Sub: Outcome of Board Meeting held on Saturday November 8, 2025.

Ref.: Regulation 30, 33, 51 and 52 read with Schedule III of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (“Listing Regulations”).

With reference to the captioned subject and pursuant to Regulation 30, 33, 51 and 52 read with Schedule III of the Listing Regulations, we wish to inform you that the Board of Directors of Neogen Chemicals Limited (“**the Company**”) had at its meeting held today i.e., Saturday November 8, 2025, at 02:30 p.m. and concluded at 6:15 p.m., inter alia considered and approved the following:

1. Approval of Un-audited (Standalone & Consolidated) Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025, pursuant to Regulation 33 and 52 of the Listing Regulations along with the “Limited Review Report” thereon as provided by the Statutory Auditors of the Company, which has been duly reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee.

A copy of the said Financial Results containing disclosures required under Regulations 33, 52, 54 and other provisions of the Listing Regulations, as applicable, together with the Limited Review Reports by M/s. Chandabhoy Jassoobhoy, Chartered Accountants and security cover certificate under Regulation 54(3) and 56(1)(d) of the Listing Regulations is enclosed herewith as **Annexure 1**.

2. Noting of the following notice received by the Board:

Pursuant to Regulation 30 of the Listing Regulations read with relevant SEBI Circulars and our intimations dated June 3, 2025 and July 12, 2025 in this matter, which can be accessed at <https://neogenchem.com/wp-content/uploads/Outcome-06-06-2025.pdf> and <https://neogenchem.com/wp-content/uploads/outcome-bm-july-2025.pdf>, respectively and the same was also uploaded at BSE and NSE, we hereby inform you that the Company had further received an email dated August 29, 2025 at 17:49 hours with a Notice therein with ref. no. SOP-CReview/QTR-June 2025/29.08.2025 (“**Notice**”) from BSE Limited (“**BSE**”) and an email dated August 29, 2025 at 19:22 hours with a Notice therein with ref. no. NSE/LIST-SOP/COMB/FINES/0945 (“**Notice**”) from National Stock Exchange of India Limited (“**NSE**”) (hereinafter collectively referred as “**Notices**”) giving notice of observation of non-compliance with the requirements of Regulation 17(1A) Listing Regulations as the Company has not specifically mentioned regulation 17(1A) in the special resolution and explanatory statement passed for re-appointment of one of the Non- Executive and Independent Director who was about to attain an age of **75 years**.

The said Notices received from BSE and NSE levied a fine on the Company for the quarter ended June 30, 2025. As per the Notices the Company could either pay a fine amount within 15 days from the date of the Notice or file a waiver application with BSE and NSE within the timelines as prescribed in the Policies for

exemption of fines levied as per the provisions of SEBI SOP circular read with SEBI Master Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD2/CIR/P/0155 dated November 11, 2024 (Chapter-VII(A)-Penal Actions for Non-Compliance).

The Company has complied with the requirements of Regulation 17(1A) of Listing Regulations in true spirit, as the shareholders of the Company has in its 34th Annual General Meeting held on September 5, 2023 ("**34th AGM**") already approved the re-appointment of Prof. Ranjan Kumar Malik by way of passing a special resolution prior to him attaining an age of 75 years.

However, as required by NSE and BSE the Company had taken immediate actions to meet the compliance requirements of Regulation 17(1A) of Listing Regulations by again seeking the approval of shareholders of the Company for continuation of directorship of Prof. Ranjan Kumar Malik (DIN: 08221989) as an Independent Director of the Company post attaining the age of 75 years through postal ballot and the same was duly approved by the shareholders by passing a Special resolution with requisite majority through postal ballot on Saturday, July 12, 2025 (i.e. the last date of remote e-voting). The voting results of postal ballot can be accessed at <https://neogenchem.com/wp-content/uploads/OutcomeofPostalBallotJune2025.pdf> and the same was also uploaded at BSE and NSE portal.

Hence, as the Company had again complied with the requirements of Regulation 17(1A) of Listing Regulations, it had made an application to both NSE and BSE for waiver of fine levied for the quarter ended June 2025, on September 10, 2025, and is awaiting a response from BSE and NSE on the said application.

The details in respect of the notices received from BSE and NSE as required under Regulation 30 of the Listing Regulations read with SEBI Master Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD2/CIR/P/2023/120 dated July 11, 2023, SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD1/P/CIR/2023/123 dated July 13, 2023, and SEBI Master Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD2/CIR/P/0155 dated November 11, 2024 (as amended) ("**SEBI Circulars**"), is enclosed herewith as **Annexure 2**.

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Independent Auditors' Limited Review Report on the Quarterly and Year to Date Unaudited Standalone Financial Results of the Company Pursuant to the Regulation 33 and 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended

To
The Board of Directors of
Neogen Chemicals Limited

1. We have reviewed the accompanying statement of unaudited standalone financial results of Neogen Chemicals Limited ("the Company") for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025 ("the Statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 and 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").
2. This Statement, which is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Company's Board of Directors, has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" ("Ind AS 34") prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 and 52 of the Listing Regulations. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.
3. We conducted our review of the Statement in accordance with the Standards on Review Engagements (SRE) 2410 "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity", issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. This Standard requires that we plan and perform the review to obtain moderate assurance as to whether the Statement is free of material misstatement. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.
4. Based on our review conducted and procedures performed as stated in Paragraph 3 above, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying Statement, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the aforesaid Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of the Listing Regulations, including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.



5. Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to Note 3 to the Statement with regard to incident of Fire at Dahej SEZ Plant of the Company. This incident led to damage of certain property, plant and equipment, inventory and it also interrupted business. The Company intimated the insurance company about the fire incident and submitted loss estimate to the Insurance Company in terms of its insurance policy. The Company had appointed Independent Surveyor for ascertaining the Loss caused by Fire and the claim that the Company is entitled from the Insurance Company vis-a-vis its insurance policy. The company simultaneously had appointed Independent expert seeking opinion on accounting treatment for the Loss caused and the Claim made to the Insurance Company. Based on the Independent Surveyor's Report and Independent expert opinion:

- (i) the Company had recognised Loss caused by fire as Rs 348.16 crores and Insurance Claim receivable from Insurance Company as Rs. 334.60 crores during the previous year ended March 31, 2025; and
- (ii) the aforementioned losses of Rs.348.16 crores and corresponding insurance claim credit of Rs 334.60 crores has been presented on a net basis of Rs 13.56 crores under "Exceptional Items" in the standalone financial results for the year ended March 31, 2025.

The assessment of the loss claim submitted to the insurance company is in process. The Company has received Rs.50 crores during the quarter ended June 30, 2025 and Rs.30 crores during the quarter ended September 30, 2025 as on account payment from the insurance company.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

- 6.** We draw your attention to Note 2 to the Statement in respect of Scheme of Amalgamation of Buli Chemicals India Private Limited, the wholly owned subsidiary with the Company with effect from the appointed date of April 1, 2024 as approved by the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, (Mumbai Bench) vide their order dated January 9, 2025. This Scheme, being a common control transaction has been accounted for based on the pooling of interest method in the Statement in accordance with the accounting treatment specified in the Scheme, i.e. as prescribed in 'Appendix C' of Ind AS 103- "Business Combinations". Accordingly, figures included in these financial results in respect of prior period i.e. for the quarter ended September 30, 2024 and for the half year ended September 2024 have been restated as if the business combination had occurred with effect from the beginning of the previous year i.e. April 1, 2023.

Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.

During the current quarter, the company has listed Non-convertible debenture on BSE and accordingly the company has complied with the disclosure requirements specified under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulation 2015 from this quarter onwards. The Ratios specified under Regulation 52(4) have been presented for the current quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025. The same was not applicable in previous periods as the Company had no listed non-convertible debt securities in those periods.

The Company is rated by leading credit rating agency Crisil Limited. Crisil has assigned the rating "Crisil A1" and "Crisil A/ Negative" for its short term facilities and long term facilities (including NCDs) respectively.

- The above unaudited financial results of the Company for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the IND AS, as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India and are in compliance with the disclosure requirement of Regulations 33 and Regulations 52 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended and were reviewed by the Statutory Auditor and recommended by the Audit Committee in its meeting held on November 08, 2025, to the Board for approval and was approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on November 08, 2025.

- The Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Mumbai Bench ("Hon'ble NCLT") had on January 9, 2025, pronounced the order sanctioning and approving the Scheme of Amalgamation of Buli Chemicals India Private Limited i.e. wholly owned subsidiary ("Transferor Company/BULI") with Neogen Chemicals Limited i.e. holding company ("Transferee Company / NCL / the Company") and their respective shareholders ("Scheme"), under sections 230 to 232 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and rules framed thereunder (" Act") ("Order") with appointed date as April 1, 2024. The Scheme is effective from the date of filing of the certified copy of Order with the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai by both the Transferor Company and Transferee Company i.e. January 31, 2025 ("Effective Date").

The Scheme sanctioned by Hon'ble NCLT, being a common control transaction, has been accounted for based on the pooling of interests method retrospectively for all periods presented in the standalone results in accordance with Appendix C to Ind AS 103 - "Business Combinations".



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Accordingly, the financial information included in these financial results in respect of prior periods has been restated as if the business combination had occurred with effect from the beginning of the previous year i.e., April 1, 2023. The effect of mergers on the amounts of Revenue, Expense, Profit and Total Comprehensive Income published in the respective period are as shown in the below table:

3. On March 05, 2025 there was fire at Multi-Purpose Plant (MPP3) Facility, Tank Farms and warehouse at Dahej SEZ Plant of the Company. This incident led to damage of certain property, plant and equipment, inventory and interrupted business. The Company is adequately insured for reinstatement value of damaged fixed assets, inventory and loss of profits due to business interruption. The Company has intimated the fire incident with the insurance company and submitted loss estimate pertaining to replacement value of the damaged property, plant and equipment, loss of damaged inventory and incidental expenses incurred on account of fire. The Claim is admitted by the insurance company.

During the financial year and quarter ended March 31, 2025, The Company has recognised loss of ₹ 348.16 Crore on account of damage to certain property, plant & equipment, inventory and estimated cost of incidental charges. The Company has recognised insurance claim receivable of ₹ 334.60 Crore to the extent of recovery of loss after adjusting applicable deductibility considering its assessment of loss and admissibility of claims as per the policy, adequacy of coverage and nature of loss and based upon the independent opinion obtained by the company from Independent Surveyor and Independent Expert Practitioner. The Company has not accounted claim for loss of profit due to business interruption and excess value of reinstatement of assets over written down value as per accounting conservatism. The aforementioned losses and corresponding insurance claim has been presented on a net basis of ₹ 13.56 Crore under exceptional item and claim receivable in other current financial assets in these standalone financial results for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2025.

During the half year ended September 30, 2025, Company has received ₹ 80.92 Crore (including ₹ 80.00 Crore as on account payment from insurance company), accordingly net claim receivable as on date reduced to ₹ 253.68 Crore.

4. During the half year ended September 30, 2025, the Company has subscribed to Compulsorily Convertible Debentures ("CCDs") amounting to ₹ 105.00 Crore offered, issued and allotted by Neogen Ionics Limited - wholly owned subsidiary of the Company.
5. The Board of Directors of the Company had in its meeting held on July 12, 2025 approved the raising of funds upto ₹ 200.00 Crore (Rupees Two hundred crore only) by issuance of fully paid, secured, listed, rated, redeemable, rupee denominated, non-



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cumulative, non-convertible debentures ("NCDs"), in one or more tranches, on private placement basis. The said NCDs were allotted on August 12, 2025 and were listed on BSE Limited. For more details visit: <https://neogenchem.com/wp-content/uploads/BMoutcome12082025.pdf>. Further we hereby confirm that there have been no deviations in the use of proceeds of issue of NCDs from the objects stated in the Key Information Document bearing reference no.: NCL/KID/2025-26/001 dated August 11, 2025 for the quarter ended September 30, 2025 and the intimation in this regard is available at <https://neogenchem.com/announcements/> and is also uploaded at BSE Limited and National Stock exchange of India Limited.

1. We have reviewed the accompanying statement of Unaudited Consolidated Financial Results of Neogen Chemicals Limited ("the Parent") and its two subsidiaries, one step down subsidiary and one joint venture (the Parent and its subsidiaries and joint venture together referred to as "the Group") for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025 ("the Statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the Parent pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 and 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").
2. This Statement, which is the responsibility of the Parent's Management and approved by the Parent's Board of Directors, has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" (Ind AS 34) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 and 52 of the Listing Regulations. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.
3. We conducted our review of the Statement in accordance with the Standards on Review Engagements (SRE) 2410 "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity", issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. This Standard requires that we plan and perform the review to obtain moderate assurance as to whether the Statement is free of material misstatement. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019 issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India under Regulation 33 (8) of the Listing Regulations, to the extent applicable.



4. Based on our review conducted and procedures performed as stated in Paragraph 3 above and based on the consideration of the review report of the other auditor referred to in paragraph 8 below, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying Statement, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the aforesaid Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of the Listing Regulations, including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.

5. Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to Note 5 to the Statement with regard to incident of Fire at Dahej SEZ Plant of the Company. This incident led to damage of certain property, plant and equipment, inventory and it also interrupted business. The Company intimated the insurance company about the fire incident and submitted loss estimate to the Insurance Company in terms of its insurance policy. The Company had appointed Independent Surveyor for ascertaining the Loss caused by Fire and the claim that the Company is entitled from the Insurance Company vis-a-vis its insurance policy. The company simultaneously had appointed Independent expert seeking opinion on accounting treatment for the Loss caused and the Claim made to the Insurance Company. Based on the Independent Surveyor's Report and Independent expert opinion:

- (i) the Group had recognised Loss caused by fire as Rs 362.90 crores and Insurance Claim receivable from Insurance Company as Rs. 348.82 crores during the previous year ended March 31, 2025; and
- (ii) the aforementioned losses of Rs.362.90 crores and corresponding insurance claim credit of Rs 348.82 crores has been presented on a net basis of Rs 14.08 crores under "Exceptional Items" in the consolidated financial results for the previous year ended March 31, 2025.

The assessment of the loss claim submitted to the insurance company is in process. The Company has received Rs.50 crores during the quarter ended June 30, 2025 and Rs.30 crores during the quarter ended September 30, 2025 as on account payment from the insurance company.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

6. We draw your attention to Note 4 to the Statement in respect of Scheme of Amalgamation of Buli Chemicals India Private Limited, the wholly owned subsidiary with the Company with effect from the appointed date of April 1, 2024 as approved by the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, (Mumbai Bench) vide their order dated January 9, 2025. The Scheme is effective from the date of filing of the certified copy of Order with the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai by both the Transferor Company and Transferee Company i.e. January 31, 2025.

Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter

These financial results have been reviewed by other auditor whose review reports have been furnished to us by the management and our conclusion in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries is based solely on the review reports of such other auditor and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 3 above.
- b. 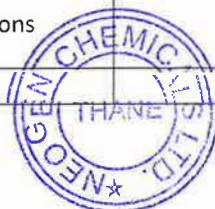
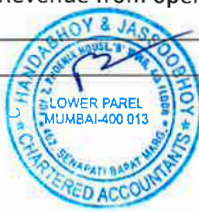

Pursuant to SEBI Operational Circular for Issue and Listing of Non-Convertible Securities, Securitised Debt Instruments, Security Receipts, Municipal Debt Securities and Commercial Paper dated 10th August, 2021, the Company has listed Non-Convertible Debentures (NCDs) on Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE).

During the current quarter, the company has listed Non-convertible debenture on BSE and accordingly the company has complied with the disclosure requirements specified under Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulation 2015 from this quarter onwards. The Ratios specified under Regulation 52(4) have been presented for the current quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025. The same was not applicable in previous periods as the Company had no listed non-convertible debt securities in those periods.

The Company is rated by leading credit rating agency Crisil Limited. Crisil has assigned the rating "Crisil A1" and "Crisil A/ Negative" for its short term facilities and long term facilities (including NCDs) respectively.

2. The above unaudited consolidated financial results of the Company for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the IND AS, as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended and are in compliance with the presentation and disclosure requirement of Regulations 33 and Regulations 52 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India and were reviewed by the Statutory Auditor and recommended by the Audit Committee in its meeting held on November 08, 2025 and was approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on November 08, 2025.
3. The unaudited financial results of Dhara Fine chem Industries (a joint venture where the Company is holding 90% of the capital contribution), the wholly owned subsidiaries of the Company namely Neogen Ionics Limited and Neogen Chemicals Japan Corporation Limited for the quarter and half year ended September 30, 2025 and of a Step down subsidiary - Neogen Morita New Materials Limited for the period from July 30, 2025 to September 30, 2025 is considered for Unaudited Consolidated Financial Results of the Company.
4. The Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Mumbai Bench ("Hon'ble NCLT") had on January 09, 2025, pronounced the order sanctioning and approving the Scheme of Amalgamation of Buli Chemicals India Private Limited i.e. wholly owned subsidiary ("Transferor Company/BULi") with Neogen Chemicals Limited i.e. holding company ("Transferee Company / NCL / the Company") and their respective shareholders ("Scheme"), under sections 230 to 232 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and rules framed thereunder ("Act") ("Order") with appointed date as April 01, 2024. The Scheme is effective from the date of filing of the certified copy of Order with the Registrar of Companies, Mumbai by both the Transferor Company and Transferee Company i.e. January 31, 2025 ("Effective Date").
5. On March 05, 2025 there was fire at Multi-Purpose Plant (MPP3) - Facility, Tank Farms and warehouse at Dahej SEZ Plant of the Group. This incident led to damage of certain property, plant and equipment, inventory and interrupted business. The Group is adequately insured for reinstatement value of damaged fixed assets, inventory and loss of profits due to business interruption. The Group has intimated the fire incident with the insurance company and submitted loss estimate pertaining to replacement value of the damaged property, plant and equipment, loss of damaged inventory and incidental expenses incurred on account of fire. The Claim is admitted by the insurance company.

During the financial year and quarter ended March 31, 2025, the Group has recognised loss of ₹ 362.90 Crore on account of damage to certain property, plant & equipment, inventory and estimated cost of incidental charges. The Group has recognised insurance claim receivable of ₹ 348.82 Crore to the extent of recovery of loss after adjusting applicable deductibility considering its assessment of loss and admissibility of claims as per the policy, adequacy of coverage and nature of loss and based upon the independent opinion obtained by the company from Independent Surveyor and Independent Expert Practitioner. The Group has not accounted claim for loss of profit due to business interruption and excess value of reinstatement of assets over written down value as per accounting conservatism. The aforementioned losses and corresponding insurance claim has been presented on a net basis of ₹ 14.08 Crore under exceptional item in these Consolidated financial results for the previous quarter and year ended March 31, 2025.
