# Employment is the path to Bihar youth's homecoming

At his rally in Samastipur on October 24, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had said the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) had delivered the internet to every village at the lowest cost across the world. "This 'chunav' has made it possible for young people to make reels from every village. The day is not far when young men will be able to set up startups in every village."

"1 GB data is now cheaper than a cup of tea," he said.

The poster was almost instant. Within hours Jan Suraj leader Prashant Kishor replied: "Biharke logon ko naukri chahiye. Data nahin, beta chahiye" (Bihar wants jobs. It wants its sons back home, not cheap data). The job was about the lack of jobs in Bihar, which was driving young men away from the state.

Migration is a recurring theme in the political cut and thrust all over Bihar. Possibly because it finds it embarrassing, the state government has made no systematic effort to

find out how many leave Bihar every year to look for work and which districts are the biggest contributors to this relocation. The last reliable data was from the 2011 Census, which revealed around 7.4 million migrated from Bihar to other places in India, not only to Uttar Pradesh at 12.3 million.

A K Jha, who recently retired after teaching political science at the L N University Darbhanga for 41 years, says he happened to visit Gopalganj in Mumbai, on a vacation and found Maithili being spoken in many parts of the urban agglomerate. When he investigated the matter, he found that most of the housekeeping staff in the region was from Madhubani. "They were mostly young men between 18 and 30. They took me to their dwelling. That is a gran-

diose description of how they lived: They had an arrangement with building supervisors. I found bed-rolls neatly rolled up at the foot of pillars in the basement garages of housing societies. They would spread the bedrolls at night and during the day they would clean and wash cars and do other odd jobs. They would eat from nearby food carts. They managed to earn ₹16,000-18,000 per month. Some of this sum they would send home. I told them they could have done the 'carter job' back home. They said they would not be paid as much. There is also societal peer group pressure," he says.

He adds that for most people in Bihar, job means government job.

N K Singh, chairman of the 15th Finance Commission and a former IAS officer of the Bihar cadre, says nearly 73,000 workers moved abroad in 2022. Roughly 72 per cent of Bihar's population reside in other states. More than half all households rely on income earned elsewhere.

"This is a demographic paradox. Bihar supplies labour to the world, yet struggles to convert that human capital into domestic productivity."

The answer is industrialisation. But that is slow in coming. Part of the problem is the dearth of large land parcels, although the state government is steadily building up a land bank to create industrial estates and economic zones and has announced many employment-linked incentives to industry.

Speaking to *Business Standard*, Bihar Industries Minister Nitish Mishra said the Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority was aiming to acquire 15,000 acres, covering all the 38 districts in Bihar. Investing entities are eligible for land at ₹1 an acre if they provide employment to 1,000 persons or above. But other ministers concede



## Tejashwi trying to hide Lalu's 'sins', says Modi at Katihar rally

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday claimed that the INDIA bloc's CM candidate Tejashwi Yadav was trying to "hide the sins" of his father Lalu Prasad, relegating his pictures to the corner of the Rashtriya Janata Dal's (RJD's) poll posters.

He made the remark at a rally in Katihar district, where he did not name the father-son duo but used the expression "jungle raja ke yuvraaj" (crown prince of lawlessness) to point towards Yadav. "What sin he is hiding by not having the pictures of his own father, whom you

claim to be such a tall leader and was a CM for years, on RJD posters? Perhaps it is because he has become aware that the big leader carries the baggage of 'jungle raja'," he said.

Modi also claimed that the Congress was trying its best to ensure that its ally RJD was drubbed in the Assembly polls. "Congress leaders have been inviting CMs of Telangana and Tamil Nadu, known for deriding Bihar, to the state with the hope that it will lead to a resentment against their ally as well, causing it to lose the elections," he alleged.

there are challenges. Acquisition of land in Bihar is not only more costly than in other states but also more difficult because of fragmented landholdings. "In Haryana, the number of people the state government will have to pay to acquire land might be one or two per acre. In Bihar, it could be 35, even as many as 51 people per acre," says Roads Minister Nitin Nabin.

Mishra says if returned to power, the NDA government's priorities will be to provide extensive skill training and employment-intensive industry. According to Nabin, the largest number of migrants join construction.

"Once we start building satellite towns, construction opportunities will be available in Bihar. No one will have to go out to look for work."

Both the contesting formations have made employment their priority.

Prince Kumar, who works in a midsize hotel in Delhi, says he sees little hope of returning to Patna anytime soon. "The government has done everything it can for the extremely poor. The extremely rich don't need the government's help. It is like us who are in-between who can't go back yet. There's nothing for us there," he says.

# The waning influence of student politics in Bihar

With Bihar witnessing 1.4 million first-time voters, and political parties betting on the youth wave this election season, one link remains missing: student leaders.

Once a breeding ground for political stalwarts, like Nitish Kumar, Sushil Kumar Modi, and Lalu Prasad, Bihar's student politics, now is in a state of apathy, with student union members and ground workers attributing this downfall to irregular polls, student migration, funding crunch, and lack of opportunity, among other reasons.

"Student leaders here are among many other student leaders from Bihar who started their political journey from outside the state. The deteriorating standard of education has largely contributed to this migration. According to a report by India Data Map, Bihar's school dropout rate at secondary and higher secondary levels remains concerning at 19.5 per cent and 10.3 per cent, respectively.

"Without good academicians and healthy democratic exposure, you will not be able to retain the talent pool, the potential leaders," Bellaji adds.

In this election, there are many emerging faces who have received education from different parts of the world. The Plurals Party's founder Pushpam Priya Choudhary, who is contesting from Darbhanga, and Rashtriya Janata Dal's Shwini Shukla, who is in the fray from Lalgaon, have completed their higher education from the UK, while Dipu Singh, fighting from Sandesh seat, is a 2017 DU graduate.

## Poor education a factor

## Good PR campaign a key

In the time of growing social media influence, a well-managed PR also

plays a key role, notes Yagyavalkya Shukla, former national general secretary, ABVP.

"Local leaders are there, but exposure is a problem," he says. "The youth in the state, however, still looks forward to somebody who has risen from one of them."

"I am associated with ABVP, completely opposite from an ideology that Dhananjay follows, but as somebody who has come from there, I keep looking at his campaigns," he adds.

According to the student leaders who have been associated with the Assembly elections, the transition from student leader to being a national contender requires nurturing.

"Student elections are fought on more realistic issues like security and infrastructure. Assembly elections, especially in Bihar, are a battle of ideologies and caste," adds Shukla.

To put this in context, it was only in March 2025 that Patna University Student Union scripted history by electing its first female president. Moreover, in a first, three top positions were bagged by women candidates. However, in the Assembly elections, merely 9 per cent of the candidates are women.

According to Divyanshu Bhardwaj, a former PUSU president and now a Janata Dal (United) candidate from Mokhar, failure of universities and unions to conduct timely elections has hampered the political culture.

"The PUSU elections were not conducted for years. How many unions have protested?" questions Bhardwaj. "Now it seems like the unions do not want to create more vacancies. Nobody here wants new faces emerging as threats," he adds.

# Amid financial strain, MP looks to opt out of decentralised procurement scheme

One of the foremost foodgrain procuring states in the country, Madhya Pradesh (MP), has approached the Centre to opt out of the decentralised procurement system, citing mounting financial challenges.

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, in a letter written recently to the Centre, said that the state government had been suffering significant financial losses due to delays in clearing

of foodgrain stocks purchased through the Decentralised Procurement System (DCP).

While, at the same time, loans taken from the Centre to make payment to farmers have risen to around ₹72,177 crore, Yadav said. The state wants to opt out of the decentralised procurement system and wants the Centre to revert to the old system of direct procurement by the Food Corporation of India.

Under the DCP, the state government undertakes direct purchase of paddy or rice and

wheat, and also stores and distributes these food grains under the National Food Security Act and other welfare schemes. The system was put in place to ensure that greater number of farmers get the benefit of the minimum support price (MSP), efficiency of procurement is enhanced and to encourage procurement in non-traditional states.

There are states that had adopted full DCP, while in some states, it was partially implemented with both Centre and states jointly doing

procurement. However, over time some states have opted out of the scheme due to mounting troubles. As of 2020, around 7 states had opted for the DCP scheme in varying proportions.

MP in the letter said that it has been following the DCP for paddy since 1999-2000 and 2007-08 for wheat. Out of the total wheat procured in India for the Central pool, Madhya Pradesh's share was around 26 per cent while it is around 6 per cent for paddy.

## State to acquire over 56K acres in Bundelkhand for development

The Uttar Pradesh government recently approved the acquisition of 56,000 acres of land for the development of the Bundelkhand region.

About 22,000 acres or nearly 40 per cent of the identified swathes of Bundelkhand region, the acquired by the nodal agency Bundelkhand Industrial Development Authority (BIDA) so far, according to an official.

The majority of the land has been acquired in the Jhansi district. The state government aims to develop BIDA as a "future investment magnet" on the lines of Noida and Greater Noida. In a recent review meeting, UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath ordered the development of an airport,

expressway, railway station, truck terminal, information technology (IT) park and a modern multimodal logistics park to position BIDA as a manufacturing and export cluster.

Bundelkhand will no longer manifest backwardness but progress, Yogi said. He added: "BIDA's success would spark an economic revolution across the region." UP will ask the National Highways Authority of India to extend the Agra-Gwalior Greenfield Expressway to BIDA and Jhansi. Adityanath also called for the development of a Delhi-Nagpur Industrial Corridor node in the BIDA region.

For transparency, BIDA has developed a special software, which makes the land acquisition process — from farmer consent to payment — digital.

## Green energy to power new Assembly

The new building of the Chhattisgarh Assembly will be fully powered by green energy, with solar projects being installed in phases.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday inaugurated the new building, constructed on a 51-acre land behind Mahamandi Bhawan (secretariat) in Naya Raipur, the upcoming new capital city of Chhattisgarh.

The total area of the building is 622,000 square feet and has been constructed at an estimated cost of ₹325 crore. Speaker Dr Raman Singh said the new building followed the green building concept and would be fully powered by solar energy. "We will be installing solar projects in phases and in future, the entire Legislative Assembly will be lit by solar power," Singh said, adding that special focus has been given to make the entire premises green.

## Jaipur's decentralised solar panel plants now at 121 with 5 additions

Jaipur, 3 November

Five decentralised solar power plants with a combined capacity of 9.28 megawatts (MW) were installed in Jaipur district last week, which are expected to benefit over 1,300 farmers, a state government official said.

"Through these decentralised small solar power plants with a total capacity of 9.28 MW, 1314 agricultural consumers falling in the respective 33/1V substation areas will be able to get electricity during the day," the official said.


The plants were installed under the government's PM-

Kusum scheme.

Component A of the scheme provides for the installation of grid-connected plants with a maximum capacity of 2 MW, and Component C provides a maximum of 5 MW. The five plants were installed under the Component C.

The Centre provides an assistance of up to ₹1.05 crore — 30 per cent of the cost — for the installation in Component C.

The official pointed out that till now, 121 plants with a total capacity of 237 MW have been made functional. Jaipur Discom, under Component A and Component-C of the Kusum scheme.
