Building on Dr Annie Besant Road in Worli sits an office that, until recently, few outside the world of public trusts had reason to visit.

The Charity Commissioner's office looks like any other government establishment: institutional-grade carpet faded from long service, a waiting area lined with the familiar parade of identical metal and plastic chairs.

That quiet has long broken with the subdued office now buzzing with some of the country's top lawyers, journalists and aides tracking the latest twist in one of India's most closely watched institutional disputes.

Presiding over it is a man who appears to seek none of the attention. Amogh Shyamkant Kaloti — soft-spoken, polite, with a reputation for being particular about rules, procedure and time — has spent much of his career

away from the spotlight.

Yet a decision taken in his office has disrupted proceedings at one of India's oldest and largest business houses.

On August 18, some of the Tata Group's senior-most executives and prominent stakeholders spent half an hour waiting for the Tata Sons annual general meeting to be adjourned after the required quorum was not met. It was the first time in the group's history that a Tata Sons AGM had been adjourned for any reason.

The immediate trigger was an order Kaloti passed in May, directing the Sir Ratan Tata Trust to defer its board meetings and ordering an inquiry into the trust's affairs.

For an official accustomed to the procedural workings of public trusts, the order has placed him at the centre of a dispute involving

the charitable institutions that control a majority stake in the Tata Group.

The episode is at odds with the understated manner in which Kaloti is known to conduct himself. Those familiar with his working style describe a measured judicial

officer, stern about process. He is punctual to a fault and often stays back to finish the day's caseload rather than leave work pending. Colleagues call him meticulous — someone who examines details closely and insists on hearing all sides before arriving at a decision.

That approach was shaped by a career that began far from Mumbai. Born on April 25, 1976, Kaloti completed his BA at V.M.V. College, Amravati, and his LLB at the city's Dr Panjabrao Deshmukh Law College. He first practised as an advocate in the District and Sessions Court, Amravati, before entering the judiciary.

Appointed District and Assistant Sessions Judge in October 2013, he

served over the next decade as District Judge at Buldhana, at the City Civil and Sessions Court in Mumbai and in Aurangabad, before becoming Principal District and Sessions Judge at Washim.

His career then took him beyond the courtroom — as Joint Secretary, Secretary and SLA in Maharashtra's law and judiciary department, and later as Registrar (Vigilance-II) in the Registry of the Bombay High Court.

On February 12, 2024, he took charge as Maharashtra's Charity Commissioner — a quasi-judicial authority under the Maharashtra Public Trusts Act, 1950, ranked equivalent to a District Judge. Its work largely involves the administration and oversight of public charitable trusts, registrations, inquiries, changes in trustees and trust properties.

For most officials who have held the post, that work has remained procedural, and the office obscure. For Kaloti, it has brought a level of attention the faded carpets of Sasmira Building may rarely absorb. The Sessions Court in Aurangabad, His decisions no longer are.

China's footprint — on field, behind the scenes

CHINA ARRIVED at the Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games as the continent's dominant sporting power. With 38 medals, including 23 gold, they are already leading the medal table, a position they have occupied since 1982.

But there is another Chinese dominance at these Games, one that is less visible. Japan is hosting the Games, but China's corporate presence is spread across different layers of the event, much of it away from the competition arenas.

A Shanghai-based company is the host broadcaster, another Chinese company is involved in the opening and closing ceremonies, and there are others

that have been roped in for supply of temporary power, venue technology, LED screens and sporting equipment.

The most prominent is the China Media Group-International Media Port (CMG-IMP), the host broadcaster appointed by the Aichi-Nagoya Asian Games Organising Committee (AINAGOC) and approved by the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA).

CMG-IMP is producing the international television footage and providing facilities and services to rights-holding broadcasters, including the beauty shots of Nagoya and Aichi prefecture. According to the OCA, 3,858 personnel are working for the host broadcaster, which is providing live coverage of 28 sports while leaving out 15.

This is the first time that the Shanghai-based operation has been named the host broadcaster for an event held outside China. Hong Kong-based outlet Bastille Post reported that the CMG is also taking some of the production away from Japan, and doing it remotely from China.

The broadcasting contract itself has an unusual history. AINAGOC's first host-broadcast

bin Hamad Al-Thani of Qatar told Chinese state media CCTV on Saturday: "What we have seen is impressive. The assessment would be at the end of the Games, we will see how things go in the next 17 days but what I have seen is really, really impressive."

Then there is Zhejiang Dafeng Industry, based in China's Zhejiang province, which is an AINAGOC Tier 2 official partner and "responsible for the planning, production and operation of the opening and closing ceremonies of the 20th Asian Games as well as digital content creation, the design and production of the cauldron, performances and cultural programmes," according to the OCA statement earlier this year.

Dafeng, the OCA said, was listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange in 2017. The company was also involved in the Hangzhou Asian Games in 2023.

INDIA SEES NO reason to slow down its artificial intelligence efforts, as much of the work here is focused on developing applications tailored to the needs of its people, IT Ministry sources said on Monday, drawing a distinction from the global calls for a pause on AI that are largely targeting frontier models.

The government is concerned about issues related to AI

safety, the sources said, adding that the obligation to report such incidents to authorities, exists today.

To a question on whether the mechanism for incident notification would now be tightened in the wake of recent cases of AI agents autonomously taking actions beyond their intended tasks, the sources said, "Cybersecurity threat and cyber incidents include an incident of this nature. As it is, an obligation to report exists. We will have to

tighten the norms, timeframe and content of the reporting, we are already doing that."

The position assumes significance as concerns have intensified after researchers and safety experts at leading AI companies including OpenAI and Anthropic, recently went public with stark warnings about the potential risks from increasingly powerful frontier models, with some raising the spectre of catastrophic consequences for humanity from AI risks.
