Pendency of bail pleas causes trauma to accused, hurts justice delivery: HC

THE Delhi HC has expressed concern over the pendency of bail applications, taking a serious view of the trauma that it causes to the accused and its detrimental effect on the justice delivery process.

Justice Girish Kathpalia made the observation while granting bail to one Amir, who has been in custody since October 2021 after being arrested in a murder case...

"It is a matter of serious concern that bail applications remained pending for such inordinately long periods before the Court of Sessions as well as this court. As mentioned above, even in this court, this bail application remained pending since December 20, 2024 and has come up before me today for the first time..."

The matter stems from an alleged remark made by Atishi during the winter session of the Assembly in January BJP leaders had termed the remark derogatory and shared a video clip on social media.

Meanwhile, Punjab Police registered a case over clip sharing, citing a forensic report that claimed it was "doctored". The issue was referred to the Privileges Committee, and on directions of Speaker Vijender Gupta, the clip was sent for another forensic examination, which reportedly found it was not tampered.

76-yr-old worker killed after SUV hits him in east Delhi, driver nabbed

A 76-year-old worker was killed on Saturday morning after he was allegedly hit by an SUV on the service road of National Highway-24 in east Delhi's Gazipur area, police said.

Police received a call regarding the accident around 6 am. A team reached the spot near Gazipur village, an official said. At the scene, police found a black SUV with an Uttar Pradesh registration number in a damaged condition on the footpath. An elderly pedestrian was found lying on the footpath. He was hit after the vehicle reportedly skidded upon striking the divider between the main road and the service road, a police official said.

The victim was identified as Paik Karmai (76), a native of West Bengal who was residing in Gazipur village. He worked at the flower mandi in Gazipur and was heading to work with two co-workers when the incident took place, a senior police official said.

The SUV was being driven by Shrey Kumar (26), a resident of Noida in Uttar Pradesh. He was apprehended at the spot, while other occupants of the vehicle fled, officials said.

5 friends killed in road accident in Haryana

FIVE friends died while two sustained injuries when their SUV rammed into a tree in Haryana's Sonapat district, police said on Saturday.

The victims were returning to Rohtak on Friday evening after attending a wedding ceremony in Gohana, Bhawar village when the accident occurred, they said.

The SUV was mangled in the collision, and three individuals died on the spot, while two succumbed at the hospital. One of the 20 injured remains in critical condition, the police said.

The deceased were identified as Sagar, Deepak, Sahil, Mohit, and Anshuk, all aged between 22 and 27, officials said, adding that they were residents of Khidwala and Ghusknai villages in Rohtak district.

Adityanath raises concern over Delhi's hazardous air, calls it 'gas chamber'

UTTAR Pradesh CM Yogi Adityanath on Saturday compared the air quality of Delhi to a "gas chamber", stressing the importance of clean air and environmental conservation.

Addressing a gathering after inaugurating the renovated Block Development Officer's office in Jungle Kauria, Gorakhpur, the Chief Minister said environmental degradation is one of the biggest challenges facing the world today.

He said that people in Uttar Pradesh are in comparatively better environmental conditions and are not being suffocated despite ongoing development work. "The environment here in Gorakhpur is quite

clean; there is less pollution, so there are fewer diseases. Whenever pollution increases, it harms the respiratory system. If oxygen supply is compromised, the entire body suffers," he said, stressing the need to establish a forestry and horticulture university.

Referring to Delhi's pollution levels, he said, "Life in the nation's capital has become suffocating due to pollution. It seems like a gas chamber. The Air Quality Index is very poor. People experience burning eyes and breathing issues. Doctors advise the elderly, children and those with conditions like asthma to stay indoors." He emphasised that environmental conservation is essential for humanity's future.

AFTER nearly five decades, the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) will relocate its rare collection of antiquities from the Central Antiquity Collection (CAC) housed at the 16th-century Purana Quila to new facilities at the Red Fort and the Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Institute of Archaeology in Greater Noida, officials said.

The CAC, one of ASI's key repositories, houses over 2.72 lakh antiquities including pottery fragments, tools, seals, and artefacts recovered from excavations across the subcontinent. The collection features items from prominent archaeological sites such as Harappa, Mohenjodaro, and Taxila, along with artefacts from Kalibangan, Hastinapur, and several other locations.

threat. The site lacks space and modern conservation facilities, which may lead to irreversible physical, chemical, and biological degradation. Therefore, it has been decided to shift the collection to larger, better-equipped structures. This will also ensure easier access for researchers," they said.

Under the plan, part of the collection will be moved to a British-era barrack within the Red Fort complex, while the remaining antiquities—primarily pottery—will be transferred to the Greater Noida institute. The relocation will be car-

ried out under the supervision of senior officials, with antiquities transported in sealed boxes. Authorities have been directed to ensure proper arrangements, safe custody, and accurate inventory management.

The CAC was established in the 1910s to house antiquities from British archaeological Aurel Stein's Central Asian expeditions. It was initially located in the ASI's main building, later shifted to Sadjarjung Tomb in 1958, and then to Purana Quila in 1974. The repository also stores antiquities confiscated by agencies such as the police, Central Bureau of Investigation, Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, and Customs.
