ACTOR-TURNED-POLITICIAN 'CAPTAIN' WAS A LEADER WHO STOOD AMONG PEOPLE

In Tamil Nadu, Premalatha fights to keep Vijaykanth's legacy alive

ON THE CAMPAIGN trail in rural Tamil Nadu, Premalatha Vijaykanth brushes aside comparisons of her late husband and actor-politician "Captain" Vijaykanth with poll debutant Vijay of the TVK.

"I don't have any opinion," says Premalatha, chief of the DMDK that was founded by her husband in 2005, before returning to a familiar refrain - that Vijaykanth was not just another actor-turned-politician, but also a leader who stood "among the people".

In the afternoon heat of Mangalampettai town, near Virudhachalam - the constituency where Vijaykanth once carved his lone but symbolic victory in 2006 - that distinction hangs in the air, unspoken but firm: Vijay is not Captain.

The convoy arrives first - a string of SUVs cutting through narrow roads that opened into small junctions and interior stretches of Cuddalore district. Premalatha steps into the scorching sun, her voice steady

as she moves from one micro-gathering to another. Around her, the echoes of Vijaykanth linger in curious ways. Local functionaries, men rushing to arrange chairs or guide crowds, carry his imprint - the same thick, carefully combed back hair, and streaks of vibhuti (ash) across foreheads. It is as if the party had, over time, learnt to resemble



its founder. For Premalatha, the resemblance is less physical than political inheritance, one she now carries almost entirely on

her own. "Captain was a people's leader," she says. "With the intention of serving the people, he transformed his fan clubs into a political party and entered elections." It is a story that has been told often in Tamil Nadu's cinematic politics continuum, but Vijaykanth's version had its own grammar. When his DMDK contested all 234 seats

in its debut 2006 Assembly election, it won just one. But it secured 8.38% of the vote, a number Premalatha still repeats. "We must prove the percentage," she says. "Even if success does not come."

The numbers tell a story of both rise and erosion. From a 8.4% vote share in 2006 and 10.3% in the 2009 Lok Sabha elections, the party slipped to 7.9% in 2011 but won 29 seats, its highest ever tally and the last time it won an Assembly seat in the state. In the 2014 Lok Sabha polls, it fell further to 5.1%, then to 2.4% in 2016, and eventually into statistical marginality at 0.43% in 2021.

Memory of better times

But, for Premalatha, the emphasis remains not on the decline, but on what those early vote shares represented: a direct connection with people.

"For any problem, he would be the first to go there," she says. She lists them like markers in a political pilgrimage: floods, the 2004 tsunami, the sandalwood smuggling crackdown, an explosion in a small village.

In 44 Bengal seats, deleted voters exceed 21 margins

WITH THE ELECTORAL rolls for West Bengal's two-phased Assembly elections finalised, Election Commission (EC) data shows that more electors have been deleted during the SC-monitored adjudication process in 15% of 293 constituencies than the winning margin in those seats in the 2021 polls.

While the state has 294 constituencies, in one, Dinhat, the BJP secured its win with postal ballots as it was behind the TMC in the EVM count. For the purpose of this analysis, that one seat has been left out as the SIR covered the electors who will vote on EVMs, not service electors who vote via postal ballot.

Of the 44 Assembly constituencies that have seen a higher deletion of electors at the adjudication phase compared to the winning margins last time, the TMC won 24 and the BJP 20.

Most of these seats are in Purba Bardhaman, Paschim Bardhaman, and Nadia districts at five each, followed by four



each in North 24 Parganas and Paschim Medinipur, three each in the districts of Cooch Behar, Dakshin Dinajpur, and Murshidabad, and two each in Purba Medinipur and Howrah. Among these constituencies is Samsanganj in Murshidabad district where 74,775 voters have been deleted, but which the TMC won last time by 26,111 votes. In contrast, in Purulia's Balarampur, where the BJP's victory margin was 273 in 2021, 1,037 voters have been deleted. Some other constituencies include Gaighata that the BJP's Subrata Thakur won last time, and Bagdah. TMC insiders said the party had set an internal target of winning 250 seats, with "a special focus" on constituencies with low margins where dedicated war rooms for the elections have been operational since last November.

In manifesto, BJP pledges UCC, plugging infiltration

THE BJP ON Friday unveiled its manifesto for the West Bengal Assembly polls, which promised to plug infiltration, implement a Uniform Civil Code (UCC) and proposed expansive welfare packages for women, youth, farmers and state government employees if the party wins the electoral battle.

Releasing the manifesto - "Sankalp Patra" - in Kolkata, Union Home Minister Amit Shah described it as a road map for "Sonar Bangla" and launched an intense attack on the Mamata Banerjee government, alleging the last 15 years of the TMC's rule had been a "nightmare" for the people of the state.

Stalin flays EPS, says his 'achievements will stay'

TAMIL NADU CHIEF Minister MK Stalin on Friday lashed out at AIADMK chief Edappadi K Palaniswami for targeting him personally, and said that though death was universal, his (Stalin's) achievements, including his numerous welfare initiatives, will live forever. Reacting sharply to the AIADMK general secretary's comments, the CM said death was natural for everyone and that he (Stalin) could not be an exception. "Palaniswami has been highly critical of me. I wish to say that death is common to all. We can become dust, even I, but my programmes will remain forever. No one can destroy them," Stalin said.

TMC veterans 'ignored, insulted', says Suvendu

LEADER OF OPPOSITION in West Bengal assembly, Suvendu Adhikari, on Friday claimed that those who had been associated with the TMC during its early years were being "attacked, snubbed, and insulted." Alleging that several leaders faced CPI(M) "atrocities" while expanding the TMC's base in the early 2000s and were now being sidelined, Adhikari urged them to join BJP. He also inducted TMC leader from Mangalkot in Purba Bardhaman district, Bikash Chowdhury, into the BJP at a function. "Bikash da had led the protests against the CPI(M) in 2009 in Mangalkot who won from zilla parishad several times."

Abhishek targets Shah over infiltration pitch

SENIOR TMC LEADER Abhishek Banerjee on Friday targeted Union Home Minister Amit Shah over his continued focus on infiltration in poll speeches, and questioned the ministry's role in failing to prevent the terror attacks in Pahalgam and New Delhi last year. Addressing a conference, Banerjee also sought clarity on whether ex-Bangladesh PM Sheikh Hasina, who has been given shelter by the BJP-led Centre, would be considered an infiltrator. Referring to Shah's pledge to act against infiltrators, the TMC national general secretary alleged that Shah had been "playing the same record over and over again" on the issue.
