# Red Fort blast stretch reopens for traffic

Traffic resumed on Netaji Subhash Marg after days of curbs following the blast, Lal Qila Metro gates also reopened

DAYS after the Red Fort blast, the stretch on Netaji Subhash Marg where the incident took place reopened for traffic movement on Saturday after being cleared, the officials said.

A senior Delhi Police officer said that since November 11, due to operational requirements, traffic restrictions and diversions were imposed on both the carriageways and service roads of Netaji Subhash Marg, from Chhatta Rail cut to Subhash Marg cut.

"From 1 pm on Saturday, both the carriageways and service roads along the mentioned stretch of Netaji Subhash Marg have been reopened for vehicular movement," the officer said.

Commuters have been advised that they can now use the stretch as per their destinations, the official added.

Additionally, two gates of the Lal Qila Metro Station, which had been closed after the blast shattered the station's glass panels, have also been reopened. In a post on X, the DMRC said, "Red Fort metro station gate numbers 2 & 3 are now open for commuters, restoring partial access that had been suspended as part of security measures following the incident."

The explosion on Monday evening near the Red Fort had prompted an immediate lockdown of the surrounding area, with enhanced checks and movement restrictions in place for several days as agencies conducted investigations. The reopening of the two gates is expected to ease pedestrian movement, especially for tourists and traders in the nearby markets.

Delhi Police has also compiled a list of vehicles that were present near the blast site and the parking lot where the 120-car exploded. The owners and drivers of these vehicles will be questioned on whether they saw anything suspicious before the incident. The photograph of main accused Umar Nabi will also be shown to them during the inquiry, the official said.

Faridabad police intensify checks amid high alert

AMID a high alert, the Crime Branch and local police teams of the Faridabad Police are conducting an intensive checking drive across police station limits. The campaign includes verification of tenants, fertilizer and seed shops, guest houses, hotels, residents from Jammu and Kashmir, and individuals involved in buying and selling old vehicles, officials said on Saturday.

A police spokesperson said the Faridabad Police has so far checked around 140 mosques, 1,700 tenants, 40 fertilizer and seed shops, about 200 guest houses and hotels, nearly 100 old-vehicle dealers, and over 500 individuals from Jammu and Kashmir.

He added that the District Magistrate, Faridabad, has issued orders to strengthen security arrangements. These orders mandate tenant verification, maintaining records of people staying in hotels, guest houses, dharamshalas and hospitals, and installing high-quality CCTV cameras with a minimum recording capacity of 30 days.

# MCD gets ₹175 cr for waste disposal, more funds soon

THE Delhi government is making every effort to strengthen sanitation in the national capital and has provided a special assistance of ₹175 crore to the MCD for garbage disposal, Urban Development Minister Ashish Sood said on Saturday. During an inspection of sanitation work in West Delhi's Vishnu Garden, Sood said the government is considering allocating additional funds to the civic body to ensure better cleanliness.

Acting on the instructions of Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, the Delhi government released ₹175 crore to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi to clear pending payments of contractors engaged in garbage collection, he said. "We will move a Cabinet note for additional funds to the MCD. Every possible help will be extended to the civic body for a neat and clean Delhi," he added.

The minister claimed that during the last two-and-a-half years of the AAP's tenure in the MCD, the city's sanitation system was derailed due to "improper contracts and mismanagement." He said the government is working to resolve these issues and, on the chief minister's direction, all ministers are personally monitoring cleanliness and sanitation works across the capital.

During the inspection drive, Sood visited several residential and commercial areas in Ward 85 and expressed concerns about problems faced by residents. He said the government is working at multiple levels to strengthen the sanitation system and improve waste management, assuring that citizens will see a cleaner city in the coming days.

## Delhi takes fire safety certificate renewal online

THE Delhi government has introduced a fully online system for renewing Fire Safety Certificates, aiming to strengthen the 'Ease of Doing Business' environment in the national capital. The new platform makes the entire process digital, paperless and citizen-friendly, requiring only four basic details for renewal.

Fire Clearance Certificates for commercial establishments (valid for three years) and residential buildings (valid for five years) can now be renewed seamlessly through the portal. Applicants only need to provide the premises address, PAN number, CA number on the electricity bill, and the previous certificate number. The rest of the procedure is handled by the department. The mandatory annual self-certification can also be submitted online.

Previously, the renewal process was fully manual, often causing delays, as applicants had to visit DFS offices, hard-copy submissions and lack of transparency. The new system eliminates these issues by enabling users to upload forms digitally.

## A decade after Akhlag lynching, UP to withdraw cases against all accused

AFTER almost a decade, in a significant move, the Uttar Pradesh government has decided to withdraw the case against the accused in the Dadri lynching. Mohammad Akhlag, 50, was lynched in 2015 over rumours of alleged cow slaughter and storing his meat at his home in Dadri's Bisada village in Greater Noida.

The withdrawal application, issued by the state in Akhlag's case, was filed before the court on October 15, said Gautam Buddha Nagar Additional District Government Counsel (ADGC), Bhag Singh Bhati. "The court is yet to pass an order on the plea and has scheduled the hearing for December," said Bhati.

He added that it was for the court to decide whether the case would be withdrawn or not. Until then, the trial would continue. "So far the testimony of the first prosecution witness — the complainant and the deceased's daughter, Shaista — is underway," Bhati added. He also said that all 15 accused

were currently out on bail. Akhlag and his son Danish had faced the mob's wrath on September 28, 2015, following an announcement from the village temple that he had slaughtered a cow. Akhlag died at a Noida hospital, while Danish survived after undergoing major surgery to correct a head injury inflicted by mobsters.

Fifteen persons, including Vishal Rana, son of a local BJP leader, and his cousin Shivam, were charge-sheeted as the main conspirators. The meat recovered from Akhlag's house was also sent for forensic examination, and the report had stated that it belonged to a "cow or its progeny". Akhlag's family, who alleged that the samples were switched,

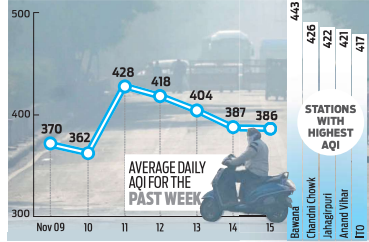
## PM10 largely driving city's pollution surge, 62 hotspots identified: Sirsa

DELHI Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa on Saturday said the capital is witnessing high pollution levels mainly due to PM10 emissions from construction activity, dusty roads and traffic congestion, and that the government is intensifying efforts to identify and address hotspots.

Sirsa said the sanitation systems and road conditions require "a lot of work", adding that gaps in local upkeep were significantly contributing to deteriorating air quality. "The major reason for pollution in Delhi is PM10, which largely comes from construction sites, dust on roads and several other factors. We have identified 62 hotspots where traffic or dust are the main causes, and we are working on them," he said.

He explained that "PM10 CAQM" refers to PM10 management by the Commission for Air Quality Management, which implements measures under the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP). These include restrictions on construction and industrial activity,



regulating vehicular emissions and deploying anti-smog devices when pollution levels rise.

Sirsa said the onset of winter is worsening the situation, as accumulated dust gradually turns into smog. "The battle for a clean Delhi is against 10 major polluting factors. Stubble burning also contributes, but with the sowing season beginning, its impact will start declining," he added.

He also noted that border areas continue to be affected by emissions from industrial units shifted to neighbouring regions.

On November 11, the capital's average AQI entered the 'severe' category for the first time this season—a level last recorded in December 2024. After three days in the 'severe' zone, the AQI improved slightly to the 'very poor' category on Friday.

The 15 identified hotspots include Anand Vihar, Wazirpur, Munda, Okhla Industrial Area, Jahangirpuri, Narola, Punjabi Bagh and others that are routinely recorded poor air quality. These zones are under continuous watch by DPCC and enforcement teams.

## Two persons killed in separate incidents in city

TWO people were killed in separate incidents in Delhi, police said on Saturday.

In the first case, a 23-year-old man died after being stabbed during a quarrel in GROUNDUR area, police said. Around 10 pm on Friday, police received a PCR call about a stabbing at Pravasi Ekta Park Camp. Officers reached the spot and found the victim in critical condition. He was taken to the AIIMS Trauma Centre, where he was declared brought dead.

During the investigation, police searched the crime scene and collected forensic evidence. CCTV footage and field enquiries helped identify those involved, a senior officer said. "During the operation, the victim's brother, Anand alias Budha (19), was apprehended. Preliminary investigation suggests the incident arose from a quarrel between the deceased and the accused. Efforts are underway to locate the remaining suspects," the officer said. A case under Sections 108(1) and 3(5) of the BNS has been registered.

In another incident, three people, including two juveniles, were apprehended for killing a 25-year-old man in northeast Delhi's New Usmanpur area over personal enmity. The victim was taken to JPC Hospital by a friend and was declared dead, police said.

## Saraswati claims threat to life in jail, court seeks report

CHAITANYANANDA Saraswati, accused of sexually harassing 16 students at a private institute in southwest Delhi, claimed before a Delhi court that his life was under threat inside Tihar Jail.

The self-styled godman and former institute chairman is in judicial custody for allegedly molesting several women. He was produced before Judicial Magistrate Animesh Kumar on Friday after completing 14 days of custody, when he alleged that he was not being allowed to wear his monk's robes, nor permitted to eat, and that he had lost weight. The court sought a detailed status report from prison authorities and posted the matter for November 18. On November 7, he withdrew his bail plea before a sessions court, with his counsel stating that the defence would examine the case after the chargesheet was filed.

### Woman shot dead in Punjabi Bagh house by 'lover'

A 24-year-old woman was shot dead allegedly by a jilted lover in west Delhi's Punjabi Bagh on Saturday, police said. Around midday, police received a call about two people lying in an injured condition in a house in the Old Stum Quarter, inside the walled area, and found on a mattress with a gunshot wound to the head and was declared dead. In another room, Neeraj, 25, was found with a gunshot injury to his chest and taken to a hospital. Police said it appears to be a case of unrequited love.
