# SEERS TO MEET CM OVER DEMAND FOR SEPARATE CHIKKODI DISTRICT

People have been fighting for formation of Chikkkodi district for past 3 decades, says seer

“THE demand for declaring Chikkodi as a separate district is fully justified, and it has been decided that a delegation of Swami’s will meet Chief Minister Siddaramaiah during the upcoming Belagavi Winter Session to submit a formal appeal,” said Pancham Shivalingeshwar Swami of Nidasosi Siddhasanathan Mutt.

He was speaking at a gathering of various Swami’s, organised recently at the Public Works Department Hall in Chikkodi by the Chikkodi District Horata Samiti and several supporting organisations. Addressing the meeting, he said, “For the past three decades, people have been fighting for the formation of Chikkodi district. During this period, more than ten new districts have been created in Karnataka. Belagavi, with a population of over 60 lakh, has long required bifurcation. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah himself has on several occasions assured that

Chikkodi district would be declared. Therefore, during the upcoming Winter Session, a delegation of Swami’s from this region will urge the Chief Minister to fulfil this commitment.”

Sharana Basava Devaru of Belagavi Charanteshwar Viraktamath said that declaring Chikkodi as a

district would strengthen the Karnataka–Maharashtra border, promote Kannada culture, and bring literary, cultural, social, political, and economic growth to the region. He urged the CM to keep his promise. Speaking at the event, Chidghanananda Seer of Jodakurali Siddharoodha Mutt said

that smaller administrative units lead to better development. He noted that several large districts, including Dharwad, had already been reorganised and that forming Chikkodi district would increase government grants and accelerate development.

Sampadana Swami of Chikkodi Charamurti Mutt said that earlier, Siddaramaiah had assured a delegation that Chikkodi would be declared a district if local MLAs showed unity and support that is now clearly visible.

SY Hanji, President of the Chikkodi District Horata Samiti, said that the Centre has asked states to finalise new districts and taluks by December 31, making this the right moment for Chikkodi’s long-pending demand to become reality. He said that another delegation of Swami’s would soon meet the Chief Minister during the Winter Session.

Many Seers of the region and committee members were present at the meeting.

## Senior Citizens’ Recreation Park inaugurated at Tilakwadi

BELAGAVI witnessed the inauguration of a unique and much-awaited community space today as Belagavi South MLA Abhay Patil’s dream project, the Dr. C Prasanakumar Senior Citizens’ Recreation Center was formally opened at the historic Tilakwadi Vaccine Depot premises.

Mayor Mangesh Pawar, Deputy Mayor Vani Joshi, and corporators Girish Dhongdi, Raju Bhatakande, Nitin Jadhav, Shreshail Kamble, Nandu Meerajkar, Bharati Gurav, and Ram Bhandari were among the dignitaries who graced the event.

Speaking after inaugurating the facility, MLA Abhay Patil said the revitalised Vaccine Depot has become Belagavi’s “oxygen bank,” offering fresh air and open spaces in the heart of the city. He announced that a civilisation gallery is also being developed here, an informative and entertainment-based initiative that will showcase aviation models, India’s rural heritage through the ‘Villages of India’ concept, and an art gallery.

Patil criticised the current government, alleging that several development works he initiated were halted. “When our government returns to power in 2028, all these projects will be revived,” he declared. He added that despite opposition to celebrating Shivarit, he would continue to push cultural initiatives that inspire society. “This new space will help senior citizens express their artistic talents and stay socially active,” he said.

Corporator Bharati Gurav and senior citizen Ram Bhandari lauded the initiative, noting that abandoned works were restarted due to Patil’s efforts. “Some people tried to shut down these projects claiming Vaccine Depot was being turned into a cement jungle. But today’s development has added another jewel to Belagavi’s beauty,” they said.

They emphasised that the area has become a true “oxygen zone” for the city and urged citizens to protect and preserve the new facility. Speakers also appreciated Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s Vandana Yojana for senior citizens and urged the Karnataka government to implement it in the state.

The inauguration ceremony also showcased various recreational and sports activities by senior citizens, reflecting the vibrant spirit the park aims to nurture.

The new recreation park, blending culture, greenery, and learning, is expected to become a major community hub for Belagavi’s elderly — offering them both joy and dignity in their twilight years.

## Gadag cops nab jewellery thief within six hours

GADAG police arrested a Gujarat-based gold thief within six hours of launching the investigation into a jewellery shop burglary. The accused, Mohammad Siddiqui, had been staying in a lodge located beneath the jewellery shop and had been observing the building and staff for several days before executing the theft.

According to police, Siddiqui entered the shop through a top window after cutting open the metal barrier and disabling the CCTV cameras. He escaped with gold and silver ornaments worth around Rs 80 lakh. Officers described him as an interstate thief with a history of similar offences.

Police received a tip-off that the accused was travelling in a Gadag–Pune bus. Acting swiftly, Gadag SP Rohan Jagadish coordinated with the Kolhapur SP and formed 10 teams to track him down. CCTV footage at the Gadag bus stand showed Siddiqui wandering around and drinking milk at a shop before boarding the bus.

By the time the footage was reviewed, the bus had already left the district. With support from Kolhapur police, the teams intercepted the vehicle at a toll gate and arrested Siddiqui.

## Bailhongal demand for district status

BAILHONGAL town witnessed a shutdown on Saturday as residents, organisations, and local leaders staged a massive protest demanding Bailhongal be given district status if the State Government proceeds with the proposed division of Belagavi district.

A large crowd gathered at the Sangolli Rayanna Circle in Bailhongal, where leaders of various organisations, citizens, and youth raised slogans pressing for the long-pending demand. A formal memorandum was submitted to the government through local officials.

Kittur MLA Babasaheb Patil said that Bailhongal must be prioritised for district status purely on administrative grounds. “Bailhongal has been aspiring for district status since the British era. We are not against granting district status to others, but we too deserve it. Belagavi is a large district, and even if four new districts are created out of it, it will not cause inconvenience. We have already conveyed this to the Chief Minister and will raise it again,” he said.

Shankar Madalagi, another prominent leader, reminded that people of the region have

been fighting for a district headquarters for nearly 30 years.

“Every assembly session, governments promise discussions, but nothing moves forward. If at all Belagavi is to be bifurcated, Bailhongal must be the first to get district status,” he asserted.

The bandh received overwhelming support as residents voluntarily shut down shops and business establishments. Leaders emphasised that Bailhongal, already a sub-division with a rich historical legacy, serves as the central point for Saundatti, Gokak, Ramdurg and neighbouring taluks, making it a natural and efficient choice for a new district. “We will once again meet the Chief Minister during the upcoming session and submit our demand,” said Shivarajan Bolannavar, adding that the administrative convenience and historic significance of Bailhongal strengthen their case.

Numerous public representatives, activists, and members of several organisations participated in the protest, underscoring the growing pressure on the State Government to take a decisive call on the creation of new districts.
