Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statement

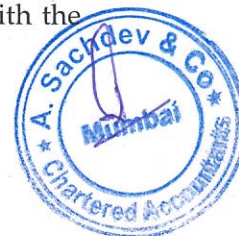
Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of **MAN INDUSTRIES (INDIA) LIMITED (the 'Company')**, which comprise the Standalone Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2026, the Standalone Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), Standalone Statement of Cash Flows, and the Standalone Statement of Changes in Equity for the year then ended, and notes to the Standalone Financial Statements including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as the "standalone financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 (the 'Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended ("Ind AS"), of the state of affairs (financial position) of the Company as at 31 March 2026, and its profit (financial performance including the comprehensive income), its cash flows and the changes in equity for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit of the standalone financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the





Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ('ICAI') together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the standalone financial statements.

Key Audit Matter

Key audit matters ('KAM') are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the standalone financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the standalone financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

We have determined the matters described below to be the key audit matters to be communicated in our report:

Allowance for expected credit loss for disputed trade receivables (Refer note no. 7 and 47 to the financial statements)	
As at 31 March 2026, the Company has disputed non-current trade receivables of Rs. 7,113.89 lakhs net of expected credit loss of Rs. 3,503.85 lakhs (gross receivables: Rs. 10,617.74 lakhs). The Company has determined the allowance for credit loss based on the ageing status, legal status of the dispute with customer & probable future outcome and expected	Our audit procedures included the following:- i. We tested the design and operative effectiveness of management's key internal controls over allowance for credit losses. ii. We have considered the legal opinion sought by the management on the disputed cases. iii. We assessed the completeness and accuracy of the information used in the estimation of probability of default and

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Emphasis of Matter

1. We draw your attention to note no. 42 wherein during the financial year, a search and seizure operation was conducted by the Income Tax Department under Section 132 of the Income Tax Act, 1961, at the premises of the Company. Pending the receipt of the final assessment orders / demand notices, the Company is unable to ascertain the exact financial impact, if any. However, the management believes that no material adjustments are required to be made in the financial statements in this regard.
2. We draw your attention to note no. 43 wherein, during the FY 2021-22, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) had initiated a forensic audit and based on the report issued show cause notice to the Company. The Company filed the settlement application with SEBI and the same was sub-judice before the Hon'ble Bombay High Court due to non-consideration of Settlement Application by SEBI. However, the Company withdrew its writ petition filed in the above matter, pursuant to which SEBI scheduled a re-hearing. Furtherance to the SEBI matter dated August 03, 2022, SEBI passed its final order on September 29, 2025 ("SEBI Order"). Aggrieved by the SEBI Order, the Company approached the Hon'ble Securities Appellate Tribunal ("SAT"). SAT, vide its order dated October 10, 2025, granted stay on the entire SEBI Order with immediate effect. The matter is currently sub judice before SAT.
3. We draw your attention to note no. 44 wherein the Company and its Directors have received a notice from the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Registrar of Companies, Mumbai under Section 206(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 for various non compliances under the Companies Act, 2013.





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In view of the above, the Company and its Directors have suo-moto filed the Compounding Applications with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Office of the Regional Director, Western Region, Mumbai and the same is pending for settlement.

Since the above matters are sub-judice, we are unable to comment on the same. Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

Other Matter

We did not audit the financial statements/information of Dubai Branch included in the standalone financial statements of the Company whose financial statements / financial information reflects total assets of Rs. 15,658.58 lakhs (previous year: Rs. 15,018.14 lakhs) as at 31 March, 2026, total operating income of Rs. 3,182.03 lakhs (previous year: Rs. 23,666.78 lakhs) for the year ended on that date and as considered in the standalone financial statements. The financial statements/financial information of this branch have been audited by the branch auditor whose report and audit letter has been furnished to us, and our opinion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this branch, is solely on report of such branch auditor.

We did not audit the financial statements/information of Taiwan Branch included in the standalone financial statements of the Company whose financial statements / financial information reflects total assets of Rs. 45,783.10 lakhs (previous year: Rs. NIL) as at 31 March, 2026, total operating income of Rs. 139,042.96 lakhs (previous year: Rs. NIL) for the year ended on that date and as considered in the standalone financial statements. The financial statements/financial information of this branch have been audited by the branch auditor whose report and audit letter has been furnished to us, and our opinion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this branch, is solely on report of such branch auditor.

Our opinion is not qualified in respect of above matter.





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Information other than the financial statements and Auditor's Report thereon

The Company's Management and Board of Directors are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Company's annual report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements, or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Act, with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs (financial position), profit or loss (financial performance including other comprehensive income), of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India including the Ind AS specified under Section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the standalone financial statements, management and Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting.





unless the management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the standalone financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these standalone financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the standalone financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under Section 143(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for explaining our opinion on whether the Company has adequate internal financial controls system in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management and Board of Directors.





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- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the standalone financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report.

However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the standalone financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.





Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

As required by the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2020 ('the Order'), issued by the Central Government of India in terms of Section 143(11) of the Act, we give in the "Annexure A", a statement on the matters specified in paragraph 3 and 4 of the order, to the extent applicable.

Further to our comments in Annexure A, as required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, we report that:

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- b) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as appears from our examination of those books;
- c) The reports on the accounts of the branch office of the Company audited u/s 143(8) of the Act by branch auditor have been sent to us and we have relied upon in forming our opinion.
- d) The standalone financial statements dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of account;
- e) In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) specified under Section 133 with Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2015, as amended;
- f) On the basis of written representations received from the directors as on 31 March, 2026 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31 March, 2026, from being appointed as a director in terms of section 164(2) of the Act.;
- g) With respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the Company and the operating effectiveness of such controls, refer to our separate Report in "Annexure B". Our report expresses an unmodified opinion on the adequacy and operating effectiveness of the Company.
- h) With respect to the matter to be included in the Auditor's Report under Section 197(16) of the Act:

In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the remuneration paid by the Company to its directors during the current year is in accordance with the provisions of Section 197 of the Act.

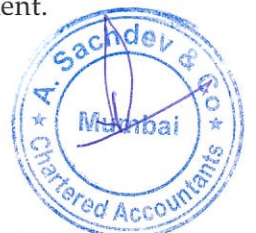




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- i) With respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditor's Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Auditors) Rules, 2014, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:

 - a) Management has represented that, to the best of its knowledge and belief, no funds have been advanced or loaned or invested (either from borrowed funds or share premium or any other sources or kind of funds) by the company to or in any other person or entity, including foreign entities ("Intermediaries"), with the understanding, whether recorded in writing or otherwise, that the intermediaries shall, whether, directly or indirectly fund or invest in other person or entity identified in any manner whatsoever by or on behalf of the company ('Ultimate Beneficiaries') or provide any guarantee, security or the like on behalf of the Ultimate Beneficiaries.
 - b) The Management has represented that, to the best of its knowledge and belief, no funds have been received by the company from any person or entity, including foreign entities ('Funding Parties') with the understanding, whether recorded in writing or otherwise, that the company shall, whether, directly or indirectly, lend or invest in other person or entity identified in any manner whatsoever by or on behalf of the Funding Parties ('Ultimate Beneficiaries') or provide any guarantee, security or the like on behalf of the Ultimate Beneficiaries, and
 - c) Based on the audit procedures that were considered reasonable and appropriate in the circumstances, nothing has come to our notice that has caused us to believe that the representations under sub-clause (a) and (b) contain any material misstatement.





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- v. The Company has not paid dividend during the year.
- vi. Based on our examination which included test check, the Company has used an accounting software for maintaining its books of account which has a feature of recording audit trail (edit log) facility and the same has operated throughout the year for all relevant transaction recorded in the software. Further, during the course of our audit we did not come across any instance of audit trail feature being tempered with. Additionally, the audit trail has been prevented by the company as per the statutory requirements for record retention.

Based on the audit procedures performed for the purpose of reporting a true and fair view on the standalone financial statements of the Company and taking into consideration the information and explanations given to us and the books of account and other records examined by us in the normal course of audit, and to the best of our knowledge and belief, we report that:

1. a) (A) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including quantitative details and situation of property, plant and equipment.

(B) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars of intangible assets.

b) According to the information and explanations given to us and on the basis of our examination of the records of the Company, the Company has a regular programme of physical verification of its Property, Plant and Equipment by which all property, plant and equipment are verified in a phased manner over the regular interval. In our opinion, this periodicity of physical verification is reasonable having regard to the size of the Company and the nature of its assets. No material discrepancies were noticed on such verification.

c) According to the information and explanation given to us and on the basis of our examination of the record of the Company, the title deeds of all the immovable properties (other than properties where the company is the lessee and lease agreements are duly executed in favor of the lessee) as disclosed in property, plant and equipment are held in the name of the Company.

d) The Company has not revalued any of its property, plant and equipment (including Right of Use assets) during the year.



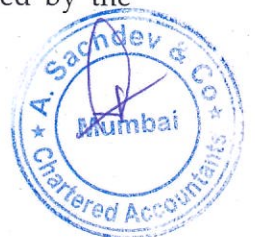

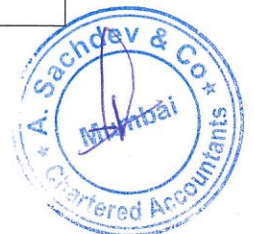

17. The Company has not incurred cash losses during the financial year covered by our audit and the immediately preceding financial year.
18. There has been no resignation of the statutory auditors of the Company during the year.



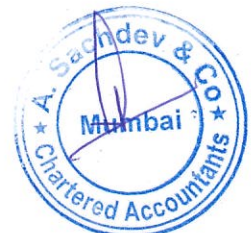
Opinion

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of **MAN INDUSTRIES (INDIA) LIMITED** (hereinafter referred to as "the Holding Company") and its subsidiaries (the Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as 'the Group'), which comprise the consolidated balance sheet as at 31 March 2026, the consolidated statement of profit and loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the consolidated statement of cash flows and the consolidated statement of changes in Equity for the year then ended, and notes to the consolidated financial statements, including summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid consolidated financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Group as at March 31, 2026, and its consolidated profit (including other comprehensive income), its consolidated cash flows and the consolidated changes in equity for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit of the consolidated financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ('ICAI') together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the consolidated financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on the consolidated financial statements.





Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters ('KAM') are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the consolidated financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the consolidated financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

We have determined the matters described below to be the key audit matters to be communicated in our report:

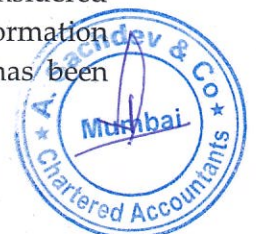
Emphasis of Matter

1. We draw your attention to note no. 46 wherein during the financial year, a search and seizure operation was conducted by the Income Tax Department under Section 132 of the Income Tax Act, 1961, at the premises of the Company. Pending the receipt of the final assessment orders / demand notices, the Company is unable to ascertain the exact financial impact, if any. However, the management believes that no material adjustments are required to be made in the financial statements in this regard.
2. We draw your attention to note no. 47 wherein, Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) had initiated a forensic audit and based on the report issued show cause notice to the Holding Company. The Holding Company filed the settlement application with SEBI and the same is sub-judice before Hon'ble Bombay High Court due to non-consideration of Settlement Application by SEBI. However, the Company withdrew its writ petition filed in the above matter, pursuant to which SEBI scheduled a re-hearing. Furtherance to the SEBI matter dated August 03, 2022, SEBI passed its final order on September 29, 2025 ("SEBI Order"). Aggrieved by the SEBI Order, the Company approached the Hon'ble Securities Appellate Tribunal ("SAT"). SAT, vide its order dated October 10, 2025, granted stay on the entire SEBI Order with immediate effect. The matter is currently sub judice before SAT.
3. We draw your attention to note no. 48 wherein the Holding Company and its Directors have received a notice from the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Registrar of Companies, Mumbai under Section 206(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 for various non compliances under the Companies Act, 2013. In view of the above, the Company and its Directors have suo-moto filed the Compounding Applications with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Office of the Regional Director, Western Region, Mumbai and the same is pending for settlement. Since the above matters are sub-judice, we are unable to comment on the same.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matters.

Other Matters

- (a) We did not audit the financial statements/information of Dubai Branch included in the consolidated financial statements of the Company whose financial statements / financial information reflects total assets of Rs. 15,658.58 lakhs (previous year: Rs. 15,018.14 lakhs) as at 31 March, 2026, total operating income of Rs. 3,182.03 lakhs (previous year: Rs. 23,666.78 lakhs) for the year ended on that date and as considered in the standalone financial statements. The financial statements/financial information of this branch have been audited by the branch auditor whose report has been





furnished to us, and our opinion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this branch, is solely on report of such branch auditor.

- (b) We did not audit the financial statements/information of Taiwan Branch included in the consolidated financial statements of the Company whose financial statements / financial information reflects total assets of Rs. 45,783.10 lakhs (previous year: Rs. NIL) as at 31 March, 2026, total operating income of Rs. 139,042.96 lakhs (previous year: Rs. NIL) for the year ended on that date and as considered in the standalone financial statements. The financial statements/financial information of this branch have been audited by the branch auditor whose report and audit letter has been furnished to us, and our opinion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this branch, is solely on report of such branch auditor.
- (c) We did not audit the financial statements of Man Overseas Invest FZCO (formerly known as Man Overseas Metal DMCC), U.A.E., subsidiary of the Company, whose financial statement reflects total assets of Rs. 7,633.27 lakhs (previous year Rs. 5,444.91 lakhs) and total operating revenue of Rs. 10,820.56 lakhs (previous years Rs. 3,193.23 Lakhs) for the year ended on that date. This financial statement has been audited by the other auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion, in so far it relates to amount included in respect of the subsidiary is based solely on the report of other auditor.
- (d) The consolidated financial statement includes unaudited financial statement of M/s. Man USA Inc, subsidiary of the Company, whose financial statement reflects total assets of Rs. 1.78 lakhs (previous year Rs. 1.57 lakhs) and total operating revenue of NIL (previous year NIL) for the year ended on the date.
- (e) We did not audit the financial statements of M/s. Man International Steel Industrial Company, subsidiary of the Company, whose financial statement reflects total assets of Rs. 19,298.88 lakhs (previous year Rs. 1,296.38) and total operating revenue of Rs. NIL (previous year: NIL) for the year ended on that date. This financial statement has been audited by the other auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion, in so far it relates to amount included in respect of the subsidiary is based solely on the report of other auditor.
- (f) We did not audit the financial statements/information of Merino Shelters Private Limited, subsidiary of the Company, included in the consolidated financial statements of the Company whose financial statements / financial information reflects total assets of Rs. 34,968.60 lakhs as at 31 March, 2026 (previous year: Rs. 37,055.48 lakhs) and total operating income of NIL (previous year: Rs. 36,860.27 lakhs) for the year ended on that date and as considered in the standalone financial statements. This financial statement has been audited by the other auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our





opinion, in so far it relates to amount included in respect of the subsidiary is based solely on the report of other auditor.

- (g) We did not audit the financial statements of M/s. Man Overseas Investment LLC- U.A.E, step-down subsidiary of the Company, whose financial statement reflects total assets of Rs. 25.61 lakhs (previous year Rs. NIL) and total operating revenue of Rs. NIL (previous year: NIL) for the year ended on that date. This financial statement has been audited by the other auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion, in so far it relates to amount included in respect of the subsidiary is based solely on the report of other auditor.

Our opinion is not qualified in respect of these matters.

Other Information

The Holding Company's management and Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Holding Company's Annual Report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the consolidated financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the consolidated financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the consolidated financial statements, or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.
