# Hand over Saeed & Azhar if serious about talks: Rajnath

● 'Navy in full form, would have split Pak into four'

PAYNEET SINGH CHADHA Panaji, May 30

**DEFENCE MINISTER RAJNATH** Singh said Friday if Pakistan is serious about talks it should hand over 26/11 Mumbai attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed and Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) chief Masood Azhar to India "so that justice is served".

This is the first time a senior minister has spelled out conditions for Pakistan to seek a dialogue with India post Operation Sindoor. Addressing officers and sailors onboard aircraft carrier INS Vikrant off the coast of Goa, Singh said, "It would be in Pakistan's interest to uproot the nursery of terrorism, that is operating on its soil, with its own hands. And it should start by handing over terrorists like Hafiz Saeed and Masood Azhar to India. Both are not only in India's list of 'Most Wanted Terrorists', they are also UN-designated terrorists."

"Tahawwur Rana, an accused in the Mumbai attacks, has been brought to India recently. Hafiz Saeed is guilty of the Mumbai attacks. We have still not forgotten, justice has to be done and, I believe, someday justice will be done. This cannot happen in Pakistan", he added.

"Pakistan is repeatedly making offers to talk. Yesterday too, Pakistan's PM repeated this, but India has made it clear that if there are talks, they will only be on terrorism and PoK. If Pakistan is serious about talks, it should hand over terrorists like Hafiz Saeed and Masood Azhar to India, so that justice is served. And what that justice would look like, I don't need to say this," he said. He said during Operation Sindoor, the Indian Navy impressed every Indian with its "silent service".

"Despite remaining silent, the Indian Navy succeeded in tying down the Pakistan Army. This time, Pakistan did not

## Pak can't fight a war for 4-5 years: Shah

**UNION HOME MINISTER** Amit Shah said Friday that Pakistan will not be able to fight a "war with complete information" for a long time "in view of the total destruction of its surveillance infrastructure" in India's strikes earlier this month.

Shah, who is on a two-day visit to Jammu, his first since Operation Sindoor, was addressing Border Security

Force personnel in Poonch, the town that was hardest hit by Pakistani shelling in the aftermath of the strikes. Referring to a report that was received from the Director General, BSF, in the aftermath of the strikes, Shah said: "The biggest damage on the Pakistan side has been the destruction of its surveillance capabilities. You destroyed their entire surveillance network one by one, which the enemy may take four-five four years to re-

establish... Woh ab lambey samaytak sampoom jaankari wali ladai nahi lad payega (It will not be able to fight a war with complete information for a long time)."

When Pakistan attacked residential areas, the BSF in the Jammu Frontier destroyed more than 118 of their posts, he said, adding that "completely destroying or causing extensive damage to such a large number of posts in just three days is a very big thing".

"Within 96 hours of the Pahalgam terrorist attack, our Western Fleet ships, deployed at sea, carried out successful firing of surface-to-surface and surface-to-air missiles and torpedoes on the western and eastern coast," he said. He said anti-India activities are being carried out openly from Pakistani soil and India is completely free to carry out every kind of operation against terrorists on both sides of the border and the sea.

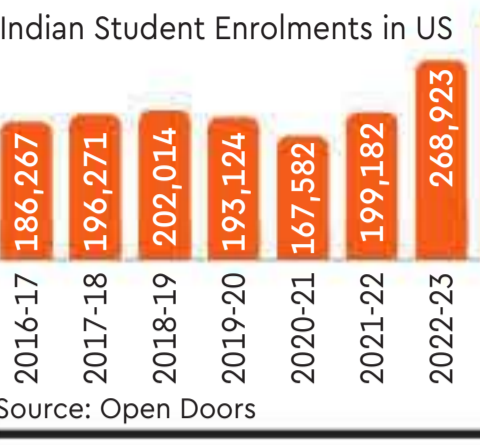
# Student visa appointments continue at US Embassy despite uncertainty

**THE PEAK SEASON** for US F-1 student visa applications related to fall admissions is generally between May and August. On Friday, it was business as usual at the US Embassy in New Delhi, with a steady stream of students arriving for their visa interviews.

The embassy's operations were in contrast with an internal directive issued earlier this week by US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, temporarily suspending the processing of new student visas worldwide. According to an internal cable, all US embassies and consulates were instructed to pause new F-1 visa appointments until the Department of State issues updated guidelines for expanded social media vetting of student visa applicants. Officials at the New Delhi

mission told FE that student visa interviews are continuing uninterrupted — at least for those with previously scheduled appointments.

"Visa interviews currently being held include both past appointments (issued over six months ago) and relatively recent ones (scheduled two to three months ago)," an embassy official said. "However, we cannot guarantee availability for students apply-

ing now. The only way to check is through the official portal (www.ustraveldocs.com). If the application is accepted online, an appointment will be scheduled in the coming months."

The official noted that between May and July — the height of the fall admission cycle — the embassy typically handles over 1,500 visa appointments per day. Outside of this window, numbers drop by 300-400 daily, except dur-

ing a smaller uptick in November and December for spring intake applicants. Industry stakeholders remain cautiously optimistic. Study-abroad platforms anticipate that the situation will stabilise well before the current admission cycle concludes.

"We expect the new social media vetting guidelines to be released in a couple of weeks," said Piyush Kumar, regional director (South Asia, Canada, LATAM) at IDP Education. "Students will still have more than two months to secure visa appointments, as most US institutions begin their fall intake in the second half of August."

Experts estimate that nearly 75% of students applying for fall 2025 admissions have already secured appointments, while the remaining 25%, who plan to apply in the coming weeks, are at the risk of being impacted by the temporary pause.

# Meta tightens online gambling ad rules

### NO SKILL, NO SLOT

■ Meta now requires a "game of skill" certificate or a court order before publishing RMG ads

■ Companies must then fill out Meta's approval form



■ The move promotes fair play, legal accountability, and user protection, say experts

■ Ads can't target users under the age of 18

**SOCIAL MEDIA GIANT** Meta has introduced stricter ad policies for real-money gaming (RMG) in India, requiring advertisers to submit a certificate establishing the game as a 'game of skill' before publishing ads. These certificates must be issued either by a court order or by one of three industry bodies - the All India Gaming Federation (AIGF), E-Gaming Federation (EGF), or Federation of Indian Fantasy Sports (FIFS).

The move puts the estimated ₹3,000-₹4,000 crore that RMG firms spend annually

on digital advertising under increased scrutiny.

According to Buzzlab CEO and founder Sindhu Biswal, roughly 60-70% of that spend has traditionally gone to Meta platforms (primarily Instagram

and Facebook) driven by their precision targeting, mass reach, and ability to deliver quick installs and conversions.

To advertise online gambling or gaming, advertisers must also request written

approval from Meta via a designated form and submit proof that their activities are licensed or legally permitted in the regions they wish to target. Meta also prohibits these ads from being shown to users under the age of 18. The rules apply to any form of online gambling, including betting, lotteries, fantasy sports, skill-based tournaments, and games offering prizes of monetary value.

The move comes amid growing scrutiny of online gaming ads in India. Recently, the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) signed a MoU with FIFS, AIGF, and EGF to establish a joint monitoring framework.
