Centre's nod to raise cochlear implant age bar

MUMBAI: In a move expected to help a larger number of hearing-impaired children, the Centre has given in-principle approval to increase the eligibility age from two years to five years for cochlear implant surgeries in the state under the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram. The development emerged during a high-level meeting held between health minister Prakash Abitkar and Aradhana Patnaik, additional secretary and mission director of the National Health Mission (NHM). Another key proposal that received a positive response was the provision of phones to ASHA workers to support digital health initiatives. Maharashtra urged the Centre to release funds for direct benefit transfer schemes and grants for the NHM staff salaries. The issue of clearing of pending dues related to infrastructure projects was also raised.

'Illegal' Govandi school faces FIR

MUMBAI: Following a complaint by the BMC, the Shivaji Nagar police have registered an FIR against the principal, secretary and owner of Govandi's Tehzeeb Islamic English school for running the institute without permission. The school, which functions from a ground-plus-three-storey building in Baiganwadi, Govandi East, is among 164 primary schools identified during a survey by the BMC's education department. As per the civic body, it served two notices to the institute and granted seven days to submit a reply. However, the school neither responded to the notices nor ceased its operations, the BMC alleged. Subsequently, the civic body approached the police.

Water tanker relief for areas worst-hit by cut

BMC to deploy water tankers in areas located at the city's edges and elevated localities if supply deficit crosses 10%

MUMBAI

As Mumbai continues to reel under a 10% water cut, concerns are growing that those living at the city's edges and elevated localities could face shortages far exceeding the official curbs. To ease the impact, the BMC has directed officials to deploy water tankers wherever the supply deficit crosses 10%.

Additional Municipal Commissioner (Projects) Abhijeet Bangar on Friday directed officials to maintain close coordination with local representatives and residents, ensure swift redressal of water supply complaints and expedite the commissioning of newly-laid pipelines. He passed the instructions during a review meeting with the officials from the hydraulic engineering department.

Bangar further said that with the weather department



SPECIAL MEETING ON WATER CRISIS

With the current water levels in seven lakes currently sufficient for only 40 to 50 days, the BMC's standing committee will convene a special meeting next week to review the situation and discuss measures to ensure uninterrupted water supply to citizens. Committee chairman Prabhakar Shinde said the meeting will focus on water conservation, supply management and contingency plans to tackle any potential shortages amid concerns over delayed monsoon

forecasting the monsoon to become active only after June 20, the civic administration must remain vigilant. He asked the officials to take strict measures against water theft and leakages, encourage citizens to obtain authorised water connections and plan permanent water supply solutions in areas currently dependent on tanker water. Emphasising the need to reduce reliance on tankers, Bangar called for long-term infrastructure planning to ensure sustainable water supply.

He also ordered the replacement and strengthening of ageing water pipelines after the monsoon, with approvals and tenders to be completed within two months, work orders issued by September 15 and execution commencing from October 1.

MCOCA blow to tobacco trade

Aiming to deliver a significant blow to the trade of banned gutkha, tobacco and nicotine-infused pan masala, the FDA has directed officials to invoke the Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA) in eligible cases. FDA chief Tukaram Mundhe warned that officials found colluding with the syndicates could face prosecution. The FDA has instructed officers to investigate the entire supply chain behind the illicit business. Records from the past 10 years are under review. According to the FDA, FIRs have been earlier registered against 703 people. In a separate move, the FDA has made it clear that no clinic or hospital can force patients to buy medicines from in-house pharmacies. Mundhe has directed action against erring hospitals.

Traffic leaves LLM aspirants locked out of exam centre

Traffic congestion, allegedly due to a protest, caused chaos at the LLM entrance examination centre at Aurum IT Park in Powai on Friday after several Mumbai University candidates were denied entry for reaching late.

The examination was scheduled for 4.30pm, but candidates said they were held up for a long time due to severe congestion in Powai. "There was heavy traffic on the Powai road due to a protest. The route through Aarey was blocked by protesters and police personnel, leaving many students stranded for a long time," said Siddhant Bankar, one of the affected candidates.

Students alleged that the centre authorities refused

Exam was at 4.30pm, but candidates said they were held up due to severe traffic jam in Powai, allegedly due to a protest

entry despite the situation being beyond their control. Some also claimed that candidates who had reached before the reporting deadline were denied entry over minor registration-related issues.

Jaising Shere, another candidate, said the decision could cost aspirants an entire academic year in their pursuit of a Master of Laws degree.

Several candidates had travelled from distant areas, including Palghar and Virar, to appear for the test. Aspirants said many of them were working professionals

who had taken leave from work.

Shere said candidates from different age groups and backgrounds had made arrangements to reach the centre, and if flexibility was provided at other centres, similar consideration could have been extended in Powai.

Following the incident, around 30 affected candidates submitted a signed letter to the Vice-Chancellor of Mumbai University, seeking intervention and asking the university to address their grievances over the conduct of the examination at the Powai centre.

Mumbai University officials said the reporting time included document validation and candidates were required to reach the centre on time, irrespective of outside circumstances.

Lawyer's suicide: Ingredients to establish abetment absent, accused avers in court

Jiya Gopalani is accused of abetting Adv Sarita Khanchandani's suicide

The Kalyan sessions court on Friday reserved its order on the anticipatory bail application filed by Jiya Gopalani, the prime accused in the suicide case of environment activist and advocate Sarita Khanchandani. The court posted the matter for orders on June 16.

Gopalani's counsel argued that the ingredients required to establish abetment to suicide were absent. The defence said there was no active participation, instigation or intentional aid by the applicant that could have driven Khanchandani to take the extreme step.

Seeking relief on the



ground of parity, the defence submitted that all other accused persons in the case had already been granted bail. It said Gopalani had lodged a criminal complaint against Khanchandani on August 28, 2025, alleging assault and forcible trespass into her residence, and had only exercised her legal right to approach the police.

The defence also questioned why CCTV footage allegedly available from Gopalani's residence had not been produced before the investigating officer despite

being accessible to Khanchandani and the original informant. It claimed the non-production raised doubts about the prosecution's case and suggested suppression of material evidence, while reliance was being placed on a "suicide note".

It further argued that there was no communication, interaction or proximity between Gopalani and Khanchandani before the incident. A mere reference to Gopalani in the suicide note, without evidence of contact, instigation or assistance, would not meet the legal threshold for abetment

under Section 108 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the defence said.

The prosecution and advocate Purushottam Khanchandani, the deceased's husband, opposed the plea. Khanchandani submitted that Gopalani was specifically named in the suicide note allegedly left behind before the death on August 28, 2025. He argued that the note attributed responsibility to the accused for instigation and abetment and was admissible as a dying declaration under Section 32 of the Indian Evidence Act.

Vithalwadi police also opposed the plea, saying custodial interrogation may be needed for a thorough probe.
