AAP begins campaign against E20 policy, Kejriwal to march to PM house on Aug 4

New Delhi, August 1

A STICK of raw sugarcane — this was what visitors received outside the Mavalankar Auditorium at Constitution Club in Delhi when they arrived for AAP's town hall against the Centre's E20 ethanol-blending policy on Saturday.

"The message was clear, said Karol Bagh businessman Priyansh. "Sugarcane should be eaten, not put in your car," he added.

While people spoke to mediapersons with sugarcane in hand, a booth titled 'Rant Booth - #GanneKiBaat'. Take out your frustration against E20 invited them to record their views on the policy.

Around 11.30 am, inside the auditorium, every seat was occupied. AAP claimed more than seven lakh people watched the proceedings online.

On stage, politicians — including AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal and Delhi party chief Saurabh Bhardwaj — scientists, mechanics, farmers and vehicle owners took turns questioning the Centre's ethanol-blending programme. Kejriwal cited a survey by LocalCircles, a community platform. "Around 45,000 people participated in the survey.

While 67% reported reduced mileage, 45% said the engines of their vehicles had been damaged because of E20," he said, calling for a discussion.

"The government should release its own data or studies on ethanol blending. It has not provided any evidence that it is beneficial," he added.

Kejriwal went on to link the push for ethanol blending to increased ethanol imports from the US under the India-US trade agreement.

Stepping up his campaign, he also announced that he would march to the Prime Minister's residence on August 4 to submit a petition containing two lakh signatures collected through an online campaign.

Environmental scientist Dr Anupam Sunny warned of the impact of expanding sugarcane cultivation for ethanol

production. Citing estimates by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, he said nitrous oxide released from nitrogen fertilisers used in sugarcane farming has a much higher global warming potential than carbon dioxide.

Amir, a mechanic, displayed a corroded carburettor that he claimed had been damaged by E20 fuel. He advised owners to avoid leaving vehicles unused for long periods and to keep fuel tanks relatively full. Jyotsna, who was introduced as an automobile industry expert, claimed that insurance policies do not cover engine damage linked to ethanol-blended petrol.

Sunil, who said he owns an E20-compatible Honda Shine motorcycle, claimed his vehicle had nevertheless suffered engine damage after the transi-

tion to E20 fuel.

Speaking to *The Indian Express*, former Delhi minister Saurabh Bhardwaj said AAP was only demanding that consumers be allowed to choose between pure petrol and E20, and that ethanol-blended fuel be sold at a lower price. "We had raised these demands even before the Jantar Mantar protests (of the BJP against NEET-UG paper leak)," he said. Dismissing suggestions that the event marked AAP's political revival, he said, "AAP ka demise kabhi hua nahi tha (AAP never died). We were only on or two percentage points behind the BJP. We will bounce back fast."

Kejriwal reiterated AAP's three demands on X: Every petrol pump should offer both pure petrol and E20, E20 should cost less than pure petrol, and the price of pure petrol should remain below Rs 84 a litre.

Slamming Kejriwal for his remarks, Union Minister of State for Road Transport and Highways Harsh Mahotra, who heads Delhi BJP, said in a statement. "He claims to be an IIT graduate. But his statements make it seem as if he has not even studied at an industrial training institute (ITI). Had he been educated at IIT, he would not have opposed ethanol-blended petrol that helps the nation in so many ways."

MAJOR REJIG: 138 JUDGES SHIFTED

Special judge in fast-track court hearing NEET paper leak case transferred

DAYS AFTER she was designated as a special judge in a fast-track court for paper leak cases, the Delhi High Court has transferred Judge Anu Grover Baliga. Special Judge Ajay Gupta will now hear the cases in the fast-track court, including NEET-UG 2026 paper leak cases. The re-jig comes as a part of a major reshuffle in the Delhi Higher Judicial Service (DHJS).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced the setting up of fast-track courts last week to tackle the cases of paper leaks following widespread protests against the issue.

The first hearing in Judge Baliga's fast-track court against 2026 NEET paper leak cases was set to be held on July 27 but was adjourned following a request from the defence counsel. While the court has taken the chargesheet on record, a hearing on the chargesheet and on

the bail pleas of two accused was scheduled for August 3.

Judge Ajay Gupta was initially hearing the NEET paper leak case before the formation of fast-track courts.

Before her appointment at fast-track court, Judge Baliga was serving as Judge-in-Charge of the Mediation Centre, Central District, at Tis Hazari Courts. She



will now hear terror-related cases.

A total of 138 judges have been transferred via the High Court's notification on Saturday. As part of the reshuffle, 13 judges have been posted to Rouse Avenue Court to deal with matters under the Unlaw-

ful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), National Investigation Agency (NIA) Act, Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA).

Of these, six judges are special NIA judges, who will exclusively hear terror cases. Across the Capital, more than 50 NIA cases are being heard, a vast majority of which were being heard before Additional Sessions Judge Prashant Sharma of Patiala House Court.

The six NIA judges are Anu Grover Baliga, Vikas Dhull, Prashant Sharma, Amit Bansal, Kiran Bansal and Palustya Pramachala. These judges will take charge with effect from August 4. New NIA courts have been set up at Rouse Avenue Court and will be inaugurated on Monday.

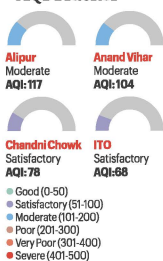

DELHI IS expected to witness a relatively milder August in terms of daytime temperatures even as nights are expected to remain warmer than usual, according to the India Meteorological Department's (IMD) monthly outlook. The Capital is also likely to record above-normal rainfall.

Monthly average maximum temperatures are likely to remain normal to below normal during August in parts of North-West India, including Delhi-NCR, as per the outlook.

This, however, stands in contrast to most parts of the country where daytime temperatures are expected to be above normal.

Across most of India, IMD expects August to be characterised by above-normal daytime temperatures, with only some areas of North-West and Central India, along with isolated pockets of the southern peninsula, likely to record normal to below-normal maximum temperatures. Similarly, minimum temperatures are expected to stay normal to above normal across almost the entire country. But the overnight temperatures in the Capital are unlikely to see similar moderation.

While rainfall over the country as a whole is expected

to remain below normal in August, the IMD has forecast normal to above-normal rainfall over some parts of North-West India, including Delhi-NCR.

The expected moderation in daytime temperatures is linked to enhanced cloud cover and intermittent rainfall associated with the Southwest Monsoon. However, higher humidity accompanying these conditions could keep nights warmer than average, limiting relief from sultry weather.

The monthly outlook comes after Northwest India experienced warmer-than-normal overall conditions in July.

According to the IMD data, the region recorded an average maximum temperature of 33.2°C, marginally above the normal of 33.0°C, while the average minimum temperature stood at 24.8°C, 0.7°C above normal. The mean temperature for the region was 29.0°C, about 0.4°C above normal.

On the rainfall front, the IMD expects the country to receive below-normal rainfall during August, defined as less than 94% of the long period average (LPA) of 254.9 mm. Despite this overall deficit, the forecast indicates that parts of Northwest India, East-Central India, the Northeast and the eastern peninsula region are likely to receive normal to above-normal rainfall.
