approx.60-75 million individuals have reverse migrated back to their natives during the pandemic and out of these at least 25% continue to start their life cycle from their respective origins. This has augured well for housing sector as it has contributed to an incremental demand of 4-5 million units.

MFI industry shows improvement after 2nd wave; caution needed on asset quality: Report

Mumbai, Dec 8: After the setbacks during the second wave of the pandemic, the microfinance industry showed an improvement in disbursements, asset quality and new loan inquiries in the September quarter, a report said on Tuesday.

The portfolio outstanding for the industry, which typically provides small ticket loans to micro entrepreneurs and women borrowers, increased to Rs 249 lakh crore as of September, up 2.1 per cent when compared with the figure in June and 6 per cent when compared with the year-ago period, it said.

Unpaid loans, which had become a concern because of the economic activity getting affected during the second wave in the April-June period, also seem to be reducing if one were to go by the 30-day overdue period, the report by CRIF Highmark, a credit information company, said.

The 30-plus days overdue loans declined to 10.4 per cent in September from June's 15 per cent, while those unpaid for over 90 days remained stable at 3.3 per cent, it said.

However, when compared to the year-ago period, the proportion of loans which were overdue in both the buckets were higher, it said.

The volume of inquiries witnessed a good recovery during the quarter as compared to the first quarter of the fiscal, it said.

"While the effects continue to linger, the second quarter marked a turnaround for the microfinance industry with an increase in disbursements.

However, lenders still need to be cautious about

asset quality,' the report cautioned.

The report said 4.1 per cent of borrowers have exposure to four or more lenders, with the proportion of such borrowers being the highest in Tamil Nadu and least in Assam.

When it comes to growth, disbursements in the rural markets grew at a faster clip as compared to the urban ones, it said, adding the top-10 states constitute for 83 per cent of the gross loan portfolio as of September 2021.

Tamil Nadu is top among states, while

Assam and West Bengal witnessed a decline in the overall loan portfolio, the report said.

Banks' share in the overall microlending mix is over 40 per cent despite a faster paced pick up in the non-bank lenders, who now account for a 29 per cent market share and are followed by the small finance banks at 17 per cent.

From a risk perspective, Darbhanga, Nanded and Sitamarhi were the best performing districts while Jalpaiguri, Koch Bihar and Kollam were the worst ones, it said.

Deadline for 'Life Certificate' submission extended till Dec 31

Chennai, Dec 8: Certificate' (Jeevan Pramaan) by the Central Government Pensioners in view of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and vulnerability of the elderly population to coronavirus, Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions Dr Jitendra Singh said.

Earlier, a pensioner was required to submit the Life Certificate till November

30 for uninterrupted disbursement of his or her pension.

Singh further said that the pensioners can submit the certificate through any of the modes including in physical form or digitally using an online system for submission of Life Certificate during the extended period. Pension will continue to be paid by the Pension Disbursing Authorities (PDAs)

uninterrupted during this extended period.

The Minister also said that the pension disbursing banks have been advised to continue to maintain Covid-19 appropriate behaviour while obtaining Life Certificates and to ensure proper arrangements and social distancing measures at the bank branches to prevent overcrowding.

Remote first: Cactus asks staff to work from anywhere

Chennai, Dec 8: Cactus Communications (CACTUS), a technology company accelerating scientific advancement, has announced its transition to a remote-first company for all its 1,200 employees across nine locations globally. It is one of the first companies in India to join a small but growing list of firms across the globe that are embracing remote-first—companies

that have office locations but do not require their employees to work from them.

"Three hundred and twenty people joined CACTUS in the seven months leading up to October 2021, and 50% of our new hires are from locations where we don't have physical offices, such as Jaipur, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, Chennai, Kolkata, Pune, and many others," said Yashmi Pujara, Chief Human Resources Officer at CACTUS.

The move will see CACTUS expand its recruitment across the globe and pioneer new, post-pandemic working practices, including work from anywhere, asynchronous communication, and more.
