China on mind, India, Japan deepen security partnership

New Delhi, 29 August

The governments of India and Japan on Friday said they supported private sector efforts that safeguarded the economic security of both countries.

They also proposed an annual dialogue of their national security advisers to take stock of the security situation facing India and Japan, and have increased consultation between their military leaderships.

The two countries welcomed the launch of the India-Japan Private-Sector Dialogue on Economic Security between Keidanren (Japan Business Federation) and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).

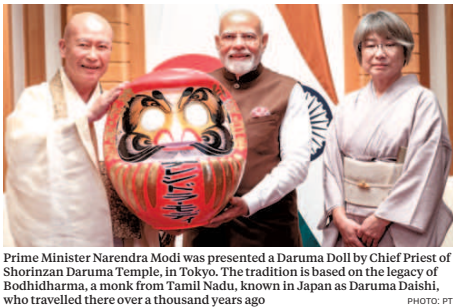
With New Delhi and Tokyo wary of an increasingly assertive Beijing, the two countries signed an agreement to deepen their economic-security partnership. The pact identified such partnership as a "key pillar" of India-Japan bilateral cooperation "emanating from a growing convergence in our strategic outlook and economic imperatives".

The two countries agreed to advance bilateral cooperation in building resilient supply chains and secure critical infrastructure. India and Japan said that key sectors would receive heightened priority for strategic collaboration—semiconductors, critical minerals, pharmaceuticals, clean energy, and information and communication technology.

On semiconductor, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology of India (MeitY), on the Indian side, and the Ministry of Economy Trade and Industry of Japan (METI), on the Japanese half, had signed an agreement in July 2023, strengthening cooperation on enhancing semiconductor supplies. They have held regular meetings since then.

India and Japan issued a joint declaration on security cooperation "to reflect the new stage of their partnership" and agreed that they should strive to contribute to each other's defence capabilities and readiness by conducting bilateral exercises between their forces and explore a new meeting framework on a comprehensive dialogue between joint staffs.

It has also envisaged collaboration between special operations units, utilising each other's facilities for repair and maintenance of defence platforms and promoting naval and coast guard cooperation for

Modi, Xi likely to meet twice on SCO summit sidelines to firm up ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping are expected to hold two bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the SCO summit in Tianjin on Sunday, as both nations look to strengthen ties amid global trade tensions sparked by US President Donald Trump.

Prime Minister Modi, who will arrive in Tianjin on Saturday evening from Japan, will have a bilateral meeting with President Xi around Sunday noon and a possible second one before the official banquet of the SCO summit, according to sources. On Monday, the Prime Minister will take part in the SCO Summit and is likely to have a bilateral meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin before leaving for home. The summit is regarded as most consequential from the point of view of India-China relations in the current context of a sudden downturn in India-US ties after Trump imposed 50 per cent tariffs on Indian exports. This will be Modi's first visit to China in seven years, perhaps the most significant.

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SC agrees to hear pleas seeking time for filing objections in SIR case

The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear on September 1 petitions seeking more time for filing claims and objections in the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Bihar.

A three-judge Bench comprising Justices Surya Kant, Joy mala Bagchi, and Vipul M Pancholi listed the matter after senior advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for the Janata Dal and other parties had sought an extension of the September 1 deadline.

Advocate Nizam Pasha, appearing for MLA Akhtarul Iman, also pressed for more time, pointing out that over 17,00,000 claims were filed in the past month. Bhushan added that the parties had already approached the Election Commission of India (ECI), which declined the request.

In the last hearing of August 22, the court told the ECI to "accept, apart from other documents, the Aadhaar card for the claims and objection stage" of the SIR. "Stressing that the exercise should be "voter-friendly", the court said the persons excluded from the draft electoral roll, ahead of the Assembly elections, could submit online applications for inclusion. And, submitting them in physical form was not necessary. The Aadhaar card was initially not on the ECI's list of 11 documents that could be accepted as identity proof for voters.

Justice Bagchi had made a suggestion to the ECI that including Aadhaar as a relevant document in the stage of claims and objections would mean more time was required for verification. The court is hearing pleas challenging the ECI's June 24 directive on SIR.

The directive requires voters not listed in the 2003 electoral roll to submit documents proving their citizenship.

Those born after December 2004 must also furnish the citizenship documents of both parents, with additional requirements if a parent is a foreign national.

Bihar SIR: Poll authority notice to 300,000 electors with 'doubtful citizenship'

Poll authorities in Bihar have issued notices to nearly 300,000 with "doubtful citizenship", officials said on Friday.

The three lakh electors are among the 7.24 crore people who have found their names in the draft electoral rolls published on August 4 as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list in Bihar.

Those issued notices are suspected to be from Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar and even Afghanistan, officials said, citing ground reports.

During verification of documents, discrepancies were noted by the electoral registration officers (EROs). Field inquiries were done thereafter and notices were issued. They said, Notices were issued by the EROs largely in East Champaran, West Champaran, Madhubani, Kishanganj, Purnia, Katihar, Araria and Supaul.

Maratha quota activist begins hunger strike

Maratha quota movement leader Manoj Jarange began his indefinite hunger strike at the Azad Maidan in south Mumbai on Friday, vowing not to leave the city till the community's demands were met. "I will die, but won't back down this time. We will not leave Mumbai till our demands are met," he said, as he began his fast at 10 am.

Thousands of office-goers faced inconvenience as Maratha protesters headed to Azad Maidan. "If the state government agrees to our demands, we will withdraw the agitation," he said. "But you have to be sincere or else, the Marathas will show their power to both the state and centre governments," he added.

He said the state government's lack of cooperation had compelled the community to march to Mumbai. "We want the government to grant us reservation and accept all our demands," said Jarange.

Advocate Nizam Pasha, appearing for MLA Akhtarul Iman, also pressed for more time, pointing out that over 17,00,000 claims were filed in the past month. Bhushan added that the parties had already approached the Election Commission of India (ECI), which declined the request.

In the last hearing of August 22, the court told the ECI to "accept, apart from other documents, the Aadhaar card for the claims and objection stage" of the SIR.

Stressing that the exercise should be "voter-friendly", the court said the persons excluded from the draft electoral roll, ahead of the Assembly elections, could submit online applications for inclusion. And, submitting them in physical form was not necessary. The Aadhaar card was initially not on the ECI's list of 11 documents that could be accepted as identity proof for voters.

Justice Bagchi had made a suggestion to the ECI that including Aadhaar as a retriever in the stage of claims and objections would mean more time was required for verification. The court is hearing pleas challenging the ECI's June 24 directive on SIR.

The directive requires voters not listed in the 2003 electoral roll to submit documents proving their citizenship.

Those born after December 2004 must also furnish the citizenship documents of both parents, with additional requirements if a parent is a foreign national.

Bihar SIR: Poll authority notice to 300,000 electors with 'doubtful citizenship'

Poll authorities in Bihar have issued notices to nearly 300,000 with "doubtful citizenship", officials said on Friday.

The three lakh electors are among the 7.24 crore people who have found their names in the draft electoral rolls published on August 4 as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list in Bihar.

Those issued notices are suspected to be from Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar and even Afghanistan, officials said, citing ground reports.

During verification of documents, discrepancies were noted by the electoral registration officers (EROs). Field inquiries were done thereafter and notices were issued, they said. Notices were issued by the EROs largely in East Champaran, West Champaran, Madhubani, Kishanganj, Purnia, Kathar, Araria and Supaul.

Maratha quota activist begins hunger strike

Maratha quota movement leader Manoj Jarange began his indefinite hunger strike at the Azad Maidan in south Mumbai on Friday, vowing not to leave the city till the community's demands were met.

"I will die, but won't back down this time. We will not leave Mumbai till our demands are met," he said, as he began his fast at 10 am.

Thousands of office-goers faced inconvenience as Maratha protesters headed to Azad Maidan. "If the state government agrees to our demands, we will withdraw the agitation," he said. "But you have to be sincere or else, the Marathas will show their power to both the state and centre governments," he added.

He said the state government's lack of cooperation had compelled the community to march to Mumbai.

"We want the government to grant us reservation and accept all our demands," said Jarange.

5 killed in landslides, cloudbursts in Uttarakhand

Five people were killed and eleven others went missing as heavy rains and a series of cloudbursts wreaked havoc in various districts of Uttarakhand early Friday, triggering landslides that damaged houses and left people buried under mounds of rubble, officials said.

Chamoli, Rudrapur, Tehri and Bageshwar districts bore the brunt of the natural calamity which came close on the heels of the Tharali disaster on August 23.

A total of 60 people went missing, including nine Army personnel, 25 Nepali nationals, 13 from Bihar, six from Uttar Pradesh, eight from Dharawi, five from areas close to Uttarakashi, two from Tehri and one from Rajasthan. The Uttarakhand State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) said that the heavy rain damaged nearly half-a-dozen houses in Pausari gram panchayat in Pakpota area of Bageshwar district. Uttarakhand has been hit hard by natural calamities this monsoon season.

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China on mind, India, Japan deepen security partnership

The governments of India and Japan on Friday said they supported private sector efforts that safeguarded the economic security of both countries.

They also proposed an annual dialogue of their national security advisers to take stock of the security situation facing India and Japan, and have increased consultation between their military leaderships.

The two countries welcomed the launch of the India-Japan Private-Sector Dialogue on Economic Security between Keidanren (Japan Business Federation) and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).

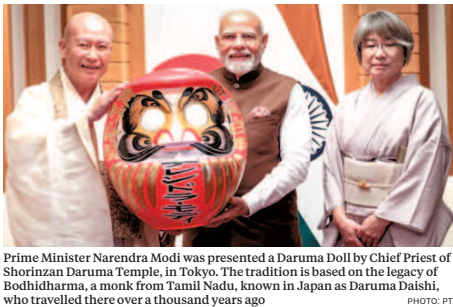
With New Delhi and Tokyo wary of an increasingly assertive Beijing, the two countries signed an agreement to deepen their economic-security partnership. The pact identified such partnership as a "key pillar" of India-Japan bilateral cooperation "emanating from a growing convergence in our strategic outlook and economic imperatives".

The two countries agreed to advance bilateral cooperation in building resilient supply chains and secure critical infrastructure. India and Japan said that key sectors would receive heightened priority for strategic collaboration—semiconductors, critical minerals, pharmaceuticals, clean energy, and information and communication technology.

On semiconductor, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology of India (MeitY), on the Indian side, and the Ministry of Economy Trade and Industry of Japan (METI), on the Japanese half, had signed an agreement in July 2023, strengthening cooperation on enhancing semiconductor supplies. They have held regular meetings since then.

India and Japan issued a joint declaration on security cooperation "to reflect the new stage of their partnership" and agreed that they should strive to contribute to each other's defence capabilities and readiness by conducting bilateral exercises between their forces and explore a new meeting framework on a comprehensive dialogue between joint staffs.

It has also envisaged collaboration between special operations units, utilising each other's facilities for repair and maintenance of defence platforms and promoting naval and coast guard cooperation for

Modi, Xi likely to meet twice on SCO summit sidelines to firm up ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping are expected to hold two bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the SCO summit in Tianjin on Sunday, as both nations look to strengthen ties amid global trade tensions sparked by US President Donald Trump.

Prime Minister Modi, who will arrive in Tianjin on Saturday evening from Japan, will have a bilateral meeting with President Xi around Sunday noon and a possible second one before the official banquet of the SCO summit, according to sources. On Monday, the Prime Minister will take part in the SCO Summit and is likely to have a bilateral meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin before leaving for home. The summit is regarded as most consequential from the point of view of India-China relations in the current context of a sudden downturn in India-US ties after Trump imposed 50 per cent tariffs on Indian exports. This will be Modi's first visit to China in seven years, perhaps the most significant.

SC agrees to hear pleas seeking time for filing objections in SIR case

New Delhi, 29 August

The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear on September 1 petitions seeking more time for filing claims and objections in the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Bihar.

A three-judge Bench comprising Justices Surya Kant, Joyyama Bagchi, and Vipul M Pancholi listed the matter after senior advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for the Janata Dal and other parties had sought an extension of the September 1 deadline.

Advocate Nizam Pasha, appearing for MLA Akhtarul Iman, also pressed for more time, pointing out that over 17,00,000 claims were filed in the past month. Bhushan added that the parties had already approached the Election Commission of India (ECI), which declined the request.

In the last hearing of August 22, the court told the ECI to "accept, apart from other documents, the Aadhaar card for the claims and objection stage" of the SIR. "Stressing that the exercise should be "voter-friendly", the court said the persons excluded from the draft electoral roll, ahead of the Assembly elections, could submit online applications for inclusion. And, submitting them in physical form was not necessary. The Aadhaar card was initially not on the ECI's list of 11 documents that could be accepted as identity proof for voters.

Justice Bagchi had made a suggestion to the ECI that including Aadhaar as a retriever in the stage of claims and objections would mean more time was required for verification. The court is hearing pleas challenging the ECI's June 24 directive on SIR.

The directive requires voters not listed in the 2003 electoral roll to submit documents proving their citizenship.

Those born after December 2004 must also furnish the citizenship documents of both parents, with additional requirements if a parent is a foreign national.

Bihar SIR: Poll authority notice to 300,000 electors with 'doubtful citizenship'

Maratha quota activist begins hunger strike

Poll authorities in Bihar have issued notices to nearly 300,000 with "doubtful citizenship", officials said on Friday. The three lakh electors are among the 7.24 crore people who have found their names in the draft electoral rolls published on August 4 as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list in Bihar.

Those issued notices are suspected to be from Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar and even Afghanistan, officials said, citing ground reports.

During verification of documents, discrepancies were noted by the electoral registration officers (EROs). Field inquiries were done thereafter and notices were issued. They said. Notices were issued by the EROs largely in East Champaran, West Champaran, Madhubani, Kishanganj, Purnia, Kathar, Araria and Supaul.

5 killed in landslides, cloudbursts in Uttarakhand

Five people were killed and eleven others went missing as heavy rains and a series of cloudbursts wreaked havoc in various districts of Uttarakhand early Friday, triggering landslides that damaged houses and left people buried under mounds of rubble, officials said.

Chamoli, Rudrapur, Tehri and Bageshwar districts bore the brunt of the natural calamity which came close on the heels of the Tharali disaster on August 23. A total of 60 people went missing, including nine Army personnel, 25 Nepali nationals, 13 from Bihar, six from Uttar Pradesh, eight from Dharawi, five from areas close to Uttarakashi, two from Tehri and one from Rajasthan. The Uttarakhand State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) said excess overnight rain had damaged nearly half-a-dozen houses in Pausari gram panchayat in Pakot area of Bageshwar district. Uttarakhand has been hit hard by natural calamities this monsoon season.

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China on mind, India, Japan deepen security partnership

New Delhi, 29 August

The governments of India and Japan on Friday said they supported private sector efforts that safeguarded the economic security of both countries.

They also proposed an annual dialogue of their national security advisers to take stock of the security situation facing India and Japan, and have increased consultation between their military leaderships.

The two countries welcomed the launch of the India-Japan Private-Sector Dialogue on Economic Security between Keidanren (Japan Business Federation) and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).

With New Delhi and Tokyo wary of an increasingly assertive Beijing, the two countries signed an agreement to deepen their economic-security partnership. The pact identified such partnership as a "key pillar" of India-Japan bilateral cooperation "emanating from a growing convergence in our strategic outlook and economic imperatives".

The two countries agreed to advance bilateral cooperation in building resilient supply chains and secure critical infrastructure. India and Japan said that key sectors would receive heightened priority for strategic collaboration—semiconductors, critical minerals, pharmaceuticals, clean energy, and information and communication technology.

On semiconductor, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology of India (MeitY), on the Indian side, and the Ministry of Economy Trade and Industry of Japan (METI), on the Japanese half, had signed an agreement in July 2023, strengthening cooperation on enhancing semiconductor supplies. They have held regular meetings since then.

India and Japan issued a joint declaration on security cooperation "to reflect the new stage of their partnership" and agreed that they should strive to contribute to each other's defence capabilities and readiness by conducting bilateral exercises between their forces and explore a new meeting framework on a comprehensive dialogue between joint staffs.

It has also envisaged collaboration between special operations units, utilising each other's facilities for repair and maintenance of defence platforms and promoting naval and coast guard cooperation for

Modi, Xi likely to meet twice on SCO summit sidelines to firm up ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping are expected to hold two bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the SCO summit in Tianjin on Sunday, as both nations look to strengthen ties amid global trade tensions sparked by US President Donald Trump.

Prime Minister Modi, who will arrive in Tianjin on Saturday evening from Japan, will have a bilateral meeting with President Xi around Sunday noon and a possible second one before the official banquet of the SCO summit, according to sources. On Monday, the Prime Minister will take part in the SCO Summit and is likely to have a bilateral meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin before leaving for home. The summit is regarded as most consequential from the point of view of India-China relations in the current context of a sudden downturn in India-US ties after Trump imposed 50 per cent tariffs on Indian exports. This will be Modi's first visit to China in seven years, perhaps the most significant.

SC agrees to hear pleas seeking time for filing objections in SIR case

The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear on September 1 petitions seeking more time for filing claims and objections in the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Bihar.

A three-judge Bench comprising Justices Surya Kant, Joyyama Bagchi, and Vipul M Pancholi listed the matter after senior advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for the Janata Dal and other parties had sought an extension of the September 1 deadline.

Advocate Nizam Pasha, appearing for MLA Akhtarul Iman, also pressed for more time, pointing out that over 17,00,000 claims were filed in the past month. Bhushan added that the parties had already approached the Election Commission of India (ECI), which declined the request.

In the last hearing of August 22, the court told the ECI to "accept, apart from other documents, the Aadhaar card for the claims and objection stage" of the SIR. "Stressing that the exercise should be "voter-friendly", the court said the persons excluded from the draft electoral roll, ahead of the Assembly elections, could submit online applications for inclusion. And, submitting them in physical form was not necessary. The Aadhaar card was initially not on the ECI's list of 11 documents that could be accepted as identity proof for voters.

Justice Bagchi had made a suggestion to the ECI that including Aadhaar as a retriever in the stage of claims and objections would mean more time was required for verification. The court is hearing pleas challenging the ECI's June 24 directive on SIR.

The directive requires voters not listed in the 2003 electoral roll to submit documents proving their citizenship.

Those born after December 2004 must also furnish the citizenship documents of both parents, with additional requirements if a parent is a foreign national.

Bihar SIR: Poll authority notice to 300,000 electors with 'doubtful citizenship'

Poll authorities in Bihar have issued notices to nearly 300,000 with "doubtful citizenship", officials said on Friday. The three lakh electors are among the 7.24 crore people who have found their names in the draft electoral rolls published on August 4 as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list in Bihar.

Those issued notices are suspected to be from Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar and even Afghanistan, officials said, citing ground reports.

During verification of documents, discrepancies were noted by the electoral registration officers (EROs). Field inquiries were done thereafter and notices were issued, they said. Notices were issued by the EROs largely in East Champaran, West Champaran, Madhubani, Kishanganj, Purnia, Kathar, Araria and Supaul.

5 killed in landslides, cloudbursts in Uttarakhand

Five people were killed and eleven others went missing as heavy rains and a series of cloudbursts wreaked havoc in various districts of Uttarakhand early Friday, triggering landslides that damaged houses and left people buried under mounds of rubble, officials said.

Chamoli, Rudrapur, Tehri and Bageshwar districts bore the brunt of the natural calamity which came close on the heels of the Tharali disaster on August 23.

A total of 60 people went missing, including nine Army personnel, 25 Nepali nationals, 13 from Bihar, six from Uttar Pradesh, eight from Dharawi, five from areas close to Uttarakashi, two from Tehri and one from Rajasthan. The Uttarakhand State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) said excess overnight rain damaged nearly half-a-dozen houses in Pausari gram panchayat in Pakpot area of Bageshwar district. Uttarakhand has been hit hard by natural calamities this monsoon season.

"We want the government to grant us reservation and accept all our demands," said Jarange.
